VANCOUVER CANUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 48-37-15 (27-18-6 at Xcel Energy Center, 20-19-9 at Vancouver)

2022-23: Minnesota went 3-0-0 against Vancouver...The Wild earned a 4-3 overtime victory in the series-opening game at Xcel Energy Center (10/20), a 3-0 win in the second game at Rogers Arena (12/10) and a 2-1 win in Vancouver (3/2)...RW **Mats Zuccarello** led the Wild with six points (2-4=6)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** had five points (3-2=5)...D Calen Addison had three assists...G **Marc-Andre Fleury** was 2-0-0 with a 1.98 GAA and a .917 SV%...G **Filip Gustavsson** stopped all 35 shots faced in the second meeting to record his first NHL shutout...C **Nils Amas** (1-1=2), RW **Brock Boeser** and C **Dakota Joshua** (1-1=2) led the Canucks with two points each...C Bo Horvat also scored for the Canucks...G **Thatcher Demko** was 0-1-1 with a 2.97 GAA and a .918 SV% in two starts...G Spencer Martin saved 30-of-33 shots against in the second meeting.

WILD LEADERS: Zuccarello leads the Wild with 23 points (8-15=23) in 20 contests vs. the Canucks...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 19 points (4-15=19) in 40 games...D **Alex Goligoski** owns 13 points (3-10=13) in 37 matches...C **Ryan Hartman** has 11 points (8-3=11) in 15 games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 15-3-2 with a 2.49 GAA, a .915 SV% and two shutouts in 20 career starts vs. the Canucks...Gustavsson is 2-1-1 with a 2.64 GAA, a .922 SV % and one shutout in four games (three starts).

CANUCKS LEADERS: C **J.T. Miller** leads Vancouver with 14 points (7-7=14) in 18 games against the Wild...C **Elias Pettersson** owns eight points (5-3=8) in 11 games...D **Quinn Hughes** (0-7=7 in nine games), D **Tyler Myers** (1-6=7 in 31 games) and Boeser (2-5=7 in 13 games) all have seven points against Minnesota.

CANUCKS GOALIES: Demko is 0-3-2 with a 3.40 GAA and a .900 SV% in five career starts against Minnesota...G **Casey DeSmith** is 4-0-0 with a 2.22 GAA and a .931 SV% in four starts.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Assistant Coach **Darby Hendrickson** skated in 27 games with the Canucks (1998-99)...Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** was selected by Vancouver in the seventh round (212th overall) of the 2001 NHL Draft and recorded 23 points (12-11=23) in 55 games in parts of two seasons with the Canucks (2002-04)...King also served as an Assistant Coach for Vancouver for three seasons (2020-23) and five seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Canucks AHL affiliate in Utica(2016-20)...Canucks Assistant Coach **Mike Yeo** served as Wild Head Coach for parts of five seasons (2011-16)...Boeser is from Burnsville...D **Ian Cole** recorded eight points (1-7=8) in 52 games with Minnesota in 2020-21.

FAST FACTS: The Wild has won its last eight meetings against Vancouver, outscoring the Canucks 28-16...Minnesota is 20-9-1 in its last 30 games against the Canucks...The Wild is 11-3-0 in its last 14 games played in Vancouver...The Wild is 15-8-1 in the last 24 games played in Saint Paul... Minnesota's 111 points vs. the Canucks are its third-most against a team.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Jonas Brodin: Has blocked 60 shots this season, T-6th in the Western Conference and T-13th in the NHL.

Connor Dewar: Notched the first hat trick, multi-goal game and three-plus point performance of his NHL career with four points (3-1=4) at NSH (11/30).

Marc-Andre Fleury: Currently at 548 career wins, needs four wins to pass Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads Minnesota with 13 goals and six PPGs this season...Is T-7th in the NHL in PPGs this season.

Brock Faber: Leads all NHL rookies with 23:16 TOI per game and 39 blocked shots and is T-1st with a plus-6 rating.

Filip Gustavsson: Is 3-2-1 with a 1.82 GAA (T-3rd in NHL, min. five GP) and a .931 SV% (T-3rd in NHL, min. five GP) since November 18 (six starts).

Kirill Kaprizov: With a goal and assist at CGY (12/5), recorded his 69th career multi-point game, tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard for fifth-most in franchise history...Holds a plus-6 rating since Nov. 28 (four games), T-4th in the NHL during that span.

Pat Maroon: Currently at 299 career points (120-179=298).

Jake Middleton: Holds a plus-6 rating since Nov. 28 (four games), T-4th in the NHL during that span

Marco Rossi: T-1st among NHL rookies in plus-minus (plus-6), T-2nd in goals (eight) and points (8-7=15), and ranks fifth in shots on goal (46).

Jared Spurgeon: Owns an active four-game assist streak (0-4=4)...Holds a plus-7 rating since Nov. 28 (four games), T-2nd in the NHL during that span...Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

Mats Zuccarello: Leads the Wild with 27 points and 21 assists this season... Owns an active 10-game point streak (3-11=14), tied for the longest active streak in the NHL and the longest of his career (two other occurrences), and an eight-game assist streak, the second longest active streak in the NHL, longest of his career and one shy of the franchise record (Kaprizov, nine games in 2022-23)...Has recorded a point in 11 consecutive home games (6-10=16) to open the season, a franchise record...Reached 600 career points (192-408=600) with an assist at CGY (12/5).

AHL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Iowa Wild G **Jesper Wallstedt** has been selected as the **Howies Hockey Tape/AHL Player of the Week** for the period ending Dec. 3, 2023.

Wallstedt stopped 83 of the 86 shots he faced last week, leading the Wild to a pair of road wins and earning Player of the Week honors for the second time this season.

Wallstedt took both starts during Iowa's weekend visit to Colorado, beginning the trip by stopping 40 shots in the Wild's 5-1 victory over the Eagles on Friday night. He came back on Saturday and made 43 saves, an AHL career high, as Iowa completed the sweep with a 3-2 decision. For the week, Wallstedt was 2-0-0 with a 1.50 goals-against average and a .965 save percentage.

In 13 appearances for Iowa this season, Wallstedt (9-4-0) leads the American Hockey League with a .939 save percentage, ranks T-3rd in wins and shutouts and fourth with a 1.95 goals-against average. As a rookie last season, he went 18-15-5 with a 2.68 GAA and a .908 save percentage, represented the Wild organization at the 2023 AHL All-Star Classic, and earned a spot on the 2022-23 AHL Top Prospects Team.

TEAM NOTES



HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 288-255-63 (.527) in 606 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, most recently served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

- Minnesota's plus-8 first-period goal differential since Nov. 28 ranks T-1st in the NHL, while its plus-16 first-period shot differential ranks third in the NHL.





PLAYER NOTES

KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** ranks second on the team with with 23 points (8-15=23), 15 assists and five PPGs this season while ranking T-2nd with eight goals.
- With a goal and assist at CGY (12/5), recorded his 69th career multi-point game, tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Holds a plus-6 rating since Nov. 28 (four games), T-4th in the NHL during that span.
- Kaprizov scored the 120th goal of his career vs. COL (11/25) to move past Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Currently with 44 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for seventh-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

- Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- **Mats Zuccarello** leads the Wild with 27 points (6-21=27) and 21 assists this season. He ranks T-3rd in the NHL with 12 power-play assists.
- Owns an active 10-game point streak (3-11=14), tied for the longest active streak in the NHL and the longest of his career (two other occurrences). He is the first player in Wild history to record three separate double-digit point streaks with the franchise.
- Owns an active eight-game assist streak, the second longest active streak in the NHL, longest of his career and one shy of the franchise record (Kaprizov, nine-game streak in 2022-23).
- Also owns an active 11-game home point streak (6-10=16), the longest in Wild franchise history to start a season and the longest home point streak of Zuccarello's career.
- Reached 600 career points (192-408=600) with an assist at CGY (12/5), the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Recorded the 400th assist of his NHL career against OTT in Sweden (11/18), becoming the first Norwegian player to reach the mark.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest season-opening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 27 points and 21 assists this season ranks first in the NHL among players age 33 or older.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (600) and third in career goals (192), career assists (408) and career games played (789).

SPURGEON GENERAL'S WARNING

- **Jared Spurgeon** owns an active four-game assist streak (0-4=4).
- Holds a plus-7 rating since Nov. 28 (four games), T-2nd in the NHL during that span.
- Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season.
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-116 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

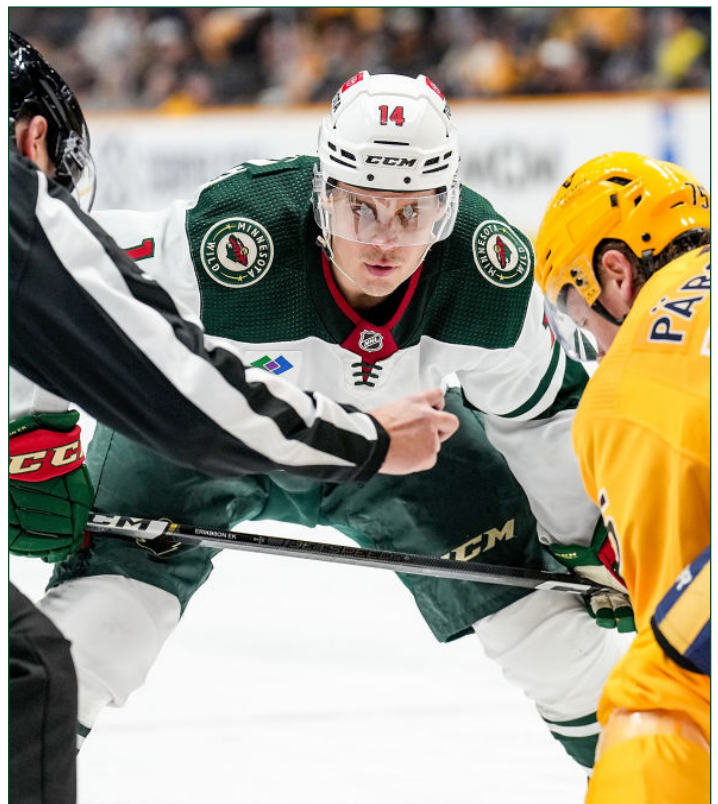


MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** is T-1st among NHL rookies in plus-minus (plus-6), T-2nd in goals (eight) and points (8-7=15), and ranks fifth in shots on goal (46).
- Owns an active three-game point streak (2-2=4).
- Recorded the first multi-goal game of his career vs. CHI (12/3), scoring two.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (1-3=4) from 11/12 - 12/24/23, a career long.

CROWN JOEL

- **Joel Eriksson Ek** leads the Wild with 12 goals and six power-play goals this season and ranks T-7th in the NHL in PPGs.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-1=4) from 11/19 to 11/28 and a three-game goal streak (3-0=3), tied for the longest goal streak of his career (third occurrence), from 11/24 to 11/28.
- Set a new career high with 23:53 of TOI at OTT (11/18) in Stockholm, Sweden.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded five multi-point games this season, T-2nd on the team.
- Currently at 31 career PPGS, two behind Jared Spurgeon (33 career PPGs) for seventh in franchise history.
- Currently at 103 career goals, needs four goals to surpass Pierre-Marc Bouchard (106 goals) for 10th-most in franchise history.





PLAYER NOTES

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Marcus Foligno** is ninth in the NHL with 67 hits this season. He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,251 hits.

BROCKED AND LOADED

- **Brock Faber** leads all NHL rookies with 23:16 TOI per game and 39 blocked shots and is T-1st with a plus-6 rating..
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.



IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender **Marc-Andre Fleury** made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 248 career wins, needs three wins to tie (four to surpass) Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 995 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
