- The Stars finished the year with a 52-25-6 record, with their 52 wins tying for the franchise's third-most in a single year according to NHL Stats. The franchise had 54 wins in 2021 and 2006.
- Tuesday's game marked the 27th time in franchise history and the first time since March 14, 2024 that the Stars have not been assessed a penalty in a regular-season game.
- **Wyatt Johnston** skated in his 200th NHL game. His 65 goals are the third most by a Stars player in team history (since they relocated to Dallas in 1993) through their first 200 career contests according to NHL Stats.
- **Thomas Harley** registered two assists on Tuesday and now has six points (1-5–6) in five career games against the Sabres.
- **Casey DeSmith** earned his first point as a member of the Stars and second of his career with the secondary assist on Esa Lindell's empty-net goal.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Senators this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. They will next meet on Jan. 12 in Ottawa.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give the Stars their first five-game point streak of the season. They are 3-0-1 in their last four games played.
- The Stars have earned at least a point in five of the last six home games that they have played against Senators, posting a 4-1-1 record in those games dating back to March 5, 2018.
- **Esa Lindell** scored the 52nd goal of his career in Dallas' last game on Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres, which tied Philippe Boucher for 10th on the franchise's all-time goals list by defensemen. He is now five goals shy of tying **Miro Heiskanen** (57) for ninth.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:11 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.53 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 20 of the 36 games that they have played this year.

UNSEATING THE SENATORS

- Dallas is 25-16-5 all-time vs. Ottawa, including a 15-8-1 mark at home.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against Ottawa, scoring three goals and adding an assist in those games.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has four points (1-3-4) in four career games against the Senators.
- **Brendan Smith** has four points (2-2-4) in his last three games against Ottawa dating back to Dec. 29, 2023.
- **Matt Duchene** registered two points including the game-winning goal the last time the Stars and Senators faced off in Dallas on Dec. 15, 2023. Duchene spent parts of two seasons with the Senators (2017-2019), recording 50 goals and 107 points (50-57-107) in 118 regular-season contests.

CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR

- Dallas finished 2024 with a 52-25-6 record for 110 points and a .663 points percentage. Their 52 wins tied for the third-most in franchise history in one calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars ranked fifth in the NHL in points, points percentage and wins (tied) in 2024.
- 2024 marked the third consecutive calendar year in which the Stars finished with at least 100 points and a points percentage above .600.
 - In 2023 they had 104 points and a .658 points percentage, and 118 points and a .648 points percentage in 2022.
- **Jason Robertson** was Dallas' leading scorer in 2024 with 72 points (27-45-72) in 83 regular-season games. He was followed closely by **Wyatt Johnston** (32-37-69) and **Matt Duchene** (28-39-67).
- **Johnston's** 32 goals topped all Stars skaters in 2024, with **Roope Hintz** (31) and **Duchene** (28) ranking second and third, respectively.
- **Thomas Harley** posted a plus-38 plus/minus rating in 2024, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL. **Harley** (10-37-47) was the Stars' highest scoring defenseman in 2024.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 41-16-3 record in 2024. His 41 wins ranked second to only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (44).
- **Oettinger's** 41 wins are the second-most by a Stars goaltender in a calendar year in franchise history, trailing only Marty Turco who had 42 in 2006.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 14 points (4-10-14) in his last 12 games played dating back to Dec. 4 against the Los Angeles Kings. His 14 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' last game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 342 career points (142-200-342) in 328 regular-season games.
 - He now sits 11 points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** – who turned 25 on July 21 – became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson's** performance against the Sabres was the 99th multi-point game of his career. Only four players in Stars/North Stars history posted more before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** now has 19 assists on the year, which ties **Matt Duchene** for the team lead.
- **Robertson** has scored in each of Dallas' last two games: on Dec. 29 against Chicago and on Dec. 31 against Buffalo. If he were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time since Jan. 6 to 10, 2024.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored the game-winning goal in Dallas' last game and now has eight points (3-5-8) in his last seven games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.
- When **Johnston** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Dec. 16, the Stars have outscored their opponents 7-1 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- If **Johnston** were to score again tonight, it would give him his first four-game goal streak since he scored in five consecutive games from March 13 to 21, 2023.
- A point of any kind would give **Johnston** his second five-game point streak of the season.
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the season with 21 goals, which would mark the third consecutive 20-goal season of his career. He's also on pace to finish the 2024-25 season with 37 assists, which would be a career high for the forward.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** recorded his third multi-point game of the season with two assists in Dallas' last game on Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres. **Harley's** second assist of the night was the 50th of his career, making him the fourth-fastest Stars/North Stars defenseman to reach the mark according to NHL Stats.
- He is now on pace to finish the season with 32 assists, which would match the career high that he set last season.
- **Harley** recorded a plus-four plus/minus rating in Dallas' Dec. 29 game against Chicago, which was tied for the seventh-highest total by any NHL skater in a single game this season entering play Wednesday.
 - It marked the first time in **Harley's** career that he has logged a plus-four plus/minus rating in a single game.
 - In that game, the Stars outscored the Blackhawks 4-0 and outshot them 10-6 during 5-on-5 play when **Harley** was on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. No player from either team was on the ice for more 5-on-5 shots for than **Harley**.
- In all this year, **Harley** has a plus-19 plus/minus rating, which was tied for the seventh-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Senators with a plus-22 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. Only Minnesota's Kirill Kaprizov (plus-23) had a better mark.

KILLING IT

- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars had the third-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 84.7 percent success rate.
- Dallas has allowed only 15 power-play goals against this season, which was tied with Vegas for the fewest in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. Their 0.42 power-play goals against per game ranked second in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 20-for-21 on the penalty kill for a 95.2 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
- **Wyatt Johnston's** shorthanded goal on Dec. 8 gives the Stars an even goal differential on the penalty kill during that span. The Tampa Bay Lightning (0) and Vegas Golden Knights (1) are the only teams with an even or better goal differential on the penalty kill since Dec. 8.
- **Thomas Harley** has allowed 3.16 power-play goals against per 60, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday among NHL defensemen that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 121:18 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fifth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Wednesday.
 - **Lindell**, who skated 7:58 of shorthanded ice time, was on the ice for all but two seconds of Dallas' eight penalty kill minutes in their game on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (333), **Jason Robertson** (246), **Esa Lindell** (206) and **Wyatt Johnston** (200). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Dec. 31 against Buffalo was the 333rd consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 246-game Iron Man streak was the 13th-longest in the NHL entering play Wednesday. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Wednesday.
- **Lindell's** 206-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.

WHAT IN THE WORLD

- The 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship began on Dec. 26 and will be played in Ottawa through Jan. 5.
- Stars prospects **Emil Hemming** (Finland) and **Aram Minnetian** (United States) have each been selected to represent their home countries at this year's tournament.
- **Hemming**, who was selected by Dallas with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.
- This tournament marks **Minnetian's** first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
 - **Minnetian** was originally selected by the Stars in the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Evgenii Dadonov**, **Matt Dumba**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Jake Oettinger**, **Jason Robertson**, **Logan Stankoven** and **Sam Steel**.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is five assists shy of tying Darian Hatcher (218) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Matt Duchene** is two points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is two assists shy of tying Al MacAdam (202) for 26th on the franchise's all-time assists list.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Evgenii Dadonov** both played for the Ottawa Senators. Duchene skated for Ottawa from 2017-18 to 2018-19 and Dadonov played for Ottawa in 2020-21.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** was a member of the Senators from 2011-12 to 2012-13 where he was teammates with Senators assistant coach Daniel Alfredsson.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** was a scout for Ottawa during the 1991-92 to 1993-94 seasons.

- Senators assistant coach Nolan Baumgartner played seven games for the Dallas Stars during the 2006-07 season.
- Stars coaches **Pete DeBoer**, **Steve Spott** and **Misha Donskov** were a part of the Vegas coaching staff when Senators forward Michael Amadio played for the Golden Knights. Donskov and Amadio won the Stanley Cup with Vegas in 2023.
- Stars coaches **Pete DeBoer** and **Steve Spott** coached Senators forward Noah Gregor when he played for the San Jose Sharks in 2019-20.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Senators forward Michael Amadio were teammates in Vegas for part of the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Senators forward Nick Cousins played together in Arizona during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Senators forward Nick Cousins shared the ice in Nashville during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Senators forward Adam Gaudette played together in Vancouver during the 2019-20 and part of the 2020-21 season. Senators defenseman Travis Hamonic joined them in Vancouver during the 202-21 season.
- Stars forward **Mason Marchment** and Senators forward Claude Giroux were members of the Florida Panthers for a short time during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Senators forward Noah Gregor overlapped in Toronto during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** and Senators GM Steve Staios and defenseman Travis Hamonic were teammates with the New York Islanders. Montoya and Hamonic shared the ice in New York from 2010-11 to 2011-12. Staios was an Islander in 2011-12 where he was an assistant captain.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Senators defenseman Nick Jensen were teammates in Detroit during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** played under Senators assistant coaches Travis Green and Nolan Baumgartner when they coached in Vancouver from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Senators assistant coach Daniel Alfredsson were teammates when they both played in Detroit in 2013-14.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Senators assistant coach Ben Sexton played two games together for Ottawa in 2017-18.
- Senators assistant coach Mike Yeo coached Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and goaltender **Casey DeSmith**. Dumba played under Yeo in Minnesota from 2013-14 to 2015-16. DeSmith played under Yeo in Vancouver during the 2023-24 season.
