Head Coach: Dean Evason

Dean Evason was named head coach of the Blue Jackets on July 22, 2024 and led the club to a 40-33-9 record and 4th place finish in the Metro Division in 2024-25. In his 1st season behind the bench, CBJ were the most improved team in the NHL in wins and points from the 2023-24 season (27 wins, 66 pts).

ATKINSON TO RETIRE A BLUE JACKET

Cam Atkinson signed a one-day contract Thursday morning that allows him to officially retire from the NHL as a member of the Blue Jackets. The club will honor the forward prior to the club's game against the Avalanche tonight. The Riverside, Connecticut native was selected in the 6th round, 157th overall, in the 2008 NHL Draft and posted 213-189-402 in 627 contests while playing in 10 of his 13 NHL campaigns as a Jacket. He ranks second on the club's all-time list in goals, points, game-winning goals (42) and shots on goal (1,883).

LOOKING AHEAD – ANNIVERSARY GAME NIGHT #1

The Blue Jackets welcome back the organization's first head coach Dave King along with four former players from the inaugural 2000-01 season for the first of five 25th Anniversary Celebration games on Saturday against Tampa Bay. Prior to the team's home game vs. the Lightning at Nationwide Arena, the club will recognize King, along with defenseman Rostislav Klesla, forward Kevin Dineen, goaltender Ron Tugnutt and defenseman Jean-Luc Grand-Pierre. This game marks the first event in a season-long series spotlighting notable alumni and moments that have defined the Blue Jackets' 25 years in the National Hockey League.

BLUE JACKETS NOTES

HOME SWEET HOME

The Blue Jackets continue the home portion of the 2025-26 season after falling 3-2 to New Jersey in the home opener on Monday. The club hosts Colorado (Thursday) and Tampa Bay as part of its three-game homestand. CBJ split their two-game (1-1-0) road trip to start the 2025-26 season. The club tied for the highest home point total in team history last season with a 26-10-5 record (57 pts./695) and ranked eighth-T in the league in total home points and points percentage. The Jackets also set franchise records and led the NHL in home goals and goals-for per game at 161 (3.93 per game). Columbus holds a 470-367-112 (.554) record in 949 games at Nationwide Arena in franchise history.

GOALS GALORE

CBJ earned their first win of the campaign, 7-4, at Minnesota last Saturday. The game saw a series-high seven goals scored by the Jackets and 11 combined goals in the 69th meeting between the expansion cousins. Columbus was the first team to notch a seven-goal effort, later matched by Anaheim later that night (7-6 OTW vs. San Jose). The Jackets notched four seven goal games in 2024-25 and led the NHL with 16 contests of six-plus goals during the campaign. Adam Fantilli's goal to make it 6-3 in the third period was the 5,000th in franchise regular season history.

TOUGH OCTOBER OPENING

The Blue Jackets play seven of its games in the month of October against teams that made the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs, including six-straight from Oct. 11-24 in Minnesota, New Jersey, Colorado, Tampa Bay, Dallas, Washington and Toronto. CBJ's home opener on Oct. 13 vs. New Jersey kicked off a three-game homestand from Oct. 13-18. The Jackets will then hit the road on Oct. 21 for a one-game trip to Dallas. Columbus will then play its first and second of 15 back-to-back games on Oct. 24 (vs. Washington) and 25 (at Pittsburgh) before playing Oct. 28 (at Buffalo) and Oct. 29 (vs. Toronto).

NEW JACKETS

Three new Blue Jackets made their team debut in the club's season opener last Thursday at Nashville. The club acquired forwards **Charlie Coyle** and **Miles Wood** from Colorado in a trade on June 27 before signing forward **Isac Lundestrom** to a two-year contract on July 1. **Coyle**, who notched 189-296-485 in 950 career NHL games in 13 NHL campaigns with the Avalanche, Boston Bruins and Minnesota Wild, notched his first points with Columbus on Saturday at Minnesota with an assist. **Wood** scored his first goal in a Blue Jackets uniform at Minnesota, he has posted a career mark of 91-91-182 in 513 career outings with the Avalanche and New Jersey Devils prior to this season. **Lundestrom**, in his eighth NHL season, has collected 35-49-84 in 337 career games with the Anaheim Ducks since making his debut in 2018-19.

MARCHY MADNESS

RW **Kirill Marchenko** scored his fourth-career hat trick last Saturday at Minnesota to give him the third-most in franchise history, trailing only Cam Atkinson (6) and Rick Nash (5). With his goal on Monday vs. New Jersey, he is second-T in the NHL in goals in 2025-26 and is the second skater in club history to score four goals in the first three games of a season (Sonny Milano, 4 in 2017-18). He also tied Ryan Johansen for the 10th-most goals in franchise history (79). It also marked his 10th career multi-goal game, which are the most among all Blue Jackets skaters since making his debut in 2022-23. He set a single-season career high with four in 2024-25. His first goal of the game at Minnesota was scored seven seconds into the second period, the fastest goal to start a period in franchise history (prev: 9 seconds into 2nd period, Patrik Laine on Feb. 17, 2022 at CHI). The Barnaul, Russia native is the first player in CBJ history to post three-

straight 20-goal campaigns to start their career, while also becoming the third skater to tally 30 goals and 70 points in a season (Nash, 2008-09; Foligno, 2014-15) in 2024-25 with a career-high 31-43-74 and +29 in 79 GP.

JENNER JOINS THE 200 CLUB

CBJ captain C **Boone Jenner** scored his 200th career goal last Saturday at Minnesota to join Cam Atkinson (213) and Rick Nash (289) as the only three players in franchise history to reach the milestone. His 1-2-3 effort also marked the 81st multi-point game of his career which tied Atkinson for the second-most in franchise history, as well as his 12th three-point game tying Ray Whitney for the seventh-most in CBJ history. The team's captain since 2020-21, he is the all-time club leader in games played with 743 and has collected 200-186-386 in 13 seasons with the Blue Jackets since making his debut on Oct. 4, 2013. He notched 7-12-19 in 26 games played during the 2024-25 season after missing the first 56 contests with a shoulder injury.

2024-25 Norris Trophy runner-up, **Zach Werenski**, scored his first goal and assisted on two others for his first three-point (1-2-3) effort, and 16th of career, of the campaign last Saturday against the Wild. He tied David Vyborny for the fourth-most three-point outings in Blue Jackets history (16), while also giving him his 80th career multi-point outing, one behind Jenner and Atkinson for second-most (Nash, 137). The blueliner entered the 2025-26 campaign as the franchise's all-time leader in goals, assists and points by a defenseman and sits third on the all-time points list with 114-273-387 in 569 career games played.

In 2024-25, he set the single-season franchise record among defensemen in goals, assists and points for the second consecutive season while also tying the club record for assists in a season (Panarin, 59 in 2018-19) with 23-59-82 in 81 GP. Last season, the blueliner set a franchise record and tied the third-longest home points streak by a defenseman in NHL history with points in 22-straight home contests from Nov. 1-Feb. 22 (14-27-41). He also became the first defenseman, and eighth skater, in club history to score 100 career goals on Dec. 12 vs. Washington. The Grosse Pointe, Michigan native led the NHL in ice time (26:45) and ranked third in shots on goal (298), while leading league blueliners in shots and even-strength goals (17), ranking second in goals, points, power play goals (tied, 5), and even strength points (54) as well as fourth in assists during the 2024-25 campaign.

MORE HISTORY FOR MAKAR

Cale Makar scored his 25th career game-winning goal in Monday's victory over the Sabres, becoming the fastest defenseman in NHL history to reach 25 game-winning tallies (399 games).

DAYDREAM BELIEVER

Monday's 3-1 victory over the Sabres marked the first of 18 afternoon games for the Avalanche this season...It's the most matinee contests in franchise history, topping the previous high of 15 in 1998-99...The 18 daytime matchups are the second most in the NHL this year behind only the Penguins (21)...The Rangers are third with 14...Five of the 18 matinees are at Ball Arena and 13 are on the road...Colorado finished 4-4-0 in day games a year ago, 3-2-0 at home and 1-2-0 on the road...The Avalanche are a league-best 30-11-2 (.721) in afternoon contests since 2019-20 and 26-7-2 in *home* afternoon games going back to 2017-18.

POSTSEASON REGULARS

The Avalanche have reached the Stanley Cup Playoffs in eight consecutive seasons, tied with Tampa Bay for the second-longest active streak behind Toronto's nine-year run...Colorado's streak is also the second-longest in franchise history behind an 11-year stretch from 1995 to 2006.

THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN WAY, IS BETTER THAN THE WAY WE HAD

The Avalanche won 50-of-72 draws (69.4%) on Oct. 9 against Utah, the first time Colorado has won 50+ faceoffs since Jan. 18, 2001 vs. Vancouver (50)...The 69.4% faceoff win percentage on Oct. 9 was the club's highest since April 13, 2024 vs. Winnipeg (71.2%)...Individually, Nathan MacKinnon won 22 draws, one shy of his career high (23) set on Oct. 21, 2022 vs. Seattle

OPENING NIGHT SUCCESS

- The Avs will play 26 games against their Central Division opponents, meeting Dallas, Minnesota, Nashville, Utah and Winnipeg four times and St. Louis (two home/one away) and Chicago (one home/two away) three times
- Colorado will play 24 games versus the Pacific Division (three each) and 32 with teams from the Eastern Conference...Anaheim, Calgary, Vancouver and San Jose come to Denver twice while the Avs visit Edmonton, Las Vegas, Los Angeles and Seattle twice
- This season features 12 back-to-back games, including at least one in every month of the regular season
- The Avalanche will have nine "one-off" road trips and nine different instances of just one home game in a row.
- March will be the busiest month featuring 15 games
- Colorado will have a seven-game homestand from Jan. 8-23, the club's longest since March 5-20, 2021 (nine).

OLYMPIC BOUND

For the first time since 2014, NHL players will be participating in the Winter Olympic Games this February...Four Avalanche players were named to the preliminary rosters for their respective national teams: defenseman Cale Makar (Canada) and forwards Nathan MacKinnon (Canada), Gabriel Landeskog (Sweden) and Martin Necas (Czechia)...Only New Jersey and Tampa Bay (both five) have more players represented on the initial rosters (Florida also has four)...The 2026 Winter Games will be held from Feb. 11-22 in Milan and Cortina, Italy.

 **Gabriel Landeskog (Sweden):** This will mark Landeskog's second appearances in the Winter Olympic Games, as he helped his country win the silver medal as the youngest member of Team Sweden in 2014 (20 years old)...He finished with an assist in six games during that tournament...Landeskog's international resume includes the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, four IIHF World Championships (2012, 2013, 2017, 2019), the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship and the 2009 IIHF U18 World Championship...He won a gold medal with Sweden at both the 2017 IIHF World Championship in Germany/France and the 2013 IIHF World Championship in Stockholm and Helsinki

 **Nathan MacKinnon (Canada):** Will be making his first appearance at the Olympics...He was named tournament MVP of the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025 after leading the tournament with four goals in helping Canada secure the championship...He is a two-time medalist with Canada at the IIHF World Championship (gold in 2015, silver in 2017) and played for Team North America at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

 **Cale Makar (Canada):** Will also be making his first appearance for the Canadian Olympic Team...He was a member of Canada's championship team at the 4 Nations Face-Off in 2025...He led that tournament in ice time (26:47) and assisted on Connor McDavid's overtime winner in the final against Team USA...His international experience also includes a gold medal at the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship

 **Martin Necas (Czechia):** Will be making his Olympic debut...Internationally, he notched an assist in the gold medal game at the 2024 IIHF World Championship to help Czechia win the title on their home soil...Overall, he has made three appearances at both the IIHF World Championship (also 2018 and 2025) and World Junior Championship (2017, 2018, 2019; he led the 2018 tournament in assists and co-led in points, then captained Czechia in 2019).

EXTRA CREDIT

Colorado is 0-1 so far in games decided past regulation in 2025-26...The Avs finished 9-4 last season, 5-1 in overtime and 4-3 in shootouts...That .692 winning percentage beyond regulation ranked fifth in the NHL...All-time, the Avalanche are 240-202-204 in OT contests and 89-53 (.627) in shootouts, the highest winning percentage of any team since the shootout started in 2005-06...The Avs have the best all-time shooting percentage at 36.7% (173/471) and the second-best save percentage at .718 (347/483)

LET'S PUT IT TO BED(NAR)

Jared Bednar enters his 10th season behind the Avalanche bench in 2025-26...Hired on Aug. 25, 2016, Bednar is the second-longest tenured coach in the NHL behind Tampa Bay's Jon Cooper, who took over the Lightning on March 25, 2013...The only individual to win a championship in the NHL, AHL and ECHL as a head coach, Bednar is the winningest coach in franchise history with a 393-246-65 (.604) record in 704 regular-season games...Bednar's 393 wins rank 43rd on the NHL's all-time wins list, one shy of tying Art Ross (394) for 42nd...His 393 wins rank 16th for a single franchise in league history...If you include his playoff totals, Bednar has 445 combined victories, one behind Punch Imlach (446) for 41st...Only six other coaches won more games through their first 700 games behind the bench.

AVALANCHE ON ALTITUDE

THE MORE, THE MERRIER

A total of 49 players appeared in a game for Colorado last season, the most of any NHL team and tied for the highest total in franchise history...The Quebec Nordiques also used 49 in both 1989-90 and 1990-91...Colorado's 49 players last year matched the highest number of any team over the last 10 seasons, equaling the 2018-19 Ducks...The 49 players included 43 skaters (30 forwards, 13 defensemen) and six goaltenders, both league highs...The previous record for an Avalanche team (since relocating) was 43 players in 2022-23.

LIGHTING THE LAMP

The Avalanche finished sixth in the NHL with 273 goals in 2024-25 (3.33 per game)...Colorado had 30 different goal scorers and 12 different double-digit goal scorers, both tied for the league lead.

Nathan MacKinnon led the league in home scoring for the second consecutive season in 2024-25 with 68 points (21g/47a) in 40 contests...He was the first NHL player to pace the NHL in home points for two consecutive seasons since Joe Thornton in 2005-06 and 2006-07...MacKinnon recorded points in each of his final 26 games at Ball Arena last year (16g/27a), the NHL's longest home point streak in 2024-25 and the second longest stretch in franchise history behind his own 35-game run in 2023-24...Since the start of the 2023-24 campaign, the Avalanche center has found the scoresheet in 76 of his last 81 home games (55-102=157) and going back to Jan. 1, 2023, has a goal or assist in 96 of his last 104 home contests (72-119=191)...Between the pipes, Mackenzie Blackwood was 14-4-2 in 20 appearances at Ball Arena last season with a 1.98 GAA, .921 Sv% and three shutouts...As a team, the Avalanche finished the 2024-25 campaign by going 12-2-1 in their final 15 matches at Ball Arena.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

Nine different Avalanche players made their NHL debut in 2024-25, the most of any NHL team and the second-highest total in Colorado history...The Avs had 11 skaters debut in 2008-09...Wyatt Aamodt, Chase Bradley, Tye Felhaber, Jere Innala, Ivan Ivan, Trent Miner, Nikita Prishchepov, Calum Ritchie and Matt Stienburg all joined the NHL fraternity in 2024-25.

THIS IS MY, MY BAD, COMEBACK SONG

The Avalanche had 24 comeback wins last season, tied for second in the NHL behind Washington (25)...Eight of those wins featured deficits of two or more goals, tied for the second-most multi-goal comebacks...The Avs were 15-16-0 when trailing after one period, the most wins of any team when behind after the first, and 8-22-2 when trailing after two periods, tied for the most victories when behind going into the third...The Avalanche also finished second in come-from-behind victories in 2023-24 (26).

ALL HAIL CALE

Cale Makar captured his second Norris Trophy in 2024-25, becoming the 14th defenseman to win multiple Norris Trophies...He is just the seventh player to win two Norris awards within his first six NHL seasons and joined Erik Karlsson as the only active players with multiple Norris Trophies...Cale was named to the NHL First All-Star Team, his fifth career selection to the NHL postseason all-star team and third time he's made the First Team (both equaling franchise records)...Cale led all NHL blueliners in goals (30), assists (62) and points (92), with his 30 goals and 92 points breaking his own franchise records for a defenseman...Makar was the first defenseman to reach the 30-goal mark since Mike Green in 2008-09 with the Washington Capitals...Cale is one of only three defensemen in NHL history to average over a point-per-game (also Bobby Orr and Paul Coffey)

THE DEFENSE RESTS

The 2024-25 Avalanche led all teams in scoring from the blueline for the fifth consecutive season with 211 points (54g/157a)...The Avs became just the fifth club in NHL history to have the highest-scoring blueline for five consecutive seasons and the first since the Calgary Flames from 1986-87 to 1990-91...Colorado's 54 goals from the back end last season also led all clubs, the third straight year and fourth time in the last five seasons that the Avs defense have scored the most goals.

NATE EXPECTATIONS

Nathan MacKinnon finished second in league scoring with 116 points (32g/84a) in 79 games last season...Nathan became the 12th player in NHL history (now 13) to record three consecutive seasons with 110+ points...MacKinnon was the first skater to the 30, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100 and 110-point marks last season...Current teammate Martin Necas was the first to 40, although MacKinnon reached 40 later in that same game...Nathan shared the league lead in assists (84) and paced all skaters in shots for the second straight year and fourth time in his career with 320...MacKinnon and Peter Stastny (six) are the only players in franchise history to register three consecutive 100-point campaign and Nate is the only player in Colorado/Quebec history to post back-to-back 80-assist campaigns.

WHAT'S WRONG WITH LUMBER, I OWN TWO LUMBERYARDS

Beginning on Dec. 8, 2024, one day before the acquisition of Mackenzie Blackwood and a week after Scott Wedgewood joined the team, the Avalanche allowed just 2.37 goals-per-game over the final 54 contests, second best in the league behind only Winnipeg (2.20)...Blackwood posted a 22-12-3 record with a 2.33 goals-against average, .913 save percentage and three shutouts in 37 games (36 starts) after being acquired from San Jose...Between the two teams, he set career highs in wins (28), games (56), starts (53) and shutouts (4) while ranking among the league's top-10 in Sv% (8th, .912) and GAA (9th, 2.55)...After joining the Avalanche on Nov. 30, Wedgewood posted a 13-4-1 record with a 1.99 GAA, .917 Sv% and two shutouts in 19 games (18 starts)...Only Darcy Kuemper (1.86) and Connor Hellebuyck (1.96) posted a lower GAA than Wedgewood since he joined the Avs on Nov. 30 (minimum 15 games)...'Wedgie' finished the year 8-0-1 in his last nine starts with a 1.63 GAA and .928 Sv%.

THAT'S THE POWER OF LOVE

The Avalanche's power play finished eighth in the NHL at 24.8% in 2024-25, finishing among the NHL's top-10 power-play teams for the fifth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons.

WELCOME BACK, CAP

Avalanche captain Gabriel Landeskog returned to the lineup for Game 3 of the 2025 First Round Series against Dallas on April 23, some 1,032 days since his last contest on June 26, 2022 when he lifted the Stanley Cup in Game 6 of the 2022 Final against the Lightning...Landeskog's return after a 1,032-day absence is the fourth-longest in NHL history and marked just the third time a captain has returned to his team after not playing in over 1,000 days...The others were Syl Apps (1,009 days) on Nov. 4, 1945 with the Maple Leafs and Sid Abel (1,045) on Feb. 16, 1946 with the Red Wings, who both left their respective teams to serve in the Canadian armed forces during World War II...Landeskog followed that up by registering a goal and one assist in Game 4 on April 26, his first tally in 1,041 days since Game 3 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Final against Tampa.

This season features 12 back-to-back sets of games, including at least one in every month of the regular season...Colorado also played 12 back-to-back sets last year, going 6-6-0 in the first contest and 8-3-1 on the second...The Avalanche's 8-3-1 (.708) mark in the second half of a back-to-back trailed only Dallas (8-2-1, .773)...Since 2020-21, the Avalanche are a combined 71-26-11 (.708) in back-to-back affairs, 34-16-4 (.667) on the first night and 37-10-7 (.750) on the second.
