- The Stars 4-2 win over the Senators made them the third team to win 1,000 games in the 21st century according to NHL Stats. The others are the Bruins (1,027) and Capitals (1,003).
- The win also gave the team their first five-game point streak of the season.
- The Stars surrendered only 13 shots on goal tonight, their fewest in a single game since Nov. 9, 2006 against the Phoenix Coyotes (now the Utah Hockey Club) when they also allowed only 13 shots on goal.
- **Roope Hintz** scored the opening goal for the second consecutive game.
 - In addition to scoring two goals, **Hintz** went 12-for-19 at the faceoff dot. His 12 faceoff wins are tied for his most in a single game this season (last: Nov. 7 vs. Chicago).
- **Wyatt Johnston** tallied two assists for his 25th multi-point game of his career which is the ninth most in franchise history among players before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games the Stars will play against the Hockey Club this season and the first time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. They will next meet on April 12 in Dallas.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would give the Stars their first six-game point streak of the season. They are 4-0-1 in their last five games played.
- A regulation or overtime win tonight would give the Stars a four-game win streak, which would tie their longest such streak of the season. The team previously won four consecutive games to begin the 2024-25 campaign.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:11 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.51 goals against per game this season, which trailed only Winnipeg (2.50) for the best mark in the NHL entering play Friday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 21 of the 37 games that they have played this year.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 23 points (5-18—23) in his last 23 games played dating back to Nov. 14 against the Boston Bruins. His 23 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' last game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- If **Robertson** were to record at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in four consecutive games for the first time since March 31 to April 6, 2023.
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
 - He now sits nine points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** – who turned 25 on July 21 – became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** now has 21 assists on the year, which tops all Stars skaters.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** notched two assists in Dallas' last game and now has 10 points (3-7—10) in his last eight games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.
- **Johnston's** 10 points since Dec. 16 trail only **Jason Robertson** (11) for the team lead during that span.
- A goal or an assist tonight would extend **Johnston's** point streak to six games, matching his career best that he set earlier this season from Nov. 20 to Dec. 1.
- **Johnston's** current five-game point streak was tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL entering play Friday.
- When **Johnston** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Dec. 16, the Stars have outscored their opponents 9-3 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the season with 20 goals, 40 assists and 60 points.
 - If he were to score 20 goals, it would mark his third consecutive 20-goal season.
 - Forty assists would be a career high for the forward.
 - Sixty points would be five shy of matching his career high that he set last season.

WHAT UTAH-KIN 'BOUT?

- With a victory tonight, the Stars could become the first team in the NHL to defeat the Utah Hockey Club three times.
- The Stars are a perfect 4-fo-4 on the penalty kill against the Hockey Club this season.
- **Jamie Benn** and **Sam Steel** have both recorded a point in each of the two games they have played against the Utah Hockey Club – **Benn** has scored two goals and **Steel** has notched two assists.
- If **Casey DeSmith** were to play and win tonight, he would become the first goaltender in the NHL to record three wins against the Utah Hockey Club. In his previous two games, he posted a 2-0-0 record with a .952 save percentage and a 1.51 goals-against average.
 - His save percentage and goals-against average are the best marks of any netminder to play the Hockey Club at least twice this season.

HEATING UP

- **Jamie Benn** has totaled 11 points (3-8—11) in his last 11 games played dating back to Dec. 8 against the Calgary Flames. He has recorded at least a point in nine of those 11 games.
- If **Roope Hintz** were to score tonight, it would give him his first three-game goal streak since March 6 to 11, 2023.
 - After scoring two goals in Dallas' last game on Jan. 2, he is now pacing to finish the year with 41 goals, which would be a career high for the forward.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has seven points (3-4—7) in his last seven games played dating back to Dec. 18 against the Toronto Maple Leafs.
- **Matt Duchene** has tallied five points (2-3—5) in his last three games played.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has three assists in his last three games played.

KILLING IT

- Entering play Friday, the Stars had the second-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 85.3 percent success rate. Only the Carolina Hurricanes (85.5 percent) have had a better success rate on the penalty kill this season.
- Dallas has allowed only 15 power-play goals against this season, which was the fewest in the NHL this season entering play Friday. Their 0.41 power-play goals against per game also topped the NHL entering play Friday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 24-for-25 on the penalty kill for a 96.0 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Friday.

- **Wyatt Johnston's** shorthanded goal on Dec. 8 gives the Stars an even goal differential on the penalty kill during that span. The Tampa Bay Lightning and Vegas Golden Knights are the only other teams with an even goal differential on the penalty kill since Dec. 8.
- **Thomas Harley** has allowed 2.98 power-play goals against per 60, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday among NHL defensemen that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 128:15 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was fifth-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Friday.

CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR

- Dallas finished 2024 with a 52-25-6 record for 110 points and a .663 points percentage. Their 52 wins tied for the third-most in franchise history in one calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars ranked fifth in the NHL in points, points percentage and wins (tied) in 2024.
- 2024 marked the third consecutive calendar year in which the Stars finished with at least 100 points and a points percentage above .600.
 - In 2023 they had 104 points and a .658 points percentage, and 118 points and a .648 points percentage in 2022.
- **Jason Robertson** was Dallas' leading scorer in 2024 with 72 points (27-45-72) in 83 regular-season games. He was followed closely by **Wyatt Johnston** (32-37-69) and **Matt Duchene** (28-39-67).
- **Johnston's** 32 goals topped all Stars skaters in 2024, with **Roope Hintz** (31) and **Duchene** (28) ranking second and third, respectively.
- **Thomas Harley** posted a plus-38 plus/minus rating in 2024, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL. **Harley** (10-37-47) was the Stars' highest scoring defenseman in 2024.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 41-16-3 record in 2024. His 41 wins ranked second to only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (44).
- **Oettinger's** 41 wins are the second-most by a Stars goaltender in a calendar year in franchise history, trailing only Marty Turco who had 42 in 2006.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** earned his 100th point as a member of the Stars organization after tallying two points (1-1-2) on Jan. 2 vs. Ottawa, reaching the milestone in 117 games.
 - In his career, Duchene has tallied 844 points in 1,093 games placing him 18th among active NHL skaters.
- **Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 35 points (15-20-35) in 37 games this season, which includes recording 11 multi-point efforts this year.
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 27-19 according to Natural Stat Trick.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** recorded his third multi-point game of the season with two assists in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres. **Harley's** second assist of the night was the 50th of his career, making him the fourth-fastest Stars/North Stars defenseman to reach the mark according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** recorded a plus-four plus/minus rating for the first time in his career in Dallas' Dec. 29 game against Chicago, which was tied for the seventh-highest total by any NHL skater in a single game this season entering play Friday.
 - In that game, the Stars outscored the Blackhawks 4-0 and outshot them 10-6 during 5-on-5 play when **Harley** was on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. No player from either team was on the ice for more 5-on-5 shots than **Harley**.
- In all this year, **Harley** has a plus-19 plus/minus rating, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Hockey Club with a plus-22 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Friday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (334), **Jason Robertson** (247), **Esa Lindell** (207) and **Wyatt Johnston** (201). Entering play Friday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 2 against Ottawa was the 334th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 247-game Iron Man streak was the 13th-longest in the NHL entering play Friday. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Friday.
- **Lindell's** 207-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

WHAT IN THE WORLD

- The 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship began on Dec. 26 and will be played in Ottawa through Jan. 5.

- Stars prospects **Emil Hemming** (Finland) and **Aram Minnetian** (United States) have each been selected to represent their home countries at this year's tournament.
- Hemming**, who was selected by Dallas with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.
- This tournament marks **Minnetian's** first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
 - Minnetian** was originally selected by the Stars in the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Evgenii Dadonov**, **Matt Dumba**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Jake Oettinger**, **Jason Robertson**, **Logan Stankoven** and **Sam Steel**.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen** is five assists shy of tying Darian Hatcher (218) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- Jason Robertson** is five assists shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 25th on the franchise's all-time assists list.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.

- **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Two Stars defensemen played for the Arizona Coyotes (now Utah Hockey Club), **Ilya Lyubushkin** from 2018-19 to 2021-22 and **Matt Dumba** during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Utah forward Nick Bjugstad were teammates with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 2018-19 and 2019-20.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Utah forward Nick Bjugstad and defenseman Ian Cole were all teammates with the Minnesota Wild in 2020-21. Both Matt Dumba and Nick Bjugstad also played the following 2021-22 season together for the Wild.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Utah forward Alex Kerfoot both played for the Colorado Avalanche for a short time during the 2017-18 season.
- Stars forward **Mason Marchment** and Utah forward Alex Kerfoot were both members of the Toronto Maple Leafs for a short time during the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** were teammates with Utah forward Alex Kerfoot with the Toronto Maple Leafs for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Utah defenseman Ian Cole were teammates for a handful of games with Pittsburgh in 2017-18 and crossed paths again as members of the Vancouver Canucks in 2023-24.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Utah defenseman Olli Matta were both members of the Pittsburgh Penguins for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Utah defenseman Ian Cole shared the ice in Carolina for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Utah goaltender Connor Ingram were teammates for a short time in Nashville in 2021-22 where Ingram played three games.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Utah goaltender Jaxson Stauber were both members of the Blackhawks during the 2022-23 season where Stauber played six games.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Utah assistant coach Mario Duhamel were both members of the Colorado Avalanche in 2013-14 to 2014-15 where Duhamel was a video coach.
- Stars defensemen **Matt Dumba** and **Ilya Lyubushkin** were with the Arizona Coyotes while Utah assistant coach Mario Duhamel was an assistant coach in Arizona from 2021-22 to 2023-24. Dumba played under Duhamel in 2023-24 and Lyubushkin played under Duhamel in 2021-22.
