AT A GLANCE

CRIMSON PRIDE

Forward Alex Laferriere continues his reign as the Kings' leading goal scorer, having found the back of the net four times in each of the last three games (4-0=4), including his second multi-goal outing on Saturday against the Blackhawks. As part of his performance, Laferriere collected his first power-play goal and seventh even-strength goal (EVG) of the campaign. Only Tampa Bay's Nikita Kucherov (8G) has more even-strength goals in the league than Laferriere's seven. Laferriere is one of 10 skaters in Kings history to record at least seven even-strength goals through the first 12 games to start a season, and is just the fourth to do so aged 23 years or younger.


ITS A BEAUT, CLARKE

Defenseman **Brandt Clarke** leads the team in assists with 10 and sits tied for second in points with 11 (1-10=11), trailing only **Anze Kopitar** (4-9=13). Clarke skates into Bridgestone Arena with seven points (1-6=7) over his last five games, including his second three-plus point game of the season – and career – last Wednesday night against the Golden Knights. Clarke is one of five blueliners in team history to record multiple three-plus point games before turning 22 years of age. With his three-assist performance last week, Clarke has now notched 11 points through the team's first 12 games of the season, becoming the fourth defenseman in Kings history aged 21 years or younger to record as many points through the teams' first 12 games to start a season.

TURCY-TROT

The last time the Kings visited the Music City, forward Alex Turcotte notched both his first career NHL goal and assist as part of his first career multi-point game on Jan. 31 against the Predators. By doing so, Turcotte became the third Kings skater to record their first career NHL goal in the 2023-24 season, following Alex Laferriere (Oct. 21, 2023, vs. BOS) and Andreas Englund (Oct. 31, 2023, at TOR). In 12 games this season, Turcotte has registered one goal and four assists (1-4=5) with a plus-7 rating, tied for the second-highest +/- rating this season among 2019 NHL draftees.
