FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP March 14, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS [1]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game homestand on Thursday night by welcoming the Vegas Golden Knights. In the first, Calgary's Dustin Wolf and Vegas' Adin Hill would combine for 19 saves in a scoreless first period. It would take until the 17:56 mark of the second for the contest's opening marker, with Anthony Mantha giving the Golden Knights a 1-0 lead heading into the third. In the final frame, Yegor Sharangovich would draw the Flames level before Blake Coleman gave the home-side their first lead of the night to flip the script put the Flames in front 2-1. Matt Coronato would add an insurance marker, and Blake Coleman scored his second of the night with the Golden Knights net empty to help Calgary rally for a 4-1 win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Canadiens. The Flames won their previous meeting this season 2-1 at the Bell Centre.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 8-5-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 13-13-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Flames finished off a three-game Eastern-Canadian road trip on November 14th in Montreal. The goalies would steal the show early with both netminders turning aside over 10 shots in the opening frame to keep the game scoreless through 20. In the second, Nazem Kadri would make a nifty move around Canadiens forward Christan Dvorak before beating Sam Montembeault to give the Flames a 1-0 lead. The Canadiens would respond under a minute later with Gustav Lindstrom tying the game. Calgary would once again retake the lead with Rasmus Andersson finding Connor Zary at the back post and the Flames led 2-1 through 40. Jakob Markstrom would turn aside all nine third period shots he was tasked with, and Calgary held on for a 2-1 win.

COMEBACK KIDS:

Following their four-goal third period rally on Thursday against Vegas, the Flames earned their 10th third-period comeback win of the season. The only club with more third-period comeback victories than the Flames during the 2023-24 campaign is the Detroit Red Wings (11). The Flames have now recorded 16 comeback victories this season, the last time they had as many in a single campaign was when they recorded 19 during the 2019-20 season. Calgary also recorded 10 third-period rallies in 2019-20 as well.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman helped the Flames rally after trialing through 40 minutes of play on Thursday with two goals including the game-winner. With his pair of tallies, Coleman moved into a tie with Zach Hyman (18) for the most third-period goals among all players this season.

SHARKNADO:

Yegor Sharangovich collected his team-leading 28th goal of the season on Thursday against Vegas. The last player to record as many in their first season with the Flames was Michael Cammalleri, who had 39 tallies for the Flames during the 2008-09 season. Sharangovich also now has seven goals since March 1st which ranks third among all skaters in the NHL, trailing only Krill Kaprizov (8) and Timo Meier (8).

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Flames captain Mikael Backlund (198-327—525 in 973 GP) is two goals away from becoming the 11th player in franchise history with 200 goals. Backlund has 13 goals on the campaign and is looking to become just the second Swedish-born skater in Flames franchise history to reach 200 goals with the Flames and join Kent Nilsson (229).

HISTORY AGAINST THE HABS:

Since the Flames and Canadiens met in the 1989 Stanley Cup Finals, the two clubs have played 71 contests, with the Flames holding a 32-29-5-5 advantage. The Flames and Canadiens have played in four different venues including the Montreal Forum where the Flames went 2-5-1 in their final games in the Forum, the Bell Centre where the Flames have a record of 9-13-2-2, the Scotiabank Saddledome where the Flames have a 20-11-2-3 advantage and a lone matchup at McMahon Stadium for the 2011 Heritage Classic where the Flames won 4-0.

BRZUS THERE IT IS:

On Thursday, the Flames announced the signing of defensive prospect Hunter Brzustewicz to a three-year entry level contract. The Rochester, Michigan native was acquired by the Flames on January 31st from Vancouver in a trade that included forward Andrei Kuzmenko, prospect defenceman Joni Jurmo, Vancouver's first-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft and a conditional fourth-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft in exchange for Elias Lindholm. The 6'0", 190lb rearguard has skated in 62 games with the Kitchener Rangers of the OHL this season. The 19-year-old has 12 goals and 73 assists for 85 points, tied for ninth overall amongst all OHL skaters while his 73 assists lead the league. Brzustewicz was a third round (75th overall) draft pick by the Canucks in 2023.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

MacKenzie Weegar played his first NHL game against the Montreal Canadiens back on April 3rd of 2017.

Canadiens Head Coach Martin St. Louis played 69 games as a member of the Calgary Flames over two seasons, scoring four goals and 16 assists for 20 points as a Flame.

With his two helpers on Thursday against Vegas, Dryden Hunt registered his first multi-point game as a Flame.


