FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP November 19, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. NEW YORK ISLANDERS [1] (SO)

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a four game homestand on Tuesday night by welcoming the New York Islanders to the Scotiabank Saddledome. Both goalies were solid early, with Dustin Wolf and Semyon Varlamov turning aside all 15 shots the clubs combined for to keep the game scoreless through 20. The Islanders would break the deadlock just 1:32 into the second with Pierre Engvall opening the scoring, and it would remain 1-0 New York through 40. In the third, Rasmus Andersson drew the Flames level on the power play midway through the frame and this game would require extra time. Overtime would solve nothing, and in a shootout, Dustin Wolf went 2/2 while Andrei Kuzmenko and Justin Kirkland scored to help the Flames knock off the Islanders 2-1.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of two meetings this season between the Flames and Rangers. Calgary fell in both meetings with the New York Rangers in 2023-24.

This is a Pacific Division versus Metropolitan Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-1-0 against Metropolitan Division teams and a record of 5-1-2 against Eastern Conference opponents.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

With his 28-save effort on Tuesday night against the New York Islanders, Dustin Wolf earned his seventh win of the season. Only three goaltenders in Flames franchise history have posted more wins in their first 10 games of a season: Dan Bouchard (8 in 1978-79), Mike Vernon (8 in 1993-94), and Roman Turek (8 in 2001-02). With Tuesday's win in his 28th game with Calgary, Wolf also became the fourth-fastest netminder to 15 wins in a Flames sweater, behind only Miikka Kiprusoff (25 games), Roman Turek (26 games), and Chad Johnson (26 games).

THIRD PERIOD MAGIC:

With Rasmus Andersson's third period marker on Tuesday, the Flames have scored 25 of their 48 goals in the third period so far this season. The Flames have the sixth-most third period tallies through the 2024-25 campaign thus far, only the Winnipeg Jets, Vegas Golden Knights, Los Angeles Kings, New Jersey Devils, and Minnesota Wild have scored more goals in the final frame of a game.

SHARANGOVICH 300:

Flames forward Yegor Sharangovich is slated to appear in his 300th NHL game tonight. The Minsk, BLR native skated in his first NHL game on January 14th, 2021 against the Boston Bruins as a member of the New Jersey Devils. He would score his first NHL goal two nights later on January 16th, 2021, a goal that would hold up as the game-winning goal. Sharangovich was a quired by Calgary from New Jersey with a third-round pick in the 2023 NHL Draft (Aydar Suniev) for Tyler Toffoli on June 27th, 2023.

COMEBACK KIDS:

The Flames erased a 1-0 third-period deficit on Tuesday to earn their fourth third-period comeback win. Calgary is tied with Philadelphia for the most third-period comeback wins in the NHL so far this season. In 2023-24, the Flames finished third in the NHL in third-period comeback wins with 11, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (14) and the New York Rangers (14).

KIRKLAND SIGNATURE:

Justin Kirkland scored in Tuesday's shootout to give the Flames a 2-1 win over the Islanders. Kirkland is the only player in the NHL to score two shootout goals at home this season, and one of just 13 skaters to register a game-deciding goal (shootout-winning goal).

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson scored his fifth of the season on Tuesday against the Islanders which ties him with Nazem Kadri, and Matt Coronato for the second-most on the Flames, behind only Jonathan Huberdeau's six markers. Andersson has also now scored 21 goals at home in his career which ties him with Dougie Hamilton for the ninth-most by a blueliner at home in Flames franchise history. Only: Al MacInnis (114), Mark Giordano (80), Gary Suter (69), Paul Reinhart (52), Dion Phaneuf (47), Jamie Macoun (39), Phil Housley (27) and T.J. Brodie (25) have more home goals among defenceman.

THROWBACK THURSDAY:

Flames forward Andrei Kuzmenko and Rangers netminder Igor Shesterkin were teammates in the KHL with St. Petersburg SKA for the 2018-19 campaign. Kuzmenko would post a then-career best 31 points in 58 games (12G, 19A) while Shesterkin played in 28 games, posting a 24-4-0 record.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In these teams' last meeting at the Scotiabank Saddledome, Blake Coleman recorded his 200th NHL point. The Plano, Texas native became the third Texas-born NHLer to eclipse 200 NHL points, joining Brian Leetch and Seth Jones.

Flames blueliners Daniil Miromanov and Brayden Pachal along with Rangers netminder Jonathan Quick and forward Reilly Smith were all teammates on the 2022-23 Vegas Golden Knights.
