

SEYMOUR H. KNOX III Chairman of the Board and President

Excellence in sport is both personal accomplishment and professional aim for Seymour Knox and his brother Norty. The older Knox brother, Seymour has been a hard-driving dynamic leader in Buffalo's ascendancy in the NHL, as well as in rebuilding the city's self-image.

Formerly a nationally ranked squash racquets player and ex-President of the U. S. Squash Racquets Association, Seymour Knox had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football

injury. But he continued his interest in the game and it paid off in December 1969 with the grant of a major league franchise to Buffalo. He is a Vice President of Kidder, Peabody and Co., Inc., members of the New York Stock Exchange, and active as a leader in a variety of community organizations. He also serves as the Sabres' representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



ROBERT O. SWADOS
Vice President
and Counsel

There are a few men who worked long and hard to convince the nation that Buffalo was a big league sports town in the days when there wasn't a big league sports franchise on the Niagara Frontier. Bob Swados was one of those men, and in large part it was his dedication and articulate advocacy for big time sport here that resulted in this becoming one of pro sports premier hotbeds in the past few years.

Former vice president of the Buffalo

Bisons Baseball Club and vice president of Major League for Buffalo Inc., he has been counsel to the Knox brothers since their first NHL application in 1965. He is a partner in the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifin & Bradford.



NORTHRUP R. KNOX Vice Chairman of the Board

Dogged-persistence by the Knox brothers and their hockey associates led to the Buffalo Sabres franchise, and persistence to build toward championship status describes Norty Knox's life style. He was world champion in the grueling sport of court *tennis for ten years, and captain and number one player on the U. S. Polo team in 1966 and 1969. A varsity goalie at Yale University, he was one of the first in the sport to wear contact lenses in the nets, and is the Sabres'

alternate representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



DAVID G. FORMAN Administrative Vice President

The day-to-day headaches of the business of sport have been handled since the beginning of the Sabres by Dave Forman, whose administrative ability centers on separating the wheat from the chaff when problems are put before him. If it's sometimes hard to find Dave Forman at his desk, it's because he's out in the Auditorium — in hard hat if need be — checking out some construction, or off at a TV studio arranging for a broader schedule of game telecasts.

A well-known business and civic leader in Western New York for three decades,

he was named administrative vice president and a member of the Sabres' executive committee in the fall of 1970, after serving as club VP since the franchise was awarded.



GEORGE "PUNCH" IMLACH Vice President/Hockey and General Manager

The Buffalo Sabres under Punch Imlach, says Punch Imlach, have a big problem: the club has not yet won its first Stanley Cup. And Imlach, who won four of them as coach and general manager of the Toronto Maple Leafs, is the first to admit his disappointment at this fact. But if trying, trading and an unbending will to win can do the job, then Imlach brings all the right ingredients to his job. The Sabres are still one of the NHL's younger teams, in keeping with Imlach's beginning

philosophy that he would build a winner through the draft.

The winner he built was the first expansion club to make the old East Division playoffs in 1972-73, won the Prince of Wales Conference and Adams Division championships in 1974-75, and this past season finished

fourth overall in regular season play.


Born in Toronto March 15, 1918, Punch played senior hockey there, but never played in the NHL. He first coached the Quebec Aces, then joined the Springfield Indians of the AHL in 1956. Punch came to Toronto in 1958 and to Buffalo in 1970 as coach and general manager. He was sidelined from coaching duties in 1972 by a heart attack. He and his wife, Dodo, have a son, Brent, who played briefly for the Maple Leafs, and a daughter, Marlene.



FRED T. HUNT
Assistant General Manager

One of the busiest men in the Buffalo hockey organization, Fred Hunt and hockey in Buffalo are synonymous. For 18 years he was general manager and four times coach of the old Buffalo Bisons of the AHL, and was a star winger for the Bisons for a decade preceding. Fred has been the Sabres' Assistant General Manager and trouble-shooter since the club was founded, and his lengthy experience in hockey administration has been vital in setting up the very successful operation of the Sabres. In 1972-73 he was asked to

assume the extra duties of running the Sabres' farm team in Cincinnati, and served as general manager of the Swords until the club was deactivated.



FLOYD SMITH Coach

As a coach Floyd Smith has never been anything but a winner, guiding the Sabres to their best two finishes ever in two years with Buffalo, and leading the old AHL Cincinnati Swords to divisional and playoff championships in his tenure there. Smitty isn't satisfied with his first two seasons as an NHL coach though. He says he won't be until the Sabres win their first Stanley Cup. "And keep winning it year after year," says Smith, who tasted champagne from the cup with Toronto during his 12th-season pro career as a right

winger. Born in Perth, Ont. May 16, 1935, Smitty turned pro with the Boston organization and played for the Bruins, Rangers and Detroit, as well as under Punch Imlach at Toronto. He finished his big league career as the first captain of the Sabres, and began coaching after Imlach's 1972 heart attack. Under Smith the Sabres won more regular schedule games in two seasons than the club won in its first three full years in the NHL. He and his wife, Audrey, and son, Dean, a hockey player in his own right, reside in the Buffalo suburb of Grand Island. Smith returns to his home town each summer to defend his Perth Open Golf Tournament title.



JOHN ANDERSEN Director of Scouting

There are good teams, and there are young teams in the NHL. But it takes a successful scouting system to build both a good and a young team at the same time. And John Andersen has operated just that kind of a system since the Sabres begain in 1970. John and his scouts have helped build the heart of a Stanley Cup contender through the draft, and high choices such as Gil Perreault, Rick Martin, Jim Schoenfeld and so on have blossomed quickly into NHL stars. A native of Denmark, Andersen emigrated to Canada and joined the Toronto Maple

Leafs organization under Punch Imlach. He was with Toronto for 10 years, then spent a year with the California Golden Seals before rejoining Punch with the Sabres.



THE YEAR PAST

An artistic success though an emotional letdown: a fair description of the Buffalo Sabres in 1975-76. It was a season which saw Coach Floyd Smith's young team finish fourth overall in the National Hockey League during the regular schedule, setting 19 season records enroute, but lose in the quarterfinal round of Stanley Cup competition to the New York Islanders in a six-game series.

The Sabres had progressed to the cup finals a year before, and psychologically, only winning the cup itself would have been an improvement. So there was disappointment among everyone concerned, particularly the players who felt that the spring of '76 would bring Buffalo its first Stanley Cup.

But the playoff loss shouldn't dampen a record which included Danny Gare's first 50-goal season, the highest finish ever by a Sabre in the NHL scoring race as center Gilbert Perreault counted a personal high and team mark 113 points, and the most wins by a goaltender in a season, 29, by Gerry Desjardins.

The Sabres once again were one of hockey's most explosive teams, averaging 4.24 goals per game, and 34 shots an outing, against 26 by their opponents.

The goals flew in fast and furiously on occasion, with 14 against Washington Dec. 21, 1975, a team record, and part of an NHL mark. But the day the double figures really counted was the Sabres high point, and it was a game which didn't even count in the regular standings.

On Jan. 4, 1976 the undefeated Wings of the Soviet, the heart of Russia's Olympic championship hockey team, visited Memorial Auditorium, and suffered the worst loss ever by a USSR squad in international play, a stunning 12-6 pasting by the Sabres.

The Wings never lost again on their US tour, and the Sabres were the only NHL club to totally dominate a Russian opponent during the series, and only one of the two to win.

The Sabres suffered through injuries to Captain Jim Schoenfeld, Jerry Korab and Rene Robert, but finished the season on a high note. After a thrilling two-overtime three-game series win over St. Louis, they opened the Islanders series with two wins at home, but lost the next four to the tight-checking New York club to be eliminated from the playoff race.

There's always this year, and Buffalo's young players have a year's more experience to count on this season. With General Manager Punch Imlach dealing and Coach Floyd Smith wheeling, the Sabres should do nothing but improve. And the next step: enough improvement to win the Stanley Cup.

Gerry's first full season with the Sabres was one of the best in his NHL career. He played in 55 games, set a Buffalo victory record with 29, and marked up a 2.94 goals against average, and two shutouts. In the first-round playoff series against St. Louis, Desjardins kept the Sabres alive in an overtime game with one of the dazzling stops of the year against Pierre Plante who was on a breakaway. In his 12th pro season, Gerry feels he still should improve. "Every goalie should get better, should always be learning how to play his position better, and that's my aim," he says. Desjardins came to the Sabres late in the 1974-75 season from the WHA Baltimore club just before that team folded. He saw earlier NHL service with Los Angeles, Chicago and the New York Islanders.







What NHL winger last season tied the record for the most goals in his first two years of big league play? A bachelor, he bought a home in a Buffalo suburb late in the season past. He was voted Buffalo's most valuable and most popular player in 1975-76.

The Cold War turned hot when Jerry and his teammates met the Wings of the Soviet, with the Sabres administering a stunning 12-6 pasting. And Jerry Korab played what some observers called the best game of his life, chewing up Russian skaters as if detente was only a word on a French menu. It was one of the high points of his season. The others were a second consecutive selection to the Prince of Wales Conference all-star team for the mid-season classic, and a Buffalo record for goals by a defenseman with 13. The low point came when Jerry was struck in the nose by an errant puck in a February game and required surgery, causing him to miss 15 games. He saw some service as a forward in the NHL with Chicago and Vancouver, and in a few games with Buffalo after his trade to the Sabres in 1974, but has found a permanent home on defense.
