GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW [Asioita, jotka sinun pitäisi tietää]

- Tonight and tomorrow's games will mark the first time that the Dallas Stars are playing a regular-season game at a non-North American location.
 - When the team was located in Minnesota, they participated in several non-regular-season tournaments and showcases in Europe.
- Tonight and tomorrow's games against the Panthers are the second of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season and the only time in which both games will be played at a neutral site.
- The Stars have gone 27-for-29 on the penalty kill this season for a 93.1 percent success rate, which was tied with Nashville for the best mark in the league entering play Thursday.
- The Stars have allowed only 1.89 goals against per game this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday and made them the only team to allow fewer that two goals against per game this season.
- Stars head coach Pete DeBoer is one win away from tying Bryan Murray (620) for 20th on the all-time head coaching wins list.

FROM START TO FINNISH [alkaen aloittaa jotta Suomi]

- Forward Roope Hitz was named one of the Stars alternate captains this season. 2024-25 will mark the first time that Hitz and fellow Fins Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell are all a part of Dallas' leadership group.
 - Captain Jamie Benn and alternate captain Tyler Seguin round out the team's leadership group for this season.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are three of six Finnish players in the NHL this season to be a part of their team's leadership group, joining Florida captain Aleksander Barkov, Carolina alternate Sebastian Aho and Colorado alternate Mikko Rantanen.

- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are set to face off against Barkov the NHL's Global Series when the Stars will take on the Panthers in back-to-back games on Nov. 1 and 2 at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- All three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** rank in the top 15 in all-time scoring among active, Finnish skaters. At eighth, **Hintz** ranks the highest with 318 career points followed by **Heiskanen** (261, 10th) and **Lindell** (192, 13th).
- The trio are three of 31 Finnish players to appear in at least one regular-season game for the Stars franchise. **Hintz**, **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** rank second, third and fourth, respectively, in all-time franchise scoring among Finnish skaters, trailing only Jere Lehtinen.

GOING GLOBAL [kansainvälistyminen]

- Three Stars players have previously played in an NHL international regular-season game: Evgenii Dadonov, Matt Duchene and Tyler Seguin.
- **Duchene** has played in the Global Series twice: at the 2017 Global Series in Stockholm and at the 2022 Global Series in Prague.
 - While with the Ottawa Senators, Duchene faced his former team, the Colorado Avalanche, on Oct. 10 and 11, 2017. The games marked his first with the Senators, who won both matchups, after being traded from Colorado to Ottawa on Nov. 5, 2017.
 - o **Duchene** again played in the Global Series in 2022 when his Nashville Predators faced off against the San Jose Sharks in Prague. He scored a goal in the first game on Oct. 7 and added an assist on Oct. 8, with the Predators winning both contests.
- Seguin previously played in the 2010 NHL Premier Series when the Boston Bruins took on the Phoenix Coyotes (now the Utah Hockey Club) in Prague. He made his NHL debut on Oct. 10, 2010 the first game of the series and scored his first NHL goal the following day.
 - o The Bruins fell to the Coyotes 5-2 on Oct. 10 and defeated them 3-0 on Oct. 11.
- Evgenii Dadonov's Panthers took on the Jets on Nov. 1 and 2, 2018 at the 2018 Global Series in Helsinki. Florida and Winnipeg split the series, but Dadonov scored in both games and added an assist in the second contest.

SEEING STARS [tähtien näkeminen]

- Matt Duchene was named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending on Oct. 27 after totaling six points (3-3-6) in three games, a stretch that included a three-point performance (1-2-3) against Boston.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in seven of the nine games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (six) and points (11).
- His six goals this season were tied for 10th in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Duchene has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 4-1.

CATNIP [aitokissanminttu]

- Jamie Benn has 33 career points (16-17—33) in 30 career games against the Panthers.
- Evgenii Dadonov has four points (3-1—4) in his last four games against Florida.
- Matt Duchene has 14 points (6-8—14) in his last 14 games against the Panthers dating back to Nov. 19, 2018.
- Wyatt Johnston has recorded at least one point in each of the four career games he has played against Florida, totaling five points (1-4-5) in those contests.
- Mason Marchment has four points (1-3-4) in four career games against the Panthers.
- Jason Robertson has 14 points (9-5—14) in 14 career games against Florida.
- Tyler Seguin has 32 points (10-22—32) in 29 career games against the Panthers, which includes recording 10 multipoint efforts against Florida over the course of his career.

FLORIDA MAN [Florida mies]

- Evgenii Dadonov and Mason Marchment have both previously played for the Panthers.
- Dadonov was originally selected by Florida in the third round (71st overall) of the 2007 NHL Draft and went on to total 202 points (91-111—202) in 280 regular-season games for the team.
 - Dadonov had two different stints with Florida he first played for the Panthers from 2009-10 to 2011-12 and then again from 2017-18 to 2019-20.
- Marchment played for the Panthers from 2020-21 to 2021-22. In those two seasons, he recorded 57 points (20-37—57) in 87 regular-season games and added three goals in 10 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- Additionally, Stars head coach **Pete DeBoer** was the head coach of the Panthers for three seasons (2008-09 to 2010-11), amassing a 103-107-36 record behind the bench during his tenure with the team.
- Stars vice president of cultural growth and strategy Al Montoya also previously played for the Panthers, posting an 18-14-5 record in 45 regular-season games.

HOME COOKING [kotiruok]

• Although being played in Tampere, Finland, tonight's matchup against the Panthers is considered a home game for the Stars and thus will count towards home records.

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Florida with a perfect 5-0-0 record while playing at home this season. It marks the fourth time in franchise history that they have begun a season by winning five consecutive home games according to NHL Stats.
 - Entering play Thursday, Dallas and Vegas (7-0-0) were the only two teams to be undefeated at home this season.
- If Dallas were to win tonight, it would give them six consecutive home wins to begin a season for only the second time in franchise history, having previously done so in 1979-80.
- The Stars have allowed only five goals against in total in five games at home this year, which is the best mark in the NHL this season.
- Dallas has gone a perfect 13-for-13 on the penalty kill when playing at home this season. Entering play Thursday, the Stars were the only team to not allow a power-play goal against at home this year.

MR. 200 [Hra. 200]

- Jake Oettinger's next game will mark the 200th of his NHL career. He is set to become the eighth netminder in franchise history to play in at least 200 games for the team.
- Selected by Dallas with the 26th-overall pick in 2017, **Oettinger** is also expected to become the first goaltender from the 2017 draft class to play in 200 regular-season games.
- Dallas' last game on Oct. 26 was the 188th win of Oettinger's career. He became the ninth goaltender in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) with at least 118 wins prior to his 200th career game according to NHL Stats. Igor Shesterkin (125) is the only other active netminder on the list.
- Oettinger has posted a 5-1-0 record with a .938 save percentage and a 1.84 goals-against average in six games this season. Entering play Thursday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL this year in wins (tied third), save percentage (fourth) and goals-against average (fifth).
- Oettinger has saved 7.0 goals above expected this season according to MoneyPuck.com, which was the fourth-best
 mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. His 1.17 goals saved above expected per 60 this season also ranked seventh in
 the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Oettinger has won 24 games since Jan. 1, 2024 the most in the NHL during that span.

HOT TO GO [aitokissanminttu]

- Matt Duchene enters tonight' game riding a four-game point streak, recording multi-point efforts in three of those four games.
- Tyler Seguin has recorded at least a point in each of the last three games he has played, totaling five points (2-3—5) in those contests. He has a point in five of the six games he has played this year.
- Thomas Harley has recorded a point in each of Dallas' last three games, scoring his first goal of the season on Oct. 22 against Buffalo and then registering an assist on both Oct. 24 and 26 against Boston and Chicago, respectively.
- A goal or assist tonight would give Harley a point in four consecutive games for the third time in his career, matching
 his career high.

ROOKIE REPORT [aitokissanminttu]

- Logan Stankoven notched an assist in Dallas' last game vs. Chicago and now has nine points (1-8—9) through his first nine games played this season.
- Entering play Thursday, **Stankoven** was leading all rookies in assists this season and was tied with Philadelphia's Matvei Michkov for the scoring lead among first-year players.
- Entering play Thursday, **Stankoven** was the only rookie this season who has appeared in at least two games to be playing at a point-per-game pace.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, Stakoven became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to
 record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according
 to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a threepoint game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.

ROBO ON THE GO GO [Robo Liikkeellä ollessasi]

- Dallas' Oct. 24 matchup against the Bruins marked the 300th game of Jason Robertson's career.
- Robertson scored the 137th goal of his career in that game, a power-play goal 31 seconds into the second period. According to NHL Stats, Robertson's 137 career goals are the second most by a Stars/North Stars player through 300 career NHL games behind Dino Ciccarelli (158).

- The goal was also the 320th point of Robertson's career. Only five active skaters have totaled more points through their first 300 games than Robertson Sidney Crosby (407), Connor McDavid (394), Alex Ovechkin (384), Evgeni Malkin (371) and Krill Kaprizov (340).
- Robertson is 13 goals shy of becoming the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the club.

CASE BY CASE BASIS [tapauskohtaisesti ohi tapauskohtaisesti perusta]

- Casey DeSmith has a 2-1-0 record in three games with the Stars this season, posting a .936 save percentage, 1.69 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Entering play Thursday, DeSmith ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (third) and save percentage (fifth).
- Additionally, according to MoneyPuck.com, DeSmith has saved 4.5 goals above expected this season, which was tied
 with for the seventh-best mark in the NHL this year. His 1.52 goals saved above expected per 60 also ranked third in the
 NHL entering play Thursday according to MoneyPuck.com.
- **DeSmith** became the third goaltender in Stars history to record a shutout in his debut with the team when he made 25 saves in Dallas' 2-O win over the Seattle Kraken on Oct. 13.

BENN THERE DONE THAT [Benn perusta valmis että]

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 306 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that Benn had played in, making him
 the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- Benn's current 306-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 16 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,121), goals (385), assists (526) and points (911). His 911 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS [yksi historiankirjoihin]

- Esa Lindell has several franchise milestones withing reach:
 - He is eight points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defensemen in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars. He is also just three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for the 10th-most goals among defensemen in franchise history.
 - Lindell is three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
 - He is also just four games shy of tying Tom Reid for 10th all-time among franchise defensemen in games played.
- Tyler Seguin is four assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows
 for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
 history.
- Miro Heiskanen is eight assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list.
