GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Flames this season. Dallas won their previous meeting against Calgary, defeating them 6-2 on Dec. 8. The teams face each other once more this season on March 27 in Calgary.
- Dallas has won six consecutive games at home. A victory over the Flames tonight would give the team their first sevengame home winning streak since they won eight straight games at the American Airlines Cetner from Nov. 13 to Dec. 6, 2021. Please note that this does not include streaks that span over two seasons.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 40-19-2 record for 82 points and a .672 points percentage. Their point total and points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season and their 40 wins were second entering play Wednesday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only NHL team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.41, fourth) and goals against per game (2.57, third).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 31 of the 61 games that they have played this year.

EXTINGUISHING THE FLAMES

- Dallas is 78-72-36 all-time vs. Calgary, including a 45-31-18 mark at home.
- Jamie Benn has 45 points (23-22-45) in 44 career games against the Flames.
 - o His 45 career points against Calgary rank eighth among all active NHL skaters.
- Colin Blackwell has nine points (3-6—9) in nine career games against Calgary.
- Matt Duchene has 13 points (4-9—13) in his last 10 games against the Flames dating back to Feb. 27, 2020.
- Roope Hintz has seven points (2-5—7) in his last six games against Calgary.
- Mason Marchment enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Flames, earning three points (2-1—3) during those games. In all, Marchment has six points (3-3—6) in seven career games vs. Calgary.
- Jason Robertson has 14 points (8-6—14) in 10 career games against Calgary and has totaled at least one point in nine of those 10 games.
 - o Robertson enters tonight's contest riding a nine-game point streak against the Flames.
- Thomas Harley registered two goals in Dallas' last game vs. Calgary on Dec. 8. Harley enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Flames (3-0-3).
- Mikael Granlund has totaled 11 points (3-8—11) in his last 10 games against Calgary. In all, Granlund has 21 points (5-16—21) in 31 career games against the Flames.

SEEING STARS

- Roope Hintz was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 2 after tallying nine points (2-7—9) in three games played. It is the second time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after previously being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on April 12, 2021.
- Hintz enters tonight's contest having tallied at least three points in the last three games that he has played, notching four assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings, scoring one goal and adding three assists on March 2 against the Blues, and then scoring two goals and adding two assists on March 4 against the Devils.
 - Hintz has now recorded six four-point games in his career.
 - o His four assists against the Kings were a single-game career high.
- With two assists against the Devils, Hintz became the first player in franchise history to have nine assists over the course
 of three games according to NHL Stats.
- **Hintz**' assists against the Devils also brought his career point total up to 359, which gave him sole possession of 20th on the franchise's all-time scoring list, surpassing Loui Eriksson (357).
- According to NHL Stats, Hintz was just the second Stars/North Stars player in the past 40 years to post consecutive four-point games, following Tyler Seguin (2 GP in 2018-19).
- **Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a five-game point streak, scoring three goals and adding 11 assists during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him a point in six consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 18 to 31, 2023.
- If Hintz were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in four consecutive games for the
 first time since Jan. 20 to 25, 2022.
- Hintz has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 20, totaling 40 points (19-21—40) in 40 games.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored a goal and added an assist in Dallas' last game to extend his point streak to a career-best seven games. His seven-game point streak was the fifth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - His assist was the 85th of his career, which surpassed Buffalo's Owen Power (84) for the most by a player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft.
- Johnston's point streak is the longest by a Stars skater this season. If he were to extend it tonight, it would make him the first Dallas player to have a point streak of at least eight games since Jamie Benn did so from March 12 to 28, 2024.
- **Johnston** has also recorded a point in each of the last 13 games he has played at the American Airlines Center. A goal or an assist tonight would make **Johnston** the third player in franchise history to have a point in 14 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- **Johnston** now has 57 points (22-35—57) in 61 games this season, which ranks third on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 50-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 77 points, which would be a career high.
- Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Oct. 27, totaling 52 points (21-31—52) in 52 games played.
- Johnston scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over
 the St. Louis Blues. Johnston tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before
 turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, Johnston's hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of **Johnston's** goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three power-play goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.

- Johnston's performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 - that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single
- Johnston's first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward.
- Johnston scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Wednesday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for third in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since Johnston made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (Roope Hintz; 7) and are tied for eighth in the NHL.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 26-11-2 record in 40 games for 54 points and a 0.692 points percentage. The team's win total, point total and points percentage during that span all topped the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 25.2 percent and 85.9 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

Robertson (fifth) and Johnston (10th) both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring since Dec. 1 entering play Wednesday.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley scored the game-winning goal and added an assist in Dallas' last game a 4-3 win over New Jersey on March 4 - to give him 14 points (4-10-14) in his last 11 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 14 points during that span are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
 - Harley scored with five seconds remaining to win the game for Dallas. According to NHL Stats, he became the eighth player in franchise history to score a go-ahead goal with five or fewer seconds remaining in regulation.
- If Harley were to have at least two points again tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- A goal or an assist tonight would also extend Harley's point streak to five games, which would set a career high for the defenseman.
- Harley's 14 points since Jan. 31 were tied with Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin for the most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Wednesday. Both blueliners have scored four goals and notched 10 assists since Jan. 31.

- o His 14 points were also tied for 11th among all NHL skaters during that span entering play Wednesday.
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 70-40. Entering play Wednesday, his plus-30 goal differential was the second-best mark in the NHL this year and his 70 on-ice goals for ranked ninth.
 - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-28 plus/minus rating this season, which was tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- In all, Harley has totaled 37 points (11-26-37) in 59 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 35 assists and 50 points.
 - His 11 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Wednesday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 25:26 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked fourth in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - Harley has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in five of those 11 games during that span.

POWER UP

- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in six of their last seven games played. If they were to score a powerplay goal again tonight, it would mark the first time this season that they have scored at least one power-play goal in four consecutive games.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 24-for-67 on the power play for a 35.8 percent success rate, which ranked second in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- The team's 24 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (26) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson have each scored five power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the thirdmost in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday. Only Detroit's Dylan Larkin (7) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (7) have scored more power-play goals since the turn of the new year.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a five-game point streak:
 - He recorded two assists on March 4 against the Devils.
 - He tallied an assist on March 2 against the Blues.
 - He scored a goal and added two assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings. 0
 - He notched a goal and an assist on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets.
 - He scored a hat trick on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Roberston points in six consecutive games for the first time since he earned points in seven consecutive games from Dec. 18, 2023 to Jan. 2, 2024.
- An assist would give him a five-game assist streak for the first time since Dec. 21 to 31, 2022. It would also make him the fourth Dallas skater this year to have a five-game assist streak, joining Jamie Benn, Miro Heiskanen and Wyatt Johnston.
- Robertson's assist against the Blues was his 60th point of the season. 2024-25 is now the third consecutive year in which he has recorded at least 60 points.
- Roberston's goal against the Kings was his 25th of the season, making the 2024-25 season the fourth consecutive year in which he has scored at least 25 goals. Roberston is sixth Dallas player in the past 30 years to record four or more consecutive 25-goal campaigns, joining Jamie Benn (6), Tyler Seguin (6), Mike Modano (5), Joe Pavelski (4) and Loui Eriksson (4).*
- Robertson's hat trick on Feb. 23 was the fourth of his career. Only three players in Stars/North Stars history have as many at age 25 or younger: Dino Ciccarelli (8), Tyler Seguin (7) and Steve Payne (6).*
- All three of Roberston's hat trick goals game in the second period, making him the first Stars skater to score three goals in a single period since Jamie Benn did so on April 7, 2018.*
- Robertson's three goals came within a 8:40 span, marking the fastest hat trick by a Stars player since April 7, 2018 when Jamie Benn scored three in 5:17.*
- Robertson's younger brother Nicholas also scored twice for the Maple Leafs on Feb. 23, making the Robertsons the first pair of brothers to score multiple goals on the same day since Pavel Bure and Valeri Bure on March 1, 2000.*

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

Stars rookie Lian Bichsel has played in 11 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-9 during even-strength play when Bichsel has been on the ice.

- Additionally, since Jan. 23 during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outshot their opponents 78-63 and had 77 scoring chances
 to their 68 when Bichsel has been on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - o His 55.3 shots for percentage tops all Stars skaters during that span.
- Bichsel had two assists in Dallas' game on Feb. 8, an 8-3 win over the San Jose Sharks. It marked both the first multipoint performance of his career and the first time that he has recorded a point in a road game.
- **Bichsel's** assists brought his season point total up to five (2-3—5), which tied him for eighth in scoring among rookie defensemen this season entering play Wednesday. He is also averaging 0.26 points per game this year, which was also tied for eighth among rookie defensemen.
- **Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in nine of the 11 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 16.6 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked seventh among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Wednesday.
- Despite only playing in 19 games this season, **Bichsel** ranks second on the Stars roster with 79 hits. His 79 hits also ranked 10th among all NHL rookies this season entering play Wednesday.
- There have been seven instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with Bichsel owning six of them.
- Bichsel is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game six times. No other rookie has done it more than four times this season entering play Wednesday.

NEW YEAR, NEW ME

- Since Jan. 1, Jason Robertson, Wyatt Johnston and Matt Duchene were all ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring entering play Wednesday. Robertson's 34 points (16-18—34) ranked fourth, Johnston (13-19—32) was tied for fifth and Duchene (11-18—29) was tied for eighth.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars were the only team to have multiple players ranked in the top 10 in league scoring since the New Year.
- Robertson's 16 goals ranked third in the NHL since the start of the New Year entering play Wednesday.
- Thomas Harley has scored seven goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.

GOALIE GANG

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 13-4-1 record in his last 18 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .915 save percentage and a 2.43 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 13 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
 - Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last five games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .927 save percentage and a 2.21 goals-against average in those contests.
 - DeSmith's five-game win streak is the longest such streak of his career.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .907 save percentage this season, which was the third-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. Only Winnipeg (.916) and Tampa Bay (.909) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.56 goals-against average this season also ranked third in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.2 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 26, and their -20 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in both total penalty minutes (410) and penalty minutes per game (6:43) entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (211:21) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:28) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** and **Sam Steel** both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Wednesday.
 - o Harley, who has played 103:55 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.46.
 - Steel ranked third with 3.76. He has totaled 111:43 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

DALLAS MAVRIK

- Stars rookie Mavrik Bourque has recorded a point in seven of the last nine games that he has played dating back to Feb.2, which includes a career-best six game point streak from Feb. 2 to 25.
- Bourque's point streak was the longest by a Stars rookie since Jason Robertson had a point in nine straight games from April 14 to 27, 2021.

- Bourque tallied an assist in Dallas' March 2 game, which was his 20th point of the season. Bourque (20) and Logan Stankoven (29) are the first set of Stars rookies to have at least 20 points the same year since Miro Heiskanen (33) and Roope Hintz (22) did so in 2018-19.
 - o Dallas rookies have combined to score 70 points this season, which was the third-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only the San Jose Sharks (103) and Montreal Canadiens (72).
- Since Jan. 1, **Bourque** has scored seven goals including the Stars fourth of the game in their game on Feb. 25 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His seven goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Wednesday, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (8).
 - o **Bourque's** seven goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fifth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, **Bourque** has totaled 13 points (6-7—13) since Jan. 1, which is six points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His 13 points since Jan. 1 were tied for sixth among all NHL rookies entering play Wednesday.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have outscored their opponents 13-9 when **Bourque** has been on the ice during even-strength play.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (358), Jason Robertson (271), Esa Lindell (231) and Wyatt Johnston (225). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 4 against the Devils was the 358th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 271-game Iron Man streak is the 12th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Wednesday.
- Lindell's 231-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- Johnston's Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history
 to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is eight assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is four goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is seven assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is eight assists shy of surpassing Miro Heiskanen (225) the 20th-most assists in franchise history.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** played for the Flames in 1992-93 to 1993-94.
- Flames defenseman Joel Hanley played 161 games for the Dallas Stars from 2018-19 to 2023-24.
