Post-Game Notes

- The Tampa Bay Lightning fell 4-3 in overtime to the Seattle Kraken on Monday night at AMALIE Arena.
- The Lightning moved to 4-2-3 on the season with a home record of 4-0-2.
- Tampa Bay lost to the Kraken for the first time in history after going 4-0-0 over the first two seasons of Seattle's franchise. The Lightning had previously outscored the Kraken 17-4 over those four games.
- The Bolts wrapped up their five-game homestand with a 3-0-2 record, earning a point in every game.
- Since the start of the 2021-22 season, the Lightning are 29-2-5 against Western Conference opponents at AMALIE Arena after losing in overtime tonight.
- The Lightning fell to 0-3 in overtime this season and have lost 10 of their last 11 games that required an extra frame (includes playoffs).
- The Lightning have been outshot 12-0 in three overtime games this season.
- The Bolts moved to 0-2-3 when their opponent scores first and to 0-2-2 when trailing after two periods.
- Tampa Bay was outshot 43-37, including a 20-9 deficit in the first period and a 5-0 deficit in overtime.
- The Lightning are 1-2-3 in games that they are outshot.
- Nikita Kucherov fired a game-high eight shots on goal to lead the Lightning. It
 was the most shots taken in a game by any Bolts skater this season.
- Tampa Bay won 30/50 draws and were led at the dot by Nick Paul who went 7/10 on faceoffs.

- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johasson made 39 saves on 43 shots in defeat to fall to 4-1-3 this season.
- Brian Dumuolin scored at 12:08 of the first period to give the Kraken a 1-0 lead.
- Jonas Johansson's shutout streak came to an end at 132:08 of playing time, the longest shutout streak in the NHL this season.
- Yanni Gourde extended Seattle's lead to 2-0 just one minute after their first goal at 13:08 of the first period.
- Tanner Jeannot cut the Bolts deficit in half, banging in a rebound on the backhand from the left circle at 13:37 of the first period.
- The goal marked Jeannot's fourth point of the season (2-2—4).
- Haydn Fleury notched his first point of the season with the primary assist on Jeannot's goal.
- Darren Raddysh picked up his fifth assist and point with the secondary marker on the play.
- Raddysh extended his point streak to a career-long three games (0-3—3).
- Kailer Yamamoto made the score 3-1 in favor of Seattle with a power-play goal at 15:52 of the first period.
- The Lightning had not allowed a power-play goal since opening day, ending a 15for-15 streak on the penalty kill.
- Alex Barré-Boulet scored his third goal of the season at 3:40 of the first period to bring the Lightning back within a goal.
- Barré-Boulet's power-play marker extended his point streak to a career-long four games (3-1—4).
- Brandon Hagel registered his fourth assist and ninth point of the season with the primary assist on the goal.
- Tanner Jeannot recorded his second point of the night, picking up the secondary assist on Barré-Boulet's power-play goal.
- Jeannot posted the 11th multi-point game of his career.

- Brandon Hagel tied the game at three with a net-front pass that redirected off a Kraken skate in front and into the net with 5:28 left in regulation. Hagel's sixth goal of the season marked his 10th point.
- Hagel has found the scoresheet in each of his four career games versus Seattle (3-3—6).
- Hagel recorded the 33rd multi-point game of his career.
- Anthony Cirelli notched his third assist and fourth point of the season with the primary assist on the game-tying goal.
- Cirelli has registered four points over his last four matchups against the Kraken (1-3—4).
- Alex Barré-Boulet posted his second point of the night with the secondary assist to mark the first multi-point game of his career.
- Jared McCann scored on the power play at 2:33 of overtime to give the Kraken a 4-3 victory.
- The Lightning hit the road for a four-game road trip starting in Columbus on Thursday night where they will battle with the Blue Jackets at Nationwide Arena (7:00pm puck drop).
- Tampa Bay is 31-14-0 with one tie all time against the Blue Jackets, including a road record of 13-9-0 with one tie.
