


HOW SWEDE IT IS

Rickard Rakell has scored a team-leading 22 goals this season, which is the fourth-highest goal total of his career.

Eighteen of Rakell's 22 goals this season have come at even strength, a total that ranks fourth in the league:

Sidney Crosby recorded an assist on Kevin Hayes' power-play goal on Sunday against Tampa Bay to tie Marcel Dionne for the 11th-most assists in NHL history with his 1,040th.

His next assist with give him sole possession of 11th place on the NHL's alltime list and move him within eight of cracking the top-10:

POWERED UP

The Penguins' power play has been clicking as of late, scoring on the man advantage in eight of the last 10 games dating back to Dec. 23, going 12-for-33 [36.4%].

Stretching back further, the Penguins have 20 power-play goals over their last 20 games dating back to Nov. 30. In that span, the Penguins' 20 power-play goals lead the league and their 31.8 success rate ranks third:
