



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

March 10, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [0] vs. NEW YORK RANGERS [4]

The Calgary Flames fell 4–0 to the New York Rangers on Tuesday night at Madison Square Garden on their second stop amid a five-game Eastern Conference road swing. Alexis Lafrenière opened the scoring on a first-period powerplay before adding two more goals in the second and third. Calgary generated 21 shots but was unable to solve Jonathan Quick who stopped every attempt. Dustin Wolf made 25 saves in the loss, keeping the Flames within reach for much of the night, but the Rangers pulled away with three unanswered goals after the opening period.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Devils. Calgary fell 2-1 in overtime to New Jersey in these clubs' first matchup on January 19 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 7-5-2 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 11-12-4 against Eastern Conference opponents.

MILESTONES AT MADISON SQUARE:

On Tuesday night in New York both Ryan Strome and Adam Klapka recorded milestone nights with Strome skating in 900th NHL game, while Klapka appeared in game number 100 of his NHL career.

STROME:

In skating in his 900th NHL game on Tuesday, Ryan Strome became the ninth player from the 2011 draft class to reach 900 games played, with one of the other members on that list being Jonathan Huberdeau who did so with Calgary last season on March 22, 2025 against the New York Islanders. Strome made his NHL debut on December 14, 2013 as a member of the New York Islanders, with his first NHL goal coming 11 games into his NHL career on January 6 against Dallas. Through 900 games, the Mississauga, ON native has recorded 492 points, and is eight away from becoming the 15th player drafted in 2011 to reach the 500-point milestone.

Ryan Strome arrived in Calgary and made his Flames debut last Saturday night against Carolina, recording a goal and an assist to register his second multi-point game of the season (also: Dec. 7 vs. CHI). Strome finished the night a point short of matching the franchise record for points in a Flames debut, a feat has been achieved by six players and last done by Kristian Huselius (0-3—3 on Dec. 3, 2005).

KLAPKA:

With Adam Klapka reaching triple digits in games played on Tuesday at Madison Square Garden, he has become the 14th undrafted skater from Czechia in NHL history to reach the 100-game plateau. Klapka was signed as a free agent by Calgary on May 16, 2022 from Bílí Tygři Liberec in the Czechia first division (Tipsport Extraliga) and began his time in the Flames organization with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers in 2022-23. He would play 158 American Hockey League contests with the Wranglers between 2022-23 and 2024-25, posting 48 goals which rank as the second-most in Wranglers franchise history behind only Rory Kerins (67).

His NHL debut came on January 20, 2024 against the Edmonton Oilers, and he would go on to play six games for the Flames in 2023-24, scoring his first NHL goal on April 18, 2024 against San Jose. Over his NHL career, Klapka has 12 goals and 12 assists for 24 points through his first 100 games.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf enters tonight's contest with 55 wins in his NHL career, tied with Dan Bouchard (55) for the third-most victories by a goalie before age 25 in Flames franchise history.

CALGARY TIES TO NEW JERSEY:

Yegor Sharangovich is slated to skate in his sixth game against his former team, the New Jersey Devils. The Minsk, BLR native was the Devils fifth round pick (141st overall) in the 2018 NHL Draft and skated in 205 games with New Jersey, scoring 53 goals and 53 assists for 106 points. Sharangovich was acquired by the Flames in the summer of 2023 along with a 2023 third-round pick (Aydar Suniev). Fellow forward Blake Coleman played the first 237 games of his NHL career in New Jersey, recording 94 points (57G, 37A) as a member of the Devils.



Defenceman Kevin Bahl was acquired by Calgary from New Jersey last off-season and has suited up for 136 games so far during his Flames tenure, recording six goals and 28 assists for 34 points. He was signed to a to a six-year contract extension in in June of 2025 after a strong inaugural campaign with Calgary where he posted a career-best 20 points while averaging over 21-minutes of ice-time per night in 2024-25. Bahl spent his first four NHL seasons with New Jersey, skating in 148 games for the Devils with four goals and 21 assists for 25 points.

NEW JERSEY TIES TO CALGARY:

New Jersey netminder Jacob Markstrom spent four seasons with the Flames after he was signed as a free agent prior to the 2020-21 season. Markstrom appeared in 213 games for Calgary, posting a 105-78-25 record along with a .907 Sv% and a 2.63 GAA. Markstrom was traded from Calgary to New Jersey in the summer of 2024 in exchange for Kevin Bahl and a 2025 1st round pick (Cole Reschny).

Devils blueliner Dougie Hamilton appeared in 245 games as a Flame, scoring 42 goals and 95 assists for 137 points, only missing one game during his three seasons with Calgary.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund enters play tonight with 599-career points, sitting one shy of becoming the 26th skater of Swedish descent in NHL history to reach 600 points. He also can become the sixth player in Flames franchise history to record 600 points with the club:

Backlund's 228 career goals sit one shy of tying Kent Nilsson (229) for the fifth-most in Flames franchise history. With one more tally, he would also tie Nilsson for the most goals by a Swedish-born player in Flames history, with the pair ranking as the only two Swedes to eclipse 200 goals with the club.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman scored his 12th shorthanded goal as a Calgary Flame on Monday night in Washington to tie Paul Ranheim for the sixth most in franchise history. Since he made his NHL debut on January 12, 2017, Coleman has recorded 23 shorthanded goals, the most among all skaters over that span.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Calgary Flames have won 51-straight games when scoring four or more goals in a contest, dating back to December 16, 2023. This season, Calgary is 14-0-0 when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game.

FUTURE WATCH:

Flames prospects Cole Reschny and Eric Jamieson were named to the NCHC 2025-26 All-Rookie Team while Ethan Wyttenbach earned a unanimous selection to the ECAC All-Rookie Team and recent acquisition Jonathan Castagna was named First-Team All-Ivy.

In his first collegiate season with the University of North Dakota, Reschny leads all NCHC freshmen with 33 points from five goals and 28 assists, also NCHC freshmen high, in 32 games. The Macklin, SK native has excelled in the faceoff dot, ranking third among NCHC rookies with 265 faceoff wins, while his 54.3-win-percentage is second among freshman centers. He was twice named NCHC Forward of the Week and once Rookie of the Week in 2025-26 and tops all NCHC rookies with a +13 plus/minus on the year. Reschny was selected 18th overall by the Flames at the 2025 NHL Draft.

Also in his first collegiate campaign, Eric Jamieson amassed 16 points from seven goals and nine assists in 37 games with the University of Denver. His seven goals led all NCHC freshman blueliners, while his 16 points were the third-most among NCHC rookie defensemen. The Calgary, AB native also topped NCHC freshman rearguards with a + 11 rating and ranked second in blocked shots with 49. He was the Flames sixth round selection (177th overall) in the 2024 NHL Draft.

Freshman Ethan Wyttenbach was the only unanimous selection to the ECAC All-Rookie Team following his debut season with Quinnipiac. The Roslyn, NY native led the entire NCAA in scoring, posting 57 points in 36 games. He scored 24 goals which ranked second the NCAA along with 33 assists which also ranked second among NCAA skaters. In conference play, Wyttenbach averaged 1.64 points-per-game, scoring 15 goals while adding 21 assists for 36 points in ECHC contests. He was selected by the Flames in the fifth-round (144th overall) in the 2025 NHL Draft.

Flames recent acquisition Jonathan Castagna was unanimous named First-Team All-Ivy after leading Cornell in scoring with 32 points from a team-high 14 goals and 18 assists, the second-most on the club. Castagna recorded 11 points (6-5—11) in Ivy play, tied for third in the league in scoring. He also paced the Ivy League in both faceoff wins (126) and faceoff wins per game (12.60), which included registering a season-high 22 faceoff wins against Princeton on Jan. 16. In 2023-24, Jonathan helped Cornell win the ECAC Championship, was named ECAC Tournament MVP, and earned a spot on both the ECAC All-Rookie Team and the All-Ivy League Second Team. Last season, he helped Cornell repeat as ECAC Champions while being named to the ECAC All-Tournament Team.
