

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 30, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [0] vs. CAROLINA HURRICANES [1] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

In a tight defensive matchup at Lenovo Center on Sunday, the Calgary Flames fell 1–0 in overtime to the Carolina Hurricanes. Neither side found the net through 60 minutes, with Devin Cooley turning aside all 15 shots he faced in regulation, while Carolina netminder Brandon Bussi also stopped 15 attempts to send the game to 3-on-3 overtime. In the extra frame, Nikolaj Ehlers scored for Carolina at 2:52, finishing a setup from Taylor Hall. Calgary got steady minutes from Rasmus Andersson, who recorded a game-high 24:29 of ice time, while MacKenzie Weegar, Yan Kuznetsov and Kevin Bahl also logged over 20 minutes for the visitors.

## **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Predators. Calgary fell 4-2 in their first trip to Nashville on November 1.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-9-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 4-12-1 against Western Conference opponents.

### **MAN OF THE MONTH:**

Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson finished the month of November with a team-leading 14 points, recording three goals and 11 assists in 15 games. The Malmo, SWE, native posted four multi-point outings, including a pair of three-point nights on Nov. 19 in Buffalo (1-2—3) and Nov. 23 in Vancouver (0-3—3). He was named the NHL's first star of the week for the period ending Nov. 23 after posting a league-high nine points from Nov. 18–23. Andersson added two assists in Florida on Friday to record his 13th and 14th points of the month, giving him the most by a Flames defenceman in a single month since Noah Hanifin had 16 in April 2022.

Andersson registered 11 of his November points on the road, finishing two points shy of tying Gary Suter (2-11—13 in January 1988) and Paul Reinhart (3-10—13 in March 1981) for the most road points in a single calendar month by a Flames defenceman.

### **KEEPING HIS COOL:**

Devin Cooley has helped the Flames earn at least a point in each of his last four starts, posting a 3-0-1 record since Nov. 19. Over that span, he has made 127 saves — the second most in the league since that date. This season, Cooley is 3-2-2 with a 1.88 goals-against average and a .931 save percentage in seven starts.

### **ON THE HUNT:**

Dryden Hunt made his season debut on Sunday in Carolina, skating in 10:02 of ice-time through 13 shifts, posting one shot and two blocked shots. Hunt now has 236 games of NHL experience, with 18 goals and 36 assists for 54 points, having spent time with the Florida Panthers, Arizona Coyotes, New York Rangers, Colorado Avalanche, Toronto Maple Leafs and Calgary Flames. The Flames acquired the Cranbrook, BC, product in a trade with Toronto on March 3, 2023. He has appeared in 34 games for Calgary, recording three goals and eight assists for 11 points.

### **WEEGSY BABY:**

MacKenzie Weegar enters tonight's game with 196 assists in his NHL career and is four away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With four more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206th overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round-selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208th overall in 2011).

### **HUBY DOO:**

Johnathan Huberdeau has accumulated 794 points in his NHL career and is six shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 2<sup>nd</sup> round – 58<sup>th</sup> overall) and Mark Scheifele (WPG: 1<sup>st</sup> round – 7<sup>th</sup> overall). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

### **LIL KUZY VERT:**

Yan Kuznetsov scored his first NHL goal on Friday afternoon in Florida to become the 19<sup>th</sup> defenceman drafted in 2020 (CGY: 2<sup>nd</sup> round – 50<sup>th</sup> overall) to score in the National Hockey League. He is the second player selected by the Flames in the 2020 NHL Draft to find the back of the net in the NHL, joining Connor Zary (CGY: 1<sup>st</sup> round – 24<sup>th</sup> overall) who has 29 goals through his 142-game career thus far. With his first career goal, Kuznetsov became the sixth member of the Flames active roster to score their first NHL goal at Amerant Bank Arena. The others:

LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund is closing in on 1,100 NHL games, needing just seven more to reach the milestone. Backlund was the Flames’ first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2007 NHL draft and made his NHL debut on January 8, 2009, against the New York Islanders.



As Backlund developed in Calgary, he became known for his hockey IQ, defensive reliability, penalty-killing strength and ability to drive play at both ends of the ice. He represented Sweden at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, following that tournament with a breakout season in 2016-17 in which he posted a then-career-high 53 points and earned Selke Trophy consideration. In 2022-23, he set a new career high with 56 points (19G, 37A) and a team-best plus-minus rating of +24, while appearing in all 82 games for the Flames. That summer, the Vasteras, SWE, product won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy for his leadership and humanitarian contributions, and on September 21, 2023, was named the 21<sup>st</sup> captain in franchise history.

Backlund became the 19<sup>th</sup> player of Swedish descent — and the 397<sup>th</sup> skater in NHL history — to reach 1,000 NHL games, hitting the mark Oct. 30 in Utah. He was also just the second player to skate his first 1,000 games with the Flames, joining Jarome Iginla. He now looks to join Iginla once again as the second skater in franchise history to reach 1,100 games played with Calgary.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Nazem Kadri (56) and Matt Coronato (55) finished first and second, respectively, on the team in shots during the month of November. Kadri’s 56 shots were tied for the sixth most in the league in November, while Coronato’s 55 ranked eighth in the NHL for the month.

FIRST MEETING WITH NASHVILLE:

The Calgary Flames fell 4–2 to the Nashville Predators on November 1 at Bridgestone Arena. Nashville struck three times in the first period to put the home side up 3-0 through 20. After a scoreless second period, the Flames mounted a late push in the third as Jonathan Huberdeau scored 4:39 into the final frame, shortly after, Joel Farabee added another midway through the frame to cut the deficit to one, but the Predators would add an empty netter in the final minute. Five different Flames found their way onto the scoresheet (Coronato: 1A, Farabee: 1G, Kadri: 1A, Bean: 1A, Huberdeau: 1G) while Rasmus Andersson and Blake Coleman tied with a game-high five shots each.
