- The Stars defeated the Lightning 4-2 in Tampa Bay, giving Dallas victories in three consecutive road games for the first time this season.
- With Saturday's win, the Stars earned their 2,000th regular-season win and became the tenth team to have as many
  victories.
- · Nine different skaters recorded a point during the game, while Matt Duchene had a multi-point effort.
- Matt Duchene registered a multi-point night (1-1—2). His 25th multi-point game with Dallas which passes Jason Robertson for the most since joining the club last season.
- Miro Heiskanen scored his 56th career goal, sitting one back from tying Joni Pitkanen for the seventh most by a Finnish defenseman, according to NHL Stats.
- Roope Hintz scored his 39th power-play goal since he joined the League. Only two Stars players have more over that span: Joe Pavelski (55) and Jamie Benn (55), according to NHL Stats.

## **GAME NOTES**

## THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Hurricanes this season and the only time that the teams will play in North Carolina this year. They will next face off on Jan. 21, 2025 in Dallas.
- Entering play Sunday, the Stars ranked fourth in the NHL in both wins (13, tied) and points percentage (.684) this season.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.32 goals against per game this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 12 of the 19 games that they have played this year.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 65-44 this season. Their plus-21 goal differential was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
- The Stars have gone 48-for-56 on the penalty kill this season. Their 85.7 success rate when playing a man down was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- If Evgenii Dadonov were to score tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time since he scored in four straight from March 17 to 26, 2022.
- Thomas Harley has recorded a plus-17 on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the third-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
  - This includes having a plus-11 on-ice goal differential over the course of Dallas' last six games dating back to Nov. 11, 2024. No player in the NHL had a better on-ice goal differential during that span entering play Sunday.

#### Y2K

- Dallas' 4-2 victory over the Lightning in their last game was their 2,000th win in franchise history, making the Stars the 10th franchise in NHL history to record at least 2,000 wins.
- The team's first 758 wins came while the team was known as the North Stars and located in Minnesota (1967-68 to 1992-93) and the next 1,242 wins came when the team was relocated to Dallas (1993-94 to 2024-25).
- Since entering the league in 1967-68, the Stars have the ninth-most wins in the NHL and the 16th-ranked points percentage (.524).
- Since relocating to Dallas, the Stars have posted a .590 points percentage, which is the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span. Their 1,242 wins during that span rank third in the NHL.

#### STORM CHASING

- Dallas is 53-34-10 all-time vs. Carolina, including a 24-20-6 mark on the road.
- Captain Jamie Benn leads active Stars in goals (16), assists (18) and points (16-18—34) in a team-high 32 career games vs. Carolina. He also leads the club in game-winning goals (3) and is the lone player with a shorthanded goal (2) against the Hurricanes.
- Matt Duchene has six points (3-3-6) in his last six games against the Hurricanes dating back to May 10, 2021.
- Miro Heiskanen has five assists in his last five games against Carolina.
- Roope Hintz has six goals in his last six games against the Hurricanes dating back to Nov. 30, 2021.
- Jake Oettinger has a 4-1-2 career record against Carolina, posting a .933 save percentage and 1.98 goals-against
  average in those games.
  - His 1.98 goals-against average and .933 save percentage rank third and fourth, respectively, among active goaltenders that have played the Hurricanes at least four times in their careers.
- Jason Robertson has 18 career points (5-13—18) against the Hurricanes and has recorded at least a point in 11 of the 12 career games he has played against Carolina.
  - Robertson's 18 points against Carolina since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied with Tampa Bay's Nikita Kucherov and Brayden Point for the most in the NHL.
  - o His 13 assists against the Hurricanes also top all NHL skaters from 2020-21 on.

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- The line of Roope Hintz, Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson have combined for three goals over Dallas' last two
  games, with Hintz scoring on Nov. 23 against the Lightning and Johnston and Robertson scoring against the Sharks
  on Nov. 20.
- When the trio has been on the ice in all situations in those two games, the Stars have outscored their opponents 4-1, outshot them 17-7 and have 15 scoring chances to their opponents' 7 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- If **Hintz**, **Johnston** or **Robertson** were to have a goal or an assist in tonight's game against the Hurricanes, it would give each player points in three or more consecutive games for the second time this season.

## **ROAD WARRIORS**

- A win tonight would give the Stars victories in four consecutive road games for the first time this season.
- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer when playing on the road this year, totaling 12 points (4-8—12) in nine games.
- Tyler Seguin has recorded a point in six of the seven road games that he has played this season, totaling eight points (3-5—8) in all. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive road games for the first time since he had a point in five consecutive road games from Oct. 25 to Nov. 18, 2021.
- Sam Steel has recorded an assist in each of Dallas' last two road games. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive road games for the first time since Dec. 6 to 16, 2023.
- Ilya Lyubushkin has three assists in Dallas' last two road games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in three consecutive road games for the first time since Dec. 31, 2022 to Jan. 14, 2023 when he had an assist in four consecutive road games while playing for the Buffalo Sabres.

#### **DOUBLE DUTCH**

- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game having totaled 23 points (11-12—23) in 19 games this season, which includes recording eight multi-point efforts this year.
- Entering play Sunday, Duchene ranked in the top 10 among Canadian skaters this season in goals (tied fourth) and points (ninth).
- With 23 points in 19 games, **Duchene** has already reached 35.4 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40—65) despite only being 23.2 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in 13 of the 19 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (11), assists (12, tied) and points (23).
- When Duchene has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 16-8
  according to Natural Stat Trick.

 He is currently pacing to finish the year with 47 goals, 52 assists and 99 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

#### **IDES OF MARCH**

- Mason Marchment was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending in Nov. 17 after totaling nine points (4-5—9) in three games, the most of any player during that span.
  - o It marked the second time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after being named the Third Star of the Week on Feb. 6, 2022 after totaling six points (2-4—6) in two games while playing for the Florida Panthers.
  - o It is also the second time this season that a Stars player has earned Star of the Week honors after Matt Duchene was named the league's Third Star of the Week for the week ending in Oct. 27.
- Marchment has totaled 10 points (4-6—10) over the Stars' last six games dating back to Nov. 11. His 10 points during that span were tied for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The 2024-25 season marks the first time in his career that Marchment has played at a point-per-game pace or better through his first 18 games played of a season.
- His 18 points are already 34.0 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31-53) that he reached last season in 81 games.
   Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 27 goals, 54 assists and 81 points, all of which would be career highs.
- Marchment has a plus-13 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which ranked fourth among all NHL forwards entering play Sunday.
- Marchment recorded in assist in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks. The helper marked the 100th assist of his NHL career and made him the 18th undrafted, active skater to reach the 100-assist milestone.
- Marchment recorded five points (1-4—5) in Dallas' 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game
  - o It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4—6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
  - Marchment joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- Marchment (1-4—5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following Wyatt Johnston (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.

#### **SLIDING INTO YOUR DMS**

- Matt Duchene, Mason Marchment and Tyler Seguin have combined for 24 goals this season, accounting for 36.9
  percent of Dallas' total offense this year.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when the trio is on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 10-5, outshooting them 87-67 and have 82 scoring chances to their opponents' 63.
- Additionally, according to MoneyPuck.com, the Duchene/Marchment/Seguin line has 60.4 expected goals for percentage this year, which ranks 11th among all NHL forward lines to play at least 100 minutes together this season.
- All three of **Duchene** (1.21), **Marchment** (1.00) and **Seguin** (1.07) are playing at a point-per-game pace this season, and the trio ranks first (**Duchene**), second (**Marchment**) and third (**Seguin**) in scoring on the Stars roster this season.

#### LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- Esa Lindell has recorded eight points (2-6—8) in 19 games this season and enters tonight's contest ranked second among Stars defensemen in scoring (Thomas Harley, nine points).
- Lindell enters tonight's game one point shy of totaling 200 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 13th defenseman from the 2012 NHL Draft class to total 200 points.
- He will also become the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
- Lindell is one goal away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
- Lindell is currently on pace to finish the year with 26 assists and 35 points, both of which would be career highs for the 10-year veteran.
- He is averaging 3:28 of shorthanded ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-highest mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.

#### **FACING OFF**

- **Jamie Benn** has gone 105-for-163 at the faceoff dot this season. His 64.4 percent success rate was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Sunday.
- Benn is one of five players this season to take at least 10 draws while only losing one or fewer and the only player to do so twice.
- Benn first went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot on Nov. 7 against the Chicago Blackhawks. It marked the first time in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.

- Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, Benn became just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.
- Benn then went 10-for-11 at the faceoff dot in Dallas' game on Nov. 18 against the Anaheim Ducks for a 90.9 percent success rate.

#### FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 57.9 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 11 of their 19 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 10 of the 11 games that they have scored first in. Their 10 wins when scoring first were tied
  for the best mark in the league this season entering play Sunday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .909 win percentage when scoring first this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.

#### **ROOKIE REPORT**

- Logan Stankoven has 15 points (4-11—15) through his first 19 games played this season and enters tonight's game ranked fourth on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Sunday, **Stankoven** ranked in the top 10 among NHL rookies this season in goals (tied third), assists (tied first) and points (second). His 12 even-strength points were the most of any first-year player this year.
- Three of Stankoven's goals this season have been game-winners, which is tied for the team lead and topped all NHL
  rookies entering play Friday. His three game winners were also tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Stankoven's goal against the Bruins in Dallas' game on Nov. 14 was his 14th point of the season. His 14 points are tied with Danny Grant (10-4—14 in 1968-69) for the third most through 15 games in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie behind only Neal Broten (10-7—17 in 1981-82) and Steve Christoff (8-7—15 in 1979-80) according to NHL Stats.
- Stankoven recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a
  franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The
  previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny
  O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).
- Stankoven (8-18—26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following Jason Robertson (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, Stakoven became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to
  record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according
  to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, Stankoven became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4—4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, Stankoven appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8—14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5—8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
  - His 10 assists and 15 points this season have already surpassed his totals from last year.
- Despite only playing in 42 regular-season games in his career, Stankoven already ranks 12th in career scoring among skaters selected in the 2021 NHL Draft. His 0.69 career points per game also top 2021 draftees who have appeared in at least two regular-season games.
  - o The 11 skaters ranked in front of him have all played in at least 90 career regular-season games.
- Stankoven is pacing to finish the year with 47 assists and 65 points. Forty-seven assists would be the third-most by a rookie in franchise history and 68 points would make him the highest scoring rookie since Elias Pettersson had 66 points (28-38—66) in 2018-19.

#### BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 316 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Nov. 23 matchup against the Lightning marked the 316th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, giving him sole possession of the second-longest Iron Man streak in franchise history and the longest ever by a Dallas skater.

- Benn's current 316-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 18 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.

• The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,131), goals (387), assists (530) and points (917). His 917 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history. He is also just two wins away from tying Don Beaupre (126) for seventh on the franchise's all-time wins list.
- Miro Heiskanen is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is seven points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is 12 points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is 12 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
