Seymour H. Knox III

Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer

Although he shuns the limelight, it was the quiet drive and determined effort by Seymour H. Knox III and his brother Norty that brought a National Hockey League franchise to Buffalo 14 years ago. For the hockey fans of Western New York and Southern Ontario, it was a blessing that the Knox brothers did not give up their fight for an NHL franchise after being rejected in 1966. Their efforts were rewarded in December, 1969 when the NHL announced expansion teams would be placed in Van-

couver and Buffalo.

Seymour served as the Sabres' Chairman and President during the organization's first 12 years of operation. He still remains extremely active as Chairman and as the Sabres' Governor on the NHL Board of Governors and as a member of its Advisory Committee.

Formerly a nationally-ranked squash racquets player and ex-president of the United States Squash Racquets Association, Seymour had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football injury. He is currently a vice president of Kidder, Peabody and Co., members of the New York Stock Exchange, a director of F.W. Woolworth Co. and Pratt & Lambert, Inc., and is a leader in a variety of community organizations.

He is Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the YMCA of Buffalo and Erie County; a member of the Board of Directors of the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, the Buffalo General Hospital and he was recently named Chairman of the National Board of Smithsonian Associates.

Seymour and his wife, Jean, reside in Buffalo. Jean is actively involved in the Sabres' community relations, which included the first three Sabres Super Carnivals.



Northrup R. Knox President

Like his brother Seymour, Northrup R. Knox prefers to work behind the scenes and away from the public attention in an effort to bring a Stanley Cup winner to Buffalo.

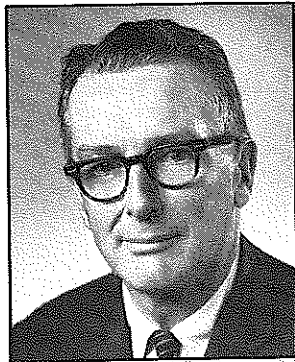
On May 23, 1982, the Sabres' Board of Directors elected Norty as president of the club. During the club's first 12 NHL seasons, he served as the organization's vice-chairman of the board as well as the Sabres' Alternate Governor on the NHL Board of Governors.

He remains one of the club's Alternate Governors on the NHL Board of Governors and also serves on the league's Public Relations Committee.

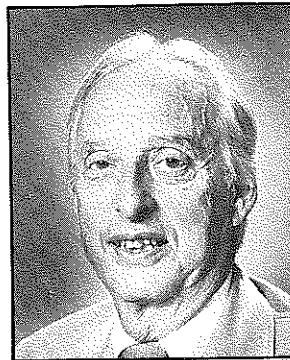
Norty was an undefeated world champion in court tennis for ten years, and captain of the U.S. Polo teams that played Argentina in 1966 and 1969. At one time, he was chairman of the U.S. Polo Association.

Currently, he is Chairman of the Board of Marine Midland Bank — Western Region, and a director of Marine Midland Banks Inc. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of the University of Buffalo Foundation, the Niagara Share Corporation, Midland Capital Corporation and the Albright-Knox Art Gallery.

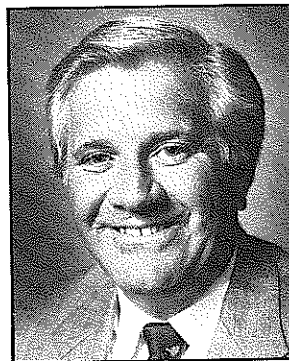

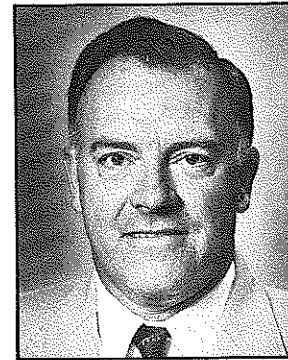

Scott Bowman

**Director of Hockey Operations,
General Manager and Coach**

Long recognized as one of the finest coaches in NHL history, William Scott Bowman is considered one of the top general managers in the game as well. Wearing several hats during the 1983-84 season with the Sabres, Bowman guided the Sabres to the fourth best overall record in the NHL. The team showed a 14-point improvement over 1982-83, making the Sabres the second most improved team in the NHL.

At the conclusion of the season, Bowman finished second in NHL Coach of the Year balloting and he was named The Hockey News Executive of the Year. The 51-year-old native of Montreal enters the 1984-85 season 10 wins away from equalling Dick Irvin's NHL all-time coaching record of 690 career wins. During the 1983-84 season, Bowman moved into second place on the NHL all-time list for games coached with 1147, behind Irvin's record 1437.

As the Sabres' Director of Hockey Operations and General Manager, Bowman's keen hockey sense has paid big dividends. When he selected Phil Housley with the sixth pick overall in 1982, eyebrows were raised. Housley had a tremendous rookie season and has established himself as one of the top offensive defensemen in hockey. Bowman then grabbed high school netminder Tom Barrasso with the fifth pick overall in 1983. Last season, Barrasso earned NHL Rookie of the Year honors as well as the Vezina Trophy and a spot on the NHL First All-Star Team.

Bowman's stockpiling of draft picks has left the Sabres with an abundance of top young talent. Adam Creighton and Normand Lacombe, both first round picks in 1983, may make an impact on the Sabres' performance in 1984-85 along with John Tucker, a second round pick in 1983, and defenseman Timo Jutila, a fourth rounder in 1982. Also considered future prospects are Jiri Dudacek, the Sabres' first round pick in 1981 from Czechoslovakia who was rated the top junior player in the world that year, and Bo Mikael Andersson, the team's first pick in 1984 from Sweden.

Previously, Bowman served as coach and general manager of St. Louis, guiding the Blues to three Stanley Cup appearances from 1967 to 1971. He coached the Montreal Canadiens to five Cup titles, including four straight (1976-79) from 1972 to 1979.

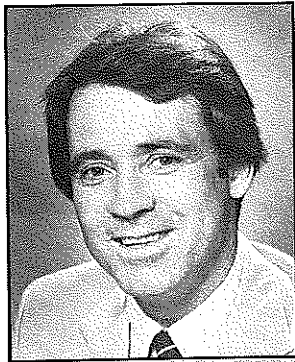
No fewer than 15 former players or coaches who have worked under Bowman have gone on to general manager or coaching positions in the NHL, including Glen Sather, of the 1984 Stanley Cup champion Edmonton Oilers, and Al Arbour, who guided the New York Islanders to four consecutive Cup titles from 1980 to 1983.

Bowman has also served as head coach of Team Canada in the 1981 Canada Cup tournament; he was chief coach of Team Canada, winner of the 1976 Canada Cup tournament and coach of the 1979 NHL All-Stars in the three-game series against the Soviet Union. In 1977, he was named NHL Coach of the Year.

Scott and his wife Suella, and children Alicia 14, David 12, Stanley 11, Bobby 8, and Nancy 8, reside in Williamsville.

Gerry Meehan

Assistant General Manager

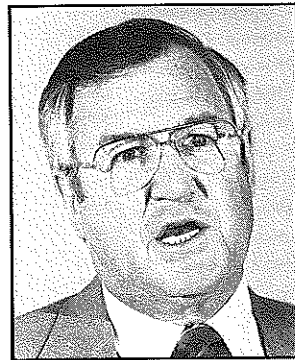
A center in the Sabres' first NHL game in 1970, Gerry Meehan became the franchise's second captain in 1971 and, this past off-season, became the first former Sabre to move into the Sabres' front office.

Meehan, 37, works directly under Sabres' Director of Hockey Operations and General Manager Scott Bowman and handles many of the hockey department's administrative duties.

Gerry spent 10 seasons in the NHL at the playing level. In addition to the Sabres, he played for Toronto, Philadelphia, Vancouver, Atlanta and Washington. In 670 NHL games, the former center scored 180 goals, added 243 assists and totaled 423 points. He joined the Sabres on June 10, 1970 and remained with the club until he was traded along with Mike Robitaille to Vancouver in exchange for Jocelyn Guevremont and Bryan McSheffrey on October 14, 1974.

Appointed team captain prior to the 1971-72 season, Gerry served in that capacity until he was traded. He scored 94 goals and totaled 208 points in 306 career games with the Sabres. Gerry is perhaps best remembered for scoring a dramatic goal with four seconds remaining in the final regular season game of 1972 against Philadelphia to knock the Flyers out of a playoff position.

After retiring from hockey in 1979, Gerry completed his undergraduate degree from Canisius College and went on to law school at the University of Buffalo. Upon graduation in 1982, he joined the law firm of Cohen Swados Wright Hanifin Bradford & Brett where he was involved with some of the Sabres' legal work.



Joe Crozier

Associate Coach

Joe Crozier, who led the Buffalo Sabres to their first-ever NHL playoff berth (1972-73), reached two coaching milestones during the 1983-84 season with the Sabres' top affiliate, the AHL Rochester Americans. He was named the Sabres' associate coach on September 17, 1984.

On March 21, 1984, he earned his 600th professional regular season coaching win. It was also his 1,200th professional game coached.

The 1983-84 season saw the Crozier-led Amerks post the best road record in club history, finish second in the Southern Division and advance to the Calder Cup Finals.

In six seasons at the helm in Rochester — he led the Americans to Calder Cup titles in 1964-65, 1965-66 and 1967-68 — Crozier has taken his team to the finals on four occasions. He is now the winningest coach in the franchise's history.

Prior to joining the Sabres' organization for the 1983-84 season, the 55-year-old Crozier coached the Kitchener Rangers to the Memorial Cup championship in 1981-82.

His work setting up and administering the Sabres' scouting system including computer operations built a vital element of the Sabres' success.

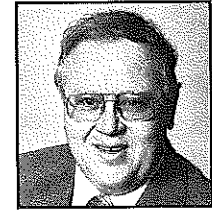
But Mike's real success was in bringing warmth and happiness to all those fortunate to share part of his life. For that, he'll most be missed.

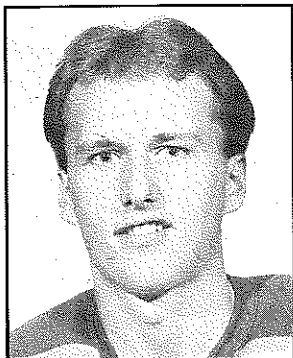
Dave established himself as one of the top young goal-scorers in the NHL during the 1983-84 season as he scored 38 goals, becoming just the sixth different player in the Sabres' 14-year history to lead the club in goals. His name is now on a list that includes top-notch goal-scorers such as Gil Perreault, Richard Martin and Danny Gare. The big center struggled through the first quarter of the 1983-84 season as he had just four goals and six assists in the Sabres' first 20 games. Over the final 60 games, though, he scored 34 goals and added 36 assists. Included in that stretch was an eight-game period in February (Feb. 8-23) in which he recorded eight consecutive multiple-point games on his way to 10 goals and nine assists. Dave scored two overtime goals within a nine-day period (Feb. 8 at Pittsburgh and Feb. 17 vs. Minnesota). Unlike many young players, Dave enjoyed more success on the road as he tallied 22 goals away from Memorial Auditorium and 16 in the Aud. At 6'3" and 200 pounds, Dave is perfectly suited to Memorial Auditorium's smaller ice surface where corner play is very important. Strong on his skates, Dave is an excellent puck-handler and possesses a quick release and a deadly wrist shot. Because of his size, Dave is often able to set up camp near the opponents' goal — especially on the power play — where he can capitalize on rebounds and screened shots. Single, Dave shares an apartment with defenseman Hannu Virta during the season.

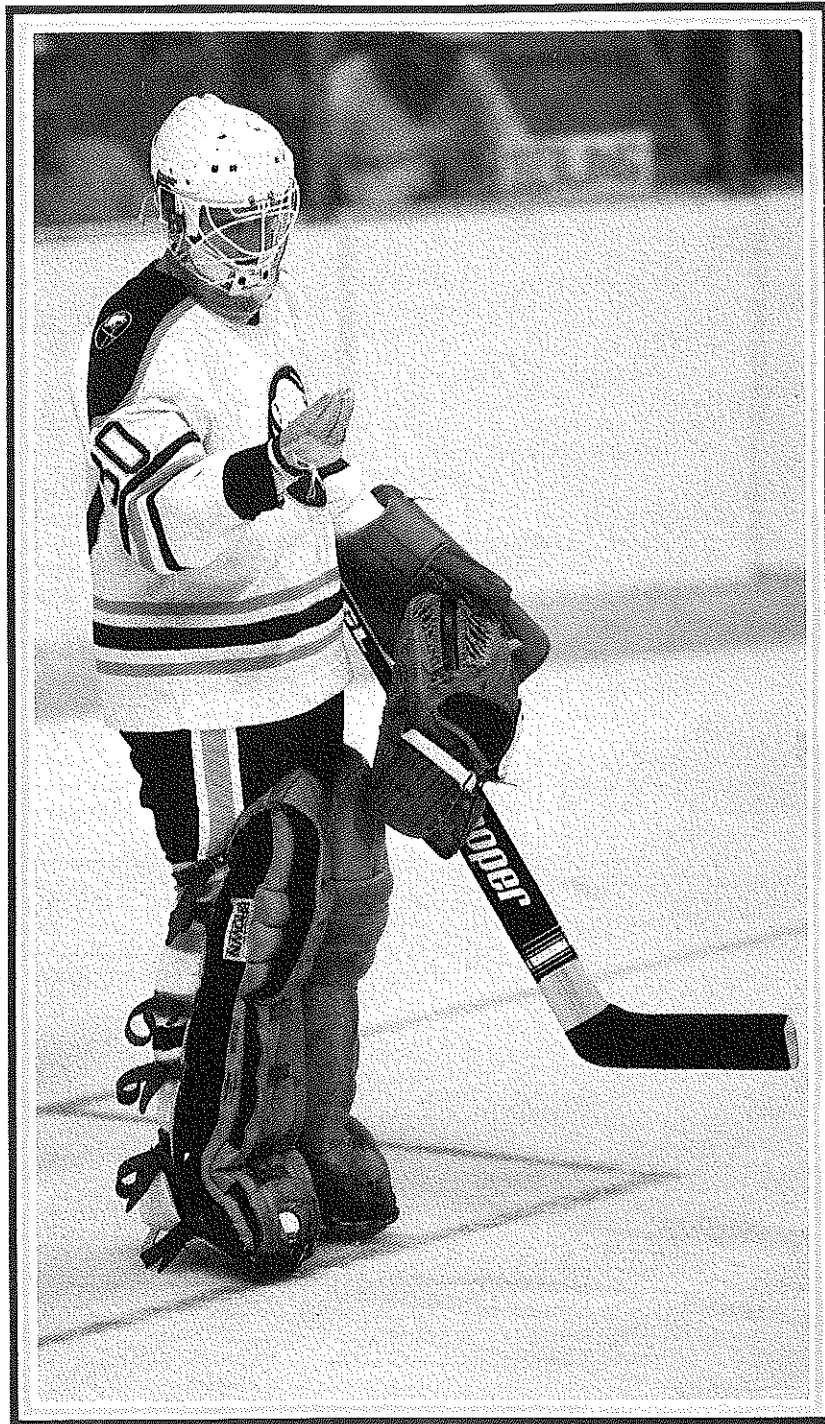

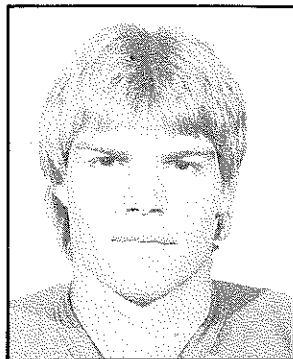
Even in his wildest dreams, Tom Barrasso couldn't have planned the rookie season he enjoyed in 1983-84 with the Buffalo Sabres. After deciding against participating in the 1984 Winter Olympics, Tom turned pro and came to the Sabres' training camp hoping to win a spot on the club's NHL roster. Following an impressive camp, the big net-minder was rewarded with the starting assignment in the 1983-84 regular season opener. He opened with a win, stopping 21 Hartford shots as the Sabres prevailed, 5-3. The Boston, Massachusetts native alternated in goal with Bob Sauve throughout the season and for Tom, it was a season filled with highlights — two shutouts, NHL Player of the Week honors in January, two NHL Rookie of the Month selections and two six-game unbeaten streaks (6-0-0 in November and 5-0-1 in January). But the best was still to come. During a five-day span in June, Tom was named the NHL's Rookie of the Year, Vezina Trophy winner, a member of the NHL First All-Star Team and a member of the NHL All-Rookie Team. He is just the third goaltender in the NHL's 67-year history to win the Calder and Vezina Trophies as well as being named to the first all-star team in the same season (Frank Brimsek in 1938-39 and Tony Esposito in 1969-70). He also became only the sixth player in NHL history to be named to the First All-Star Team in the same season as winning the Calder Trophy. Single, Tom owns a townhouse in the Buffalo area but returns to Stow, Mass. during the off-season.

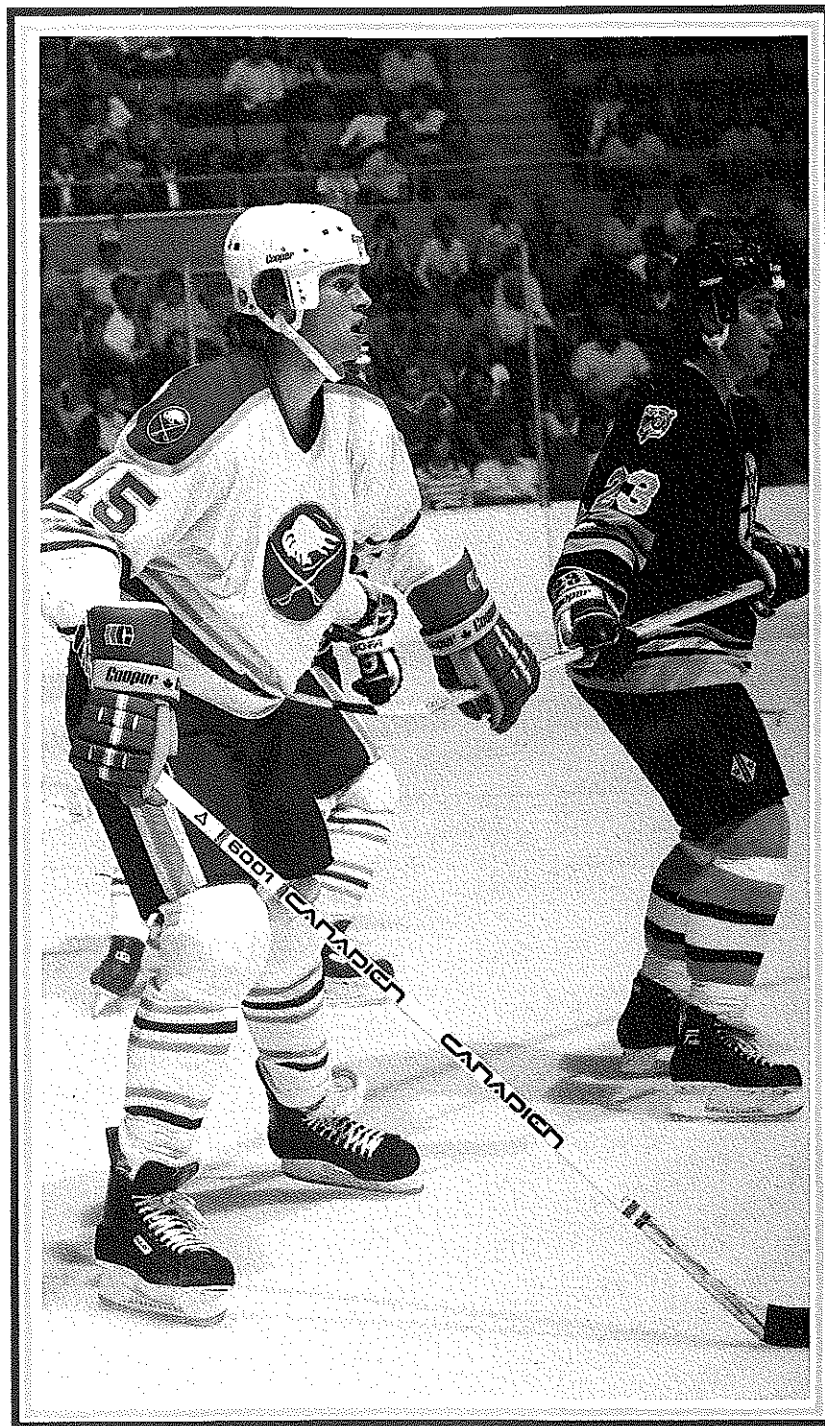

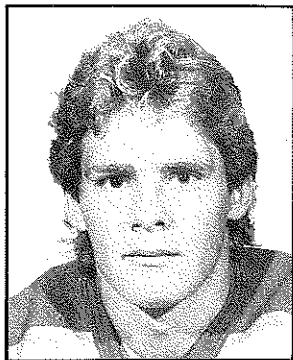

Barry Beck, Stan Smyl, Dale Hawerchuk, Sean McKenna and Adam Creighton all have one thing in common. They were named the most valuable player during the Memorial Cup Finals, with Creighton, the Sabres' third of three first round picks in 1983, winning the award in 1984 as he led the Ottawa 67s to the championship. During the Ontario Hockey League playoffs and the Memorial Cup Finals, the 6'5" Creighton was nothing short of awesome. He had 27 points (16-11=27) in 13 OHL playoff games and then registered 12 points (5-7=12) in the five Memorial Cup Final games. The 19-year-old center from nearby Welland, Ontario was impressive in his brief seven-game stint with the Sabres during the 1983-84 season. He set up the game winning goal in his first game (Dec. 17, 1983 vs. Hartford) and then scored the winning goal the following night (Dec. 18, 1983 vs. Vancouver). Adam was voted the OHL's best stickhandler in a coaches' poll last season. In addition to his size and stickhandling abilities, Adam has excellent moves around the net and plays aggressively.

Buffalo's third first round pick (11th overall) in the 1983 NHL Entry Draft ... 11th pick was acquired along with Real Cloutier from Quebec in exchange for Tony McKegney, Andre Savard, Jean Francois Sauve and the Sabres' third round pick in 1983 ... his father, Dave, played 10 seasons in the NHL with Boston, Chicago, Toronto and the New York Rangers and also for the AHL Buffalo Bisons ... recalled by Sabres Nov. 7, 1983 and returned to Ottawa Nov. 15 ... recalled again Dec. 16 and returned Jan. 4, 1984 ... scored his first NHL goal Dec. 18, 1983 vs. Vancouver ... had 42-49=91 in 56 regular season games with Ottawa last year ... Ottawa's opponent in the 1984 Memorial Cup Finals was John Tucker and the Kitchener Rangers.

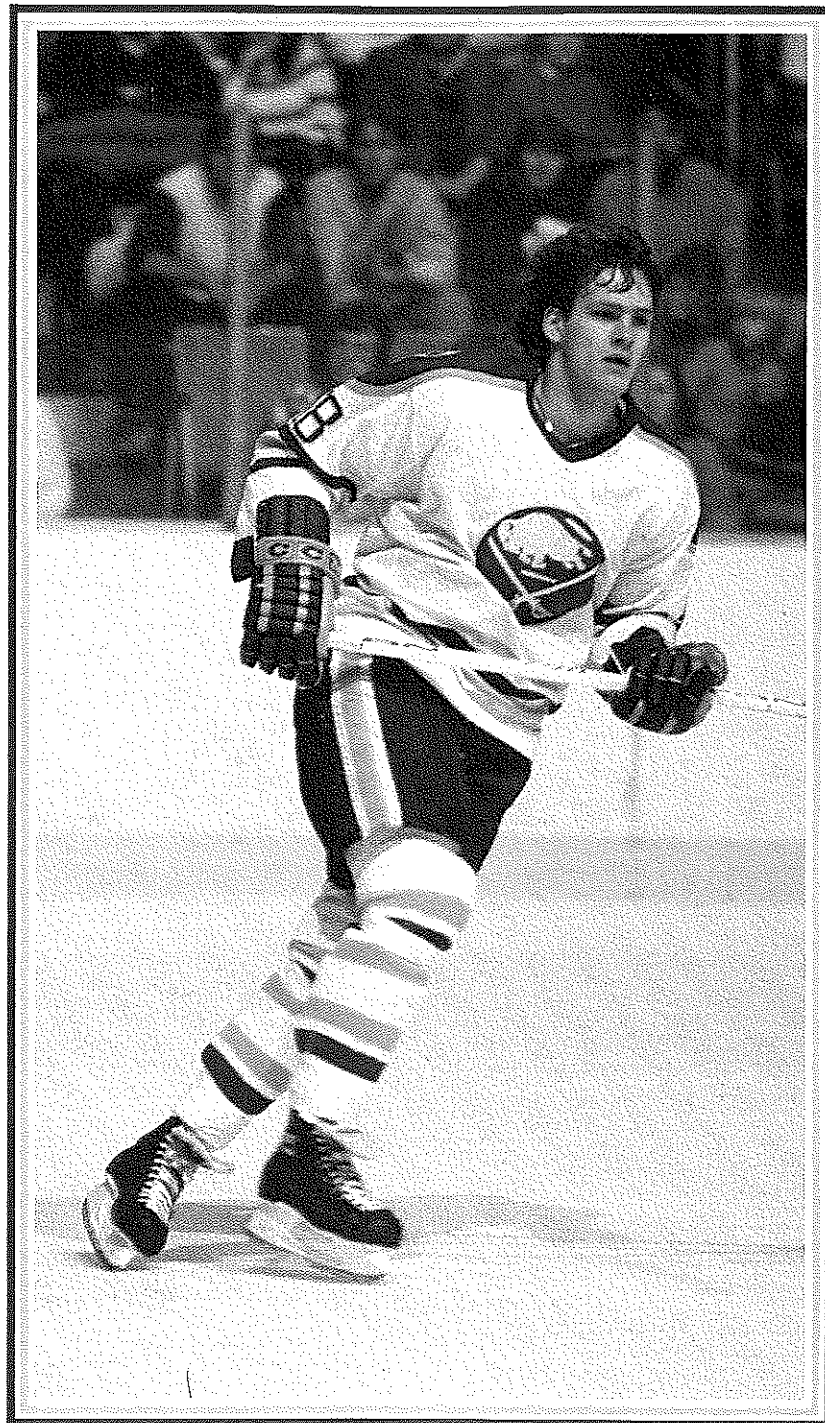

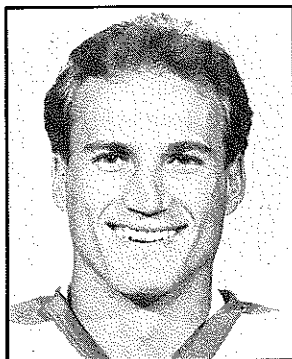
Paul Cyr's all-around abilities were perhaps best illustrated during the 1983-84 pre-season when he was the Sabres' leading scorer and, arguably, their best player. A hard-shooting left winger, Paul has the abilities to be a game-breaker. One need look no further than March 3, 1983 when Paul blasted three shots past Pete Peeters within 4:27 to give the Sabres a come-from-behind 3-2 win in Boston, the team's first win in Boston since 1979. Paul's streak scoring abilities were prevalent again from November 29 to December 7 last season when he had nine points (3-6=9) during a five-game stretch. Overall, the 1983-84 year was filled with bad luck, great saves and posts — all of which limited Paul to 16 goals. Paul's booming slap shot was also put to use on the Sabres' power play unit during the second half of the season and Paul ended up with five power play goals, including one late in a game on March 4 which pulled the Sabres into a 1-1 tie with Quebec. A strong player who skates well, Paul is suited to the NHL style of the 80's. He can play a skating, wide-open style with success as well as a grinding, hard-hitting game with plenty of corner work. After missing eight games late in the season due to a fractured finger, Paul came back with a strong playoff performance. A bachelor, he spends part of his off-season in the Buffalo area and returns to British Columbia the remainder of the summer.

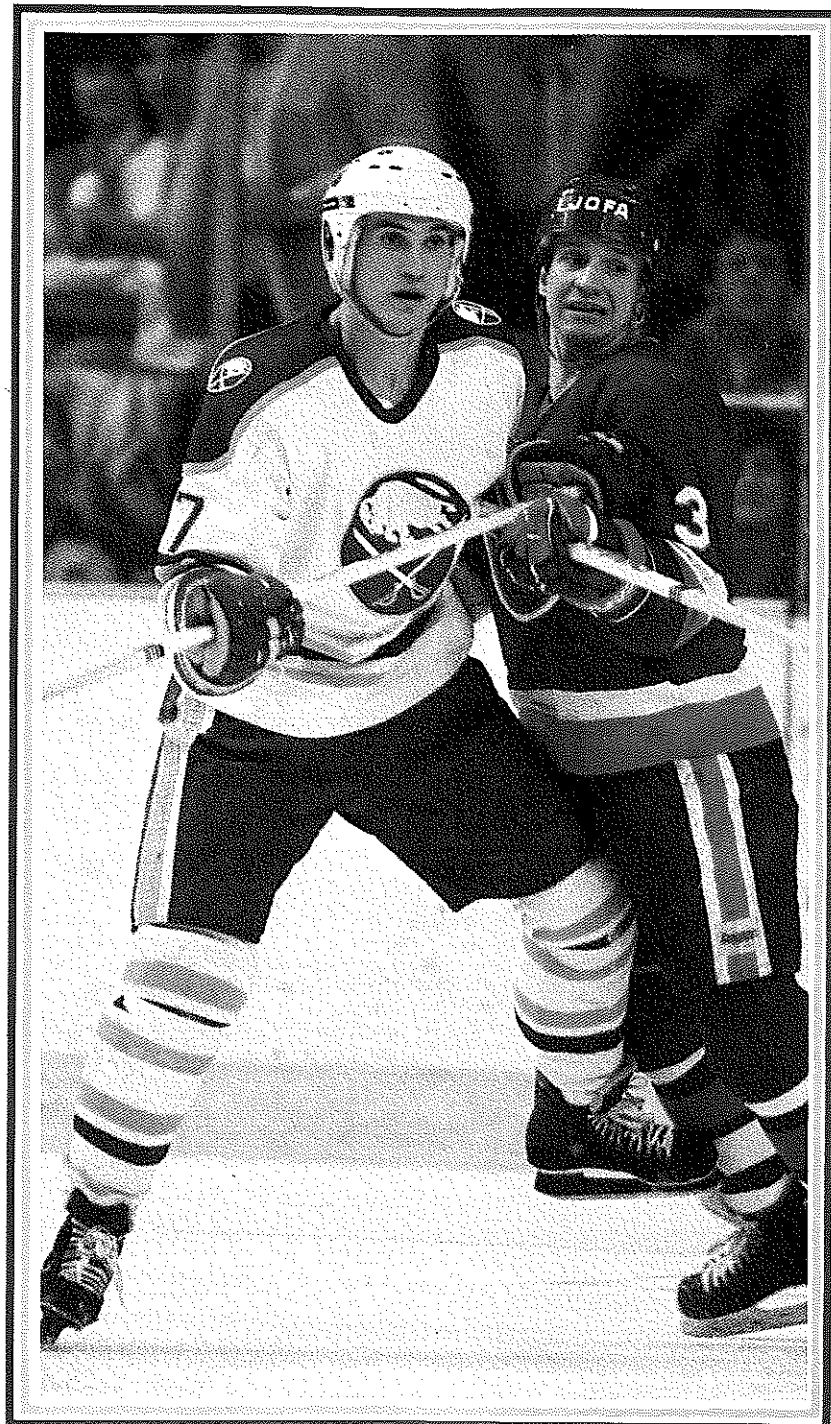

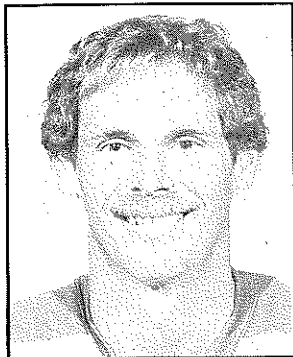

The Sudbury, Ontario native was rewarded when he finished the season as the Sabres' top plus/minus player last season. Slowed by an ankle injury in October (he missed three games) and again in December (he missed seven games), Mike had 14 goals and 10 assists in his first 30 games. Over the second half of the season, Mike's performance was a key to the Sabres' success. He recorded 39 points in the last 40 games. The big right winger had 13 points (6-7=13) in a seven-game stretch in February and he then scored goals in five consecutive games (7 goals) in March. He finished the season 22 games away from his 400th NHL regular season game. Mike and his wife Janis are the proud parents of Caramia, their first child who was born in May, 1984. The Folignos are year-round residents of the Buffalo area.

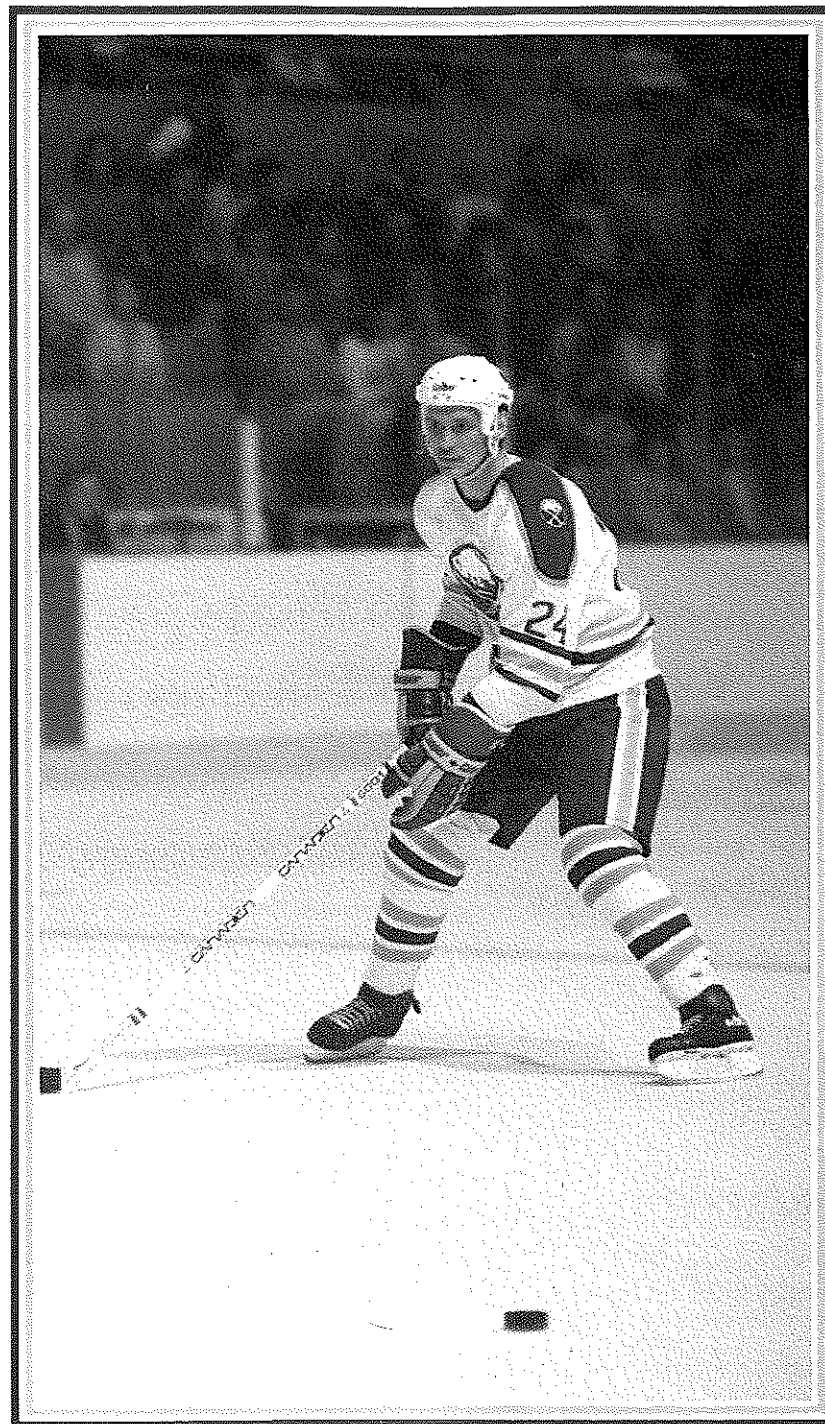

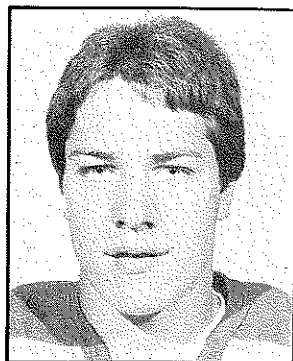
Bill might hold the professional sports world record for the shortest retirement period — five days. Last September, the rangy westerner announced his retirement during training camp. After five days, though, Bill decided to resume his playing career and the 1983-84 season turned out to be one of Bill's finest. Defensively, he was his usual steady self, seldom caught out of position and always making the right play. Bill was one of the players most responsible for the Sabres' excellent defensive record — second fewest goals against — and penalty killing efficiency — third best in the NHL. Offensively, last season was his best since 1975-76 when he also had 27 points. Bill's 27 points in 1983-84 surpassed his combined output of the last two seasons when he had 15 points in 1982-83 and 11 in 1981-82. The 6'3", 205-pound Hajt missed just one game last year and played in more games than any other Sabre. He became just the fourth player in Sabres' history to play in 700 NHL regular season games. The Hajt family — Bill, wife Jean and children reside in Amherst during the season but return to Saskatchewan during the off-season.

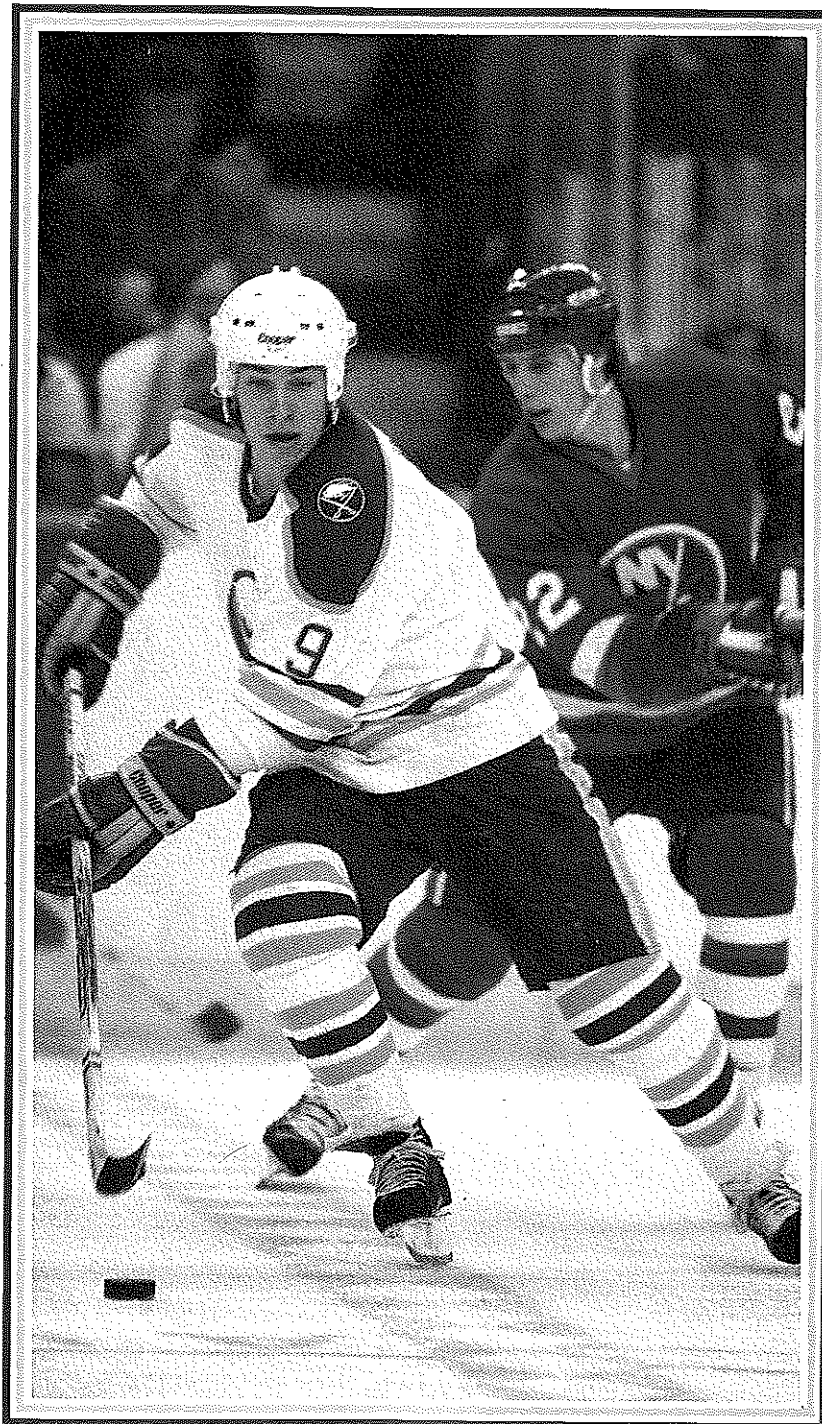

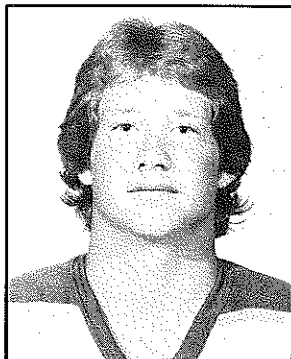
Drafted in 1979 as a left winger, Gilles spent the month of March, 1984 at center and enjoyed a great deal of success at his new position. In 12 games, the 6'0", 185-pound native of Asbestos, Quebec scored seven goals and added nine assists. He was also named WGRZ-TV's Player of the Month for his March efforts. Often teamed with winger Sean McKenna, Gilles was able to utilize his open-ice skating abilities to create scoring opportunities for himself and his linemates. He possesses a blistering slap shot and is capable of scoring from anywhere inside the blue line. Late in the 1983-84 season, Gilles was inserted at the point on the Sabres' power play unit where his shot could best be used. Always willing to get involved, he also saw action on the penalty killing team and scored his first NHL shorthanded goal on November 23, 1983 against the New York Rangers. He added a second shorthanded goal on March 27, 1984 against Hartford. Gilles' biggest night of the season, though, came on October 23, 1983 when he recorded the first hat trick of his NHL career as he led the Sabres to a 5-2 win over Winnipeg. 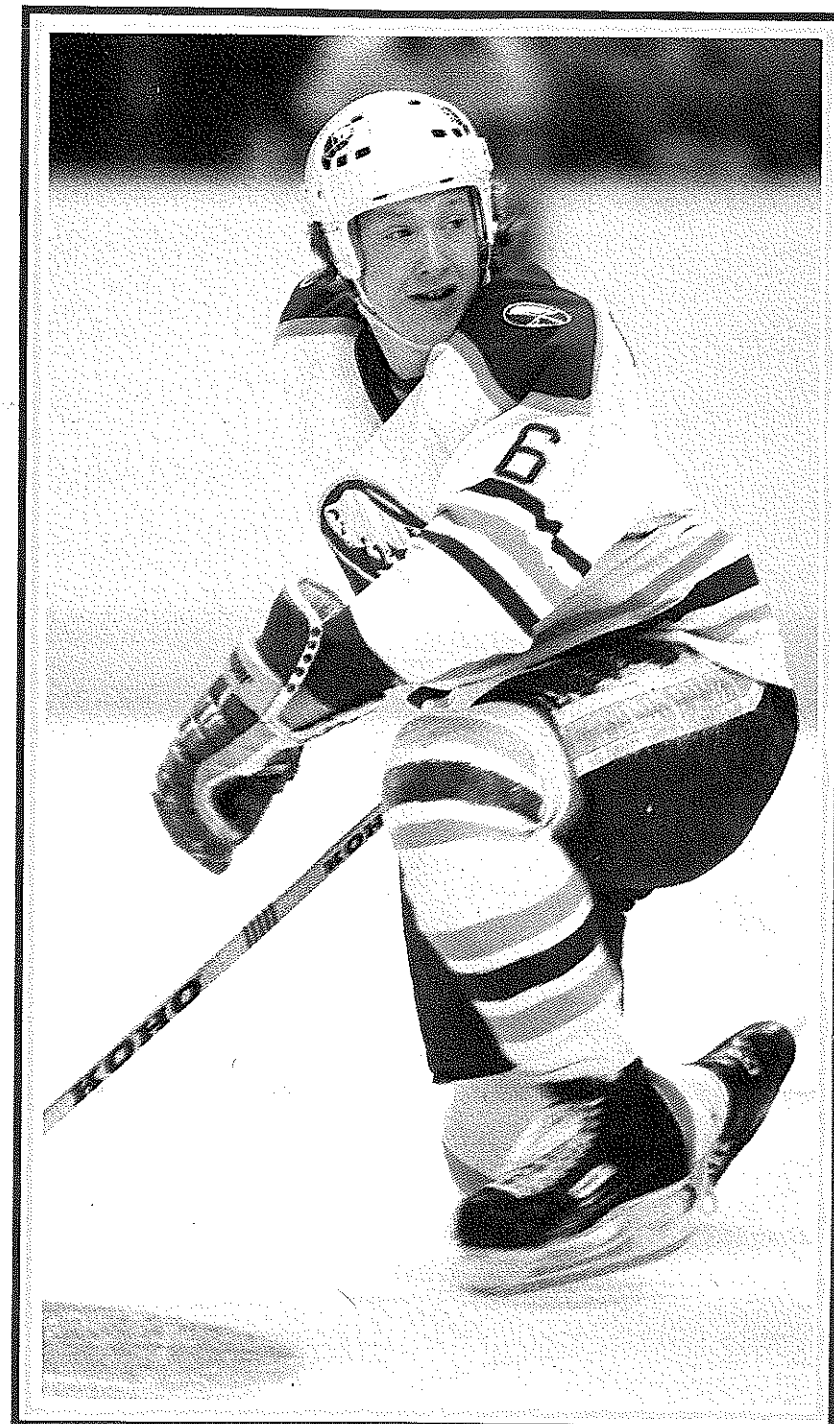

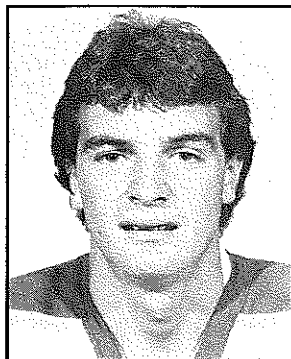
The threat of a "sophomore jinx" had no ill effect on Phil Housley as his second NHL season was even more spectacular than his rookie year. After recording the second highest point total in NHL history by a rookie defenseman in 1982-83 (66 points) and finishing second in the rookie of the year balloting, the 5'10", 180-pound redhead from South St. Paul, Minnesota, surpassed his rookie totals. When his slapshot from the blue line sailed past Edmonton's Grant Fuhr on March 18, 1984, Phil became the youngest defenseman in NHL history to score 30 goals in one season and he became just the fifth defenseman in league history to reach that plateau. Again in 1983-84, Phil showed a flair for the dramatic, in particular when he seemingly came from nowhere to score an over-time goal in Philadelphia on February 21. In January, he finished fourth in the balloting at defense and participated in his first NHL All-Star game in New Jersey. At season's end, he finished fifth in the All-Star balloting at defense, finishing behind Rod Langway, a two-time Norris Trophy winner, Ray Bourque, a three-time First All-Star Team pick, Paul Coffey, who had 126 points in 1983-84, and Denis Potvin, a five-time first All-Star team choice. The flashy defenseman saw even more ice time in 1983-84. He plays his normal shift at defense, quarterbacks the power play unit and spent some time on the penalty killing unit. Phil, a bachelor, lives right around the corner from Tom Barrasso and spends his summer months in Minnesota.

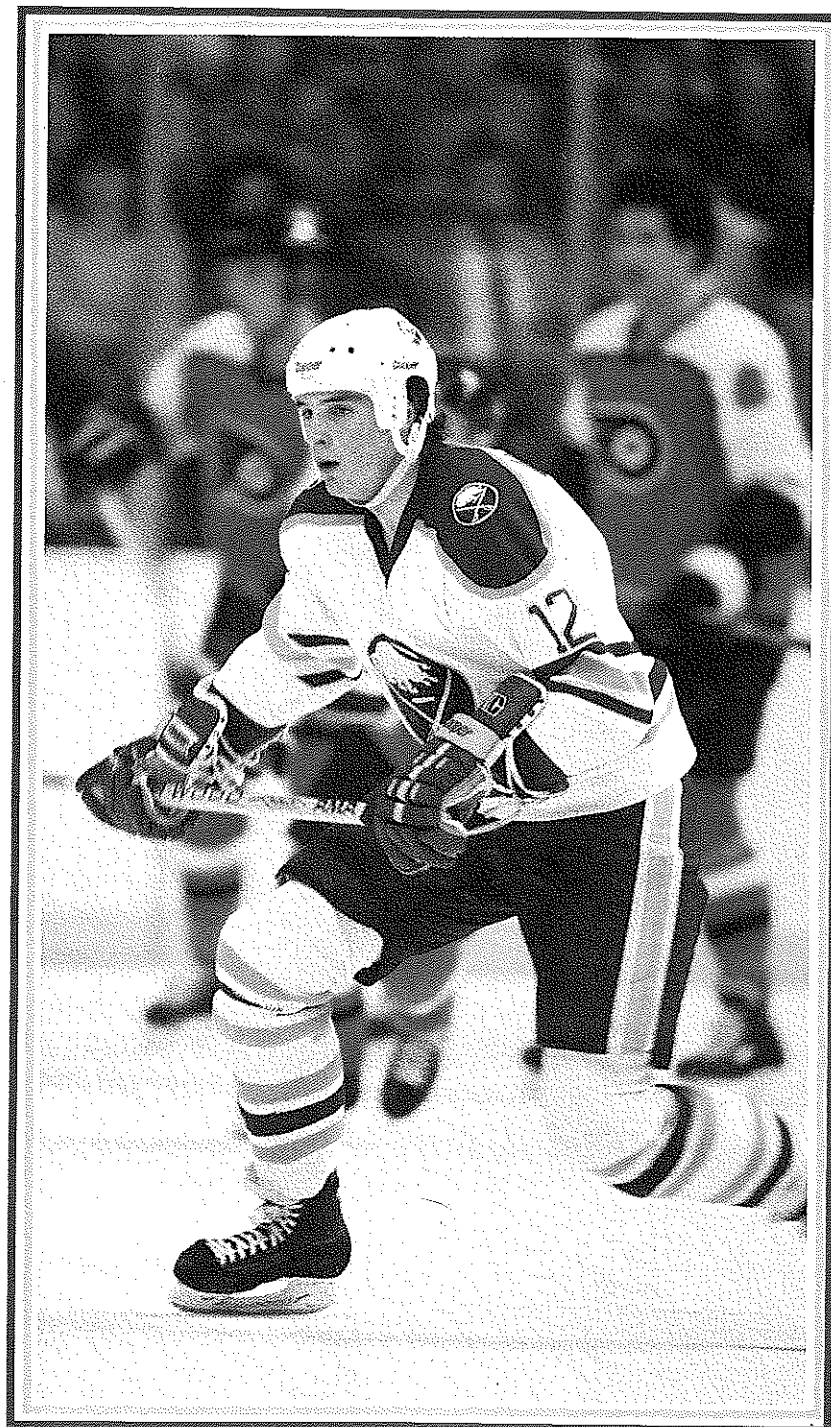

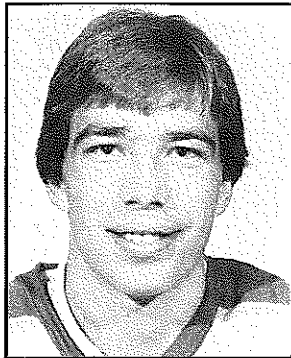
A star in junior hockey and the AHL record-holder for most playoff goals in one year (14 in 1983), Sean enjoyed his first 20-goal season in the NHL last year. 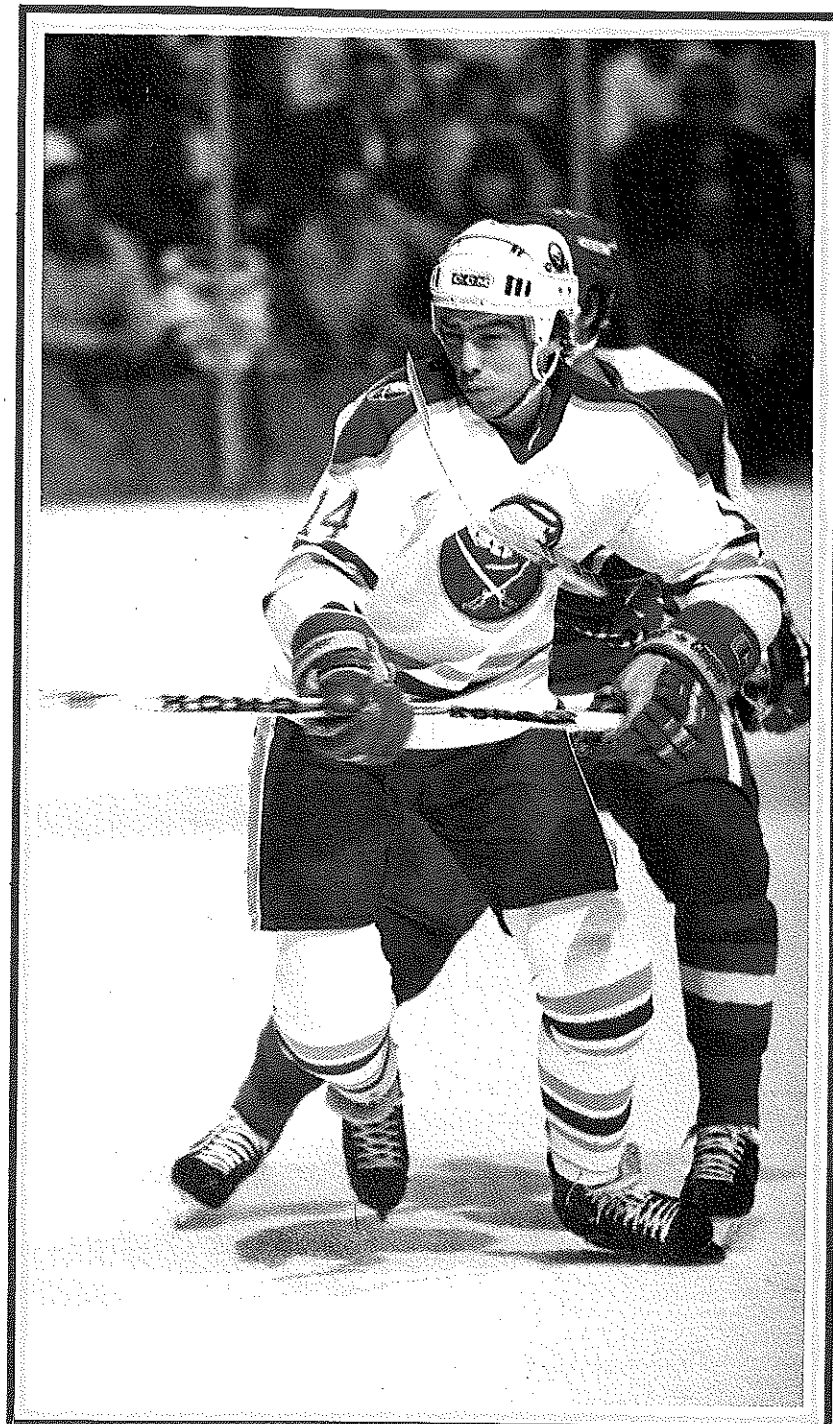

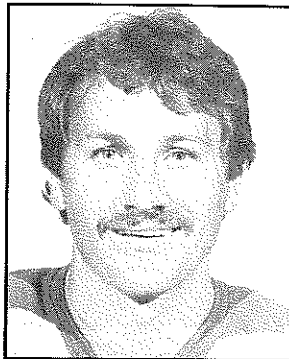
The second half of the 1983-84 season can best be looked upon as a learning experience for Mike. 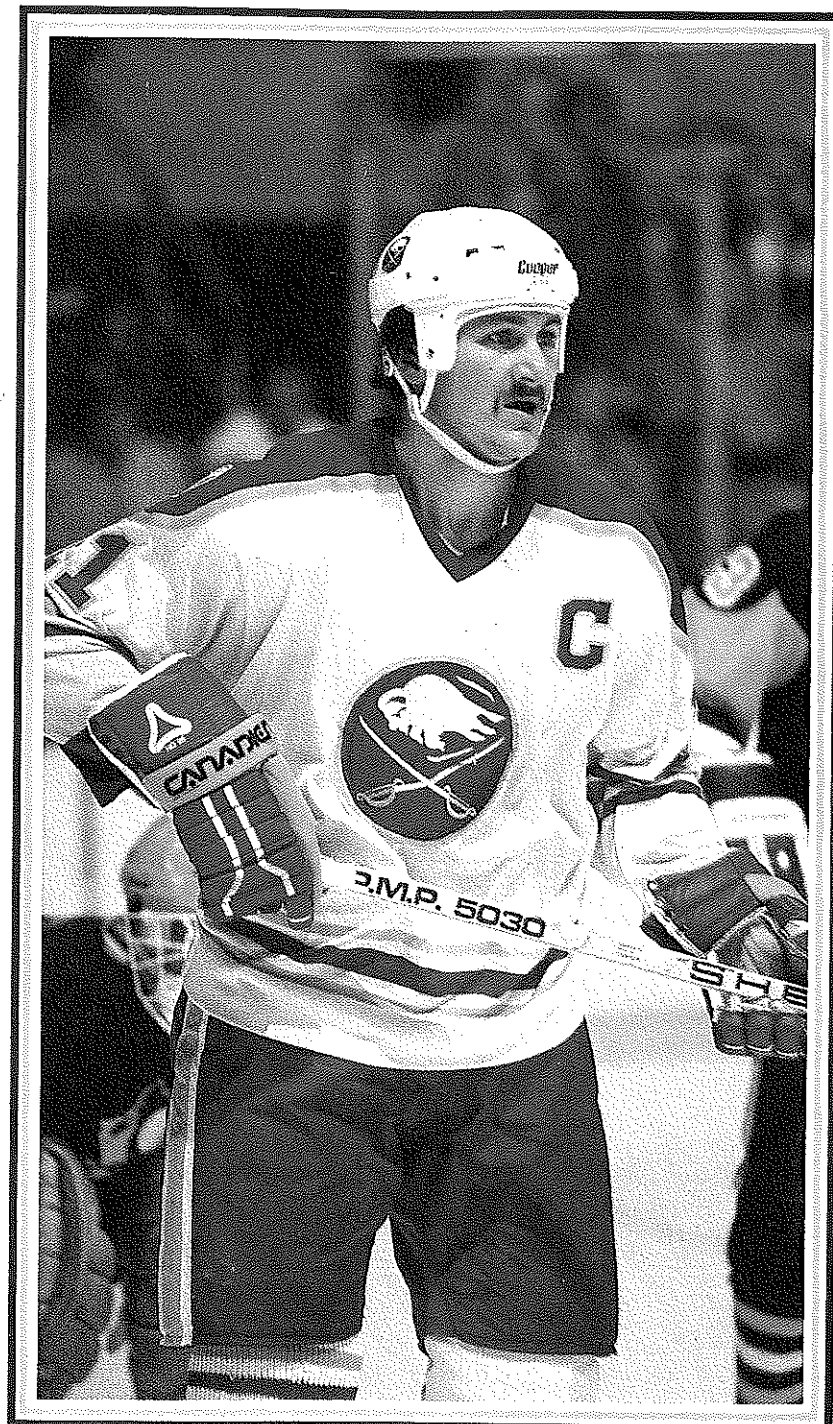

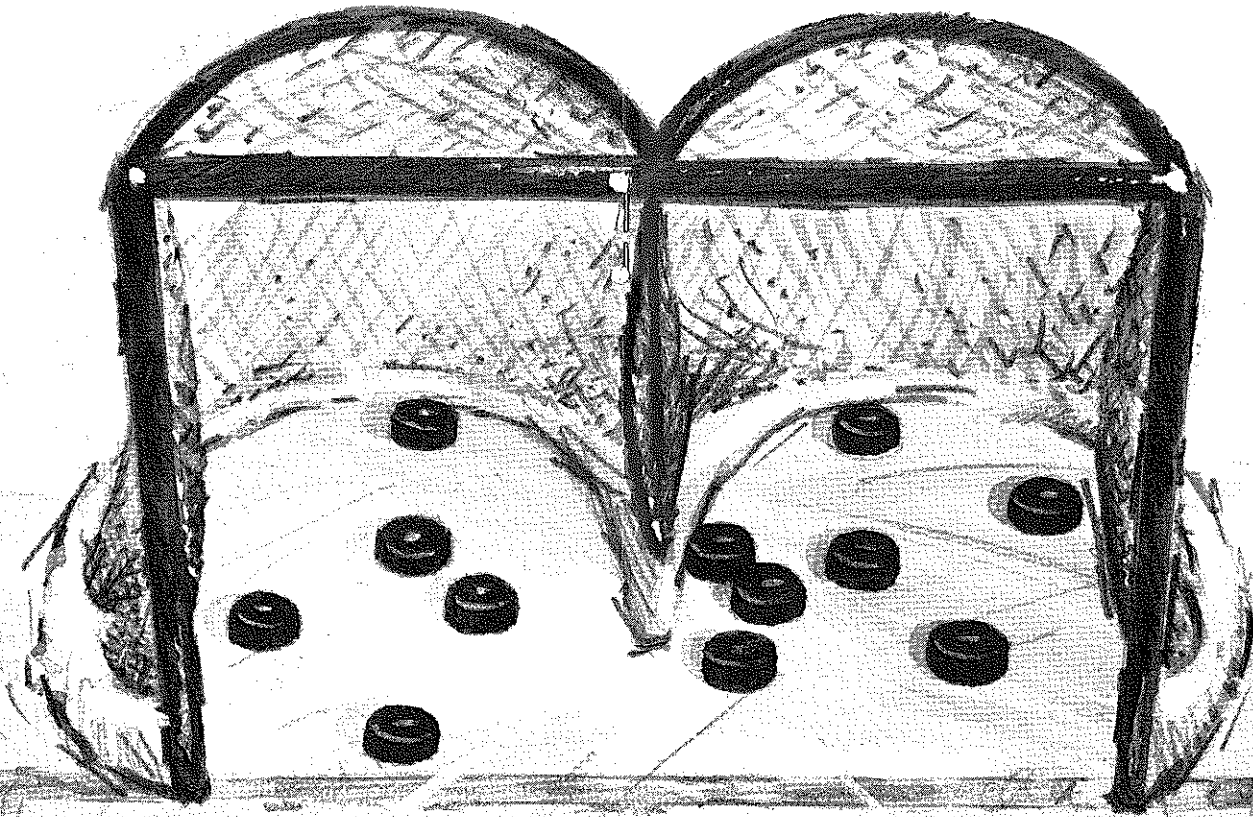
The 6'0", 202-pound center from Victoriaville, Quebec reached three milestones during the 1983-84 season — all within 10 days. Gil played in his 1,000th NHL regular season game on January 29, 1984; he then scored his 450th NHL goal on February 8 at Pittsburgh; and he recorded his 700th NHL assist the following night, February 9 vs. New Jersey. Gil is nearly certain to surpass some of the NHL greats on the league's all-time scoring list. He enters the 1984-85 season with 452 goals, 15th on the NHL all-time list and four behind Alex Delvecchio. Perreault has 715 career assists, 11th on the all-time list and 24 behind Norm Ullman. He stands 13th on the NHL all-time scoring list with 1,167 points, three behind Bobby Hull. Still a key part of the Sabres' power play, Perreault had 30 power play points (8-22=30). Gil, his wife Carmen, and their son Marc live in Amherst during the season, but spend the summer months in Victoriaville, Quebec.

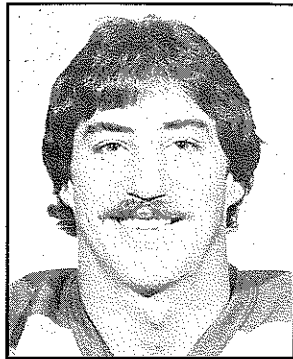
Defensive work is often overlooked in individual hockey games. But in Brent Peterson's case, it is difficult to overlook his performance against some of the NHL's top centers during the 1983-84 season. Five of the best offensive centers in the game — Wayne Gretzky, Peter Stastny, Bryan Trottier, Denis Savard and Dale Hawerchuk — were held to a combined total of three goals in 23 games against Buffalo. Although Brent and his linemates — usually Craig Ramsay and Ric Seiling — may not have been pitted against the top centers on every shift, they were on the ice on the majority of occasions. In addition to taking a regular shift against the top offensive players in the game, Brent is a regular member of the Sabres' penalty killing unit which ranked third in 1983-84 and second in 1982-83. Brent is also called upon to take most of the face-offs in the Sabres' defensive zone in the late stages of tight games. A dependable and dedicated performer, Brent is a student of the game, often studying films to critique his own play and prepare for upcoming games. A junior teammate of Larry Playfair in Portland in the late 70s, the two were reunited when Brent was acquired by the Sabres from Detroit in 1981. Brent and his wife Tami have two sons, Ryan and Bradley, and spend their summer months in Beaverton, Oregon.

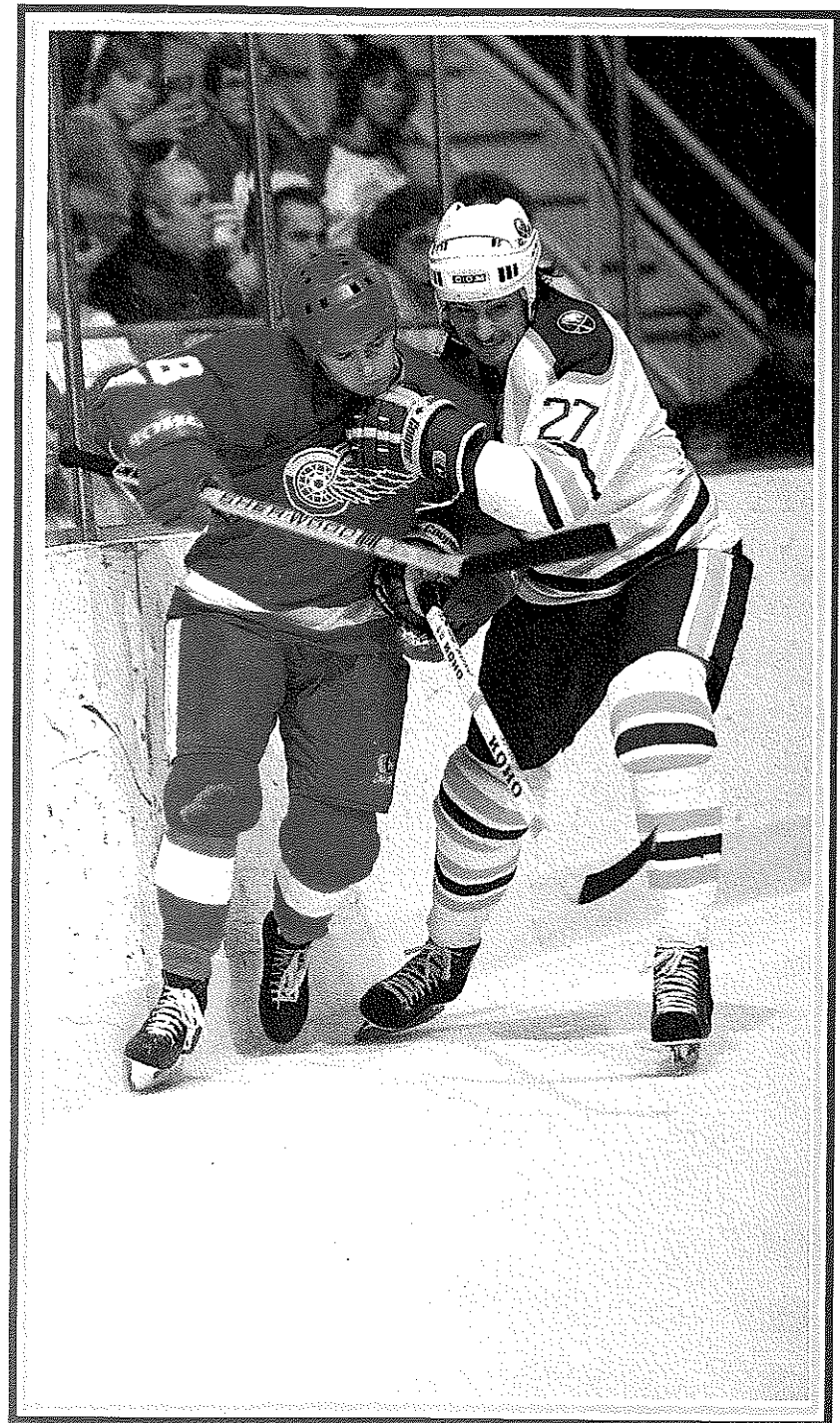

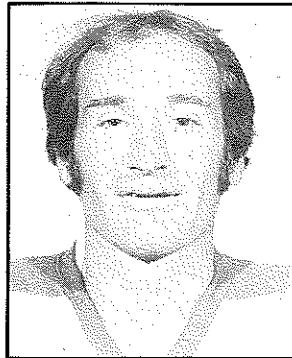
Standing 6'4" and weighing in at 220 pounds, Larry is unquestionably the most imposing Buffalo Sabre. The 26-year-old defenseman uses his size to clear the area in front of the Buffalo goal, giving the netminders a clear view of long-range shots. His size also makes him effective at breaking up two-on-one and three-on-two situations. Despite playing a physical brand of hockey, Larry has been a durable performer since being drafted by the Sabres in the first round in 1978. He is the only Sabre to have appeared in 75 or more regular season games in each of the last five seasons. During that time, he has also become the Sabres' all-time penalty minute leader, becoming the first player in the club's history to go over the 1,000 penalty minute mark. Although known as a defensive defenseman, Larry made several significant offensive contributions in 1983-84. He scored an important goal against Boston on February 15 which paved the way to a 7-4 win over the Bruins. Two nights later, he scored one goal and then set up the overtime marker by Dave Andreychuk in the Sabres' 5-4 win over Minnesota. Physically imposing on the ice, Larry is one of the most popular Sabres off the ice. Year-round he spends a great deal of time making public appearances and working for various local charities. Larry and his wife Jayne live on Grand Island but travel to Fort St. James, B.C. during the off-season for a few weeks.

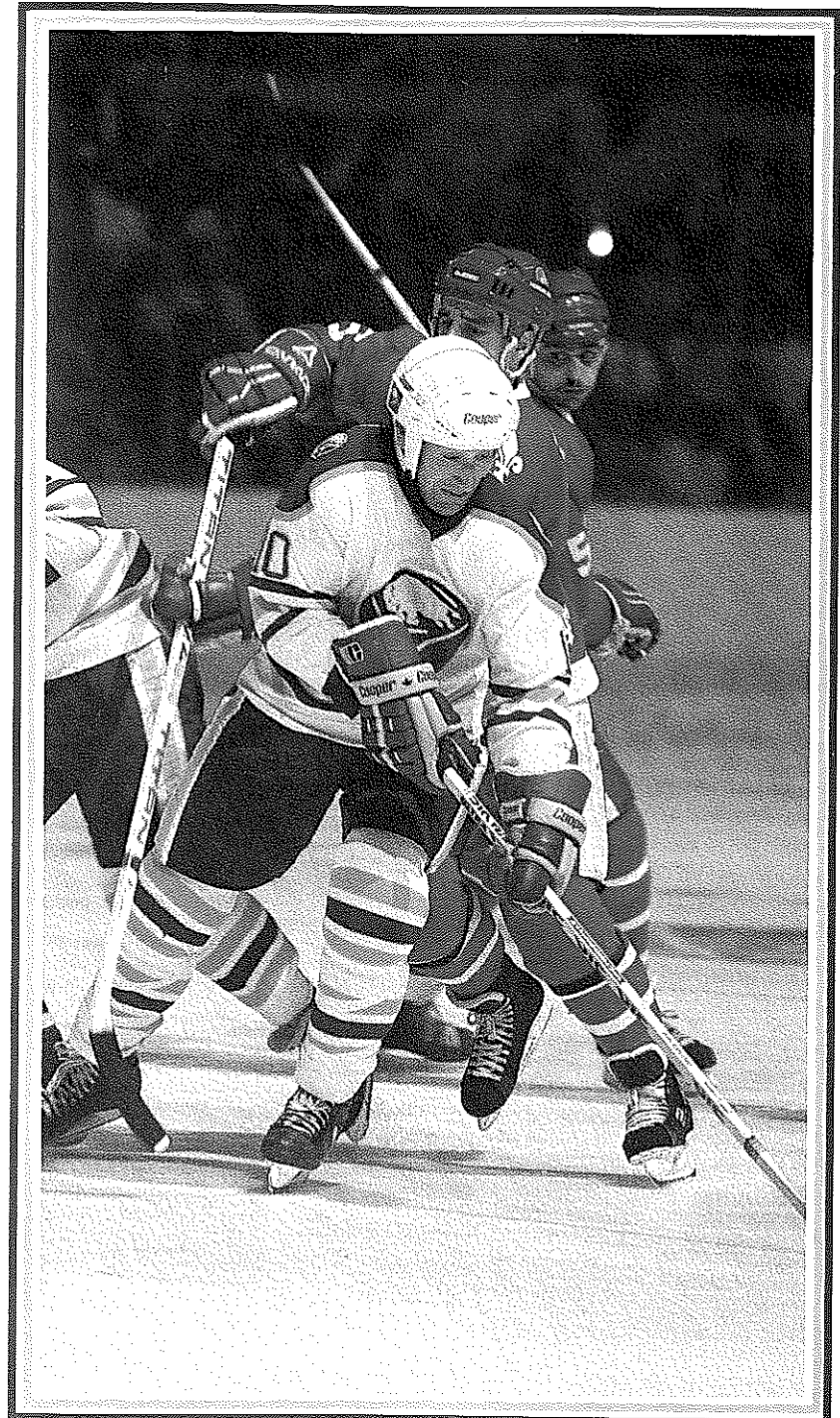

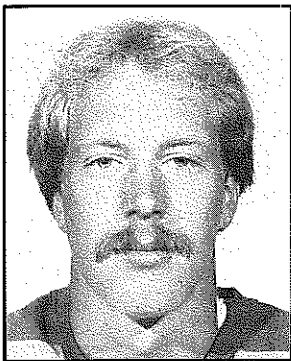
Offense attracts the vast majority of fans to professional sporting events, but it is defense that most often wins games and championships. Left winger Craig Ramsay's defensive abilities are a major reason the Buffalo Sabres have posted one of the NHL's top won-loss records over the last 10 seasons. During that decade, the Sabres' coaches have had the luxury of knowing one of the league's superior defensive forwards is in a Buffalo uniform — someone who can shut down a high-scoring winger, kill penalties, or get the puck out of the defensive zone in the late stages of a tight game. Craig has been doing all of this and more since joining the Sabres early in the 1971-72 season. Although he has never won the Selke Award (best defensive forward), Craig always finishes high in the balloting and 1983-84 was no exception as he finished fifth. Often overlooked are Craig's offensive contributions. He stands third on the Sabres' all-time goal-scoring list, second on the club assist list and third in points, behind Gil Perreault and Richard Martin. And when he steps onto the ice for his ninth game this season, he will join Gil Perreault as the only Sabres to have played in 1,000 NHL games. Craig's first assist this season will be his 400th and he is just 11 points shy of his 650th NHL point. Craig, his wife Susan and their children, are year-round residents of Buffalo. He was appointed an assistant coach on Sept. 14, 1984.

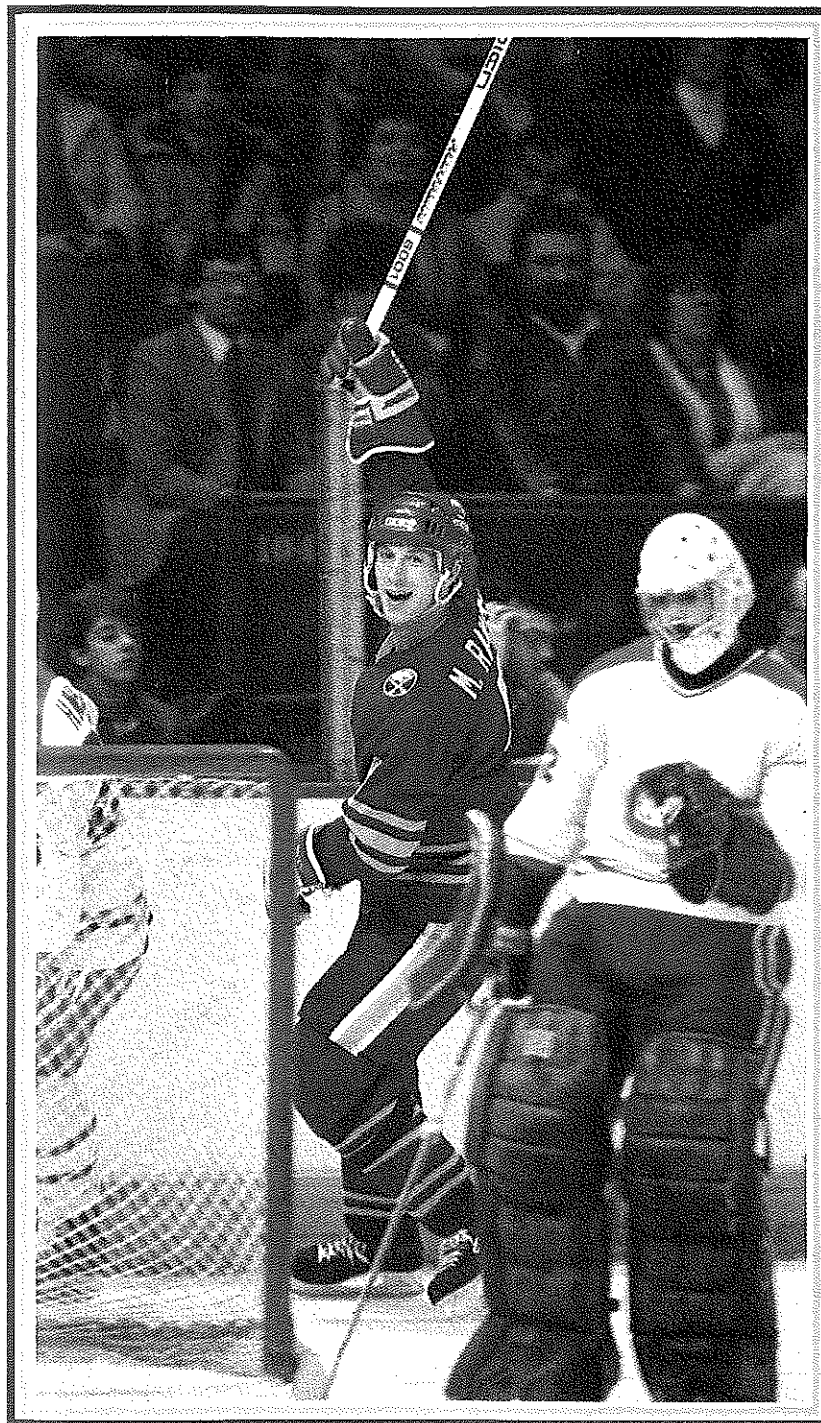

Mike Ramsey might give serious thought to moving his parents to Buffalo in the very near future. It seems whenever his mom and dad visit Buffalo, Mike has a big offensive performance. During the 1982-83 season, the 6'3", 195-pound defenseman scored two goals and added two assists against Los Angeles while his parents were in attendance. Last season, Mike's mother and father saw him score two goals as he led the Sabres to a 6-2 win over Philadelphia in Memorial Auditorium. However, Mike's offensive production is often overlooked. In 1983-84, he did score a single season career high of nine goals. Four of them turned out to be game winners, including the Sabres' first-ever regular season overtime goal on November 16, 1983 in Winnipeg 17 seconds into overtime. While his offensive work is somewhat overlooked, his defensive work is not. Mike is regarded as one of the premier shot-blockers in the NHL and one of the hardest workers in the league. Had there been a third team All-Star team in 1983-84, Mike and teammate Phil Housley would have occupied both defensive positions. Phil finished fifth in the All-Star balloting at defense while Mike was sixth. USA Today's Hockey Editor, Rod Beaton, said, "Mike Ramsey seldom plays a great game, but I've never seen him play anything less than a very good game." Named the Booster Club's Most Popular Player in each of the last two seasons, Mike is also one of the team leaders, both on and off the ice. One of Buffalo's most eligible bachelors, Mike shares a home with Lindy Ruff during the season. During the summer months, he spends time at his summer house in Minnesota.

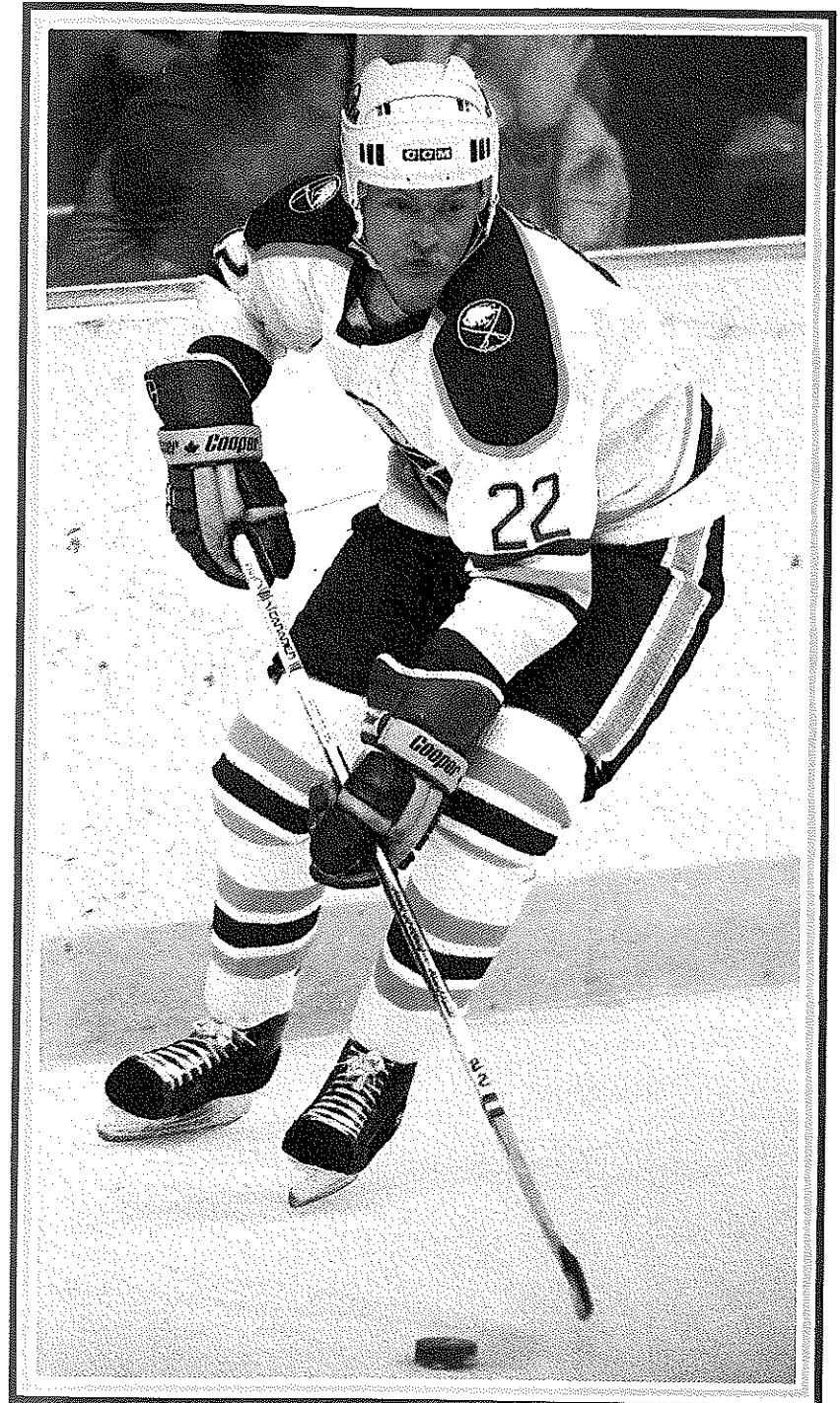

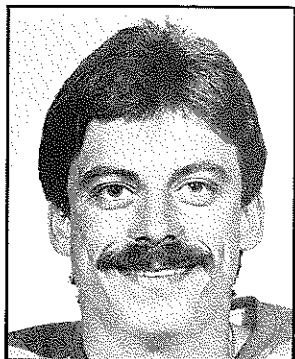
Two separate injuries cut into what would have been Lindy's most productive season in the NHL during the 1983-84 campaign. After picking up an early assist in the season opener October 5 against Hartford, Lindy broke a bone in his foot while blocking a shot and had to miss the next eight games. On January 14, he scored the game winning goal in Buffalo's 2-1 win in Detroit. Near the end of the game, however, he suffered a shoulder injury which forced him to miss 14 games. Lindy still finished with his second best point total in five NHL seasons. Had he scored at his 1983-84 pace over 80 games, Lindy would have finished the season with career highs of 19 goals, 41 assists and 60 points. The 24-year-old native of Warburg, Alberta spent all of last season at left wing. His style of play — all-out and at top speed — leaves him somewhat susceptible to injury. Despite injuries, Lindy plays the same way all the time and is one of the team catalysts. For his efforts, he received the Buffalo Evening News Seventh Player Award last season. Lindy had a goal and two assists in the 4-2 win in Boston and followed up with a goal and assist in Buffalo's 6-5 win in Philadelphia. A crowd favorite in Buffalo, Lindy is single and shares a house with Mike Ramsey.

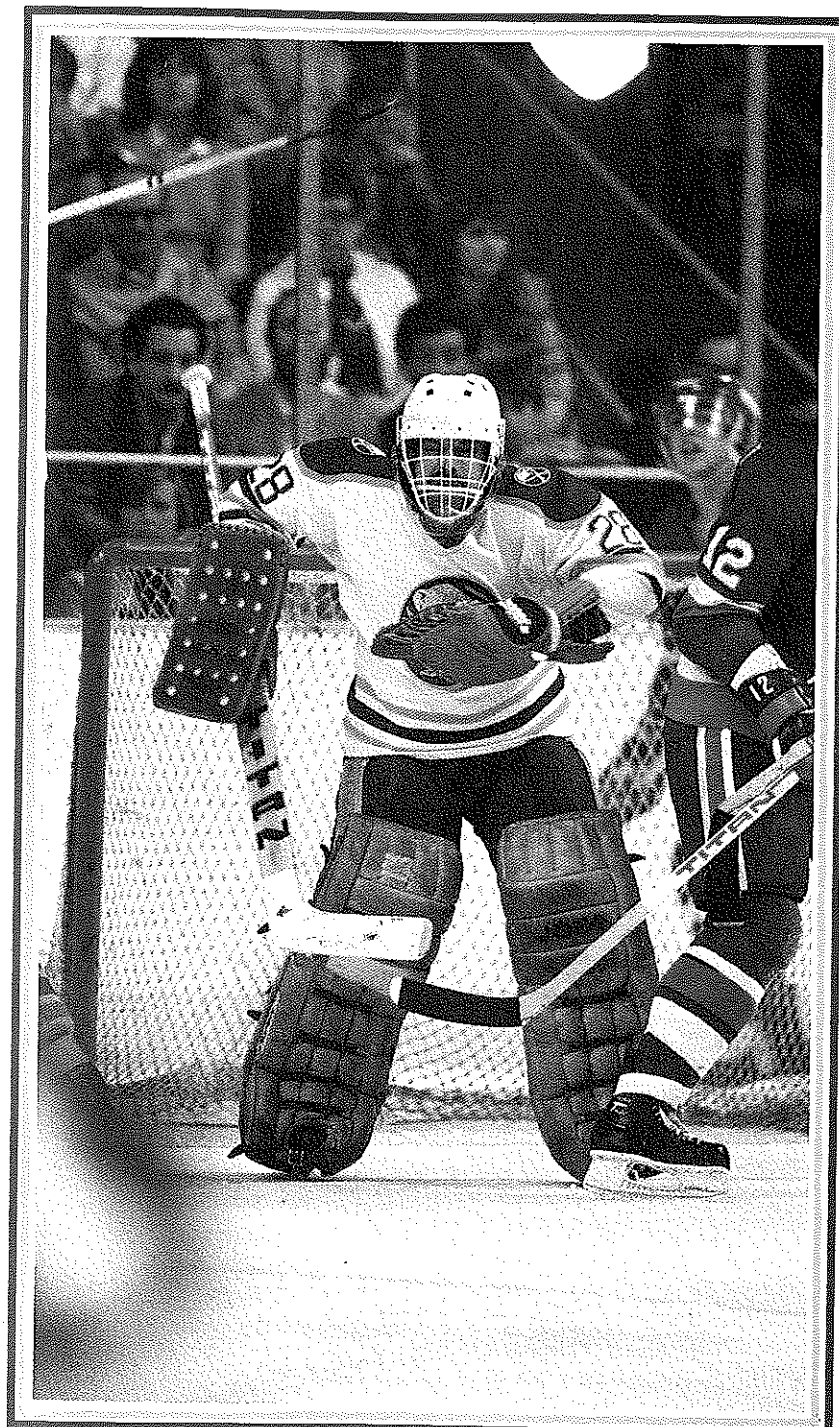

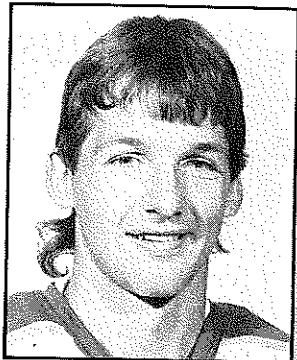
Bob, who shared the Vezina Trophy with Don Edwards in 1979-80, was outstanding during the second half of the 1983-84 season. In the last half of the year, Bob posted a 12-5-2 record and a 3.00 goals against average. He was brilliant during the month of January when he was undefeated (5-0-1) and surrendered just 11 goals. For the second consecutive year and the third time in his NHL career, Bob reached the 20-win plateau (22-13-4). He lost just four of 20 decisions on home ice (13-4-3). Few Sabres' fans will soon forget Bob's performances in Montreal during the 1983 Adams Division semi-finals when he blanked the Canadiens on back-to-back nights. 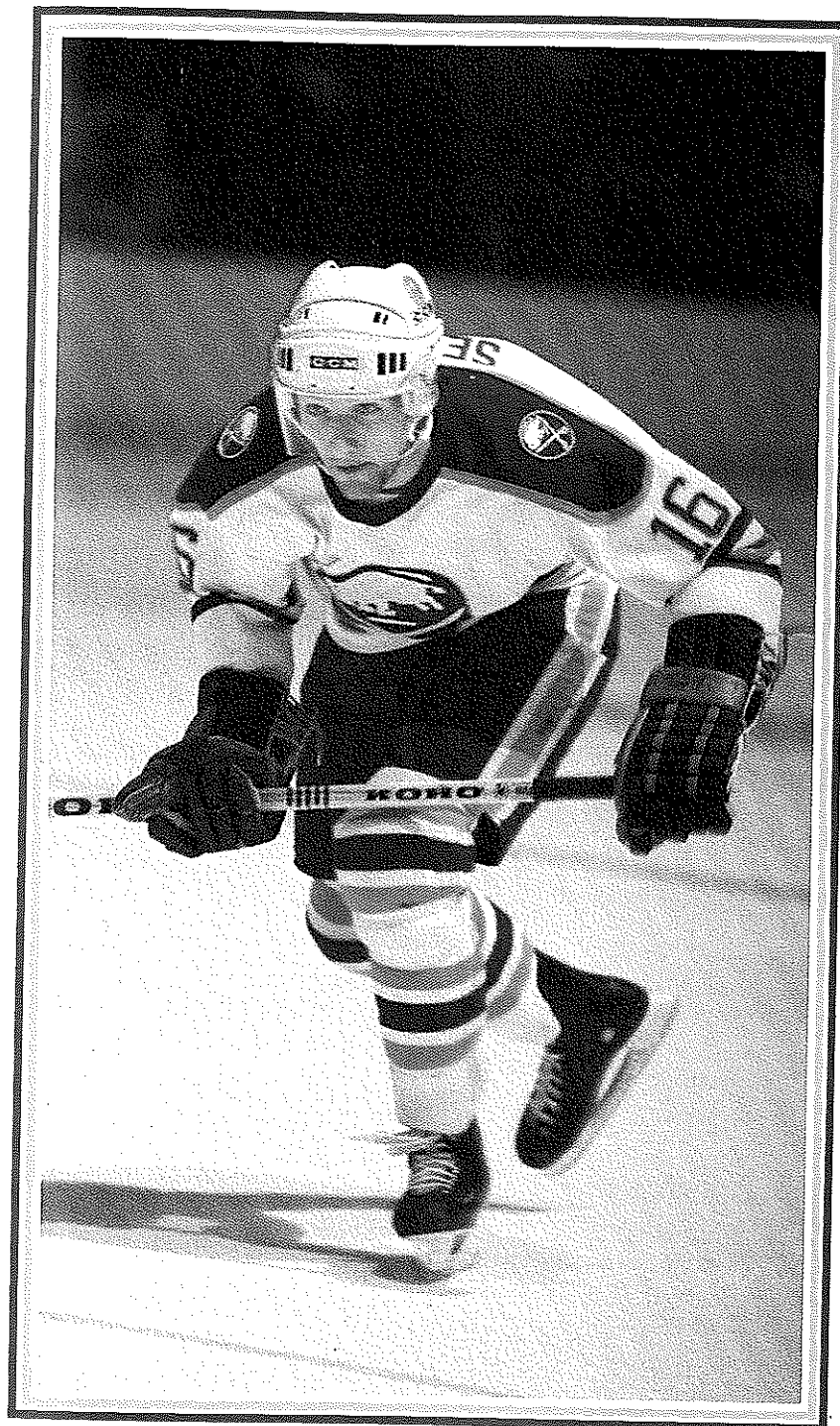

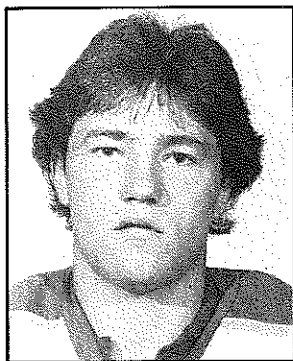
Few players who have worn a Buffalo uniform during the Sabres' 14-year existence have been more durable than Ric. The slender 6'1", 178-pound right winger has played in 74 or more games in six of his seven seasons with the Sabres. Only a serious eye injury on January 30, 1982 has sidelined him for an extended period of time. Ric missed 20 games that season as a result, and now wears a protective shield on his helmet. Despite the injury, Ric backs down from no one. He is a tenacious checker, normally playing opposite opponents' high-scoring left wingers. Named by the Booster Club as the 1983-84 recipient of the Tim Horton Memorial Award, Ric led the team with three shorthanded goals. Last season, he also became one of just 10 players to have appeared in 500 or more regular season games in a Buffalo uniform. His 148 career goals rank him seventh on the Sabres' all-time goal-scoring list. One of Ric's biggest assets is his hockey sense. He always seems to read plays before they develop and has been able to create scoring chances as a result of his keen anticipation. While killing penalties, Ric has a knack for knowing when to take to the offensive. Aside from his hockey career, Ric has interests in his family's harness horse business. The popular winger also makes numerous off-season appearances for the public relations department. Ric, his wife Bonny and daughter, Melody, live on Grand Island.

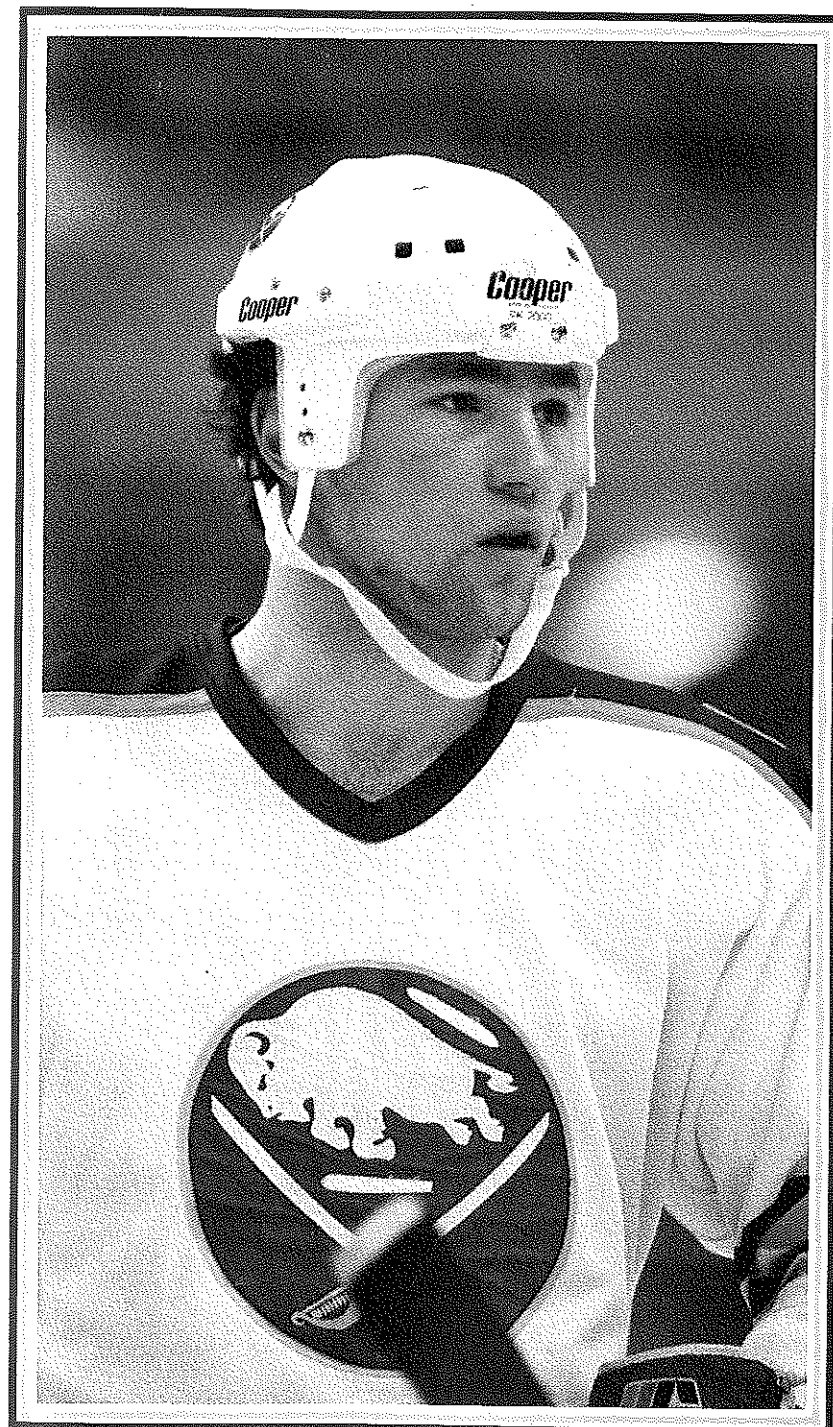

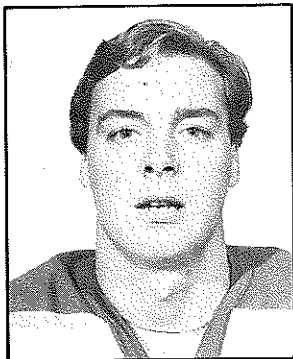
When John Tucker was still available in the second round of the 1983 NHL Entry Draft, the Sabres ended up with the equivalent of four first round picks. After John's play in 21 games with Buffalo last season, a good many NHL general managers no doubt wish they had grabbed John with their first round selection. The 6'0", 185-pound center from Windsor, Ontario enters the 1984-85 as a top candidate for the rookie of the year award. He capped a brilliant junior career last season as he was named the Ontario Hockey League's Player of the Year despite appearing in just 39 games with Kitchener. However, he totaled 100 points (40-60=100) in those 39 games and then led the Rangers to the Memorial Cup Finals where they were defeated by Adam Creighton's Ottawa 67s. John was recalled by the Sabres on two occasions during the 1983-84 season. He had five goals and two assists in his 10-game stint from Nov. 19 to Dec. 14. John then scored seven goals — including his first NHL hat trick against Toronto on April 1 — and added two assists when he was brought up on March 9 and finished the season with the Sabres. A natural goal-scorer, John gets to the right spot and has some nifty moves around the net. He has good balance and shoots and passes extremely well. In addition, John is an excellent face-off man.

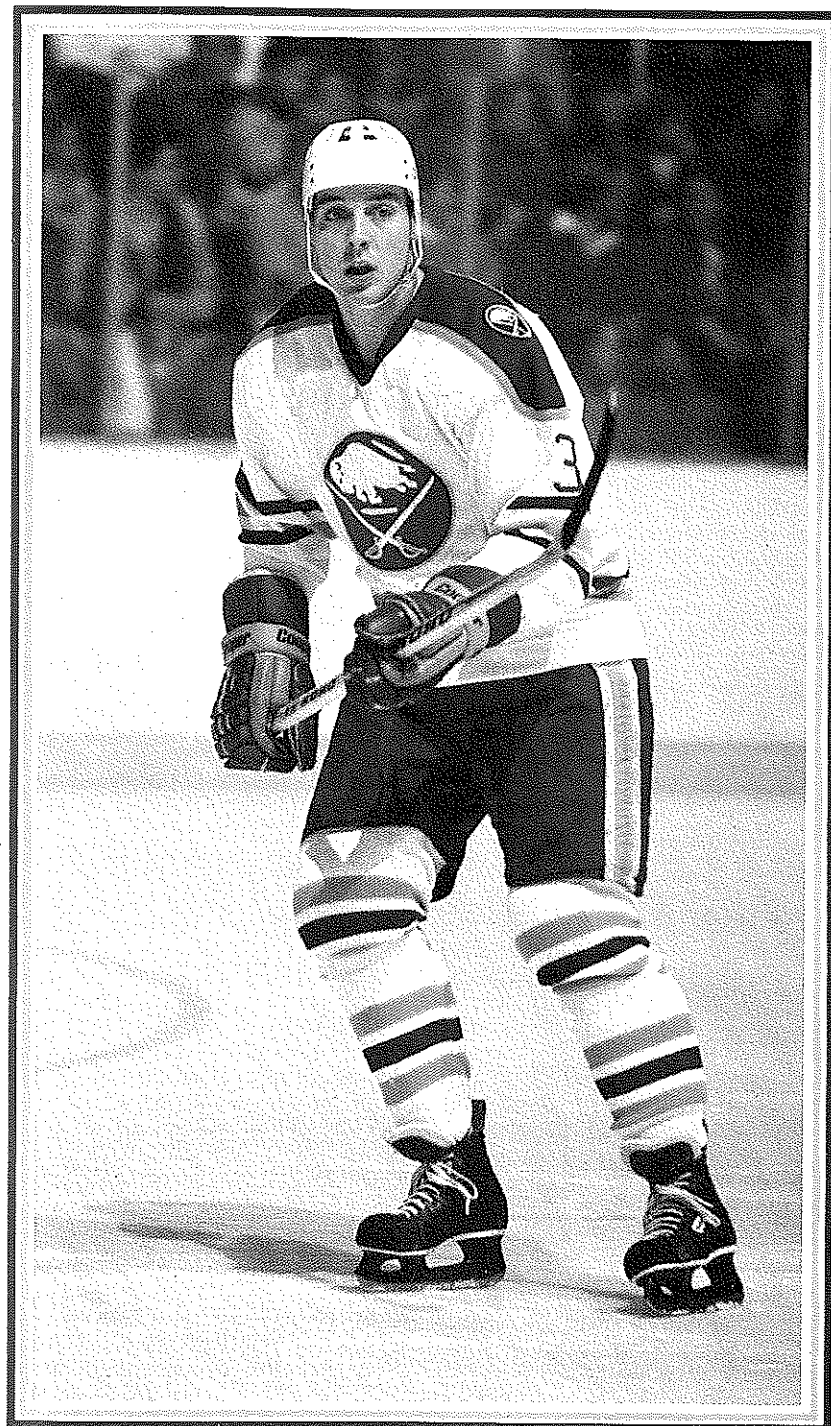

Now that the National Hockey League is truly an international league, it's not uncommon to find European names on most team rosters. Hannu Virta, although not the first European to don a Sabres' uniform (Finland's Kai Suikkanen played a game early in the 1981-82 season), is the first European to play regularly for the Sabres. A regular since joining the Sabres for the final three games of the 1981-82 regular season, Hannu has been one of the most unheralded Sabres. Hannu, who spoke very little English when he first came to Buffalo, has improved his vocabulary tremendously, but remains reluctant to be interviewed on radio or television. His play on the ice, though, is praised in any language. A steady performer, Hannu seldom gets in trouble in the defensive zone. His skating ability enables him to avoid opposing forwards and he has excellent passing abilities, always able to spot the open man. Among Sabres' defensemen, only Phil Housley had more assists and points than Hannu in 1983-84. Once out of the defensive zone, Hannu becomes a dangerous offensive defenseman and often is used at the point on the Sabres' power play unit. Single, Hannu returns to Finland during the summer months. During the hockey season, he shares an apartment with teammate Dave Andreychuk.

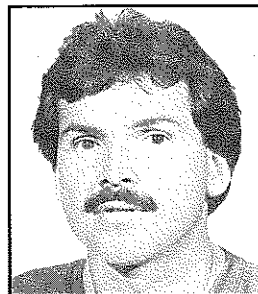

One of the smallest goaltenders in professional hockey, Jacques is also one of the most durable. The 5'7", 155-pound netminder appeared in 51 of Rochester's regular season games in 1983-84 and then played every minute of the Americans' 18 playoff games. In 1980-81, his rookie professional season, Jacques played in 61 regular season games. The Noranda, Quebec native has started all 34 of Rochester's playoff games over the last two seasons and was largely responsible for the Amerks' march to the Calder Cup championship in 1983. Still highly regarded by NHL scouts, Jacques is unquestionably one of the top AHL goaltenders.

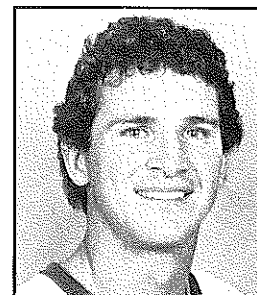
The 28-year-old winger was especially effective on the Sabres' power play unit as he had 26 power play points, third most on the team behind Phil Housley and Gil Perreault.
