# SMITH ENTERTAINMENT GROUP BRINGS THE NHL TO UTAH

## RYAN AND ASHLEY SMITH

Co-Founders of Smith Entertainment Group

Ryan and Ashley Smith purchased Utah's first-ever NHL Franchise (to be called Utah Hockey Club during their inaugural season) in April 2024, adding it to the Smith Entertainment Group (SEG) portfolio, which also includes the Utah Jazz (NBA), Delta Center, SEG Media, Real Salt Lake (MLS), the Utah Royals (NWSL), America First Credit Union Field, Salt Lake City Stars (NBA G League), Utah Jazz Gaming (NBA 2K League), Real Monarchs (MLS NEXT Pro), and other Utah-centric business ventures. With this move, SEG introduced the second "Big Four" major professional sports league to Utah for the first time in state history.

## THE NHL IS COMING TO UTAH

On April 18, 2024, the NHL Board of Governors voted to establish a new NHL team in Utah and awarded the team to Ryan and Ashley Smith, co-founders of Smith Entertainment Group. The unprecedented deal resulted in Smith Entertainment Group receiving the totality of the Arizona Coyotes' existing hockey assets at that time - its full Reserve List, roster of players and draft picks, and hockey operations department.

## UTAH FANS PACK DELTA CENTER TO WELCOME NHL TO UTAH

On April 24, Utah's first-ever NHL team touched down in Salt Lake City for the first time, welcomed by hundreds of youth hockey players at the airport. The team toured their new home arena, Delta Center, and the Utah Jazz headquarters. Later that evening, the team was welcomed by more than 12,400 fans who packed inside the arena to greet the team, with thousands more outside on the plaza. Each member of the team introduced themselves to their new fanbase by stating their names, positions, and hometowns.

"This is honestly one of the coolest experiences we've all had as hockey players," Alex Kerfoot told the crowd. Bill Armstrong, general manager of Utah Hockey Club said, "We're looking forward to this being the loudest building in the NHL," to which fans responded by chanting, "Utah! Utah! Utah!" Player Lawson Crouse added, "It's been very special. Ever since that plane touched down, we've felt nothing but love and support from you guys. We're very grateful for you. We can't wait to get on the ice."

## FANS INVITED TO HELP NAME UTAH'S NHL FRANCHISE

In May 2024, Smith Entertainment Group launched a multi-phase survey process that invites fans to help pick the permanent name of Utah's NHL franchise. Fans were given more than a dozen names to choose from initially and continue to narrow it down as the voting rounds continue. While the community continues to vote for the official name of the team, for the 2024-25 season, the team will be known as Utah Hockey Club – leading proudly with the state identity and accompanied by a more formal naming convention used by many of the League's other member clubs.

# LEADING THE DRAFT

## **BILL ARMSTRONG**

*General Manager*

Armstrong joins Utah Hockey Club after serving as the General Manager of the Arizona Coyotes for the past three seasons. Before his time in the desert, Armstrong played a pivotal role in shaping the St. Louis Blues roster, contributing to their 2019 Stanley Cup victory while serving as the team's Director of Amateur Scouting. Following this success, he was promoted to Assistant General Manager, where he spearheaded the team's strategies for the NHL Draft. Throughout his career, Armstrong has demonstrated a keen eye for talent, overseeing the selection of numerous skilled players, including Logan Cooley, Josh Doan, Dylan Guenther, and J.J Moser, all of whom now are on Utah's roster.

## **DARRYL PLANDOWSKI**

*Director of Amateur Scouting*

Plandowski joins Utah Hockey Club after being with the Arizona Coyotes as the Director of Amateur Scouting since October 2020. Prior to his time with the Coyotes, Plandowski spent 12 seasons with the Tampa Bay Lightning where he ascended to the team's Assistant Director of Amateur scouting. Plandowski played an integral part in the Tampa Bay Lightning team that secured the 2020 Stanley Cup. The former Stanley Cup Champion began his career with the Buffalo Sabres, serving as an amateur scout for eight years, before transitioning to the Pittsburgh Penguins in a similar capacity.

## **RYAN JANKOWSKI**

*Associate Director of Amateur Scouting*

Jankowski joins Utah Hockey Club after serving three seasons with the Arizona Coyotes as the Associate Director of Amateur Scouting. Prior to his time with the Coyotes, Jankowski was the Director of Amateur Scouting for the Buffalo Sabres where he oversaw all amateur scouting and ran the team's drafts, including the 2018 Draft when Buffalo selected defenseman Rasmus Dahlin No. 1 overall. Jankowski also spent four seasons with Hockey Canada as Head Scout and Director of Player Personnel. He also possesses over 10 additional years of experience in NHL front offices.

# BILL ARMSTRONG'S SOUNDBITES

## – ON HAVING THE SIXTH OVERALL PICK IN THE FIRST ROUND –

“You get excited because now you know exactly where you are picking. Now it's going to the scouting meetings and honing in on the players that you like at six. It's an exciting time of year because you've battled all year with your scouts, going across the world, working every single night in hockey rinks. It's now at the point where we are making decisions who we will be picking at the sixth spot. This is a great time of year for us as an organization to get together and go through the scouting meetings, go through the combines, and then we end up in Vegas. They've got a lot of talented players up top in the Draft, and we get a chance to get one of them.”

## – ON THE PROSPECTS THAT WILL BE AVAILABLE IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THE 2024 NHL DRAFT –

“Every draft is different. It's interesting because when I was with St. Louis we were always picking between 20-26 (in the first round). We kind of honed in on that area. Now that we have been going through the rebuild we are in the 3-6 range. The more you pick (in the same range) the better you get and I do believe that. I think there's a good talent level there. They are young men that are 18 years old and some of them are still late developers and you get glimpses of what they will become, but there's some real good talent in this draft. There's good defensive talent, good offensive players and I know our scouts are excited about where we are picking and the opportunity to pick some of that talent.”

## – ON THE GENERAL SCOUTING PROCESS AND THE STAFF'S THOUGHTS ABOUT UTAH –

“Our process has stayed the same. The thing that has changed is our scouts being excited about coming into Salt Lake City and seeing the city and getting the vibe and feeling the excitement of the city. I think that will help us as we go through the process when we have our scouting meetings here. The people in Salt Lake City and throughout the state have been so excited about us coming. Every time we land here you get a smile on your face because the people are so excited about having a hockey team in Utah.”

# PLETHORA OF PICKS

## UTAH ENTERS THE DRAFT WITH 13 PICKS – MORE THAN ANY OTHER NHL TEAM

Entering the 2024 NHL Draft, Utah Hockey Club holds 13 picks, the most of any NHL team. Should GM Bill Armstrong utilize all 13 selections this year, he will have made a total of 44 picks during his four-season tenure, including 25 since 2022 – more than any other GM in the NHL. Looking ahead, Utah holds an additional 24 Draft picks over the next three years, with 20 of those in the first three rounds, positioning the team for a promising future.

# UTAH HOCKEY CLUB PROSPECT DEVELOPMENT CAMP
