- The Stars extended their point streak to 15 games (14-0-1), tying the franchise record that the team originally set Dec. 6, 1998 to Jan. 6, 1999, going 12-0-3-0 in those games.
- The win also extended Dallas’ home winning streak against Detroit to 13 games dating back to Jan. 12, 2017.
- With the win, **Jake Oettinger** extended his personal point streak to 12 games (11-0-1), which began on Jan. 20. His 11-game point streak is...
 - The longest point streak of his career.
 - The second-longest in Dallas Stars team history, trailing only Casey DeSmith’s 13-game earlier this season (Oct. 26 to Dec. 23).
 - Tied for the third-longest point streak by a goaltender in franchise history.
- **Michael Bunting** scored his first goal as a member of the Stars in the second period on the power play. **Bunting** now has 19 points (8-10—18) in 17 career games against the Red Wings.
- **Jason Robertson** recorded the secondary assist on **Bunting’s** goal to give him 22 points (9-13—22) in 16 career games against the Red Wings.
- **Wyatt Johnston’s** first-period goal was his 72nd point of the season, which set a new career high for the forward. He surpassed the 71 points (33-38—71) he had in 82 games last season.
 - With a goal and an assist during the game, **Johnston** extended his point streak against Detroit to five games, totaling eight points (4-4—8) during that span.
- **Thomas Harley’s** game-winning goal was the seventh overtime goal, which sets the record for the most by a Stars defenseman in franchise history.
 - **Harley’s** seven career overtime goals are tied for the sixth-most in the NHL since the start of the 2023-24 season and are the most by any defenseman during that span.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the fourth and final game that the Stars will play against the Mammoth this season. Dallas defeated Utah in two of their last three games played against them this season on Nov. 28 (4-3 W) and Jan. 31 (3-2 W) while falling short on Jan. 15 (2-1 L).
- The Stars ranked second in the NHL in wins (42, tied), points (94, second) and points percentage (.712, second) this year. The team's success this season comes despite having 229 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Radek Faksa**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Mikko Rantanen** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Dallas has only allowed 44 goals against in the first period this season, which was the fewest in the NHL entering play Sunday. In all, the Stars are averaging 2.64 goals against per game this year, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jason Robertson** have both scored 36 goals this season, tying for sixth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Jamie Benn**, **Matt Duchene** and **Sam Steel** have played 129:37 together at 5-on-5 this season. When the line has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 9-4, have a 58.8 expected goals for percentage and a 60.0 high danger chances for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Casey DeSmith** ranked 10th in goals saved above expected (13.2) and eighth in goals saved above expected per 60 (0.558) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Sunday.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars have earned at least a point in each of the last 15 games that they have played, posting a 14-0-1 record during that span.
- The team's current point streak is tied for the longest in franchise history, matching the franchise record that the Stars set from Dec. 6, 1998 to Jan. 6, 1999, posting a 12-0-3-0 record during that span.
- Dallas' current run is tied with the Tampa Bay Lightning (14-0-1) for the second-longest point streak in the NHL this season. They trail only the Colorado Avalanche's 17-game point streak (14-0-3) from Oct. 26 to Dec. 2 for the longest in the NHL this year.
- Since Jan. 23, Dallas has led the League in wins (14), points (29) and points percentage (.967).
- The Stars have outscored their opponents 62-35 over the course of the streak. Their plus-27 goal differential topped the League during that span entering play Sunday.
- Dallas led in the NHL in goals per game (4.13, tied) and ranked second in goals against per game (2.33) since Jan. 23 entering play Sunday.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, at 5-on-5 play during the team's current point streak, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 38-24 and own a 60.8 expected goals for percentage, a 63.4 high danger chances for percentage and a 55.4 shots for percentage.
 - No team has a better expected goals for percentage during that span. The Ottawa Senators ranked second entering play Sunday with 57.2 percent.
- The team has gone 18-for-54 on the power play over the course of this point streak for a 33.3 percent success rate. Their 33.3 percent conversion rate and 18 power-play goals both topped the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Sunday.
 - The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in 14 of the 15 games that they have played during the team's current point streak.
- Dallas has also gone 37-for-43 (86.0 percent) on the penalty kill during the streak, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Sunday.
 - They have not allowed a power-play goal against in four consecutive games played, going a perfect 10-for-10 while playing shorthanded during that span.
- **Matt Duchene** (9-12—21) and **Jason Robertson** (7-14—21) are tied for the team lead in scoring over the course of the streak, totaling 21 points each. In all, six Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.40), **Robertson** (1.40), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.27), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.13), **Jamie Benn** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
 - **Duchene's** and **Robertson's** 21 points during that span were tied for the ninth-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Eighteen different skaters have scored at least one goal for the Stars during the team's current 14-game point streak: **Johnston** (10), **Duchene** (9), **Benn** (7), **Robertson** (7), **Mavrik Bourque** (5), **Thomas Harley** (4), **Sam Steel** (4), **Nathan Bastian** (3), **Lian Bichsel** (2), **Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Michael Bunting** (1), **Adam Erne** (1), **Roope Hintz** (1), **Nils Lundkvist** (1) and **Rantanen** (1).
- Defensive pairs **Esa Lindell** and **Miro Heiskanen** (60.0) and **Thomas Harley** and **Nils Lundkvist** (65.9) both have an expected goals for percentage above 60 percent over the course of the streak.

MAMMOTH MATCHUP

- Dallas is 5-2-0 all-time vs. Utah, including a 2-1-0 mark on home ice.
- The Stars' five all-time wins against the Mammoth are tied for first among all NHL teams.
- Dallas upholds a 33.3 percent success rate (7-for-21) on the power play against Utah, which is the fifth-best mark among all NHL teams.
- **Jamie Benn** registered two assists in Dallas' last game played against the Mammoth on Jan. 31. In all, **Benn** has totaled six points (4-2—6) in seven career games played vs. Utah, including putting up two game-winning goals.

- **Wyatt Johnston** enters tonight's contest riding a six-game point streak against the Mammoth, earning seven points (3-4—7) during that span. In all, **Johnston** has totaled seven points (3-4—7) in seven career games played vs. Utah, recording points in all but one game played against them.
- **Thomas Harley** has collected three points (2-1—3) in five career games played against the Mammoth, averaging 23:39 of time on ice per game.
- **Jason Robertson** has tallied four points (2-2—4) in seven career games played vs. Utah, averaging 18:46 of time on ice per game.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's matchup riding a two-game point streak against the Mammoth, earning three assists during that span. In five career games played vs. Utah, **Heiskanen** has totaled four assists and averaging 26:06 of time on ice per game.
 - His 26:06 of time on ice per game played against them is the fourth-best mark among all active NHL skaters.
- **Matt Duchene** recorded the game-winning goal in his last meeting against the Mammoth on Jan. 31. In all, **Duchene** has notched four points (1-3—4) in six career games played vs. Utah, carrying a plus-minus rating of +2.
- **Sam Steel** has collected four assists in seven career games played against the Mammoth, putting up three shots on goal.
- **Jake Oettinger** owns a 2-1-0 career record against Utah, posting a .924 save percentage and 2.34 goals-against average.
 - His .924 save percentage against the Mammoth ranks fourth among active NHL netminders who have played Utah at least three times in their career.
- **Casey DeSmith** has a 3-1-0 record against the Mammoth, posting a .910 save percentage and 2.51 goals-against average.
 - His .910 save percentage against them ranks ninth among active NHL netminders who have played Utah at least three times in their career.

HOME COOKING

- Tonight marks the final game of a season-long, six-game homestand for the Stars. The team has posted a 4-0-1 record in the first five games of the homestand.
- Dallas has earned at least a point in each of the last 11 games that they have played at the American Airlines Center dating back to Jan. 20, going 10-0-1 in those games.
- The team's current 11-game home point streak is tied for the eighth-longest such streak in franchise history.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give the Stars points in 12 consecutive home games for the first time since Jan. 24 to April 3, 2025.

POWER TRIP

- The Stars have gone 60-for-200 on the power play this season for a 30.0 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Dallas was the only team to score at least 60 power-play goals this season entering play Sunday.
- The Stars have scored at least one goal on the power play in each of the last 12 games they have played, which is Dallas' longest streak since Oct. 28 to Dec. 10, 2005 when the team scored a power-play goal in 18 straight games.
 - Dallas is the first team in the NHL to score a power-play goal in 12 consecutive games since the Colorado Avalanche did so from March 7 to 27, 2023 according to NHL Stats.
- If they were to do so again tonight, it would make them the first team to score a power-play goal in 13 consecutive games since the Boston Bruins scored one in 14 straight from Dec. 14, 2019 to Jan. 13, 2020.
- Dallas' 60 power-play goals have already surpassed the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 75 power-play goals, which would be the fifth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
 - The Stars' 60 power play goals are their most in a single season since they scored 64 times on the man advantage in 82 regular-season games in 2022-23.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 different times this season, most recently on March 12 against the Edmonton Oilers, a 7-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 17 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they also scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 60 power-play goals have been scored by 13 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (22), **Jason Robertson** (12), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Miro Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Jamie Benn** (2), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Michael Bunting**, **Thomas Harley**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 12 power-play goals are just one shy of matching his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Johnston** (22-14—36) ranked third in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Sunday, followed by **Robertson** (12-21—33), who ranked fifth, and **Rantanen** (5-25—30), who ranked eighth.
 - **Johnston's** 36 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 33 power-play points are the second-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 22 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Sunday and were four more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- His 22 power-play goals are a career high, the most in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and tied with Dino Ciccarelli (in 1986-87) for the most in a single season in franchise history.
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 22 points (2-20—22) on the power-play this season, which was the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** made 22 saves in Dallas' last game to secure a 3-2 overtime win over the Detroit Red Wings. The victory extended his personal win streak to 11 games, posting a 10-0-1 record during that span dating back to Jan. 20.
- **Oettinger's** 11-game point streak is...
 - The longest point streak of his career.
 - The second-longest points streak by a goaltender in Dallas Stars team history, trailing only **Casey DeSmith's** 13-game earlier this season (Oct. 26 to Dec. 23).
 - Tied for the third-longest point streak by a goaltender in franchise history.
- The Stars are the first team to have two separate goaltenders record a point streak of at least 10 games in the same year since the 2022-23 season.
 - Antti Raanta (12-0-1) and Pyotr Kochetkov (8-0-2) did so for the Carolina Hurricanes as did Jack Campbell (8-0-3) and Stuart Skinner (10-0-1) for the Edmonton Oilers in 2022-23.
- **Oettinger's** and **DeSmith's** performances this year also marks the first time in franchise history that two Stars goaltenders have recorded a point streak of at least 10 games in the same season.

TALK TO ME GOOSE

- **Mavrik Bourque** tallied an assist in Dallas' last game and now has 13 points (5-8—13) in his last 13 games played dating back to Jan. 29. His 13 points during that span rank sixth on the Stars' roster.
- **Bourque** has averaged 3.42 points per 60 at 5-on-5 and 1.55 goals per 60 since Jan. 29, both of which rank third on Dallas' roster during that span.
- Since Jan 29, when **Bourque** is on the ice during 5-on-5 play the Stars are outscoring their opponents 13-8, have a 67.1 expected goals for percentage and a 70.5 high danger chances for percentage according to Natural Stat Trick.
- If **Bourque** were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- In all, **Bourque** has totaled 13 goals, 18 assists and 31 points this season, all of which are career highs for the forward.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** has already set career highs in both goals (36) and points (73) this season. He enters tonight's game having totaled 37 assists this year, which is one shy of matching his career high of 38.
 - **Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 45 goals, 46 assists and 91 points.
- **Jason Robertson** (45) and **Johnston** (45) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- With 16 games remaining in the regular season, **Mavrik Bourque** (13-18—31) and **Sam Steel** (11-20—31) have both already set career highs in goals, assists and points this year.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 26 points (5-21—26) in 66 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. His 21 assists this season are tied for his most in a single season in his career, which he has reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
 - **Lindell's** 26 points are six shy of matching his single-season career high of 32.
- **Oskar Bäck** scored his fifth goal of the season – setting a new career high – in Dallas' 2-1 win over Vegas on March 10th.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has totaled 56 points (9-47—56) in 64 games played this season, the second-highest total in a single season in his career. His 56 points are already the sixth-most by a defenseman in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and the 12th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
 - **Heiskanen** has scored two goals on the power-play this year, which is one shy of matching his career high of three that he reached in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.
- **Colin Blackwell's** eight assists are three shy of matching his career high of 11 that he had last season.
- **Casey DeSmith's** 14 wins are just one shy of matching his career high of 15 that he reached in both 2018-19 and 2022-23 while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
 - **DeSmith** is also two wins away from recording the 100th win of his NHL career.

BIKER GANG

- **Thoams Harley** scored the seventh overtime goal of his career in Dallas' last game on March 14 against Detroit, which set the franchise record for the most overtime goals by a Stars defenseman. His seven overtime goals are the fourth-most by a skater in franchise history regardless of position.
- **Harley's** seven career overtime goals are tied for the sixth-most in the NHL since the start of the 2023-24 season and are the most by any defenseman during that span.
- **Harley's** goal was his fourth game-winning goal of the season, which set a new career high for the defenseman. He was tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen in game-winning goals this year entering play Sunday.
- **Harley's** goal was also the 38th of his career, which tied Richard Matvichuk for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman. He enters tonight's game two goals shy of tying Curt Giles (40) for 13th.
- **Harley** also scored the overtime winner on Feb. 2 against the Winnipeg Jets, making him one of six defensemen this season to score multiple overtime goals this year entering play Sunday.

- In all, **Harley** has totaled 29 points (6-23—29) in 54 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 29 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 56 points (9-47—56).
- He enters tonight's game six assists shy of totaling 100 NHL assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 11th skater and third defenseman drafted in 2019 as well as the 21st defenseman in franchise history to reach the 100-assist milestone.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 22nd power-play goal of the season on March 12 vs. Edmonton, which tied Dino Ciccarelli (in 1986-87) for the most power-play goals in a single season in franchise history.
- **Johnston's** 22 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Sunday and are already tied for the 14th-most in a single season by any NHL skater in the post-lockout era (since 2005-06).
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- If he were to maintain that pace, he would finish the season tied for the second-most power-play goals in a single season in the post-lockout era (since 2005-06), trailing only the 32 power-play goals Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl scored in 2022-23.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 33 power-play goals, which was the most in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- **Jamie Benn** scored two goals in Dallas game on March 12 – a 7-2 win over the Edmonton Oilers. His first goal of the game came just 1:23 into the first period, and his second came on the power play in the third period.
- **Benn's** performance against the Oilers was the 48th multi-goal game of his career, which gave him sole possession of fifth on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Benn** has tallied 15 points (7-8—15) in his last 13 games played dating back to Jan. 29 at Vegas, which includes scoring five goals in his last six games.
- **Benn** had totaled 29 points (14-25—29) in 44 games in all this season. Despite missing 22 games with an injury, his 14 goals are just two shy of matching the 16 he scored in 80 games last year.

21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** had four points (2-2—4) on March 12 against the Edmonton Oilers, matching his single-game career high that he has reached on two other occasions, most recently on April 3, 2023 against the Nashville Predators.
- **Robertson** scored his 35th and 36th goals of the season against the Oilers, surpassing the 35 he scored in 82 games last year.
 - **Robertson's** 36 goals are his third-most in a single season in his career and were tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Robertson** is now the fourth player in franchise history with four career 35-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, following Dino Ciccarelli (6), Brian Bellows (5) and Mike Modano (4).
- **Robertson's** performance against the Oilers was also the 34th multi-goal game of his career, which tied Neal Broten for eighth place on the franchise's all-time list according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson's** first goal against the Oilers stood as the game-winner. He now has seven game-winning goals this year, which was tied for fourth in the NHL entering play Sunday and is also tied for the second-most in his career in a single season, trailing only the 11 he had in 2021-22.
- **Robertson** had an assist the following game on March 14 against Detroit to become the sixth player in franchise history to total at least 150 power-play points with the club according to NHL Stats.
- In all, **Robertson** has totaled 79 points (36-43—79) on the season, which was tied for the eighth-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The 2025-26 season marks **Robertson's** fifth-straight 70-point season. The only other active U.S.-born player with as many consecutive campaigns is Patrick Kane (5 from 2015-16 to 2019-20) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** is one of nine players in franchise history to have at least five 70-point seasons for the team, joining Mike Modano (12x), Brian Bellows (6x), Dino Ciccarelli (6x), **Tyler Seguin** (6x), **Jamie Benn** (5x), Neal Broten (5x), Dave Gagner (5x) and Bobby Smith (5x).
- He enters tonight's game one point shy of reaching the 80-point milestone for the fourth time in his career
- **Robertson** has recorded four consecutive multi-point games from Feb. 28 to March 6, matching his career high that he set earlier this season from Nov. 11 to 18.
 - **Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in eight of the last 16 games that he has played, totaling 19 points in all (7-12—19) during that span.
- **Robertson** scored his 34th goal of the year in Dallas's game on March 2 against the Canucks, the team's 60th game of the season. His 34 goals were the third-most through the team's first 60 games of the season in Dallas Stars team history according to NHL Stats, trailing only his own 35 goals in 2022-23 and Mike Modano's 39 goals in 1993-94.
- **Robertson** has scored 12 goals on the power-play this year, which was tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Sunday and was also just one shy of his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.

- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

PUTTING ON THE RITZ

- **Justin Hryckowian** has totaled 23 points (10-13—23) in 64 games this year, ranking second among undrafted rookies in scoring this season entering play Sunday.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas is 6-0-4 in those contests.
- **Hryckowian** recorded the second multi-point game of his career with a goal and an assist in Dallas' game on March 6 against Colorado. He skated 20:22 in the game, setting a new single-game career high.
- He then scored the following game on March 8 against Chicago, giving him goals in consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Hryckowian** drew four penalties in Dallas' March 12 game, a 7-2 win over the Oilers. His four penalties drawn were...
 - The most by a rookie in a single game this season entering play Sunday.
 - Tied for the most by any skater in the NHL (rookie or veteran) in a single game this season entering play Sunday.
 - The most in a single game by a Stars rookie in franchise history.
 - Tied for the third-most in a single game by any skater in franchise history (rookie or veteran).
- **Hryckowian** has drawn 17 penalties in all this season, which ranked sixth among all NHL rookies entering play Sunday.
- **Hryckowian** has recorded 98 hits this year, which ranked seventh among all NHL rookies entering play Sunday.
- **Hryckowian** has also won 57.0 percent of the faceoffs he has taken this season (127-for-223), which ranked second among rookies to take at least 80 draws this season entering play Sunday. His faceoff win percentage ranks second to only **Roope Hintz** (59.1 percent) for the best mark on the team among players to appear in at least eight games.

MIRO THE HERO

- **Miro Heiskanen** has totaled 56 points (9-47—56) this season. The 2025-26 campaign marks his third 50-point season, which makes him the third Finnish-born defenseman in NHL history, alongside Reijo Ruotsalainen (5x) and Risto Siltanen (3x), to have at least three 50-point campaigns according to NHL Stats.
- **Heiskanen's** 56 points this season are already the second-most of his career, trailing only the 73 points (11-62—73) he had in 2022-23.
- **Heiskanen** joins Sergei Zubov (6x) and Craig Hartsburg (4x) as the only defensemen in franchise history to record at least three 50-point seasons.
- **Heiskanen's** 56 points ranked eighth among all defensemen in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 20 points (2-18—20) in his last 17 games played dating back to Jan. 20, 2026.
- With a goal and an assist on March 6 against Colorado, **Heiskanen** (78) passed Reijo Ruotsalainen (77) for the fifth-most multi-point games by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Kimmo Timonen (113), Teppo Numminen (97), Jyrki Lumme (85) and Risto Siltanen (84).
- **Heiskanen** scored the third overtime goal of his career – and first since March 11, 2023 – on March 8 against the Blackhawks to secure a 4-3 Stars win. His three overtime goals are tied for the third most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- **Heiskanen** enters tonight's game two points shy of surpassing Al MacAdam and Joe Nieuwendyk (340) for sole possession for the 23rd-most points in franchise history.

TEXAS TOUGH

- The Dallas Stars acquired defenseman **Tyler Myers** from the Vancouver Canucks for a 2027 second-round pick and a 2029 fourth-round pick on March 4.
- Born in Houston, **Myers** will become the first-ever Texas-born player to appear in a game for the Stars when he plays in his first game for the club.
- Although born in Houston, **Myers** holds dual citizenship and has elected to represent Canada in international competition. **Myers** won a gold medal while playing for Team Canada with new teammate **Jamie Benn** at the 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship. He would later play for Canada alongside **Matt Duchene** at the 2010 IIHF World Championship.
- **Myers** and **Benn** were teammates during the junior careers, both playing for the Kelowna Rockets of the Western Hockey League (WHL) during the 2007-08 and 2008-09 seasons. The two won the 2009 WHL Championship together, with **Myers** being named the playoff Most Valuable Player and **Benn** leading the WHL in postseason goals (13), assists (20) and points (33).
- **Myers** and **Duchene** were both nominated for the Calder Memorial Trophy as the League's top rookie in 2010, with **Myers** ultimately taking home the award.
- **Myers** and **Casey DeSmith** both played for the Vancouver Canucks during the 2024-25 season.

I WANNA BE LIKE MIKE

- The Dallas Stars acquired forward **Michael Bunting** from the Nashville Predators in exchange for Seattle's third-round pick in 2026 on March 5, 2026.
- **Bunting** had 31 points (13-18—31) in 61 games played with the Predators prior to the trade. He also previously played for Pittsburgh Penguins (2023-24 to 2024-25), Carolina Hurricanes (2023-24), Toronto Maple Leafs (2021-22 to 2022-23) and Arizona Coyotes (2018-19, 2020-21).
- **Bunting** previously played with Stars defensemen **Kyle Capobianco** and **Ilya Lyubushkin** while he was a part of the Coyotes organizations.

- He later played with **Lyubushkin** again and forward **Colin Blackwell** for the Toronto Maple Leafs.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (358) and **Wyatt Johnston** (312).
- **Robertson's** 358-game Iron Man streak was the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 312 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Sunday, it was the 10th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.

- All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
- **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
- **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
- **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forward **Michael Bunting** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** both skated for the Arizona Coyotes before the team relocated to Utah. Bunting skated with the team from 2018-19 to 2020-21, while Lyubushkin skated with Arizona from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Mikko Rantanen** and Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot and defenseman Ian Cole all played for the Colorado Avalanche. Duchene played with Kerfoot in 2017-18. Rantanen and Kerfoot also played together in the 2018-19 season. Rantanen and Cole were members of the Avalanche from 2018-19 to 2020-21, along with Mammoth forward Liam O'Brien who skated 12 games in Colorado in 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** were teammates with Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot with the Toronto Maple Leafs for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Mammoth defenseman Ian Cole were teammates for a handful of games with Pittsburgh in 2017-18 and crossed paths again as members of the Vancouver Canucks in 2023-24.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Mammoth defenseman Olli Matta were both members of the Pittsburgh Penguins for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Mammoth forward Brandon Tanev and defenseman John Marino were all teammates in Pittsburgh from 2019-20 to 2020-21. DeSmith and Marino would skate another season together in 2021-22.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Mammoth forward Kevin Stenlund played four games together on the Columbus Blue Jackets in 2018-19.
- Stars forward **Wyatt Johnston** and Mammoth forward Dylan Gaunter both represented Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Michael Bunting** and Mammoth forwards Brandon Tanev, Dylan Guenther and Jack McBain all represented Team Canada during the 2024 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Mammoth forwards Clayton Keller and Kailer Yamamoto all represented Team USA during the 2016 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship and 2015 IIHF U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Mammoth forward Clayton Keller were teammates at Boston University (NCAA) during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Mammoth forward Kailer Yamamoto skated for Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Mammoth forward Alex Kerfoot shared the ice at Harvard University (NCAA) from 2013-14 to 2015-16.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Mammoth forward JJ Peterka both skated in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards **Collin Blackwell** and **Nathan Bastian** and Mammoth forward Brandon Tanev all played for Seattle during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** and Mammoth defenseman John Marino and goaltender Vitek Vanecek were all teammates in New Jersey from 2022-23 to 2023-24. Mammoth defenseman Nick DeSimone would join the three in New Jersey during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Mammoth defenseman Mikhail Sergachev shared the ice in Tampa Bay from 2017-18 to 2018-19.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Mammoth forwards Jack McBain, Michael Carcone and Lawson Crouse and defenseman MacKenzie Weegar were teammates on Team Canada during the 2023 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Mammoth forward Clayton Keller won the gold medal together on Team USA during the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Stars forward **Michael Bunting** and Mammoth forward Alexander Kerfoot were teammates in Toronto during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Mammoth forward Brandon Tanev shared the ice in Winnipeg from 2016-17 to 2018-19.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Mammoth defenseman Nate Schmidt skated together in Vancouver during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars head coach **Glen Gulutzan** coached Mammoth forward Kailer Yamamoto as an assistant coach in Edmonton from 2018-19 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Mammoth assistant coach Mario Duhamel were both members of the Colorado Avalanche in 2013-14 to 2014-15 where Duhamel was a video coach.
- Stars defensemen **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Mammoth assistant coach Mario Duhamel were together in Arizona while Duhamel was an assistant coach in Arizona from 2021-22 to 2023-24. Lyubushkin played under Duhamel during the 2021-22 season.
