- Eight different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game. Three had multi-point outings (**Matt Duchene, Thomas Harley** and **Jason Robertson**).
- According to NHL Stats, **Matt Duchene** (0:40) became the sixth different Stars player in the past decade to score two goals in a span of 40 seconds or less. **Jason Robertson** (0:39 on Jan. 18, 2025) was the last to do so.
- **Thomas Harley** scored with 1:07 remaining in regulation and became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation (also 59:55 on March 4, 2025), according to NHL Stats.
  - He also became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation.
- **Wyatt Johnston** assisted on **Thomas Harley's** game-winning goal, extending his point streak against the Blues to four games, collecting seven points (4-3—7) during that span.

## GAME NOTES

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games that the Stars will play against the Golden Knights this season. The two teams will face each other again this season on March 10 and March 22, both in Dallas.
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in points (69, tied fourth) and points percentage (.651, fourth) this year entering play Wednesday. The team's success this season comes despite having 182 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck, Jamie Benn, Lian Bichsel, Matt Duchene, Adam Erne, Thomas Harley, Roope Hintz, Nils Lundkvist, Ilya Lyubushkin** and **Tyler Seguin** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.

- Fourteen different skaters have scored a game-winning goal for Dallas this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
  - **Jason Robertson** and **Sam Steel** lead the team with five each, which was tied for eighth in the NHL entering play Wednesday. **Steel's** five game-winning goals are a career high and **Robertson's** are the fourth-most of his career.
- Five different plays have totaled at least 40 points for the Stars this season: **Mikko Rantanen** (19-45—64), **Jason Robertson** (30-32—62), **Wyatt Johnston** (27-30—57), **Miro Heiskanen** (7-34—41) and **Roope Hintz** (15-26—41). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas, Montreal and Vegas were the only three teams to have five 40-point players on their rosters this season.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 399-for-680 at the faceoff dot this season for a 58.7 percent success rate, which was tied for the seventh-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Wednesday.

## ROLLING THE DICE

- Dallas is 8-8-4 all-time vs. Vegas, including a 4-4-1 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in eight of their last 10 games played against the Golden Knights (6-2-2) dating back to April 26, 2022. Dallas has also earned points in four of their last five games played vs. Vegas at T-Mobile Arena (3-1-1).
- **Mikko Rantanen** has tallied six points (4-2—6) in his last four games played against the Golden Knights, dating back to Jan. 10, 2024. In all, **Rantanen** has totaled 18 points (9-9—18) in 24 career games played vs. Vegas, averaging 20:54 of time on ice per game.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Golden Knights, earning four points (1-3—4) during that span. In 14 career games played against Vegas, **Hintz** has registered 12 points (5-7—12), carrying a plus-minus rating of +4.
  - **Hintz** has also tallied eight points (2-6—8) in six career games played at T-Mobile Arena, averaging 1.33 points per game.
- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak against the Golden Knights, collecting six points (3-3—6) during that span, including scoring a hat trick in Dallas' last outing against them on Jan. 28, 2025. In all, **Johnston** has recorded seven points (4-3—7) in nine career games vs. Vegas, upholding a plus-minus rating of +4.
  - **Johnston** has registered five points (4-1—5) in five career games played at T-Mobile Arena.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game riding a two-game point streak against the Golden Knights, tallying three points (2-1—3) during that span. In 12 career games played against Vegas, **Robertson** has totaled nine points (5-4—9) with a plus-minus rating of +3.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Golden Knights, earning three assists during that span. In all, **Heiskanen** has seven points (0-7—7) in 17 career games played vs. Vegas, averaging 24:39 of time on ice per game.
  - His 24:39 time on ice per game played against them ranks ninth among all active NHL skaters who have played the Golden Knights at least 10 times in their career.
- **Mavrik Bourque** has put up two goals in his three career games played against Vegas, both of which were on the road at T-Mobile Arena.
- **Justin Hryckowian** is set to play in his first career game against the Golden Knights.
- **Jake Oettinger** holds a 6-2-2 record in 10 games played vs. Vegas, with a .917 save percentage, 2.33 goals-against average and one shutout.
  - His .917 save percentage against them is the fourth-best mark among all active NHL netminders who have played the Golden Knights at least 10 times in their career.

## MR. 300

- Forward **Wyatt Johnston** is expected to play in his 300th NHL game tonight. He will become the fourth player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to reach the 300-game milestone and the 82nd player in franchise history to play in 300 regular-season games with the team.
- **Johnston** has not missed a Stars game (regular season or playoffs) since making his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He will become the 17th skater in NHL history – and first since Nick Suzuki – to begin his NHL career by playing in at least 300 consecutive regular-season games according to NHL Stats.
  - Suzuki played in 410 consecutive regular-season games from Oct. 3, 2019 to Dec. 31, 2024 to begin his NHL career.
- **Johnston** has totaled 234 points (116-118—234) in his career, which is currently the 20th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the team according to NHL Stats.
  - He enters tonight's game one point shy of matching Dennis Maruk for 19th. Maruk had 235 points (80-155—235) in his first 300 games with the Minnesota North Stars from 1978-79 to 1987-88.
- His 234 points are also the 10th-most in franchise history through a player's first 300 games played with the Stars from the start of his career according to NHL Stats.
  - **Jason Robertson** (137-183—320) is the only Stars skater who began his career with the team since the franchise relocated to Dallas to have more points than **Johnston** through his first 300 games played.
- **Johnston**, selected with the 23rd-overall pick in 2021, leads all 2021 draftees in career goals, assists, points, even-strength goals (76), even-strength points (157), power-play goals (34), power-play points (70) and shorthanded goals (6).

## IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars have scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in each of their last two games to win in regulation, taking down the Blues in both contests. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2 and **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win.
- **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.

- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- Two of **Harley's** three goals this season have stood as game winners, which is just one shy of matching his career high of three that he reached in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.

## DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** scored twice in a span of 40 seconds in Dallas' last game on Jan. 27 against the Blues. His first goal came on the power play at 3:20 of the second period and then he scored a 5-on-5 goal at 4:00 of the second period.
- **Duchene** became the sixth different Stars player in the past decade to score two goals in a span of 40 seconds or less according to NHL Stats. **Jason Robertson** (0:39 on Jan. 18, 2025) was the last to do so.
- **Duchene** is also one of eight players to score two goals in a 40-second span this season according to NHL Stats.
- When **Duchene** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play against the Blues, the Stars owned a 62.2 expected goals for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Duchene** has now scored three goals in his last two games. If he were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time this season.

## MILESTONE MEN

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring 200 NHL goals. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the...
  - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
  - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
  - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- The next game that **Adam Erne** plays will be the 400th of his regular-season career. When he reaches the milestone, it will make him the 42nd player drafted in 2013 and the 10th Connecticut-born player in NHL history to play in at least 400 regular-season games.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.

## POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 46-for-154 on the power play this season for a 29.9 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas' 46 power-play goals scored this season also ranked second the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas' 46 power-play goals are just nine shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 71 power-play goals, which would be the seventh-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 15 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 27 against the St. Louis Blues, a 4-3 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
  - Their 15 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
- Dallas has scored two power-play goals in three of the last five games that they have played, including their last two. If they were to do so again tonight, it would give them multiple power-play goals in three straight games for the first time since April 1 to 6, 2023.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 46 power-play goals have been scored by 10 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (17), **Jason Robertson** (10), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (3), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
- **Johnston** (17-11—28) and **Rantanen** (5-23—28) were tied for fourth in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Wednesday with 28 each, followed by **Robertson** (10-16—26) who ranked sixth.
  - **Johnston's** 28 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 26 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 28 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 17 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Wednesday and were four more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 17 power-play goals are already a career high and are tied with **Jamie Benn** in 2015-16 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). He trails only the 18 power-play goals that Mike Modano scored in 1993-94.
  - **Johnston's** 17 power-play goals are five shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Rantanen** is currently on pace to have 44 power-play points this year, which would be a career high and would match the franchise record for most power-play points in a season, tying Bobby Smith (13-31—44) in 1980-81.
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 17 points (1-16—17) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Wednesday.

## ROAD WARRIORS

- Tonight's matchup against the Golden Knights marks the 10th of 11 road games the Stars will play in January – the most they will play in any one month during the 2025-26 regular season.
- The Stars have a 16-6-6 record for 38 points in 29 road games this season, ranking second in the NHL in road wins (tied) and points entering play Wednesday.
- Dallas ranked second in the NHL in goals scored on the road (99) and fifth in road goals per game (3.41) entering play Wednesday.
- **Jason Robertson** (17-19—36) is the Stars' leading scorer on the road this season. His 17 road goals and 36 road points tied for second and sixth, respectively, in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Mikko Rantanen** (12-22—34) ranked second on the Stars and 10th in the NHL in road scoring this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 23, totaling 18 points (7-11—18) in 18 road games.

## THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 167:51 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 10-5, have a 63.9 expected goals for percentage, a 58.3 shots for percentage and a 59.9 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
  - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 63.1 expected goals for percentage, which is the third-best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together.
- Despite playing in only 52 games this season, **Bourque** (8-10—18) is three goals, four assists and seven points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
  - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 12 goals, 15 assists and 27 points.

## CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- The Stars are currently on pace to finish the year with 71 power-play goals, which would be the seventh-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- **Wyatt Johnston** is pacing to score 26 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (46) and **Johnston** (42) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
  - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.

## 21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** has totaled 62 points (30-32—62) in 53 games played this season, ranking second on the team and tied for 10th in the NHL in scoring entering play Wednesday. **Robertson's** 30 goals were tied for third in the League entering play Wednesday.
- **Robertson** was leading all American NHLers goals (30, tied) and points (62) this season entering play Wednesday.
  - **Robertson** has totaled 331 points (140-191—331) since the start of the 2022-23 season, which leads all American-born skaters during that span. His 331 points are 16 more than second-ranked Auston Matthews (315).
- **Robertson's** 192 shots on goal this year were the fifth-most in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- Twenty-six (10-16—26) of **Robertson's** 62 points this season have come on the power play, which was the sixth-most in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- On Jan. 23 against the Blues, **Robertson** recorded his 30th goal, 30th assist and 60th point of the season.
  - The 2025-26 campaign is the fourth season, and second consecutive, that **Robertson** has reached the 30-goal mark. **Robertson** is the ninth player in franchise history to record at least four 30-goal seasons with the Stars, joining Mike Modano (9x), Brian Bellows (7x), Dino Ciccarelli (7x), Dave Gagner (6x), Jamie Benn (5x), Bill Goldsworthy (5x), Tyler Seguin (5x) and Steve Payne (4x).
  - With his assist, **Robertson** has now recorded six consecutive 30-assist seasons.
  - 2025-26 is the fifth straight season that **Robertson** has recorded at least 60 points.
- **Robertson** scored with one minute remaining in regulation on Jan. 23 against St. Louis, marking the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Thomas Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With a goal on Jan. 6 against the Carolina Hurricanes, **Robertson** reached the 50-point mark in his 43rd game played, making him the fourth player in Stars team history to have 50 points in 45 or fewer games according to NHL Stats. He joined Mike Modano (3x), Brad Richards (2x) and **Tyler Seguin** (2x).
- **Robertson** scored his first-ever goal against the Maple Leafs in Dallas' game on Dec. 21 against Toronto. With the goal, **Robertson** has now scored at least one goal against every other team in the NHL.

- **Robertson** tallied three points (2-1—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 19, an 8-3 win over the Anaheim Ducks. It marked the 33rd three-point performance of his career, which tied Tim Young for the 10th-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- His performance against the Ducks was also the 12th time in his career that he has scored at least two goals in the same period, which is also the 10th-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' game on Dec. 11 against Minnesota, making the 2025-26 season his fifth consecutive 20-goal campaign. He is now the fourth player in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) to have 20 or more goals in five consecutive seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (8 from 1995-96 to 2002-03), **Jamie Benn** (6 from 2013-14 to 2018-19) and **Tyler Seguin** (6 from 2013-14 to 2018-19).
- **Robertson** played in his 400th NHL game on Nov. 30 against the Senators. In reaching the milestone, he became the 47th player in franchise history and the 13th skater selected in the 2017 NHL draft to play in 400 regular-season games.
  - **Robertson's** 429 career points (184-245—429) were the third-most in franchise history through a player's first 400 games with the team and the fifth-most in NHL history among American-born players through their first 400 career games.
- **Robertson** scored the 184th goal of his career in that game, which was the second-most by a player through 400 career games with the Stars/North Stars (NHL debut or otherwise) behind Dino Ciccarelli (221) according to NHL Stats. He also passed Kyle Connor (183) for the eighth-most goals through 400 games by a U.S.-born player in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored in seven consecutive games from Nov. 11 to 25, finding the back of the net 11 times in total during that span. His seven-game goal streak remains the longest in the NHL this season.
- **Robertson's** seven-game goal streak was the longest of his career and the longest by a Stars skater since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94. It is also tied for the second-longest by an American skater since the start of the 2005-06 season according to NHL Stats, trailing only Auston Matthews' eight-game goal streak in 2023-24.
- **Robertson's** 11 goals over the course of his seven-game goal streak were the most ever by a Stars skater. The previous record was held by Bill Goldsworthy, who scored nine goals over the course of a seven-game goal streak from Feb. 6 to 17, 1971.
- When he extended his goal streak to six games on Nov. 22 against the Flames, **Robertson** became the fifth player in Stars/ North Stars history to have multiple six-game goal streaks according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (4x), Jamie Benn (2x), Danny Grant (2x) and Bill Goldsworthy (2x).
- From Nov. 13 to 18, **Robertson** recorded three consecutive multi-goals games for the second time in his career according to NHL Stats. **Robertson** previously had three consecutive three-point games for the first time in his career after doing so from Nov. 11 to 15.
- **Robertson** scored two goals in the Stars' game on Nov. 18 against the Islanders for his 31st career multi-goal game, which surpassed former Minnesota North Stars forward Steve Payne for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored the sixth hat trick of his career in Dallas' game on Nov. 15 vs. Philadelphia to tie Neal Broten and Steve Payne for seventh place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats. All three of his goals came consecutively, making him the second player in franchise history (Neal Broten) to score multiple natural hat tricks.

## JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** has totaled 57 points (27-30—57) in 53 games played this year and enters tonight's game ranked third on the team and tied for 16th in the NHL in scoring entering play Wednesday. **Johnston's** 27 goals were tied for 10th in the NHL this year.
- **Johnston** was tied for fourth in goals and sixth in points among Canadian NHL players this season entering play Wednesday.
- Twenty-eight (17-11—28) of **Johnston's** 57 points this season have come on the power play, which was tied with teammate **Mikko Rantanen** for the fourth-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday. His 28 power-play points are already a career high.
- **Johnston's** 17 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Wednesday and were four more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 17 power-play goals are already a career high and are tied with Jamie Benn in 2015-16 for the second-most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). He trails only the 18 power-play goals that Mike Modano scored in 1993-94.
  - **Johnston's** 17 power-play goals are five shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 42 goals, 46 assists and 88 points, all of which would be career highs. Forty-two goals would tie for the 10th-most by a Stars skater in a single season in franchise history.
- **Johnston** enters tonight's game three goals shy of making the 2025-26 campaign his third consecutive 30-goal season.
- He recorded his 30th assist of the season on Jan. 27 against the Blues and has now tallied at least 30 assists in each of his last three seasons.
- **Johnston** tied his single-game career high with three assists on Dec. 27 against Chicago, factoring in on each of Dallas' three goals. It marked the fifth three-assist game of his career, which is tied for the third-most in franchise history by a player age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats. Bobby Smith (11) and Mike Modano (7) are the only players with more.
- **Johnston** scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' Dec. 23 against Detroit, making the 2025-26 season his fourth-consecutive 20-goal season. His four 20-goal seasons to begin his career is the fifth-longest run by a player in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston** scored the fourth hat trick of his career and added an assist for his second four-point game of the season in Dallas' game on Nov. 30 against the Senators. He became the third player in Stars/North Stars history with four career hat tricks before age 23 according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli and **Tyler Seguin** (both with five).
- **Johnston** had four points (1-3—4) in Dallas' game on Nov. 25 against the Oilers – an 8-3 Stars win – scoring one power-play goal and adding three assists. It was his highest single-game point total since he had a career-high five points (3-2—5) on March 5, 2024 against the Nashville Predators.

- His performance against Edmonton marked the third time in his career that he has had at least four points in a game. He joined **Tyler Seguin** (6x) as the second player in Stars team history to register as many at age 22 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston's** second assist of the night was the 200th point of his NHL career, making him the first player in his draft class to total 200 career points and the 50th player in franchise history to have 200 points with the club. He is the first player in Stars team history with 200 career points at age 22 or younger, and the fifth in franchise history alongside Brian Bellows (342), Mike Modano (309), Bobby Smith (222) and Tom McCarthy (202) according to NHL Stats.
- Among players to debut with the Stars, **Johnston** (100-100—200 in 269 games played) became the third-fastest player in team history to record 200 NHL points behind Jason Robertson (190 games played) and **Roope Hintz** (263 games played) according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston's** second assist of the night also marked the 100th assist of his NHL career. He became the first player from his draft class to total 100 career assists and the 60th player in franchise history to have 100 assists with the Stars.
- **Johnston** (100-100—200) became the 10th active player to have 100 goals and 100 assists at the time of his 200th career point according to NHL Stats. He joined Alex DeBrincat, Tyler Toffoli, James van Riemsdyk, Conor Sheary, Nino Niederreiter, Sam Bennett, Victor Olofsson and Joel Armia.
- **Johnston's** scored his 100th NHL goal in Dallas' Nov. 13 game, a 7-0 win over Montreal. In doing so, he became the first player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft to score 100 NHL goals and the 26th player in franchise history to score 100 goals for the Stars/North Stars.
- **Johnston**, who was 22 years and 183 days old on Nov. 13, became the third-youngest player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career goals according to NHL Stats. Only Brian Bellows (20 years, 179 days) and Mike Modano (22 years, 173 days) reached the mark at a younger age.
- **Johnston** recorded at least one point on the power play in five consecutive games from Nov. 1 to 9, which was the longest such streak of his career. He is the first Stars skater to have a power-play point in five straight games since **Tyler Seguin** had a six-game power-play point streak from Dec. 29, 2018 to Jan. 8, 2019 according to NHL Stats.
- **Johnston** recorded three consecutive multi-point efforts from Nov. 4 to 8, notching three assists against the Oilers, three points (2-1—3) against the Ducks and two assists against the Predators.
  - Both of **Johnston's** goals against Anaheim came on the power play, marking the second time in his career that he has had multiple power-play goals in the same game, after scoring three on March 2, 2025 against the St. Louis Blues.
  - **Johnston** also scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Edmonton. It marked the second shootout goal of his career and the first time he has scored a game-winner in the shootout.

## PUTTING ON THE RITZ

- On Jan. 7, **Justin Hryckowian** signed a two-year, one-way contract extension that will run through the 2027-28 season. The two-year deal is worth \$1.9 million (\$950,000 AAV).
- The rookie has totaled 17 points (8-9—17) in 52 games with Dallas this season. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 12 goals, 14 assists and 26 points. Twelve goals would be the most by a Stars rookie since **Wyatt Johnston** scored 24 goals in his rookie season in 2022-23.
- **Hryckowian** recorded the first multi-point game of his career and finished the night with three points (1-2—3) on Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins, a 6-2 Stars win. It made him the first Stars rookie to have a three-point game since Logan Stankoven scored two goals and added an assist on Jan. 14, 2025 against the Toronto Maple Leafs.
- **Hryckowian** has won 58.3 percent of the faceoffs he has taken this season (77-for-132), which was the second-best mark among rookies to take at least 100 draws this year entering play Wednesday.
- His 58.3 win percentage at the faceoff dot ranked 16th among all NHL skaters who have taken at least 100 draws this year entering play Wednesday, regardless of rookie or veteran status.
- **Hryckowian** went 10-for-13 at the faceoff dot on Jan. 20 against Boston, setting a single-game career high and becoming the first Stars rookie to win at least 10 faceoffs in a game since **Roope Hintz** went 14-for-20 (70 percent) on April 6, 2019 against the Minnesota Wild.
- **Hryckowian** has totaled 77 hits this season, which was tied for eighth among all NHL rookies this year entering play Wednesday.

## LIND, LAUGH, LOVE

- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 21 points (5-16—21) in 53 games this year, which is the second-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 26 assists and 34 points, both of which would be career highs.
  - His 16 assists this season are only five shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Lindell** has totaled a team-high 116 blocked shots this season, which was the seventh-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday. The 2025-26 campaign is the 10th consecutive season in which he has had at least 100 blocks.
  - **Lindell** has recorded at least 100 blocked shots in each of his full NHL seasons, topped by a career-high 170 blocks last year.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when **Lindell** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars...
  - Are outscoring their opponents 43-29.
  - Have 23 high-danger goals for to their opponents' 10.
  - Own a 55.2 expected goals for percentage.
  - Have a 55.1 high-danger chances for percentage.

- **Lindell** is leading the Stars in 5-on-5 in on-ice goals for (43, tied), high-danger on-ice goals for (23) and expected goals for percentage (55.2) this season.
- **Lindell** ranked second in the NHL in both total shorthanded ice time (214:17) and shorthanded ice time per game (4:03) this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Lindell** scored his fifth goal of the season on Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins, matching his total from 2024-25 in 30 fewer games played.
  - His goal against the Bruins was the eventual game winner, his first since April 10, 2023 against the Detroit Red Wings.
- **Lindell** tied his single-game career high in both points and assists on Jan. 12 against the Los Angeles Kings, assisting on all three of Dallas' goals. It marked the fourth three-assist game and the sixth three-point game of his career.
- **Lindell's** first assist against the Kings was the 178th of his career, giving him sole possession of ninth on the franchise's all-time assist list among defensemen.
- **Lindell** tallied an assist on **Miro Heiskanen's** shorthanded goal – the team's first of the season – in Dallas' game on Dec. 11 against the Minnesota Wild. It marked the 13th shorthanded point of his career, the second-most by a Finnish defenseman on record in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
  - He trails only Kimmo Timonen (14).
- **Lindell** opened the scoring 44 seconds into regulation in Dallas' game on Dec. 9, a 4-3 win over the Winnipeg Jets. It was the fourth opening-minute goal of his career, which is the most by a defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
  - Only five players in franchise history have more: Mike Modano (10), Jamie Benn (7), Brian Bellows (6), Dino Ciccarelli (6) and Bill Goldsworthy (5).
- His goal against the Jets made **Lindell** the 11th defenseman in NHL history with four opening-minute goals according to NHL Stats. Only four have more: Ray Bourque (9), Larry Murphy (6), Brent Burns (5) and Sandis Ozolinsh (5).

## MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** has 41 points (7-34—41) in 51 games played this season, tying for fourth on the Stars and 10th among all NHL defensemen in scoring this season entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** has scored 65 total goals in his career, making him the seventh Finnish defenseman in NHL history to have 60 or more career goals and the only active one to do so according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** is averaging 25:59 of ice time per game this season, which was the third-highest total in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 32 takeaways this season, which was the seventh-most in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** recorded his 40th point of the season with an assist on Jan. 23 against St. Louis. The 2025-26 campaign is the third time **Heiskanen** has reached the 40-point mark, making him one of six defensemen in franchise history to have at least three 40-point seasons with the Stars.
- **Heiskanen** tallied three assists on Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins for his 56th career multi-assist game, which tied Dino Ciccarelli for ninth on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** recorded the 55th multi-assist game of his career with two helpers on Dec. 19 against the Ducks. His 55 multi-assist games are the third-most by a Finnish-born defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** scored the first shorthanded goal of his career in Dallas' game on Dec. 11 against the Wild. He was one of nine defensemen this season to score a shorthanded goal entering play Wednesday.
- **Heiskanen** scored in three consecutive games from Dec. 3 to 7, setting a career high and becoming the seventh defenseman in Stars team history to score in three straight games.
- **Heiskanen** scored the game-tying goal with 1:49 remaining in regulation on Dec. 7 against the Pittsburgh Penguins, an eventual 3-2 shootout win for the Stars. According to NHL Stats, it was the latest game-tying goal by a Stars skater since Craig Smith (59:45) on Dec. 23, 2023.
- **Heiskanen** played in his 500th NHL game on Nov. 28, a 4-3 win over the Utah Mammoth. In reaching the milestone, he became...
  - The 34th player and 16th defensemen to play in 500 games for the Stars.
  - The second player (Nico Hischier) drafted in 2017 to play in 500 NHL games.
  - The 46th Finnish player and 13th Finnish defenseman to play in 500 NHL games.
- **Heiskanen** tallied two assists against Utah, the second of which was the 305th point of his career. He surpassed Philadelphia's Rasmus Ristolainen for eighth place on the NHL's all-time points list among Finnish defensemen.
- His 305 career points (61-244—305) were the fourth-most by a Stars defensemen through his first 500 games played according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** performance against the Mammoth was also the 54th career multi-assist game, tying Craig Hartsburg for the second most in franchise history among defensemen according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen** set a regular-season, single-game career high with 32:47 of ice time in Dallas' Nov. 22 game against the Calgary Flames, a 3-2 shootout loss. It is the most ice time any skater in the NHL has had in a single game this season.
  - It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since **Heiskanen** skated 32:01 April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- **Heiskanen** tallied an assist against Montreal on Nov. 13 for the 300th point of his career, making him:
  - The second defenseman and ninth skater from the 2017 draft class to tally 300 NHL points.
  - The fifth defenseman and 29th skater in franchise history to reach the 300-point milestone.
  - The ninth Finnish defenseman in NHL history to record 300 points.
  - The 45th active defenseman to have 300 career points.

- **Heiskanen** recorded at least two assists in four consecutive games from Nov. 6 to 11, which tied **Roope Hintz** (March 24 to 29, 2025) for the longest streak of multi-assist games in franchise history according to NHL Stats. His 10 assists over that stretch also tied **Hintz** for the most assists by a Stars skater in franchise history over a four-game span according to NHL Stats. **Hintz** first accomplished this feat from Feb. 28 to March 6, 2025.
  - He is one of three active defensemen to have posted a multi-assist streak of four games, joining Erik Karlsson (four games in 2014-15 and 2011-12), Josh Morrissey (four games in 2023-24) and Roman Josi (four games in 2021-22).
  - His performance against the Kraken on Nov. 9 was the 52nd multi-assist game of his career, which gave him sole possession of 13th in franchise history according to NHL Stats. He was previously tied with Dennis Hextall (51).
- **Heiskanen** tied his single-game career high with four assists in Dallas' game on Nov. 6 against Anaheim. He is now the sixth defenseman in franchise history to have multiple four-point games.
  - He joins Colorado's Cale Makar and Vancouver's Quinn Hughes as the only defensemen this season to tally four assists in a single game.
  - **Heiskanen** last had four assists in a game on March 5, 2024, against the San Jose Sharks.
- **Heiskanen** scored two goals in the team's Oct. 25 game against the Hurricanes, opening the scoring for the Stars and tallying the game-winning goal on the power play in the third period. It marked the first multi-goal game by a Stars skater this season.
- His performance against Carolina marked the sixth multi-goal game of his career and first since Nov. 11, 2024. His second goal of the game also was his first power-play goal since Feb. 20, 2024 against the New York Rangers.
- **Heiskanen's** six multi-goal games are the third-most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history according to NHL Stats, trailing only Brad Maxwell (11) and Craig Hartsburg (8). He now also ranks fourth all-time among Finnish born defensemen in career multi-goal games behind only Reijo Ruotsalainen (12 GP), Kimmo Timonen (7 GP) and Risto Siltanen (7 GP) according to NHL Stats.

## THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- **Mikko Rantanen** has totaled 64 points (19-45—64) in 50 games played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in scoring. He tied for seventh in both points and assists in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday.
- He is one goal shy of becoming the fifth Finnish player in NHL history to record nine-plus 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats. He would join Teemu Selanne (17x), Jari Kurri (13x), Aleksander Barkov (10x) and Sebastian Aho (9x).
- **Rantanen** is currently pacing to finish the year with a career-high 71 assists and 101 points, which would be four points shy of matching his career high. If he were to maintain that pace, **Rantanen** would become the third Finnish skater in NHL history to record three 100-point seasons after also doing so in 2022-23 (55-50—105) and 2023-24 (42-62—104). He would join Jari Kurri (6x) and Teemu Selanne (4x).
  - 101 points would tie for the 13th-most in a single season by a Finnish player in NHL history.
- If **Rantanen** were to finish the year with 101 points, it would make his 2025-26 campaign the sixth-highest scoring season by a Stars skater in franchise history.
- Seventy-one assists would tie for the second-most in a single season in franchise history and the most-ever by a Finnish skater in NHL history.
- Twenty-eight (5-23—28) of **Rantanen's** 64 points this season have come on the power play, which was tied for the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.
- **Rantanen** reached the 60-point mark in his 44th game played of the season on Jan. 10 at San Jose, tying the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) for fewest games needed to total 60 points according to NHL Stats. He matched the record that **Jason Robertson** set in 2022-23.
- **Rantanen's** performance against San Jose on Jan. 10 was also the 209th multi-point game of his career, which matched **Aleksander Barkov** for the third-most by a Finnish player according to NHL Stats. The only players with more are **Jari Kurri** (385) and **Teemu Selanne** (382).
- According to NHL Stats, **Rantanen** became the fifth player in franchise history to record five consecutive multi-point games on the road when he did so from Dec. 18 against San Jose to Jan. 6 against Carolina. He totaled 10 points (2-8—10) during that run.
- Fifty-six (16-40—56) of his 61 points came in his first 40 games played of the season, which tied for the fourth-most through a players' first 40 games played of the season in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- **Rantanen** tallied his 40th assist of the season in Dallas' game on Jan. 1 against Chicago, making the 2025-26 season the second time he has recorded 40 assists in 40 or fewer games in his career (also 2018-19) according to NHL Stats. He became the second Finnish player to achieve the feat multiple times, joining Jari Kurri (3x).
- **Rantanen** had two assists in Dallas' Dec. 23 game against Detroit, the first of which was his 50th point of the season. He became the second-fastest player in Stars team history (since 1993-94) to record 50 points in a season according to NHL Stats. Only **Jason Robertson** required fewer games in 2022-23 (35 GP).
- **Rantanen** tallied two assists on Dec. 18 against the Sharks to bring his career point total to 751, which gave him sole possession of fifth on the all-time scoring list among Finnish-born players.
- **Rantanen** scored a goal and tallied an assist in Dallas' game on Dec. 15 – a 4-1 win over Los Angeles. **Rantanen's** assist was his 30th of the season, tying Neal Broten in 1985-86 for the fifth-fastest player in franchise history to reach the 30-assist mark, doing so in his 33rd game of the season.
- **Rantanen** tallied three assists on Dec. 9 against the Winnipeg Jets – his 50th regular-season game with the Stars. His third assist of the night was his 60th point with the Stars (18-42—60), setting a franchise record for most points by a skater through his first 50 regular-season games with the team according to NHL Stats.
- **Rantanen** scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout against Pittsburgh on Dec. 7. It marked the sixth game-deciding goal of his career, which tied him with Teemu Selanne for the sixth-most in NHL history among Finnish skaters.

- **Rantanen** had three points (1-2—3) the previous game on Dec. 5 against the Sharks, a 4-1 Dallas win. His performance against San Jose marked the 200th multi-point performance of his career, making him the fourth Finnish player and seventh-fastest European skater to record 200 multi-point games according to NHL Stats.

## GOING FOR GOLD

- Seven stars players have been selected to represent their home countries at the upcoming Winter Olympic Games in Milan – **Radek Faksa** (Czechia), **Thomas Harley** (Canada), **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland), **Roope Hintz** (Finland), **Esa Lindel** (Finland), **Jake Oettinger** (United States) and **Mikko Rantanen** (Finland).
- The Stars are one of seven NHL teams to have at least seven Olympians on their roster, joining the Colorado Avalanche (8), Florida Panthers (9), Minnesota Wild (8), New Jersey Devils (8), Tampa Bay Lightning (10) and Vegas Golden Knights (7).
- The Stars and the Wild are the only teams to have four of their players on the same Olympic team – Four Stars will play for Finland and four Wild will play for Sweden.
- This marks the first Olympic selection for **Faksa, Harley, Hintz, Lindell, Oettinger** and **Rantanen**.
- **Heiskanen** previously represented Finland at the 2018 Winter Olympic games, scoring one goal in five games. He has also represented Finland in international play at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2016, 2017), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2018, 2022).
- **Lindell** has played for Finland's national team at nearly every level of international competition – the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2012), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF World Championship (2015, 2022) and World Cup of Hockey (2016).
- **Rantanen** has previously represented Finland at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2014), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016) and IIHF World Championship (2016, 2017, 2018, 2023).
- Prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off, **Hintz** played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- The Winter Olympics will mark the first time that all four Finns on Dallas' roster will play in an international tournament together.
- Although born in Syracuse, New York, **Harley** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition, doing so at the 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and the 2021 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship prior to last year's Four Nations Face Off.
- **Oettinger** – a native of Minnesota – has previously played for Team USA at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2015, 2016), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2017, 2018) and IIHF World Championship (2021).
- **Harley, Oettinger** and all four Finns were selected for their country's roster for the Four Nations Face Off that was played last February. **Heiskanen** ultimately had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- **Faksa** has previously played for Czechia's national team at the IIHF U18 World Junior Championship (2011), IIHF U20 World Junior Championship (2012, 2013, 2014), IIHF World Championship (2016, 2018, 2019) and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

## STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson, Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
  - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
  - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
  - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

## IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (345) and **Wyatt Johnston** (299).
- **Robertson's** 345-game Iron Man streak was the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 299 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Wednesday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
  - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

## THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
  - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
  - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
  - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
  - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
  - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

## CONNECTIONS

- Golden Knights assistant coach John Stevens served as an assistant coach with the Stars from 2019-20 to 2021-22.
- Golden Knights forward Reilly Smith was originally selected by the Stars in the third round (69th overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft. Smith would skate in Dallas from 2011-12 to 2012-13.
