2024-25 SEASON

- Named the 11th captain in Lightning history on September 18
- Led TBL defensemen for goals (15), assists (51) and points (66)
- Became Tampa Bay's all-time games played leader (1,083 GP) on December 28 vs. NYR
- Captained Team Sweden at the 2025 4 Nations Face-Off
- Named to the NHL's Second All-Star Team for the sixth time in nine seasons

2025 Playoffs

- Played in all five games of Tampa Bay's First Round series against the Florida Panthers and tallied three assists
- Ranked tied for second among Bolts skaters for assists and ranked fifth for shots on goal (10)

2023-24 Season

- Appeared in 78 games for TBL, recording 13 goals and 76 points
- Ranked 4th among NHL defensemen for assists, fifth for points, and sixth for power-play points (31)
- Led all TBL skaters for plus/minus (+18) and average time on ice (24:48)
- Skated in his 1,000th career NHL game on December 4, becoming the second player in franchise history to do so
- Tallied seventh career four-point game (1-3—4) January 18 vs. MIN
- Played all five Stanley Cup Playoff games vs. FLA, recording one goal and six assists (tied for team lead in points)
- Tallied three assists in Game 4, surpassing Bobby Orr for the 10th-most multi-point playoff games by a defenseman in NHL history

2022-23 Season

- Skated in 76 games, tallying 9 goals and 49 points
- Ranked fifth on TBL for assists and seventh for scoring

2022-23 Season Cont.

- Ranked second among TBL defensemen for goals, assists, and points
- Finished second on TBL for average time on ice (23:43), ending a nine-season run leading the team for time on ice
- Scored first career shorthanded goal on March 25 at BOS
- Recorded 500th career assist on February 11 at DAL (947th game)
- Played 900th NHL game on October 14 at CBJ
- Played five of six Stanley Cup Playoff games, recording three assists and a +4 rating (team-high)
- Ranked tied for third on TBL for playoff assists and first among defensemen

2021-22 Season

- Skated in all 82 regular season games for the first time in career
- Recorded 20 goals and 65 assists for 85 points all career highs
- Ranked third among NHL defensemen for goals and points, second for assists
- Ranked eighth among all NHL skaters for assists
- Tied Dan Boyle's franchise record for goals by a defenseman in a season (20)
- Set TBL blueliner records for assists (65) and points (85)
- Ended regular season on a career-long, eight-game point streak (1g, 16a)
- Led TBL for average time on ice (25:05), assists, and plus/minus (+25)
- Named Norris Trophy finalist (finished third) and to NHL Second All-Star Team
- Selected to NHL All-Star Game (fourth career selection)
- Played all 23 Stanley Cup Playoff games, recording three goals and 19 points
- Tied personal postseason assist record
- Ranked 3rd among NHL defensemen for postseason points
- Recorded 100th career playoff assist in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Final vs. NYR

2020-21 Season

- Played 54 games, tallying nine goals and 45 points
- Ranked seventh in NHL for average time on ice (25:03), tied for third among NHL defensemen for points (45) and 4th for assists (36)
- Played 800th NHL game on April 4 vs. DET
- Recorded 500th NHL point on March 16 vs. CHI
- Norris Trophy finalist (fifth straight year)
- Played all 23 Stanley Cup Playoff games, recording two goals and 16 assists (18 points)
- Led NHL defensemen for playoff scoring and ranked second overall for playoff assists

2019-20 Season

- Appeared in 66 games, tallying 11 goals and 55 points (11-44—55), with a +27 rating
- Norris Trophy finalist (fourth straight year)
- Ranked third among NHL defensemen in scoring
- Ranked third on TBL and seventh in NHL for plus/minus (+27)
- Led TBL in average time on ice (24:04)
- NHL All-Star (third selection)
- Played in 25 Stanley Cup Playoff games, registering 10 goals and 12 assists (10-12—22), with a +13 rating
- Won the Conn Smythe Trophy as the NHL's playoff MVP
- Posted seven points in Stanley Cup Final

2018-19 Season

- Played in 70 games, recording 10 goals and 44 assists (10-44—54), with a +24 rating
- Became franchise leader in games played by a defenseman (January 10 vs. CAR)

- Led TBL defensemen for goals, assists, and points
- Norris Trophy finalist (third straight year)
- Played in two Stanley Cup Playoff games and posted 10 penalty minutes

2017-18 Season

- Played in 77 games, tallying 17 goals and 46 assists (17-46—63), with a +32 rating
- Ranked tied for first among NHL defensemen for goals and ranked fifth for points
- Became TBL's all-time leader in goals by a defenseman (February 8 vs. VAN)
- Selected to All-Star Game (did not play due to injury)
- Awarded the Norris Trophy as the NHL's best defenseman
- Played in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games, tallying a goal and 10 assists (1-10—11), including six power-play points
- Led TBL for average time on ice in the postseason (26:04)


2016-17 Season

- Appeared in 79 games for TBL, posting 16 goals and 56 assists (16-56—72)
- Ranked fourth in the NHL for assists (led all NHL defensemen)
- Ranked second in NHL for power-play points (33)
- Ranked tied for first in the NHL for three-assist games (5)
- Tallied 19 multi-point games, including five game-winning goals
- Norris Trophy finalist
- Selected to be an NHL All-Star for the first time in his career

2015-16 Season

- Played in 78 games, posting 10 goals and 37 assists (10-37—47) with a +21 rating
- Led TBL in time on ice (23:03), assists, plus/minus, and blocked shots (132)
- Appeared in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games, tallying 4 goals and 10 assists (14 points)
- Led TBL for average time on ice (27:26)
- Raked tied for third for team scoring and led all TBL defensemen
- Posted his first career multi-goal playoff game (Game 5 vs. NYI)

2014-15 Season

- Saw action in 59 games, and had 10 goals and 28 assists (10-28—38)
- Led TBL for time on ice (22:41) and blocked shots (110)
- Led TBL defensemen for goals and ranked second for points
- Missed 21 games due to injuries
- Skated in 26 Stanley Cup Playoff games, scoring one goal and tallying 13 assists (1-13—14)
- Ranked second among NHL skaters for postseason plus/minus (+11)
- Led TBL for average postseason time on ice (23:57) and blocked shots (47)

2013-14 Season

- Played in 75 games, logging 13 goals and 55 points
- Ranked fifth among NHL defensemen for scoring
- Had 15 multi-point games, good for the second-most among all NHL defensemen
- Played four Stanley Cup Playoff games, recording one goal and two assists

2012-13 Season

- Played in 44 games, tallying four goals and 20 points
- Ranked second among TBL defensemen in goals, assists, points and average time on ice (22:39)

2011-12 Season

- Appeared in 61 games, scoring five goals and adding 18 assists for 23 points

2009-10 Season

- Played 74 games in his first NHL season, scoring four goals and posting 20 points
- Ranked second among NHL rookies for blocked shots (97), third for penalty minutes (79)
- Scored first NHL goal on December 5 vs. NYI
- Tallied three assists over his first three NHL games
- Made his NHL debut on October 3 at ATL and recorded his first career point (assist)

2008-09 Season

- Played in 43 games with Modo of the Swedish Elite League, recording seven goals and 21 points with 52 penalty minutes
- Named Rookie of the Year in the SEL at the age of 18
- Led the team in plus/minus with a +21 and ranked second among Modo defensemen in goals, assists and points
- Also played in two games with Modo's U-20 team, recording two assists
- Played five playoff games with Modo Jr., recording an assist

2007-08 Season

- Played in 39 games with Modo, recording 2 goals and 4 points in his professional debut
- Played in 5 playoff games, recording a goal
- Played in 6 games with Modo U-20, recording two goals and three points
- Also played in three postseason games


