GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Kings this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Los Angeles this year. The teams will next meet on Feb. 7 in LA.
- Tonight is the sixth game the Stars will play against a Pacific Division opponent this season. They've posted a 4-1-0 record in the previous five games.
- The Stars have a 15-6-1 record against the Kings since the start of the 2015-16 season, outscoring Los Angeles 67-50 in those games.
 - Their .705 points percentage during that span is the fourth-best mark in the NHL. 0
- A victory tonight would give the Stars their second four-game win streak of the season after winning their first four games of the year from Oct. 10 to 15.
- Over the course of the Stars' last five games dating back to Nov. 25, 10 different Dallas skaters have scored at least one goal: Mason Marchment (4), Jamie Benn (2), Roope Hintz (2), Tyler Seguin (2), Colin Blackwell, Evgenii Dadonov, Matt Duchene, Thomas Harley, Miro Heiskanen and Wyatt Johnston.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.54 goals against per game this season, which was tied for the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 14 of the 24 games that they have played this year.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 82-61 this season. Their plus-21 goal differential this season was the tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Only one of Dallas' games this season has required extra time their 3-2 shootout win over the San Jose Sharks on Oct. 15. The Stars and the Rangers were the only teams in the NHL this season to have only one of their games go beyond regulation.

DETHRONING THE KINGS

- Dallas is 124-80-43 all-time vs. Los Angeles, including a 51-45-27 mark on the road.
- The Stars have won eight of their last 10 contests against the Kings, upholding a perfect 3-0-0 record against them last season. Dallas has also recorded wins in eight of their previous 10 games at Crypto.com Arena.

- Evgenii Dadonov has 11 points (5-6—11) in his last nine games against Los Angeles and enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak against the Kings.
 - Dadonov has five points (2-3–5) in five career road games against Los Angeles.
 - Miro Heiskanen has eight points (2-6—8) in his last eight games against Los Angeles.
- Roope Hintz has 10 points (4-6–10) in his last 10 games against the Kings.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak against Los Angeles, totaling five points (3-2-5) in those games. He has scored in each of the last three games he has played against the Kings.
- Jason Robertson has 12 points (5-7–12) in eight career games against the Kings. He has recorded a point in all but one of the games he has played against the Kings and enters tonight's matchup riding a seven-game point streak.
 - **Robertson's** 1.50 points per game against the Kings are tied for the best mark in the NHL among players to have played Los Angeles at least twice.

EVEN STEVENS

- The Stars have played 13 games since returning from the Global Series in Finland dating back to Nov. 7. During that span, the team has scored 34 5-on-5 goals, the most of any team in the NHL.
- Dallas has averaged 2.62 5-on-5 goals per game during that span, which ranks second in the NHL to only the Washington Capitals (2.67).
- Additionally, during that span the Stars have outshot their opponents 312-284 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick. Their 312 shots at 5-on-5 top the league during that span and their 52.4 percent shot share ranks eighth.
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 34-23 at 5-on-5 during that span. Their 59.7 goals-for percentage since Nov. 20 is the third-best mark in the NHL according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Fifteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one even-strength goals (5-on-5 and 4-on-4) since Nov. 20, with Mason Marchment leading the team with eight. His eight even-strength goals during that span were the most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.

JAKE AND BAKE

- Dallas' 2-1 victory over the Utah Hockey Club in their last game was the 126th win of **Jake Oettinger's** career, which tied him with Jon Casey for the sixth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
 - He's now two wins shy of matching Gilles Meloche (141) for the fifth-most in franchise history.
- The Stars' win over the Hockey Club was also **Oettinger's** 13th win of the year, which was the second-most in the NHL this season by a goaltender. Entering play Tuesday, only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (15) had won more games this season than **Oettinger**.
- Oettinger has posted a 2.38 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage this season, which were tied for fourth and seventh, respectively, in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday among netminders that have played in at least 10 games.
- Additionally, **Oettinger** has saved 6.8 goals above expected and 0.414 goals above expected per 60 this season according to MoneyPuck.com, which both ranked seventh among goalies to play in at least 10 games entering play Tuesday.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer when playing on the road this year, totaling 16 points (5-11—16) in 12 games.
 His 16 road points this season were tied for 12th in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Miro Heiskanen has nine points (4-5–9) in his last nine road games dating back to Oct. 24 against the Buffalo Sabres. His nine road points during that span were tied for sixth among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.
- Mason Marchment has 13 points (6-7–13) in 12 road games played this season, which includes posting multi-point efforts in three of his last six road games played.

HEATING UP

- Miro Heiskanen has recorded seven points (2-5—7) in his last six games dating back to Nov. 23 against the Lightning. His seven points during that span are tied with Matt Duchene for the team lead and were also tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.
- Wyatt Johnston has seven points (2-5–7) in his last seven games played dating back to Nov. 20 against the San Jose Sharks.
- Roope Hintz has won at least 60 percent of the face offs he has taken in four of the last six games that he has played dating back to Nov. 20. In all, he has gone 27-for-45 at the faceoff dot during that span, for a 60 percent success rate.

IDES OF MARCH

- Mason Marchment has totaled 24 points (10-14–24) in 23 games played this season and enters tonight's matchup against the Kings ranked second on the team in scoring.
- Sixteen (8-8–16) of Marchment's 24 points this season have come in the last 11 games that he has played dating back to Nov. 11. Entering play Tuesday, only Edmonton's Connor McDavid (8-10–18) has more points than Marchment during that span.

- Additionally, Marchment's eight goals since Nov. 11 were tied with McDavid, Anthony Cirelli and Brayden Point for the most in the NHL.
- Three of Marchment's goals this season have been game-winners, matching his career high that he set last season. Entering play Tuesday, he was tied for 10th in the NHL in game-winning goals.
- Marchment's 10 goals this season were tied for the 10th-most by a Canadian skater this season entering play Tuesday, and his 24 points were tied for 13th.

TILTING THE ICE

- **Thomas Harley** has recorded a plus-17 even strength on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifthbest mark in the NHL this year entering play Tuesday.
- In all, **Harley** has been on the ice for 34 even-strength goals this season, which was the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday, trailing only Washington's Rasmus Sandin (36).
- Among NHL defensemen this year, **Miro Heiskanen** ranked in the top 10 in both even strength on-ice goal differential (11, tied 10th) and even strength on-ice goals for (32, tied fourth) entering play Tuesday.
- Since Nov. 11, Harley and Heiskanen rank third and fourth among NHL defensemen in on-ice goal differential with a plus-11 and plus-10 rating, respectively, entering play Tuesday.
- Entering play Tuesday, Mason Marchment and Tyler Seguin were tied for fifth among all NHL forwards this season in even strength on-ice goal differential, both with a plus-15. Linemate Matt Duchene (plus-14) ranked seventh.

SETTING THE PACE

- With 58 regular-season games remaining, four different Stars skaters are pacing to set career highs in scoring this year: Matt Duchene, Ilya Lyubushkin, Mason Marchment and Sam Steel.
- Duchene is currently pacing to finish the year with 55 assists and 96 points, which would all be career highs for the 16year veteran.
 - If he were to maintain that pace, his 2024-25 season would be the eighth-highest scoring season in franchise history.
- Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 35 goals, 49 assists and 85 points, all of which would be career highs. His 24 points this year are already 45.3 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31–53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
- Lyubushkin (0-21–21) and Steel (7-28–34) are all on pace to finish the regular season with career highs in both assists and points.
- Colin Blackwell (12), Thomas Harley (34), Wyatt Johnston (34), Esa Lindell (24) and Brendan Smith (18) are all pacing to finish the 2024-25 season with a career high in assists while Miro Heiskanen is on track to score 14 goals this season, which would be a career high.
- Additionally, rookie Logan Stankoven is pacing to finish the year with 40 assists and 55 points. Forty assists would be the sixth-most by a rookie in franchise history.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 58.3 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 14 of their 24 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 12 of the 14 games that they have scored first in. Their 12 wins when scoring first were tied with the Minnesota Wild for the best mark in the league this season entering play Tuesday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .857 win percentage when scoring first this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Dallas' first goal in their game on Nov. 25 came on their first shot of the game. **Tyler Seguin** opened the scoring 18 seconds into the game, which tied Michael Kesselring (0:18 on Nov. 7 w/ UTA) for the second-fastest game-opening goal this season behind Nathan Walker (0:11 on Nov. 21 w/ STL) according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars have scored on their first shot of the game three times this season according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also three assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is five points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is seven points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is seven games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- Lindell also enters tonight's contest six assists shy of typing Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
