

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 22, 2023 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] at NASHVILLE PREDATORS [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a four-game road trip on Wednesday night in Nashville. Colton Sissons would score just under three minutes into the contest to give Nashville the lead, before Noah Hanifin found the back of the net for his fourth goal of November to even the score at one's. Ryan O'Reilly would net his ninth of the season midway through the opening 20 to give Nashville their lead back, a lead they would take into the first intermission. The middle stanza would see the two clubs combine for 18 shots, but both goalies held strong to keep the score 2-1 after 40 minutes of play. Nashville would score a pair in the third, followed by a Yegor Sharangovich goal for Calgary and this game finished 4-2 for the home side.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Stars. The Flames and stars met at the start of the month with Calgary falling 4-3.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 2-3-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 5-4-0 against Western Conference opponents.

LAST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Dallas Stars to the Scotiabank Saddledome back on November 1st. Connor Zary would open the scoring with his first NHL goal just over five minutes into the first to give the Flames an early lead. Jamie Benn would respond for the Stars in the latter stages of the frame to leave the game deadlocked at one a piece through 20. In the second, Andrew Mangiapane sniped home his fourth of the year to give the Flames their second lead, but Dallas would score three unanswered goals to go up 4-2 through 40. MacKenzie Weegar would draw the Flames within one just 2:20 into the final stanza, but that is as close as Calgary would come as they fell 4-3.

TEXAS'S OWN:

Flames forward Blake Coleman is one of seven Texas-born skaters in the NHL this season, and he gets set to play in his 23rd game against his childhood team tonight. Coleman was born in Plano, TX just a 30-minute drive from Dallas, with six goals and four assists for 10 points against the Stars throughout his career thus far. Earlier this year, Coleman became just the fourth Texas-born NHLer to eclipse 200 NHL points when he reached the plateau on October 24th, joining Brian Leetch (1028), Seth Jones (377) and Tyler Myers (351).

BACK-TO-BACKS:

The Flames gear up to enter their third back-to-back set of the 2023-24 season tonight in Dallas before travelling to Colorado for their first of three meetings against the Avalanche tomorrow. The Flames previous two back-to-back scenarios came on Oct. 19 at BUF, Oct. 20 at CBJ and Nov. 10 at TOR, Nov. 11 at OTT. Following this, Calgary will have five more back-to-back sets this season with their next coming on Dec. 11 in COL and Dec. 12 in VGK.

DUBE 300:

Dillon Dube played his 300th NHL game on Wednesday in Nashville, skating in 16:54 of ice-time and registering two shots. Dube skated in his first NHL game on October 3rd, 2018 in Vancouver and scored his first NHL goal on November 21, 2018 against the Winnipeg Jets. Last season, Dube set a career-best with 45 points from 18 goals and 27 assists while skating in all 82 games for the Flames. The Golden, BC native was the Flames second-round pick (56th overall) in the 2016 NHL Draft and has played all of his 300 NHL games with Calgary.

CAPTAIN TIES:

The two captains of tonight's opponents Mikael Backlund and Jamie Benn were teammates on the Kelowna Rockets during the 2008-09 season. The Rockets would go on to win the WHL Championship that year in six games over the Calgary Hitmen and advance to the 2009 Memorial Cup, where they would fall in the finals to the Windsor Spitfires. The Rockets Head Coach that season was newly appointed Flames Head Coach Ryan Huska.

WE NOAH GUY:



Noah Hanifin found the back of the net on Wednesday in Nashville for his fourth goal in the month of November. With his four tallies this month, Hanifin is tied with the second-most goals by a defenceman in the month of November, only trailing Quinn Hughes (5). Hanifin has also registered two assists for six points since Nov. 1, and sits just four helpers away from 200 in his NHL career.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Connor Zary made his NHL debut and scored his first NHL goal against the Dallas Stars in the clubs last meeting back on November 1st.

The Flames have gone 5-0-0 in their last five regular-season trips to American Airlines Center dating back to the 2019-20 season, outscoring the Stars 23-15 through those contests. Elias Lindholm leads the Flames with eight points (3G, 5A) through those five meetings.
