

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 16, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. MONTREAL CANADIENS [2]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game homestand on Saturday night by welcoming the Montreal Canadiens. Mikael Backlund would score the only goal of the first, deflecting a MacKenzie Weegar point shot to help the Flames lead 1-0 through 20. In the second, the teams would trade goals with Backlund netting his second of the night, and 200<sup>th</sup> of his career, followed by Martin Pospisil recording his seventh on the campaign. Montreal would score a pair in the middle frame as well, but the Flames led 3-2 through 40. In the third, Nazem Kadri would score just 1:01 into the final frame to give the Flames some breathing room, followed by Daniil Miromanov's second as a Flame to help Calgary knock-off Montreal 5-2.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Capitals. The Flames fell 3-2 in a shootout in meeting number one.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 5-8-2 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 14-13-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

**BACKLUND 200:**

Flames captain Mikael Backlund scored two goals on Saturday against Montreal to record the 199<sup>th</sup> and 200<sup>th</sup> NHL goals of his career. Backlund has become the 11<sup>th</sup> player in franchise history to reach the 200-goal plateau, and just the second Swedish-born skater in Flames history to reach 200 goals, joining Kent Nilsson (229). The Flames captain also recorded his second two-goal effort of the season (Nov. 4 at SEA) and has now registered 21 such efforts in his career.

**HOWLIN' FOR YOU:**

Dustin Wolf turned aside 36 of the 38 shots he faced on Saturday night against Montreal to earn back-to-back victories, and his third win of the year. Since March 14<sup>th</sup> Wolf has the second-most saves in the NHL with 64, behind only Andrei Vasilevsky (72) and has a 2-0-0 record with a .955 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average.

**SHARKNADO:**

Yegor Sharangovich collected his team-leading 28<sup>th</sup> goal of the season on Thursday against Vegas. The last player to record as many in their first season with the Flames was Michael Cammalleri, who had 39 tallies for the Flames during the 2008-09 season. Sharangovich now has seven goals since March 1<sup>st</sup>, only Krill Kaprizov (9) and Timo Meier (8) have scored more this month. With two more goals, Sharangovich can become the sixth player to score at least 30 goals in his first season with the Flames franchise. Only Michael Cammalleri (39 in 2008-09) and Hakan Loob (30 in 1983-84) have done so in the past 40 years.

**MIRO, MIRO ON THE WALL:**

Daniil Miromanov scored his second goal as a Flame on Saturday against Montreal to help the Flames knock-off the Canadiens 5-2. Miromanov has become the fifth defenceman in Flames franchise history to score 2 goals within his first 5 games with the team, and the first to do so since Phil Housley in 1995.

**DEFENSIVE SCORING:**

With Daniil Miromanov's third period marker against Montreal on Saturday, the Flames have now gotten 41 goals from defenceman in 2023-24. The Flames' 41 goals from blueliners are the third-most by a defensive-core in the league so far this season, with only the Colorado Avalanche (54) and the Montreal Canadiens (42) having more goals from defenceman on the campaign. MacKenzie Weegar leads all Flames rearguards with 15 goals, which also rank tied for the third-most in goals among all defenceman in the league this season.

**HUBY-DOO:**

Jonathan Huberdeau recorded a pair of assists on Saturday against Montreal to register his ninth multi-assist game of the season, and 13<sup>th</sup> multi-point effort on the campaign. 21 of Huberdeau's 34 helpers are primary assists, which is tied with Nazem Kadri for the most on the Flames.

**HEY A.J.:**

A.J. Greer made his return to the Flames lineup on Saturday for the first time since January 25<sup>th</sup> after missing 18 games with a lower-body injury. The 27-year-old skated in 8:30 of ice-time in his return to the lineup against Montreal and has a career-best six goals along with four assists for 10 points in 48 games with the Flames this season. Greer was claimed off waivers from Boston on October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2023.



**HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Mikael Backlund opened the scoring against Montreal on Saturday for his 41<sup>st</sup>-career game-opening goal. Only three players in Flames franchise history have scored the first goal of a game more: Jarome Iginla (93), Theo Fleury (47), and Kent Nilsson (45).

With Dustin Wolf's fourth career win, he passes Curtis Joseph on the Flames all-time wins list. He now sits one win away from tying Hockey Hall of Fame honoree Grant Fuhr in wins with the Flames.

MacKenzie Weegar registered three helpers on Saturday against Montreal for his first three assists game since January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022 against the Columbus Blue Jackets as a member of the Florida Panthers.
