<u>FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP</u> November 7, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. BOSTON BRUINS [4] (OT)

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a three-game eastern road swing on Thursday night in Boston. The Bruins would open the scoring 2:04 into the contest courtesy of Hampus Lindholm, but just 19 seconds later Tyson Barrie would blast a point shot past Joonas Korpisalo to level things at one, and that is how the first 20 ended. In the second, Boston would net a pair to lead 3-1 through 40. Calgary would try to claw back in the third and it took just 58 seconds to draw within one as Ygor Sharangovich tipped a point shot home. Later in the frame, Nazem Kadri would bury his fourth third-period marker of the season to tie things up and force overtime. In the extra frame, Boston would score to win 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Sabres. Calgary and Buffalo split the season-series in 2023-24, with the home team winning on both occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-0-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 4-1-1 against Eastern Conference opponents.

ON THE HUNT:

On Thursday afternoon, the Flames announced the recall of winger Dryden Hunt from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. Hunt played in 12 games with the Wranglers this season, registering a pair of goals along with eight assists for 10 points and eight penalty minutes. Hunt split last season between the Flames, where he scored three goals and five assists for eight points in 28 games, and the Wranglers, where he netted seven goals and 15 assists for 22 points in 23 games. The 28-year-old veteran has 230 NHL games to his credit with 18 goals and 33 assists for 51 points and 121 penalty minutes.

BARRIE PICKING:

Tyson Barrie scored his first goal as a member of the Flames on Thursday night in Boston. The 33-year-old blueliner now has 110 goals in his 816 career NHL games. Barrie is currently sitting at 397 assists and needs three more to become the 10th active defenceman in the NHL to reach 400 assists.

SHARK ATTACK:

With his goal on Thursday in Boston, Yegor Sharangovich has tallied 33 goals in his first 89 games as a member of the Calgary Flames. In Calgary Flames history (1980-pres.) only eight skaters total have registered more goals through their first 90 games in Flames colours than Sharangovich; Joe Nieuwendyk (61), Lanny McDonald (59), Joe Mullen (53), Mike Bullard (46), German Titov (37) Eddy Beers (35), Doug Gilmour (34) and Rene Bourque (34). Sharangovich's 33rd marker tied him with Mel Bridgman, Hakan Loob, Theo Fleury and Mike Cammalleri for the most goals in 90-or-less games in Calgary.

THIRD PERIOD SCORING:

With two goals in the third period on Thursday in Boston, Calgary has now upped their third-period goal total to 21 on the 2024-25 campaign. Only the Winnipeg Jets, Los Angeles Kings, and Vegas Golden Knights have scored more times in the final frame of a game this season.

A SHOOTING ZAR:

Following his goal on Tuesday in Montreal, the Flames have won seven-straight games in which Connor Zary scores a goal, a streak which began on February 6th, 2024. Calgary is also 10-1-0 in the last 11 games in which Zary has found the back of the net.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In Calgary's lone trip to the KeyBank Center last season, the Flames finished the game with four go-ahead goals, tied for the second-highest total in a game in franchise history. The last time Calgary recorded as many on the road was in 2013-14 with four on Nov. 18, 2013 at WPG. Mike Cammalleri, T.J. Brodie, Lance Bouma, and Jiri Hudler were the goal scorers on that night in a 5-4 shootout win for the Flames.

Four of Nazem Kadri's five goals this season have come in the third period.

Sabres defenceman Dennis Gilbert spent the past two seasons with the Flames organization, skating in 57 games with the Flames and an additional 26 games with the AHL's Calgary Wranglers.
