FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 19, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. OTTAWA SENATORS [3] (OT)

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a five-game homestand on Thursday night by welcoming the Ottawa Senators to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Calgary would open the scoring just past the midway point of the first with Blake Coleman finding a loose puck in front and depositing home his seventh on the campaign to give the Flames a 1-0 lead. Ottawa would find a response late in the frame to knot this game at ones through 20. Neither team would light the lamp in the second despite combining for 21 shots, and this game headed into the third still deadlocked at one a piece. The Senators would take their first lead of the night following a Ridly Greig marker, but Jonathan Huberdeau responded on the powerplay under a minute later to draw the Flames level. Nothing could separate these teams through the rest of the third, but in overtime Ottawa would score to knock off the Flames 3-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Blackhawks. Calgary won 3-1 in their first meeting with Chicago on October 15th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-3-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 7-6-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Chicago Blackhawks to the Scotiabank Saddledome on October 15th for the first of their three meetings. It would take until the 16:01 mark of the first for the game's opening goal, and it would be Matt Coronato who jammed home his own rebound to give the Flames a 1-0 lead. Just 10 seconds later, Chicago's captain Nick Foligno would deflect a point-shot home to tie things up, and that's the way it remained heading into the intermission. In the second, Calgary would strike on the power play with Andrei Kuzmenko redirecting a Jonathan Huberdeau shot to reclaim the Flames lead through 40. In the third, Dustin Wolf and the Flames would slam the door shut, Coronato added an empty netter for his second of the night, Calgary skated away with a 3-1 win over the Blackhawks.

JAKE AND THE BEAN STOCK:

Defencemen Jake Bean skated in his 200th NHL game in Calgary and Chicago's first meeting on October 15th to become the 11th blueliner from the 2016 NHL draft class to reach the 200-game mark. The Calgary, AB native made his NHL debut on November 27th, 2018 in Montreal as a member of the Carolina Hurricanes. Bean has registered 14 goals and 45 assists for 98 points in 217 NHL games, with a goal and two helpers in 20 contests so far this season.

CHICAGO CALGARY TIES:

Blackhawks blueliner T.J. Brodie was drafted by the Flames in the fourth round (114th overall) in the 2008 NHL Draft. The Chatham, ON native would spend 10 seasons with the Flames organization, establishing himself as a full-time NHLer beginning in the 2013-14 campaign. Chicago forward Taylor Hall was born in Calgary and is looking to skate in his 36th contest against his hometown team.

Flames Head Coach Ryan Huska played his lone NHL game as a member of the Chicago Blackhawks, their opponent on that night was the Calgary Flames. Flames forwards Walker Duehr and Matt Coronato and goaltender Dan Vladar all spent time with the Chicago Steel of the USHL. Both Duehr and Vladar spent one season with the Chicago Steel (Vladar: 2015-16), (Duehr: 2016-17) while Coronato spent both the 2019-20 and 2020-21 campaigns with the Steel. In his second season in the USHL, Coronato would help guide Chicago to a USHL Championship, earning USHL Forward of the Year honours along the way.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Tyson Barrie leads all players on the Flames roster in points against Chicago with 35 (11G, 24A) in 41 career games against the Blackhawks. Barrie's 35 career points against Chicago are the most he has registered against any single NHL franchise.

Tyson Barrie's first NHL game came against the Chicago Blackhawks on February 7th, 2012 as a member of the Colorado Avalanche.

Kevin Rooney scored his first NHL goal against the Chicago Blackhawks as a member of the New Jersey Devils on January 14th, 2019.
