## FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP March 12, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. COLORADO AVALANCHE [6]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames kicked-off a four-game homestand on Tuesday night by welcoming the Colorado Avalanche. Colorado would open the scoring 2:05 into the contest courtesy of Mikko Rantanen who put the visitors up 1-0. Calgary would respond shortly after with Daniil Miromanov netting his first as a Flame to draw Calgary level, before Walker Duehr found a puck in the slot and fired home his second of the year to give the Flames a 2-1 lead through 20. Colorado would five in the second, and ultimately take this one 6-2.

#### **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. The Flames have won two of the clubs' first three meetings.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-7-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 18-16-2 against Western Conference opponents.

#### **VERSUS VEGAS THIS SEASON:**

The Calgary Flames opened a six-game homestand back on November 27<sup>th</sup> by welcoming the Vegas Golden Knights to the Scotiabank Saddledome for their first meeting. Calgary would find themselves trailing for the majority of the contest until A.J. Greer finally solved Adin Hill by finding a loose puck in the slot and depositing his then fourth on the season into the net to tie the game at ones. This contest would require overtime and in the dying embers of the extra frame, MacKenzie Weegar took a puck end-to-end a ripped home the game-winner as Calgary prevailed 2-1. In their second meeting, the Flames again found themselves trailing in the third, until Yegor Sharangovich tied the game with the Flames net empty and a minute left in regulation. Calgary would eventually fall in overtime. In the clubs' most recent meeting in Vegas, Calgary would score two in the first courtesy of Blake Coleman and Nazem Kadri, and another in the second off the stick of Mikael Backlund and hold off the Golden Knights for a 3-1 win.

#### MIRO, MIRO ON THE WALL:

In Tuesday's game against Colorado, defenceman Daniil Miromanov scored his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames. Miromanov now has three goals and five assists for eight points in his 32-game NHL career and became the third Flames skater to score in their home debut this season, joining Connor Zary (Nov. 1 vs. DAL) and Andrei Kuzmenko (Feb. 15 vs. SJS).

#### **BLOCKBUSTER:**

On March 6<sup>th</sup>, the Calgary Flames acquired a first-round pick in the 2026 NHL Draft, a conditional third-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft and defenseman Daniil Miromanov from Vegas in exchange for Noah Hanifin in a three-way deal involving Philadelphia. Hanifin spent six years with Calgary, skating in 420 games with 42 goals and 149 assists for 191 points.

The Conditions on Vegas' 2025 fourth-round pick are as follows:

In the event Vegas advances to the second (2nd) round of the 2024 NHL playoffs, Vegas shall convey their second (2nd) round choice in the 2025 NHL Draft in lieu of 2024 third (3rd) round choice.

#### **OKHOTIUK'S DEBUT:**

Defenceman Nikita Okhotiuk made his Calgary Flames debut on Tuesday against Colorado, skating in 8:23 of ice-time through 11 shifts, registering three hits. The 23-year-old skated in 43 games with the San Jose Sharks this season, scoring one goal and seven assists for eight points along with 44 penalty minutes before being acquired by the Flames at the trade deadline. He made his NHL debut on April 21<sup>st</sup>, 2022 and has 59 games of NHL experience split between San Jose, New Jersey and now Calgary.

#### **LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

Flames captain Mikael Backlund (198-327—525 in 973 GP) is two goals away from becoming the 11<sup>th</sup> player in franchise history with 200 goals. Backlund has 13 goals on the campaign and is looking to become just the second Swedish-born skater in Flames franchise history to reach 200 goals with the Flames and join Kent Nilsson (229).

#### HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

The Calgary Flames announced on Tuesday the recall of goaltender Dustin Wolf from the Calgary Wranglers of the American Hockey League. Wolf had the AHL's third-best save-percentage at 0.923 through his 35 games with the Calgary Wranglers in 2023-24. Wolf has a record of 20-11-3 in American Hockey League play this season along with a 2.43 goals-against average and four shutouts on the campaign. Earlier this season, the 22-year-old represented the Pacific Division at the 2024 AHL All-Star Classic along with Flames forward Matt Coronato where he played parts of four games, helping the Pacific Division win the All-Star Challenge for the second-straight season. The Gilroy, CA native has played six games for the Flames so far this season, picking up his first win of 2023-24 against the Carolina Hurricanes with a 28-save effort.

#### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Nikita Okhotiuk's three hits on Tuesday against Colorado were tied with MacKenzie Weegar for the most among all Flames blueliners.

Nazem Kadri's 10 career goals against Vegas are tied for the fifth-most by a single skater against the Golden Knights. Only Anze Kopitar (14), Kyle Connor (11), Tyler Toffoli (11) and Ryan O'Reilly (11) have more.




