- Wyatt Johnston recorded his fifth goal of the season and extended his point streak against the Kings to five games, his longest career point streak against a single opponent (4-2—6, 5 GP vs. LAK).
- Jason Robertson factored on Johnston's goal, extending his point streak against Los Angeles to eight games.
 Robertson is only nine assists away from reaching 200 NHL career assists.
- Logan Stankoven tallied his 12th assist of the season, ranking second of all rookies. Stankoven (10-20—30 in 47 GP) required the third-fewest games by rookie in Stars team history to collect 20 career assists, behind Jason Roberton (41 GP) and John Klingberg (43 GP) according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Golden Knights this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Vegas this year. The teams will next meet on Jan. 24 in Dallas.
- Tonight is the seventh game the Stars will play against a Pacific Division opponent this season. They've posted a 4-2-0 record in the previous six games.
- Since Nov. 27, the Stars have scored five power-play goals, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- Miro Heiskanen has recorded seven points (2-5—7) in his last seven games dating back to Nov. 23 against the Lightning.
 His seven points during that span are tied with Matt Duchene and Mason Marchment for the team lead and were also tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.56 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 14 of the 25 games that they have played this year.
- Only one of Dallas' games this season has required extra time their 3-2 shootout win over the San Jose Sharks on Oct.
 15. The Stars and the Rangers were the only teams in the NHL this season to have only one of their games go beyond regulation.

ROLLING THE DICE

- Dallas is 6-7-4 all-time vs. Vegas, including a 3-3-1 mark on the road.
- Four of Dallas' last five matchups have gone beyond regulation. The Stars and Golden Knights have split those four games, with Dallas winning in a shootout on Feb. 25, 2023 and April 8, 2023 and then losing in a shootout on Oct. 17, 2023 and falling in overtime on Dec. 9, 2023.

- Roope Hintz has recorded at least a point in each of the four career road games he has played against the Golden Knights, totaling five points (2-3—5) in those contests. In all, he has six points (2-4—6) in his last six games against Vegas.
- Evgenii Dadonov has three goals and five points (3-2—5) in 10 career games against his former club. Dadonov recorded 43 points (20-23—43) in 78 regular season games with the Golden Knights in the 2021-22 season.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward Roope Hintz (Finland), defensemen Miro Heiskanen (Finland) and Esa Lindell (Finland), and goaltender Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only seven teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, NY Rangers, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
 again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
 - o Heiskanen and Lindell previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored a power-play goal in Dallas' last game and now has eight points (3-5—8) in his last eight games played dating back to Nov. 20 against the San Jose Sharks. His eight points during that span lead all Stars skaters.
- Seven of those eight points came in six consecutive games from Nov. 20 to Dec. 1. **Johnston's** six-game point streak was the longest of his career.
- **Johnston** has logged 121 points (61-60—120) in 189 regular-season games with the Stars since making his Dallas debut in 2022-23. His 61 goals during that span are the third-most of any Stars skater, trailing only linemates **Jason Robertson** (80) and **Roope Hintz** (77).
- **Johnston** leads all 2021 draft selections in career goals, points, even-strength goals (50) and even-strength points (95). His plus-19 plus/minus rating is tied with Buffalo's Owen Power for the top mark among 2021 draftees.
 - Johnston was drafted after eight of the other nine skaters ranked in the top 10 in scoring from the 2021 draft class.
 - o He also tops 2021 draftees in nearly every career playoff stat: goals (14), assists (8), points (22), points per game (.58), even-strength goals (11), even-strength points (17), power-play goals (2), power-play points (4), shorthanded goals (1) and game-winning goals (4).
- Johnston enters tonight's game 11 games shy of appearing in 200 NHL regular-season games. Ironically, when he
 reaches the milestone, he will become the 53rd draft pick in franchise history to appear in at least 200 regular-season
 games for the club according to NHL Stas.

FACING OFF

• Matt Duchene went 10-for-12 at the face off dot in Dallas' last game on Dec. 4 against Los Angeles for an 83.3 success rate. It marked the 19th time in his career – and first time this season – that he has taken at least 10 draws in a game and lost two or fewer.

- Roope Hintz has won at least 60 percent of the face offs he has taken in five of the last seven games that he has played dating back to Nov. 20. In all, he has gone 34-for-53 at the faceoff dot during that span, for a 64.2 percent success rate.
 - His 64.2 success rate ranked 10th in the NHL among skaters that have taken at least 15 draws during that span entering play Thursday.
 - Hintz went 7-for-8 in Dallas' last game on Dec. 4.
- Jamie Benn has gone 135-for-226 at the faceoff dot this season. His 59.7 percent success rate was the eighth-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 30 draws entering play Thursday.
 - Benn went a perfect 16-for-16 at the faceoff dot on Nov. 7 against the Chicago Blackhawks. It marked the first time in his career that he has taken at least 16 draws in a game without losing one.
 - Since the NHL began tracking faceoffs in 1997-98, Benn became just the sixth player to go undefeated at the faceoff dot when taking at least 16 draws.

EVEN STEVENS

- The Stars have played 14 games since returning from the Global Series in Finland dating back to Nov. 7. During that span, the team has scored 35 5-on-5 goals, the most of any team in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Dallas has averaged 2.50 5-on-5 goals per game during that span, which ranks second in the NHL to only the Washington Capitals (2.54).
- Additionally, during that span the Stars have outshot their opponents 337-302 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick. Their 337 shots at 5-on-5 rank second in the league during that span and their 52.7 percent shot share ranks seventh.
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 35-26 at 5-on-5 during that span. Their 57.4 goals-for percentage since Nov. 20 is the fifth-best mark in the NHL according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Fifteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one even-strength goal (5-on-5 and 4-on-4) since Nov. 7, with Mason Marchment leading the team with nine. His nine even-strength goals during that span were the most in the NHL entering play Thursday.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Matt Duchene is the team's leading scorer when playing on the road this year, totaling 16 points (5-11–16) in 13 games. His 16 road points this season were tied for 12th in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Miro Heiskanen has seven points (4-3-7) in his last seven road games dating back to Nov. 11 against the Pittsburgh Penguins. His seven road points during that span were tied for fifth among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- Mason Marchment has 14 points (7-7-14) in 13 road games played this season. Six of Marchment's seven road goals have been scored at even strength, which was tied for the seventh-most in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.

IDES OF MARCH

- Mason Marchment has totaled 25 points (11-14-25) in 24 games played this season and enters tonight's matchup against the Knights ranked second on the team in scoring.
- Seventeen (9-8-17) of Marchment's 24 points this season have come in the last 12 games that he has played dating back to Nov. 11. Entering play Thursday, only Edmonton's Connor McDavid (8-10-18) had more points than Marchment during that span.
- Additionally, Marchment's nine goals since Nov. 11 were the most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Three of Marchment's goals this season have been game-winners, matching his career high that he set last season. Entering play Thursday, he was tied for 12th in the NHL in game-winning goals.

JAKE AND BAKE

- Dallas' 2-1 victory over the Utah Hockey Club in their Dec. 2 game was the 126th win of Jake Oettinger's career, which tied him with Jon Casey for the sixth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
 - He's now two wins shy of matching Gilles Meloche (141) for the fifth-most in franchise history.
- The Stars' win over the Hockey Club was also Oettinger's 13th win of the year, which was the second-most in the NHL this season by a goaltender. Entering play Thursday, only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (15) had won more games this season than Oettinger.
- Oettinger has posted a 2.41 goals-against average and a .912 save percentage this season, which ranked sixth and tied for 10th, respectively, in the NHL this season entering play Thursday among netminders that have played in at least 10 games.

TILTING THE ICE

- Thomas Harley has recorded a plus-17 even strength on-ice goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifthbest mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- In all, Harley has been on the ice for 35 even-strength goals this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only Washington's Rasmus Sandin (36) and Vegas' Jack Eichel (36).
- Since Nov. 11, Harley and Miro Heiskanen were tied for second and fourth among NHL defensemen in on-ice goal differential with a plus-11 and plus-eight rating, respectively, entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, Mason Marchment (plus-14) and Matt Duchene (plus-13) were tied for eighth and ninth, respectively, among all NHL forwards this season in even strength on-ice goal differential.

SETTING THE PACE

- With 57 regular-season games remaining, four different Stars skaters are pacing to set career highs in scoring this year: Matt Duchene, Ilya Lyubushkin, Mason Marchment and Sam Steel.
- Duchene is currently pacing to finish the year with 52 assists and 92 points, which would all be career highs for the 16year veteran.
- Marchment is currently pacing to finish the year with 37 goals, 47 assists and 84 points, all of which would be career highs. His 25 points this year are already 47.2 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31-53) that he reached last season
- Lyubushkin (0-20–20) and Steel (7-27–34) are all on pace to finish the regular season with career highs in both assists and points.
- Colin Blackwell (12), Thomas Harley (33), Esa Lindell (23) and Brendan Smith (17) are all pacing to finish the 2024-25 season with a career high in assists while Miro Heiskanen is on track to score 13 goals this season, which would be a
- Additionally, rookie Logan Stankoven is pacing to finish the year with 42 assists and 56 points. Forty assists would be the sixth-most by a rookie in franchise history.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 60 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 15 of their 25 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win 12 of the 15 games that they have scored first in. Their 12 wins when scoring first were tied with the Minnesota Wild for the best mark in the league this season entering play Thursday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .800 win percentage when scoring first this year was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Dallas' first goal in their game on Nov. 25 came on their first shot of the game. Tyler Seguin opened the scoring 18 seconds into the game, which tied Michael Kesselring (0:18 on Nov. 7 w/ UTA) for the second-fastest game-opening goal this season behind Nathan Walker (0:11 on Nov. 21 w/ STL) according to NHL Stats.
 - o The Stars have scored on their first shot of the game three times this season according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen is one assist shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also three assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is four points away from tying Tom McCarthy (333) for 24th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Matt Duchene is seven points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell is six games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- Lindell also enters tonight's contest six assists shy of typing Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
