## **Post-Game Notes**

- The Tampa Bay Lightning were shutout 5-0 by the St. Louis Blues in their largest defeat of the season on Tuesday night at Enterprise center.
- The last time the Lightning were shutout in consecutive games was the 2015-16 season (Oct. 24 at CHI, 1-0 & Oct. 27 at STL, 2-0).
- The Lightning have gone 122:10 of game time without scoring a goal.
- Tampa Bay moved to 6-4-4 this season overall and to 2-4-2 on the road.
- The Bolts fell to 1-2-0 against Central Division opponents and to 3-2-1 against Western Conference opponents.
- Tampa Bay is now 4-4-2 over their last 10 games against the Blues and 2-6-2 over their last 10 road meetings.
- The Lightning outshot the Blues 30-29, including a 15-8 advantage in the second period.
- The Bolts fell to 5-3-0 in games where they outshoot their opponent.
- Brandon Hagel, Nikita Kucherov and Steven Stamkos led the Lightning with four shots on goal each.
- Luke Glendening (8/11) and Nick Paul (7/11) paced the Bolts at the faceoff dot.
- Nikita Kucherov posted a game-high three takeaways.
- Darren Raddysh blocked a team-high three shots.
- Nikita Kucherov had his four-game point streak snapped (5-7—12).
- The Lightning recorded zero penalty minutes for only the fifth time in franchise history and the first time in a road game (Last: Mar. 30, 2021 vs. CBJ)

- Lightning netminder Jonas Johansson stopped 24 of the 28 shots as he fell to 0-3-1 over his last four starts and to 5-4-4 overall this season.
- Colton Parayko put the Blues on the board first with a goal at 11:09 of the first period.
- Jordan Kyrou and Jakub Vrana scored goals 19 seconds apart at 16:17 and 16:36 of the second period to extend the Blues lead to 3-0.
- Kasperi Kapanen scored an empty-net goal to make the score 4-0 with 3:58 left in the third period.
- Jordan Kyrou scored his second goal of the game with 41.5 seconds left in regulation to seal a 5-0 victory for the Blues.
- The Lightning will travel to Chicago to wrap up a short two-game road trip on Thursday night at United Center (8:00pm puck drop).
- The Lightning are 34-16-4 with five ties all-time against Chicago, including a road record of 15-10-3 with two ties.
