# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP October 24, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. CAROLINA HURRICANES [4]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Carolina Hurricanes to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Thursday night as they continued a three game homestand. Carolina would score the only marker of the first with Seth Jarvis giving the visitors a 1-0 lead through 20. In the second, the Hurricanes added a pair to extend their lead to 3-0 before Jake Bean scored his first as a Flame to cut the deficit to two heading into the third. In the final frame, Jonathan Huberdeau drew the Flames within one, but that's as close as the home side would come as Carolina added an empty netter to knock off Calgary 4-2.

#### **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the first of three meetings this season between the Flames and Jets. Calgary went 2-1-0 against Winnipeg last season, with the home team winning on all three occasions.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-0-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 3-0-1 against Western Conference opponents.

#### **BLUELINE SCORING:**

Coming into tonight's game, the Flames have had seven goals scored by defenceman: Andersson (3), Weegar (3), Bean (1). So far this season, Calgary's seven goals from blueliners leads the NHL. The Flames finished the 2023-24 season with 52 goals from defencemen, the second-most in the league behind only the Colorado Avalanche.

#### **BAC-1K-LUND:**

Mikael Backlund skated in his 997<sup>th</sup> NHL game on Thursday night against Carolina, and now just sits four games away from joining the 1,000-games club. Backlund's NHL debut came back on January 8<sup>th</sup>, 2009 and has skated in all 997 of his NHL games in a Flames sweater. The 35-year-old is looking to become the 19<sup>th</sup> player of Swedish descent to skate in 1,000 NHL contests and become one of three other active-Swedish-born skaters with 1,000 games-played: Nicklas Backstrom (1,105), Victor Headman (1,059), and Erik Karlsson (1,011).

#### ANDY'S COMING:

Following his multi-point game on Tuesday against Pittsburgh, Rasmus Andersson recorded his 16<sup>th</sup> career game in the regular season/playoffs with at least one goal and one assist. Only seven defenceman in Flames franchise history have posted more games with at least one goal and one assist; Phil Housley (18), Dion Phaneuf (21), Mark Giordano (50), Paul Reinhart (59), Gary Suter (63), and Al MacInnis (110).

#### **HUBY DOO:**

With his assist on Calgary's game-winning goal against Chicago last Tuesday, Jonathan Huberdeau registered his 498<sup>th</sup> career helper. With two more assists, Huberdeau can join Nikita Kucherov and Johnny Gaudreau as one of just three players from the 2011 NHL draft to reach the 500-assist mark and become the 25<sup>th</sup>-active skater to achieve the feat.

#### **BEAN'S FIRST:**

Jake Bean scored his first goal as a Flame on Thursday night against the team that originally drafted him, the Carolina Hurricanes. Bean has now registered one goal and two assists for three points through his first six games with the Calgary Flames.

#### **JUNIOR TIES:**

Flames blueliner MacKenzie Weegar and Jets forward Nikolaj Ehlers were teammates on the Halifax Mooseheads of the QMJHL in 2013-14. Weegar posted a career-best 59 points with 12 goals and 47 assists while Ehlers finished second on the Mooseheads in scoring with 104 points. Flames forward Justin Kirkland and Jets rearguard Josh Morrissey won the 2015 WHL championship with the Kelowna Rockets, a group Head Coached by Flames assistant Coach Dan Lambert.

#### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

The Flames have outscored their opponents 19-12 at even-strength so far this season. Jonathan Huberdeau leads the way with all four of his markers this season coming at even-strength.
