- The Stars victory was their 26th win at the American Airlines Center this year, tying their total from last season. The team is now three home wins shy of tying the franchise record (29) that they set in 1998-99.
- Dallas has now played four consecutive overtime games for the first time since Jan. 26 to Feb. 6, 2023. Saturday's game was the team's seventh overtime win of the season, which is tied for the fifth-most in the NHL this year.
- Colin Blackwell recorded his 10th assist of the season on Thomas Harley's first goal of the afternoon, which tied his
 career high that he has reached on two previous occasions.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games the Stars will play against the Wild this season and the second time they are playing in Dallas this year. The teams will face off next on April 6 in Minnesota. The season series is currently split between the two teams:
 - o Dallas defeated Minnesota with a 2-1 win on Nov. 11.
 - o The Stars fell short to the Wild in a 3-2 overtime loss on Dec. 27.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 44-21-4 record for 92 points and a .667 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 43 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Sunday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (489).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Sam Steel a three-game point streak for the first time since Jan. 10 to 14, 2023.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.36, fourth) and in goals against per game (2.61, fifth).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 34 of the 69 games that they have played this year.

WILD THINGS

- Dallas is 53-28-11 all-time vs. Minnesota, including a 32-8-7 mark at home.
- Jamie Benn has 12 points (6-6-12) in his last 13 games against the Wild since the start of the 2021-22 season. In all, Benn has 49 points (20-29-49) in 57 career regular-season games against Minnesota, which is the fifth-highest total of any active player.
- Matt Duchene has 14 points (5-9-14) in his last 11 games against Minnesota dating back to Oct. 24, 2021. Additionally, he has posted six multi-point efforts in his last 11 games against the Wild.
- Roope Hintz has 19 points (9-10-19) in 21 career games against the Wild. 16 of those points (5-11-16) have come in 13 games since the start of the 2021-22 season, which is tied for the 10th-most in the NHL during that span.
- Wyatt Johnston has nine points (4-5-9) in nine career games against the Wild, including tallying a multi-point outing in Dallas' last game against Minnesota on Dec. 27 (1-1-2).
- Mason Marchment has 11 points (6-5—11) in 10 career games against Minnesota.
- Jake Oettinger a native of Lakeville, Minnesota has a 6-0-2 career record against the Wild, posting a .911 save percentage and 2.37 goals-against average in those games.
- Casey DeSmith has a 5-1-1 career record in seven career games against the Wild, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Jason Robertson has 17 points (10-7—17) in 13 career games against the Wild.
 - Robertson's 17 points against Minnesota since the start of the 2021-22 season are tied for the eighth-most in
 - His 1.31 points per game against the Wild is the fourth-best mark of any active NHL skater that has played Minnesota at least five times in their career, trailing only Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev (1.60), Washington's Alex Ovechkin (1.58) and Pittsburgh's Sidney Crosby (1.54).
- Mikko Rantanen has recorded 39 points (16-23-39) in 37 career games vs. Minnesota. His 39 points against the Wild rank third among Stars skaters and 12th in the league.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- Each of the Stars last four games have gone beyond regulation, with the Stars coming from behind in three of those four games to force overtime. It marks the first time since Jan. 23 to Feb. 6, 2023 that the Stars have played four overtime games.
- If tonight's game requires extra time, it will mark the first time in franchise history that the Stars have played five consecutive overtime games.
- In all this season, the Stars have a 7-2 record in games that have ended in overtime, which was tied for the fifth-most overtime wins in the NHL this season entering play Sunday. Their .778 win percentage in games that end in overtime was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Sunday, trailing only the Colorado Avalanche, who have gone 5-1 (0.833).
- Dallas' overtime game-winning goals have been scored by six different skaters: Thomas Harley on Jan. 4 vs. Utah and again on March 22 vs. Philadelphia, Matt Duchene on Dec. 14 vs. St. Louis, Jamie Benn on Jan. 7 vs. NY Rangers, Jason Robertson on March 6 vs. Calgary and Mikael Granlund on March 18 vs. Anaheim.
- Entering play Sunday, Dallas, Edmonton (7) and Winnipeg (7) were the only NHL teams to have at least six different skaters score an overtime goal this season.
- Additionally, Robertson has scored three shootout goals this season, which was tied for the most in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
- Harley's overtime goal in Dallas' last game came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fourth in the NHL.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley scored twice in Dallas' last game and now has 21 points (8-13-21) in his last 19 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fourth on Dallas' roster during that span.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyer brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 - 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 - 1972-73).
- His 15 goals this year are tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise history.
- Harley's 21 points since Jan. 31 were the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (25).
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:35 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
 - Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
 - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.

- In all, Harley has totaled 44 points (15-29-44) in 67 regular-season games this season, which puts him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 18 goals, 35 assists and 53 points.
 - His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Sunday.
- Harley enters tonight's game three points shy of totaling 100 career points. He will become the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram.
- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
 - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars have a 26-7-2 record at home this season. Entering play Sunday, they ranked in the top five in the NHL in home wins (tied second), points (tied third) and points percentage (.771, fourth).
- Dallas' 26 home wins this season match their total from all of 2023-24. They are three home wins shy of matching the franchise record of 29 set by the team in 1998-99.
- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 10 games that they have played at home dating back to Jan. 24 against Vegas. With a win or overtime loss tonight, the Stars would extend their home point streak to 11 games for the first time since they had a point in 13 consecutive home games from Oct. 30 to Dec. 23, 2010.
- Since Jan. 24, the Stars have gone 12-for-30 on the power play at the American Airlines Center. Their 40 percent success rate on the power play at home was the third-best mark in the NHL during that span, and their 12 home power-play goals were tied for second entering play Sunday.
- Jason Robertson (39 points, 35 games played) and Roope Hintz (36 points 33 games played) are both playing at a point-per-game pace at home this year.
 - Robertson's 39 home points this year are the most of any Stars skater this season.
- Hintz has scored 18 goals at the American Airlines Center this season, which was tied for the 13th-most home goals in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Thomas Harley has recorded 18 points (6-12-18) in his last 16 home games dating back to Dec. 31. His 18 home points during that span ranked third among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.
 - Thirteen of those 18 points have come in the eight home games that he has played since Feb. 2
 - He has 26 home points (8-18—26) in all this season, which was tied for ninth-most in among NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.
- Matt Duchene has tallied 16 points (3-13—16) in his last 15 home games and enters today's game riding a four-game home point streak.
- Jake Oettinger has won the last seven games that he has played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan. 24, posting a .910 save percentage and a 2.53 goals-against average in those games.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-1-1 record at home this year, which includes earning at least a point in his last four starts at the American Airlines Center.

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward Mikko Rantanen from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, Rantanen signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.
- Rantanen, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- Rantanen scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are Marchment (2-0-2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1-2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2-2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1-2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- Rantanen's goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- Rantanen scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and Marchement in 2022-23.
- Rantanen tallied the 400th assist of his career in Dallas' game on March 16 against Colorado. He became the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.
- Rantanen also become the 10th Finnish player in NHL history to record 400 career assists. He required the third-fewest games (636) to reach the mark behind Jari Kurri (523 GP) and Teemu Selanne (603 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- Rantanen's next goal will be his 30th of the season, which will make him the third Finnish player in NHL history to record five straight 30-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Jari Kurri (10 from 1980-81 - 1989-90) and Teemu Selanne (6 from 1995-96 - 2000-01).

- Rantanen has totaled 691 points (291-400-691) in 639 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (691) and 10th in assists (400).
 - Rantanen is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining Mikael Granlund, Miro Heiskanen, Roope Hintz and Esa Lindell.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

With 12 games remaining in the 2024-25 regular-season, several Stars players are withing striking distance of setting or matching various career highs.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 28-for-87 on the power play for a 32.2 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday.
- The team's 28 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Sunday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (32) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston has scored seven power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the tird-most in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday, trailing only Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (8) and New Jersey's Nico Hischier (8).
 - In all this season, Johnston has scored a career-high nine power-play goals, which is six more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has played in 18 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outshot their opponents 118-109 and have 114 scoring chances to their 103 when Bichsel has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His 52.0 shots for percentage ranks second among all Stars skaters during that span.
- Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in 15 of the 18 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 17.7 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked fifth among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Sunday.
- Despite only playing in 26 games this season, Bichsel leads all Stars skaters with 114 hits. His 114 hits ranked fifth among all NHL rookies this season entering play Sunday.
 - o He is the only player rookie to record 100 hits this season to have played in fewer than 30 games this year.
- There have been 11 instances of a Stars skater recording at least six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning 10 of them.
- Bichsel is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game 10 times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Sunday.
- Bichsel is the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in a game 10 times in a single season since Jani Hakanpää did so in 2021-22.

If he were to have at least six hits in one more game this season, he would become the first Stars skater to have at least six hits in 11 games since Mark Fistric (16) did so in 2011-12.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 30-13-4 record in 46 games for 64 points and a 0.681 points percentage. The team's win total during that span was tied for the most the NHL entering play Sunday and their point total and points percentage were tied for second and third, respectively.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 24.4 percent and 86.3 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

IT TAKES TWO

- Jake Oettinger has an 16-6-2 record in his last 24 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .905 save percentage and a 2.65 goals-against average during that span.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has posted a 6-0-1 record in his last seven games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .934 save percentage and a 1.98 goals-against average in those contests.
 - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith was tied for third and ranked seventh, respectively, in save percentage and goals-against average.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .905 save percentage this season, which was tied for the fourthbest mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Sunday. The duo's 2.59 goals-against average this season was also tied for fourth in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.

KILLING IT

The Stars have had an 84.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.

- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 28, and their -22 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 30th in the league in total penalty minutes (454) and 29th in penalty minutes per game (6:34) entering play Sunday.
- Entering play Sunday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (243:36) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:24) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley and Sam Steel
 both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Sunday.
 - Harley, who has played 108:49 of shorthanded ice time, ranked seventh with 3.86.
 - Steel ranked 10th with 4.33. He has totaled 124:47 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:52 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (366), Jason Robertson (279), Esa Lindell (239) and Wyatt Johnston (233). Entering play Sunday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 22 against the Flyers was the 364th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the
 fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 279-game Iron Man streak is the 10th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
 only teams to have two players ranked in the top 10 entering play Sunday.
