WINNIPEG JETS

All-Time Wild Record: 29-22-5 (17-9-3 at Xcel Energy Center, 12-13-2 at Winnipeg)

2023-24: Minnesota went 0-4-0 in the season series vs. Winnipeg...The Jets earned a 4-2 win at Canada Life Centre (12/30), a 3-2 victory at Xcel Energy Center the following day (12/31), a 6-3 win in Winnipeg in the third game (2/20) and a 4-2 win in Saint Paul in the series finale (4/6)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** led the Wild with five points (3-2=5) in three games...C **Freddy Gaudreau** posted four points (1-3=4)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** tallied three assists (0-3=3) in two games...G **Filip Gustavsson** started the first game and saved 19-of-22 shots before exiting with an injury after the second period...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** went 0-3-0 with a 4.04 GAA and a .860 SV% in four games (three starts)...C **Vladislav Namestnikov** led the Jets with five points (2-3=5)...LW **Kyle Connor** (2-2=4), D **Dylan DeMelo**, C **Adam Lowry** (3-1=4) and RW **Nino Niederreiter** (3-1=4) eached tallied four points...G **Connor Hellebuyck** started the first game and fourth games and posted a 2.00 GAA and a .937 SV%...G Laurent Brossoit started the second and third games and had a 2.51 GAA and a .923 SV%.

WILD LEADERS: LW **Marcus Johansson** leads the Wild with 25 points (5-20=25) in 36 games vs. Winnipeg...Zuccarello owns 24 points (11-13=22) in 27 games...LW **Marcus Foligno** has 21 points (11-10=21) in 32 games...Kaprizov owns 19 points (6-13=19) in 11 matches.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 23-14-0 with a 2.71 GAA, a .906 SV% and one shutout in 38 career games (36 starts) against the Jets...Gustavsson is 4-1-0 with a 1.71 GAA and a .943 SV% in five starts...G Jesper Wallstedt has not faced Winnings

JETS LEADERS: C **Mark Scheifele** leads Winnipeg with 31 points (13-18=31) in 41 games against Minnesota...Connor owns 23 points (9-14=23) in 23 games...D **Josh Morrisey** owns 15 points (2-13=15) in 27 games...LW **Nikolaj Ehlers** (7-6=13 in 29 games) and Lowry (5-8=13 in 35 games) each have 13 points.

JETS GOALIES: Hellebuyck is 12-10-2 with a 2.71 GAA, a .914 SV% and three shutouts in 27 games (26 starts) vs. the Wild...G **Eric Comrie** is 0-1-0 with a 4.95 GAA and a .846 SV% in two games (one start) vs. the Wild.

CONNECTIONS: Wild D **Zach Bogosian** tallied 127 points (40-87=127 in 393 games in parts of seven seasons (2008-15) with the Atlanta Thrashers and Winnipeg Jets...Wild D **Declan Chisholm** was selected by Winnipeg in the fifth round (50th overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft and appeared in four career games for the Jets (2021-24), tallying an assist...Niederreiter collected 228 points (110-118=228) in 434 games in parts of six seasons with the Wild...D **Dylan Samberg** is from Saginaw and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota Duluth (2017-20)...D **Neal Pionk** was raised in Hermantown and played two seasons (2015-17) at the University of Minnesota Duluth.

FAST FACTS: The Wild is 10-5-0 in the last 15 contests at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota's sweep of the Jets in 2018-19 (5-0-0) marked the third time in franchise history Minnesota swept a season series of more than four games: 5-0-0 vs. Chicago (2015-16) and 6-0-0 vs. Edmonton (2010-11)...The Wild fell, 4-1, in its first-ever postseason meeting against the Jets in the 2018 First Round.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Matt Boldy: Has opened the season with consecutive multi-point games from 10/10 - 10/12, leading the team with five points (2-3=5)...Notched three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), his 12th career three-point game, to become the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in a season opener.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Played in his 500th career game vs. SEA (10/12).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Has appeared in 98 career games for Minnesota, needs two game appearances to reach 100 in a Wild sweater...Currently at 1,026 career games played, needs three game appearances to tie Patrick Roy (1,029 career games) for third-most all time.

Marcus Foligno: Played in his 800th career game vs. SEA (10/12).

Filip Gustavsson: Saved 31-of-33 shots faced in a 3-2 win vs. CBJ, pushing his all-time record in season openers to 2-0-0. His 1.00 GAA and .973 SV% in those games ranks first in franchise history among goalies with two-plus season-opening starts.

Kirill Kaprizov: Notched a three-point performance (1-2=3) vs. SEA (10/12), his 33rd career three-point performance...With an assist vs. CBJ (10/10), has now registered a point in five consecutive season-opening games (2020-24).

Marco Rossi: Recorded his eighth career multi-point game with two points (0-2=2) vs. SEA (10/12).

Jared Spurgeon: Has now appeared in 15 seasons (2010-25) since debuting in 2010, tying Mikko Koivu (15 seasons, 2005-20) for most seasons played in franchise history...Currently owns 19,313:38 of career TOI, needing 405:31 to pass Koivu (19,718:08 min) for most TOI in team history.

Yakov Trenin: Skated in his 300th career game vs. CBJ (10/10).

Mats Zuccarello: Scored his 200th career goal vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.

PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov led Minnesota in points (46-50=96) and goals and was second in assists last season.
- Ranked T-3rd in the NHL with 19 PPG, fifth with 41 PPP (19-22=41),
 T-8th in goals, T-11th with eight GWG and 11th in points.
- Currently with 58 career PPGs, needs one more to tie Marian Gaborik (59 PPGs with MIN) for third-most in franchise history.
- With an assist at LAK (4/15), became the second player in franchise history with multiple 50-assist seasons (also 2021-22).
- With a three-point game (2-1=3) at San Jose (4/13), reached 10 multigoal games for the season, tying Gaborik (2007-08) for the single-season franchise record, and 11 three-point games on the season, breaking his own franchise record set in 2021-22. Also surpassed his own franchise record for single-season PPGs against San Jose (4/13), netting his 18th of the season to beat the mark he set in 2022-23.
- With two goals and an assist at CHI (4/7), recorded his 10th three-point game of the season, matching his own franchise record (also 2021-22 season), and moved his career point total to 322 (154-168=322) to pass Brunette (119-202=321) for seventh place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Notched his 22nd career GWG at CHI (4/7), tying Jason Zucker for fifthmost in franchise history.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals.
- Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons (2021-24).
- With a two-point game (0-2=2) vs. SJS (3/28), became the first player in franchise history with multiple 80-point seasons.
- Scored his 150th career goal in his 265th career NHL game at ANA (3/19/24) to became the fourth-fastest active NHL skater to reach the mark, trailing only Auston Matthews (223 GP), Alex Ovechkin (234 GP) and Steven Stamkos (245 GP).
- With two goals and an assist vs. ARI (3/12/24), recorded his 25th career multi-goal game, tying Zach Parise for second-most in franchise history. Also posted the 29th three-point game of his career vs. ARI (3/12), tying Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.
- Reached 300 career points (143-157=300) vs. SJS (3/3/24) in his 258th career game, becoming the fastest player in franchise history and the fifth fastest active NHL player to reach the milestone (Crosby, 219; Ovechkin, 237; McDavid, 240; Malkin, 240).
- Kaprizov recorded the 28th three-point game of his career vs. SJS (3/3, 3-0=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 2/26/24 after posting six goals and 12 points in four contests (6-6—12), marking his third First Star honor of the season. Became the first player in franchise history to earn NHL First Star of the Week honors three times in a single season (also 12/24/23 and 1/21/24).
- Kaprizov has been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- With three points (2-1=3) at SEA (2/24), recorded his 80th career multi-point game to move past Zach Parise (79 MPG with MIN) for sole possession of third-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.
- With a 3-1=4 line in the third period vs. VAN (2/19/24), Kaprizov also tied the franchise records for single-period goals and single-period points
- Became the first player in franchise history to reach 50 points in four consecutive seasons with an assist at ARI (2/14/24).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

 Kaprizov posted season-long five-game goal streak (6-3=9) from 3/10/24 to 3/19/24, marking his fourth career goal streak of five-plus games. Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is one of three players in Wild history to record multiple five-game goal streaks (Gaborik, two times; Rolston, two times).

PLAYER NOTES

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** played in his 500th career NHL game vs. SEA (10/12).
- Opened the season with a goal (1-0=1) and five hits vs. CBJ (10/10), tied for the ninth-highest single-game hit total of his career.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPGs and a career-high 30 goals last season while ranking third in points (30-34=64).
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28/24).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9/24 to 2/24/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12/24 to 2/19/24.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19/24) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.
- Posted a career-best plus-4 rating at CAR (1/21/24).
- Recorded a career-high 25:30 in TOI at CBJ (1/6/24).
- Eriksson Ek tied his career high with eight shots on goal at WPG (12/30/23) and vs. VAN (12/16/23).
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10/23), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy leads the team with five points (2-3=5) after opening the season with consecutive multi-point performances (10/10 - 10/12).
- Opened the 2024-25 season with three points (1-2=3) vs. CBJ (10/10), marking his 12th career three-point game and becoming the sixth player in franchise history with three-plus points in the season opener.
- Finished T-15th in the NHL with seven GWG in 2023-24.
- Finished 2023-24 second on the Wild with 69 points (29-40=69), reaching a new single-season career high with an assist at VGK (4/12).
- Scored the overtime winner vs. NSH (3/10/24) to record his 11th career three-point outing, moving within three of tying Marian Gaborik (14) for the most by a Wild skater before age 23.
- With two assists vs. SJS (3/3/24), moved to 151 career points (69-82=151) and became the 26th player to reach the 150-point mark with the Wild
- Boldy notched his 11th career multi-goal game with a 2-0=2 line at EDM (2/23/24). According to NHL Stats, is one of two Wild players with as many such performances before turning 23 is Marian Gaborik (14 times).
- Tied a career-high with four points (1-3=4) vs. VAN (2/19/24).
- Recorded three consecutive multi-point games from 2/9-2/14, a career-long.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6/23). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- Brock Faber led all NHL rookies with 24:58 TOI per game and 150 blocked shots, is T-1st with 39 assists and third with 46 points (8-39=47). Faber finished sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.

- Mats Zuccarello reached 200 career goals by scoring vs. SEA (10/12), becoming the first Norwegian-born player to reach the mark.
- He finished first on the Wild with 51 assists last season.
- With two assists at COL (4/9/24), reached the 50-assist mark for the second season in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).
- Needs three assists to tie Zach Parise (201 assists with MIN) for eighth-most in franchise history

- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15/24), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31/23).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31/23), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9/23) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made a season-high 40 saves in a 4-3 OT win at BOS (12/19/23), his 40th career game with 40-plus saves (T-11th most in NHL history).
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19/23), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
