

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****January 25, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. Minnesota Wild [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames began a back-to-back set last night in Minnesota for a clash with the Wild. In the first, Andrei Kuzmenko would give the Flames the lead on the powerplay at the 6:58 mark, but Minnesota would respond shortly after to deadlock things through 20. In the second, Calgary would re-claim their lead with Martin Pospisil outwitting Marc-Andre Fleury to bury his third of the season. Then with just eight seconds left in the middle stanza, Rasmus Andersson would convert on another Flames powerplay to put the visitors up 3-1 through 40. In the third, Clark Bishop would record his first as a Flame, and Andrei Kuzmenko recorded his second of the night to outlast a late Minnesota push and win 5-4.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Jets. The visiting team has won in both these clubs' prior meetings.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 9-6-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 15-11-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH WPG:

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a four-game road trip by visiting the Winnipeg Jets last Saturday. The Flames scored the only goal of the first with Matt Coronato blasting a one-timer over the shoulder of Eric Comrie to give the visitors a 1-0 edge through 20. In the second, Calgary would double their advantage with Andrei Kuzmenko ripping home a powerplay marker to help the Flames lead 2-0 through 40. In the third, the Jets would draw within one, but Dustin Wolf would cap off a strong night with 15 third period saves to give him 38 on the evening and Calgary added an empty netter to knock off the Jets 3-1.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf improved his career record to 26-14-3 to tie Tom Barrasso for the ninth-most wins by an American rookie goaltender. John Gibson (t-2nd: 37), Alex Nedeljkovic (t-2nd: 37) and Jeremy Swayman (8th; 30) are the only active goaltenders among that list that sit higher. In recording his 26th career win, Wolf also moves within one victory of tying Dan Vladar (27) for the second most by a Flames rookie goaltender. Mike Vernon tops the list with 39.

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his goal on Thursday against Buffalo, Mikael Backlund recorded his 210th NHL goal to tie Johnny Gaudreau for the ninth-most in Flames franchise history. Earlier this season, Backlund passed Eric Vail (206) to take sole-possession of the 10th most in Flames history and has joined Kent Nilsson as one of two Swedish-born skaters inside the top 10 in goals for the Flames.

Backlund has also registered the fifth-most game-winning goals on the road in Flames franchise history (21), and with one more can tie Theoren Fleury for the fourth-most. Only Jarome Iginla (34), Sean Monahan (23), and Johnny Gaudreau (23) have more.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

With his goal last night in Minnesota, Rasmus Andersson recorded his 43rd career goal and surpassed Dougie Hamilton and Noah Hanifin for the ninth most by a defenseman in franchise history. Andersson already ranks as the highest-scoring Swedish-born rearguard in Flames franchise history. Andersson's 502 games played also put him 15 games away from tying Paul Reinhart (517) for the seventh-most in Flames history.

BISHOP'S FIRST:

Clark Bishop scored his first as a member of the Calgary Flames last night in Minnesota to register his second NHL goal, and first since December 7th in Anaheim as a member of the Carolina Hurricanes. Bishop is in his third season with the Flames organization and at the time of his recall was enjoying a career-year in the American Hockey League with 33 points from 16 goals and 17 assists through 39 games. The 28-year-old led the Wranglers with six game-winning goals on the campaign, including a stretch from October 25th to October 31st where he recorded four-consecutive game-winning goals in the AHL. Thursday was the St. John's, NL native's first NHL game since February 15th, 2022 as a member of the Ottawa Senators.

BACK-TO-BACKS:



The Flames are set to finish off their sixth back-to-back set tonight in Winnipeg following last night's 5-4 win in Minnesota. Calgary has a record of 5-1-0 in game one of back-to-back scenarios, and a record of 1-4-0 in game two of back-to-back scenarios. The Flames next back-to-back set will come on February 1st when they welcome the Detroit Red Wings before travelling to Seattle the following night on February 2nd to face the Kraken.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

With Andrei Kuzmenko scoring to give the Flames a 1-0 lead last night in Minnesota, Calgary has scored first 27 times this season. Only Columbus (31 GP), Buffalo (30 GP) and Minnesota (29 GP) have done so more.

Clark Bishop was a member of the 2019 Calder Cup Champion Charlotte Checkers, skating in 16 playoff games alongside fellow Flame Jake Bean. Jets rearguard Haydn Fleury was also a member of that championship-winning team.
