ANAHEIM DUCKS POSTGAME NOTES

The Anaheim Ducks fell 3-2 to the Seattle Kraken Monday night at Honda Center. The Ducks killed all three Kraken power play opportunities, the fourth straight game Anaheim has not allowed a power-play goal (8-of-8). Despite the loss, Anaheim is 3-1-1 the last five games and 4-2-1 the last seven contests overall.

TROY TERRY earned assists on each of Anaheim's two goals (0-2=2), his team-leading seventh and eighth assists of the campaign. His 22nd career multi-assist game tied Chris Pronger, Bobby Ryan and Rickard Rakell for the ninth most in franchise history.

TREVOR ZEGRAS opened the scoring for the Ducks with his third goal and fifth point his last five games (2-3=5). He goal marked the fifth of his career against the Kraken, tying the Kings and Red Wings for his most scored goals vs. any one franchise.

FRANK VATRANO scored his third goal and eighth point of the season (3-5=8).

OLEN ZELLWEGER earned set a new single-season career high with his 10th point (4-6=10), surpassing his mark of 4-5=9 points in 2023-24 (26 GP). He has recorded assists in back-to-back games (0-2=2) and 2-4=6 points in his last five games.

BRIAN DUMOULIN earned an assist against his former team, his sixth helper of the season (0-6=6) which co-leads all Ducks blueliners (also Zellweger).

LUKAS DOSTAL stopped 25-of-28 shots in his 14th appearance of 2024-25.

Tonight's attendance was 15,331. Anaheim will conclude the second half of a home-at-home series vs. the Seattle Kraken Wednesday, Nov. 27 (7 p.m. PT) at Climate Pledge Arena.

TROY TERRY

On the game

I think we've proved to ourselves the team that we can be when we're playing fast. I thought we came out, did that in the first period and then whatever the case was in the second period, whether it was penalties, they were making a push, it just felt like we lost it a bit in the second period. It felt like their momentum in the second kind of carried into the start of the third, so just learning how to manage those momentum swings and being able to lock it down when they're getting time in your end. Those types of games, just learning how to manage them.

On missed opportunities to shoot in the third period

That's kind of been a theme in our meetings and trying to establish just shooting more. I thought we had a decent amount of zone time, but maybe just didn't generate enough shots tonight. That was probably the case in the third a little bit, too.

FRANK VATRANO

On Leo Carlsson not returning

Sucks. He is one of our best players and I don't like to see him go down like that. It's tough, but I wish we got the win for him. But it's nice for guys to step up for him, try to take control of the situation. Playing a forward down, you just get more minutes and try to follow with it.

On Trevor Zegras

He's a big part of our team, creates offense for us and likes to make plays. So the more we get him going, the better our team is going to be.

HEAD COACH GREG CRONIN

On Troy Terry

I thought he skated, I thought he battled, I thought he was working hard defensively as well. I think that's a game that he's going to want to play every game.

On playing short after Carlsson's injury

It happens, it's hockey. Guys get injured. We kind of went to three lines for most of the third period. It's unfortunate because [Jansen] Harkins and Ross [Johnston] have been big catalysts for our team in terms of generating energy and the forecheck and offensive zone plays. Analytically, they've been really good. We got down so quick, we tried to generate some offense and score. We put [Mason McTavish] up there to give those guys a centerman that can win draws and help in the offensive zone. We battled, but I thought they played a really smart game and got up a goal and we couldn't penetrate their D.

On Trevor Zegras

He's skating more, he's more engaged, he's more physical. He's getting into people defensively. When he has open ice he can make plays, that was visible tonight a few times. I think as he continues to build more confidence in his skating and his ability to separate people from pucks, he'll become more visible.

On playing Seattle Wednesday

We just have to play like we did the first period. We were playing our game and we just got off it, it happens. It's not complicated. We just have to play to our structure and our system. When you do that, you're connected and you can anticipate and play faster. We'll watch the tape and improve tomorrow.

SHANE WRIGHT

On the game

I think playing with some energy, playing fast, winning pucks, holding on to it a little bit and making plays. Solid defensively as well, felt like I played pretty well in my own end as well. It's always nice to chip in on offense, for sure.

On winning faceoffs

Yeah, it's a big aspect of the game, especially for a centerman, being able to be a solid guy on draws. I think it's just about reps and learning what it's like to take draws against these talented, strong centermen and definitely something that I work on a lot.

ANDRE BURAKOVSKY

On his first goal of the season

It's been a while. It's been a lot of games and hasn't come easy, so it's definitely nice to see it go in. Maybe not the prettiest one I've scored in my life, but they all count.

On playing with Jared McCann and Matty Beniers

It's really nice. I enjoy it a lot, and I think we've been creating a lot together in these games that we've been playing together. I mean, it's two guys with a lot of speed, just like I want it to be. Playing a fast game, supporting each other and those are two guys that can really create space for themselves and for me. Canner (Jared McCann), as we know, has an amazing shot, so I'm trying to feed him as much as possible, and same with Matty (Beniers), I'm trying to give him the puck. He's very good skating up the puck and entering the zone and [he can] pull up and make plays, so they make it easy for me too.

HEAD COACH DAN BYLSMA

On facing the Ducks again on Wednesday

I think we have to be aware and weary of their skill. They may be young, but they have a lot of skill throughout their lineup. If you play a chance for chance game or if you give them too many opportunities they will demonstrate that skill over and over again. I think we fought a game out tonight by coming back, but we have to be real careful with the skill they have on the ice.

On the momentum for the team after the Burakovsky goal

I think the Shane Wright goal and the Andre [Burakovsky] goal are both [the ones] that sparked our team and gave us a boost when they came. But, the smile on Andre's face said it all as he was coming off the ice on that goal.
