PLAYER NOTES

- **William Nylander** scored for the Maple Leafs at 19:05 of the second period and scored the game-winning goal for Toronto at 17:47 of the third period. Nylander recorded the third game-winning goal of his Stanley Cup playoff career. Nylander tied a single-game Stanley Cup playoff career-high in goals with two which he has marked on two occasions during his playoff career and posted the 11th multi-point game of his Stanley Cup playoff career. Per NHL Stats, “Nylander became the first Maple Leafs player with multiple goals in a win to stave off elimination since Joe Nieuwendyk (2 in Game 7 of 2004 CQF).”
- **Timothy Liljegren** recorded the primary assist on Nylander’s first goal of the game. With the assist, Liljegren recorded the first point of his Stanley Cup playoff career.
- **Morgan Rielly** registered the secondary assist on Nylander’s first goal of the game and the secondary assist on Nylander’s second goal of the game. Rielly marked the sixth multi-assist and multi-point game of his Stanley Cup playoff career.
- **Matthew Knies** posted the primary assist on Nylander’s second goal of the game, posting his first assist of the playoffs. Knies has recorded a point in back-to-back games (1G, 1A).
- **Noah Gregor** skated in his Stanley Cup Playoffs debut tonight with the Maple Leafs.
- **Simon Benoit** set a new single-game Stanley Cup playoff career-high with nine hits registered tonight.
- **Joseph Woll** stopped 22 of 23 shots he faced in tonight’s win.
- **Joel Edmundson** and **Timothy Liljegren** were on the ice for a team-high 19 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **Noah Gregor** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 69.23 percent (9 for, 4 against).

TEAM NOTES

- The Maple Leafs were 0-for-3 on the power play and 1-for-1 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Per NHL Stats, “The Maple Leafs forced a Game 7 after facing a 3-1 series deficit for the fourth time in franchise history, following the 2018 First Round, 2013 Conference Quarterfinals and 1942 Stanley Cup Final. – Toronto fell to Boston in the 2018 and 2013 series but defeated Detroit during the 1942 finale to capture the club’s fourth championship. The Maple Leafs became the first franchise in NHL history to force a Game 7 after facing a 3-1 series deficit three times against the same opponent.”
