

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****January 20, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. EDMONTON OILERS [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a six game homestand on Saturday night by welcoming the Edmonton Oilers to the Scotiabank Saddledome for Hockey Day in Canada. The Flames would trail 1-0 through 20 with Ryan McLeod scoring the only goal of the opening frame. The Flames would find an answer just under two minutes into the second with MacKenzie Weegar scoring his 10th of the season to tie the game at one through 40. The Oilers would re-take the lead in the third and add an empty netter to take round two of the Battle of Alberta 3-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Blues. The Flames suffered a 3-0 setback in their first matchup on October 26th.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-7-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 14-12-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the St. Louis Blues on October 26th for the first meeting of the season-series. The Blues would open the scoring midway through the opening frame with Kasper Kapanen netting his first of the season. St. Louis would add to their lead shortly after with Nick Leddy finding his way onto the scoresheet to give the Blues a 2-0 advantage through 20. There would be no other scoring in the contest until an empty netter by Oskar Sundqvist in the late stages of the third, and the Flames suffered a 3-0 setback.

RETURN OF THE MAC:

With his tally on Saturday night, MacKenzie Weegar scored his 10th goal of the season to reach the 10-goal mark for the first time in his career. Weegar is tied for the fourth-most goals among defencemen so far this season, trailing only Quinn Hughes (11), Evan Bouchard (11) and Rasmus Dahlin (13), and his 10 tallies currently have him tied for the fourth-most on the Flames. The 30-year-old's 27 points set the mark among Flames blueliners, with Rasmus Andersson (27), and Noah Hanifin (24) sitting in second and third respectively.

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

With his first period marker against Toronto last Thursday, Yegor Sharangovich registered seven goals over a five-game stretch to score the most over a five-game span by a Flame since Matthew Tkachuk from March 10-19, 2019. Since January 1st, Sharangovich's eight goals are tied for the fourth-most in the NHL and trail only Elias Pettersson (12), Sam Reinhart (10) and Auston Matthews (9). The 25-year-old is now five goals away from matching his career-best of 24 which he set during the 2021-22 campaign as a member of the New Jersey Devils.

AS A UNIT:

Since January 1st, the Calgary Flames have scored the sixth-most goals as a team in the NHL with 36. Yegor Sharangovich leads the charge with eight tallies while Blake Coleman has the second-most at seven followed by Nazem Kadri with six. The Flames are tied for the ninth-most points in the NHL since the calendar flip, with 12, sporting a 6-4-0 record and a .600 point-percentage.

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

Adam Klapka made his NHL debut on Saturday night against the Edmonton Oilers. The Prague, CZE native skated in 33 games for the Calgary Wranglers prior to his recall, notching 10 goals and 11 assists for 21 points along with 42 penalty minutes. At the time of his recall, Klapka was three goals away from matching his previous season total of 13 which he set in 60 games during his first North American pro season. The 23-year-old was tied for the team lead in goals for the Wranglers during the 2023 Calder Cup Playoffs with four tallies in nine games and was signed as a free agent by Calgary on May 16, 2022.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson has recorded three game-winning goals this season and is one GWG shy of matching his previous season-high which he set last year with four. Since the beginning of 2022-23, Andersson has registered seven game-winning goals which is tied with Josh Morrissey (7) and Dougie Hamilton (7) for the most among all blueliners in the NHL over that span.

DOME SWEET DOME:



The Flames get set for game four of a six game homestand starting tonight against the St. Louis Blues. This is tied for the Flames longest homestand with their other six-game stretch at the 'Dome coming from November 27th to December 9th when they went 3-3-0. Following tonight, the Flames will welcome the Columbus Blue Jackets, and Chicago Blackhawks to close out the six-game stand.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Per NHL Edge, MacKenzie Weegar has the fastest max speed by a defenceman so far during the 2023-24 campaign, with a 23.61 MPH burst earlier this season versus Vegas.

Flames forward Jonathan Huberdeau and Blues netminder Jordan Binnington were opponents during the 2011 Memorial Cup. Binnington was a member of the Owen Sound Attack while Jonathan Huberdeau skated for the Saint John Sea Dogs and the two teams met in the group stage of the tournament with Huberdeau scoring the game-winning goal in overtime on Binnington.
