EDMONTON OILERS

All-Time Wild Record: 64-33-10 (33-17-3 at Grand Casino Arena, 31-16-7 at Edmonton)

2025-26: Minnesota won the first meeting, 1-0, in Edmonton (12/3)...D Jonas Brodin scored the game's lone goal, assisted by C Nico Sturm...G Jesper Wallstedt saved all 33 shots faced to earn the shutout victory for the Wild...G Stuart Skinner stopped 23-of-24 shots faced in the game for Edmonton.

WILD LEADERS: RW Mats Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 28 points (9-19=28) in 25 career contests vs. Edmonton...D Quinn Hughes owns 27 points (5-22=27) in 29 games...RW Vladimir Tarasenko has 23 points (13-10=23) in 31 games...C Ryan Hartman has 17 points (7-10=17) in 22 games.

WILD GOALIES: G Filip Gustavsson is 2-2-0 with a 4.41 GAA and a .880 SV% in four career starts vs. Edmonton...Wallstedt is 1-0-0 with a shutout victory in his lone start against the Oilers (12/3/25).

OILERS LEADERS: C Connor McDavid (12-20=32, in 26 games) and C Ryan Nugent-Hopkins (12-20=32, in 40 games) lead Edmonton with 32 points...C Leon Draisaitl has 31 points (16-15=31) in 27 games...C Adam Henrique owns 24 points (8-16=24) in 33 games.

OILERS GOALIES: G Tristan Jarry is 5-0-1 with a 2.31 and a .921 SV% in six starts against the Wild...G Calvin Pickard is 4-4-0 with a 2.58 GAA, a .917 SV% and one shutout in eight games (seven starts) against Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: President of Hockey Operations and General Manager Bill Guerin collected 161 points (79-82=161) and 354 PIM in 211 games with Edmonton in parts of four seasons (1997-01)...D Jared Spurgeon is from Edmonton...F Tyler Pitlick was selected by Edmonton in the second round (No. 31 overall) of the 2010 NHL Draft and collected 14 points (11-3=14) in 58 games across parts of three seasons (2013-15, 2016-17) with the club.

FAST FACTS: The Wild's 64 wins and 31 road wins all-time against the Oilers are its most against any team...The Wild's 33 victories at Grand Casino are the second-most against any franchise (COL, 35)...The Wild is 12-4-0 in the last 16 games against the Oilers dating back to 10/22/19...Minnesota is 36-13-1 (.730) vs. Edmonton since the 2010-11 season, the NHL's second-best point percentage against the Oilers in that span...Since the start of the 2010-11 season, Minnesota is 20-5-0 (.800) in 25 games at Edmonton, including an eight-game win streak (2/21/13-1/31/17) – the longest road win streak in team history...Minnesota has won six of its last eight games against Edmonton at Grand Casino Arena dating back to 10/22/19...The Wild won 17 straight games against the Oilers in Saint Paul (2/25/07-10/13/11) – the longest home win streak against an opponent in franchise history.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Has won six consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NHL, the team's second-longest of the season (seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-9th longest in franchise history...All six wins in current winning streak have come in regulation...Ranks third in the NHL with 47 points (21-9-5), T-2nd highest total through the first 35 games of a season in franchise history...Owns an active 13-game home point streak (11-0-2) since Nov. 1, tied for the longest in franchise history (two other occurrences) and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 15 game streak)...Is 18-3-2 (.826) since Nov. 1, ranking first in the NHL in wins, points (38), team GAA (1.75) and team SV% (.940) while ranking second with a plus-34 goal differential...Has killed 51-of-58 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks third the NHL with a 87.9 PK% in that span...Has scored first in 22 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL...Leads the NHL with seven shutouts, one shy of tying the franchise's single-season record.

Matt Boldy: Posted three points (1-2=3) and a plus-2 rating at CBJ (12/18). Per Stats Perform, it was his seventh consecutive game as a plus player, tying the franchise record (Zach Parise, Ian Cole)...Owns active three-game goal and point streaks (3-3=6) and has 12 points (5-7=12) in his last seven games...Tallied his second shorthanded goal of his season and career vs. WSH (12/16)...For the season, ranks T-4th in NHL in SHG (two), T-5th in goals (20), and T-9th in points (20-21=41) and shots (114)...Leads Wild in assists and ranks T-1st in points and second in goals.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Owns an active six-game point streak (4-6=10), T-3rd longest of his career...Named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending 12/14 after collecting seven points (3-4=7) and a GWG to help the team to a 4-0-0 record...Leads the NHL in total faceoffs taken (752) and ranks second in faceoffs won (379).

Brock Faber: Skated a season-high 30:57 of TOI at CBJ (12/18)...Since 10/26, ranks sixth in the NHL with a 25:18 TOI/G average and eighth among NHL defensemen in goals (six) and T-13th in points (6-13=19) in 26 games.

Filip Gustavsson: Posted his third shutout of the season vs. WSH (12/16), T-2nd in NHL, and 14th of his career, one shy of tying Dwayne Roloson (15 SO) for third in franchise history...Since 2022-23 season, his 14 shutouts rank T-4th in NHL...In nine starts since Nov. 16, is 7-1-1 with a 1.64 GAA, .938 SV% and two shutouts.

Quinn Hughes: Skated a career-high 32:02 of TOI at CBJ (12/18), the second highest TOI total in an NHL game this season...With an assist (0-1=1) vs. WSH (12/16), became the second defenseman in Wild history to register a point in each of his first two games with the franchise (also C. Barker, 2 GP in 09-10)...Made his Wild debut vs. BOS (12/14), becoming the 32nd player and sixth defenseman to score a goal (1-0=1) in their first game with the franchise...Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:38 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (22:51) and second in power play TOI/G (4:38) this season.

Kirill Kaprizov: Notched three points (1-2=3) at CBJ (12/18) to reach 427 career points (207-220=427) and move past Jared Spurgeon (119-305=424) for third in Wild history...With his three-point performance (1-2=3) at CBJ (12/18), reached 220 career assists and passed Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history...Owns an active three-game point streak (4-3=7)...With a PPG vs. WSH (12/16), reached 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history...Ranks third in the NHL with 22 goals, T-4th with eight PPG, eighth with 115 shots and T-9th with 41 points (22-19=41)...Leads the Wild in goals and ranks T-1st in points (21-17=38) and second in assists...Currently tied for second in franchise history with 145 power-play points (70-75=145), matching Marian Gaborik (145) and trailing Mikko Koivu (251).

Carson Lambos: Made his NHL debut at CBJ (12/18), posting a plus-1 rating, one shot and one blocked shot.

Jared Spurgeon: With a PPG vs. BOS (12/14), reached 136 career PPP (36-100=136) and tied Andrew Brunnette (55-81=136) for fifth in franchise history. The goal marked the 119th of his career, tied with Brunnette for eighth in franchise history.

Vladimir Tarasenko: Owns four points (3-1=4) in his last two games and seven points (4-3=7) in his last six games.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 170 hits, the highest total in franchise history through a season's first 35 games.

Jesper Wallstedt: With a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18), improved to 10-1-2 (.846) and set the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender, besting Kaapo Kahkonen (14 GP in 2020-21). He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender...Leads the NHL with a 1.96 GAA, .936 SV% and four shutouts.

Danila Yurov: Owns five points (1-4=5) in his last four games...Posted a career-high three points (1-2=3) and won 10-of-11 faceoffs taken (90.9 pct) vs. WSH (12/16), the highest single-game faceoff percentage among NHL rookies this season (min. 10 faceoffs).

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Newly acquired Wild defenseman **Quinn Hughes** was selected to the United States' preliminary roster. The native of Orlando, Fla., has represented the United States in numerous international tournaments, including the 2019 and 2018 IIHF Men's World Championship and the 2019 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

LOCKING IT DOWN

- Leads NHL with seven shutouts this season, one shy of tying the single-season franchise record (eight SO, five occurrences, last 2015-16 season).
- Leads the NHL with 1.78 goals against/game and 41 goals allowed since November 1.

- Has killed 51-of-58 opponent power-play opportunities since Nov. 1 and ranks third the NHL with a 87.9 PK% in that span.
- Did not allowed a PPG in nine consecutive games (23-for-23) from 11/19 - 12/6, tied for the longest overall streak in the NHL this season (also UTA, 10/28 - 11/17). The nine-game streak without allowing a PPG was tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history.
- The full streak ended after 24 consecutive kills (11/19 - 12/8) when Seattle scored a second-period PPG.
- Minnesota hasn't allowed a PPG in 18 out of 23 games played since Nov. 1.
- Is allowing 2.37 opponent power-play opportunities per game this season, first in the NHL.

BY THE PERIOD

- Ranks second in the NHL with 21 first-period goals allowed this season and third with a plus-8 rating in the opening frame.
- Ranks third in the NHL with 24 second-period goals allowed and a plus-11 goal differential in the middle frame this season.
- Ranks T-7th in NHL with six extra-time victories (three OTW, three SOW).
- Since losing three out of four extra-time games to start the season, has won five out of seven extra-time games.

OUT IN FRONT

- Has scored first in 22 games this season, T-3rd in the NHL.
- Owns a 16-3-3 record (.795) when scoring first this season.
- From 11/7 - 11/26/25, did not trail in regulation for over eight consecutive games, a franchise-record span of 505:41 minutes, the 17th longest streak in NHL history.
- The Wild scored the game-opening goal in 12 consecutive contests from 10/30 - 11/23, a franchise record. The run was tied for the 10th-longest streak in NHL history and is the longest since Colorado's 13-game streak in the 2022-23 season.
- As a franchise, holds a 672-179-109 all-time record (.757) when scoring first in a regular-season game.

RED HOT AND ROLLING

- Has won six consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NHL, the team's second-longest of the season (seven GP, 11/15 - 11/29) and T-9th longest in franchise history.
- Ranks third in the NHL with 47 points (21-9-5), T-2nd highest total through the first 35 games of a season in franchise history.
- Owns an active 13-game home point streak (11-0-2) since Nov. 1, tied for the longest in franchise history (two other occurrences) and the second-longest streak in the NHL this season (COL, active 15 game streak).
- Is 18-3-2 (.826) since Nov. 1, ranking first in the NHL in wins, points (38), team GAA (1.75) and team SV% (.940) while ranking second with a plus-34 goal differential.
- Recorded an 12-game point streak (10-0-2) from 11/7 - 12/2, the third-longest run in franchise history and the club's longest since a franchise-record 14-game run (11-0-3) from 2/17 - 3/15/23.
- Posted a seven-game win streak from 11/15 - 11/28/25, tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history and the team's longest since an eight-game run from 11/24 - 12/9/21.
- Finished 11-1-2 (.857) in November, ranking T-1st in the NHL in wins and points (24).
- Minnesota's 24 points in November 2025 was the highest November total in franchise history, while its 11 wins ranked T-1st (also Nov. 2011).
- Matt Boldy and Kirill Kaprizov were Minnesota's co-leaders in goals in November, with each player scoring 10 goals in 14 games. It marked the first time in team history that the Wild had two players each score 10 or more goals in the same calendar month.

WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- The Wild is 4-3-0 this season when playing in the first game of a back-to-back, and 3-1-3 when playing in the second game of a back-to-back.
- The team's back-to-back against Ottawa (12/13) and Boston (12/14) marked the 28th time in team history the Wild has played back-to-back home games. When playing back-to-back home games, the Wild holds a 19-7-2 all-time record in the first contest and a 17-4-7 all-time record in the second contest.
- The Wild holds an 135-146-54 (.484) all-time record when playing the second game of back-to-backs. Since the 2006-07 season, Minnesota is 121-100-41 (.540) in the second game of back-to-backs.

- With his three-point performance (1-2=3) at CBJ (12/18), reached 220 career assists and passed Marian Gaborik (218) for seventh in franchise history
- Ranks third in the NHL with 22 goals, T-4th with eight PPG, eighth with 115 shots and T-9th with 41 points (22-19=41).
- Leads the Wild in goals and ranks T-1st in points (21-17=38) and second in assists.
- Notched a PPG vs. WSH (12/16) to reach 70 career PPG, establishing a new franchise record, and 206 career goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (205) for second in franchise history.

- Currently tied for second in franchise history with 145 power-play points (70-75=145), matching Marian Gaborik (145) and trailing Mikko Koivu (251).
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. COL (11/28) to reach 201 career goals and move past Zach Parise (199 goals) for third in franchise history.
- Reached 200 career goals in his 344th career game, becoming fourth-fastest player drafted in fifth round or later to hit the landmark (Brett Hull, 280 GP; Luc Robitaille, 323 GP; Pavel Bure, 328 GP).
- With two goals vs. COL (11/28), reached 115 career home goals, moving past Mikko Koivu (113 home goals) for most in franchise history.

- Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the third-highest total by an NHL forward this season.
- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possession of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Posted a career-high 11 shots on goal vs. CBJ (10/11), tying the franchise single-game record (Parise, 1/17/19 vs. ANA; Rolston, 10/7/06 vs. ANA).

- Per NHL Stats, Kaprizov is the only player among all 32 NHL clubs to hold the franchise record (outright or tied) for all three scoring milestones: goal streak, assist streak and point streak.

A QUINN-TESSENTIAL ADDITION

- **Quinn Hughes** skated a career-high 32:02 of TOI at CBJ (12/18), the second highest TOI total in an NHL game this season.
- Posted an assist (0-1=1) vs. WSH (12/16) to become the second defenseman in Wild history to register a point in each of his first two games with the franchise (also C. Barker, 2 GP in 09-10).
- Leads all NHL skaters with a 27:38 TOI/G, even strength TOI/G (22:51) and second in power play TOI/G (4:38) this season.
- Made his Wild debut vs. BOS (12/14), becoming the 32nd player and sixth defenseman to score a goal (1-0=1) in their first game with the franchise.

- **Marcus Johansson** ranks T-6th in the NHL with four GWG this season.

- **Jesper Wallstedt** posted a 27-save win at CBJ (12/18) and improved to 10-1-2 (.846), setting the franchise benchmark for fewest games to 10 wins in a season by a rookie goaltender (previously Kaapo Kahkonen, 14 GP in 2020-21).
- He also tied Devan Dubnyk (13 GP in 2014-15) for the fastest to 10 wins by any Wild goaltender.
- Leads the NHL with a 1.96 GAA, .936 SV% and four shutouts.
- Owns shutouts in four out of his last nine games.
- Posted a 33-save shutout at EDM (12/2) for fifth career shutout in his 15th career game, the second-fewest appearances in NHL history to reach the landmark (F. Brimsek, nine GP on 12/18/38).

- Following his shutout win at EDM (12/2), became the second-youngest goaltender in NHL history (23 years, 18 days) with a season-opening point streak of at least 10 games (P. Peeters, 27 GP in 79-80 w/ PHI - 22 years old).
- Was named the NHL's Rookie of the Month for November after going 6-0-0 with a league-best 1.14 GAA, .967 SV% and three shutouts. He joined Brock Faber (Jan. 2024) as the only Wild players to receive the award.
- Recorded a career-high 42 saves vs. CAR (11/19), tied for the second-highest single game total by a Wild rookie.
- Posted a shutout streak of 175:12 across parts of four games from 11/7 - 11/19, the longest shutout streak by a rookie in franchise history and fourth-longest overall.
- Posted his second consecutive shutout with a 28-save performance vs. ANA (11/15), becoming the first rookie and youngest goaltender in team history to record consecutive shutouts.

- In nine starts since Nov. 16, is 7-1-1 with a 1.64 GAA, .938 SV% and two shutouts.
- Started his 157th game in a Wild sweater at SEA (12/8), moving past Dwayne Roloson (156) for fourth in franchise history.
- Stopped all 19 shots faced at PIT (11/21) to reach 13 career shutouts and pass Manny Fernandez (12 SO) for fourth-most in Wild history.
