EVENTS & FUNDRAISERS



GOLF OUTING

The 16th Annual Islanders Children's Foundation Golf Outing, presented by UBS, took place at Glen Oaks Club in Old Westbury. The day started with players, coaches and alumni teeing off with donors for rounds of golf and for the first

time, a tennis tournament. The day concluded with a dinner reception, awards, and auction. This single day event raised a record-setting \$700,000 for the Islanders Children's Foundation.





IN-GAME FUNDRAISING









The 50/50 raffle took place at all Islanders games and select arena events. This initiative successfully generated more than \$1M benefiting non-profit organizations and the ICF.

This season, fans who were unable to attend the game could still participate in the raffle by purchasing tickets online.

Another fan favorite was special price points based on particular theme nights or game days.

IN-GAME FUNDRAISING





WARM-UP PUCKS +\$83,000

Commemorative, official warm-up pucks were available for fans to purchase at all home games. These pucks were personalized to showcase the date of the game and the opponent. This initiative generated over \$83,000 in funds for the ICF.



During select home games, fans in-person had the chance to bid on unique autographed Islanders memorabilia and special experiences. Throughout the season, the auctions raised more than \$60,000 for the ICF.



During select home games, fans had the opportunity to purchase specialty-designed pucks autographed by players. The pucks featured themes such as Hockey Fights Cancer, Military Appreciation, New Year's, Hockey is for Everyone and First Responders. This initiative raised over \$58,000 for the ICF and its charity partners during the season.

IN-GAME FUNDRAISING





Several jersey auctions were held, featuring themes like Hockey Fights Cancer and Military Appreciation. These teamissued autographed jerseys raised over \$42,000.



Fans purchased personalized scoreboard messages that were featured during home games, contributing more than \$15,000 to the ICF.



For a \$5 donation to the ICF, fans celebrating their birthdays at UBS Arena received a customized Birthday Button. This equated to \$5,000 raised and 1,000 birthdays celebrated.



On Friday, March 14th fans were able to purchase gold foil-wrapped mystery pucks that revealed a range of prizes from team-autographed sticks, autographed jerseys, pucks and more. This campaign raised over \$20,000 benefiting the ICF.



The Islanders player's significant others assisted in assembling unique "favorite things" baskets for each player. These baskets featured personal favorites and autographed items that were raffled off during the October 26th home game. Collectively, this raised over \$8,000 for the ICF.

Throughout the season, the Islanders Children's Foundation partnered with a group of non-profit organizations to raise awareness and funds for their missions. Through Islanders home games, social media and in-arena promotion, these groups increased visibility for their causes. Each organization received a share of the 50/50 raffle proceeds and complimentary tickets that allowed groups to distribute them to those they serve or express gratitude to volunteers, staff or donors.

On March 24th, the Islanders Children's Foundation welcomed representatives from over 45 nonprofit organizations for a special pregame event. Attendees had the opportunity to network with fellow charities and learn more about the Foundation's Hockey with a Heart initiative. The evening





featured special visits from New York Islanders co-owner Jon Ledecky and franchise legend Bryan Trottier. Following the reception, guests were invited to enjoy the game as the Islanders faced off against the Columbus Blue Jackets.





Northwell

The Islanders Children's Foundation and Northwell Health partnered to pack and distribute 500 backpacks to local students in preparation for the start of the school year. Backpacks contained essential back-to-school items such as folders, Islanders-themed notebooks, pencils and more. Families who picked up their backpacks also had the pleasure of taking part in glitter tattoos, balloon animals, Islanders I.C.E. tour elements and more.





Puppy with a Purpose: The New York Islanders introduced Butchie, the fifth Isles Puppy with a Purpose at the beginning of the 24-25 season. Named after Islanders legend Butch Goring, Butchie is in the process of going through a 14-18 month training before being matched with someone who is blind or has low vision.

Pucks & Paws: Puppies and dogs from the Guide Dog Foundation and America's Vet Dogs participated in the annual Pucks & Paws calendar photoshoot. This successful calendar fundraiser that featured New York Islanders players and various service dogs generated over \$24,000 to support the Guide Dog Foundation.





Thanksgiving Meal Distribution supported by UBS:
Ahead of the holiday season, the New York Islanders and UBS partnered to hand out 200 Thanksgiving meals to families in need within the local community.



Holiday Toy Shopping Spree: With the support of the Islanders Children's Foundation, the Islanders' wives and girlfriends went shopping for toys for all ages at Target for the holiday season. 



Community Leadership Scholarship: The Islanders Children's Foundation established a scholarship for graduating high school seniors who have significantly contributed to their community. The scholarship granted \$5,000 each to five local students who exemplified hard work, perseverance, leadership and community engagement, totaling \$25,000. Islanders Assist:

In partnership with National Grid, each home assist by the New York Islanders this season led to a tree being planted in the Metro New York area. Thanks to the team's 168 home assists, 168 trees were donated within the community.


Morthwell





The New York Islanders hosted their annual First Responders Night on February 4, 2025, presented by Northwell Health. This night recognizes and honors healthcare workers, paramedics, EMTs, police officers, and firefighters, who protect and serve our communities.

The evening started off with EMT Bianca Lugo waiving the Islanders flag as the honorary Flag Captain. At center ice, Islanders captain Anders Lee was joined by FDNY firefighter Brian Downey, NYPD officer Aaron Klein and paramedic William Bailey for the ceremonial puck drop. In addition to those being recognized, over 200 tickets were given to first responders, their families, and Northwell healthcare workers to enjoy the game and receive the recognition for their hard work.

Fans throughout the evening saw different activations both inside UBS Arena and outside on the plaza. Fans entering were greeted with flashing lights from fire trucks, police cars and ambulances. Once inside, fans enjoyed first responder graphics around the arena and had to the opportunity create "Thank You" cards that were distributed to first responders through our partnership with Bake Back America, a local non-profit.

GO GREEN NIGHT SUPPORTED BY NATIONAL GRID



The New York Islanders hosted Go Green Night, presented by National Grid, on March 20th. The evening spotlighted the eco-friendly practices implemented by the Islanders and UBS Arena to reduce waste and promote a cleaner environment within the community.


As part of the Hockey With A Heart initiative, two impactful charities were featured for their unique efforts in driving environmental change. The first, Neighborhood Forest, a national organization focused on reducing carbon footprints by planting trees. They achieved this by providing children with free trees to plant, encouraging a lifelong appreciation for nature. The second charity, Rock and Wrap it Up, combats food waste by collecting surplus food from venues, sporting events, schools, and more, and donating it to local food banks and soup kitchens.

Throughout the night, the Islanders and UBS Arena showcased their sustainability initiatives, including the use of occupancy sensor technology to automatically turn off lights in unused areas, donating surplus food to local organizations, and diverting at least 90% of waste through their two-stream system: recycling and composting.

Thanks to National Grid, the first 10,000 fans in attendance received a blue New York Islanders bucket hat. In addition, National Grid hosted a concourse activation featuring interactive games and prizes to promote energy conservation. The New York League of Conservation Voters was also on site, engaging fans with educational resources on climate change.











Beach Cleanup supported by JetBlue: Members of the New York Islanders and UBS Arena front office partnered with JetBlue employees on April 16th to assist in a beach cleanup and dune planting at Point Lookout Town Park. The group worked alongside the Town of Hempstead Department of Conservation and Waterways and the Atlantic Marine Conservation Society.





MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

During the January 25th home game, the New York Islanders and UBS Arena showcased the importance of mental health and the efforts they take to raise awareness and the services they provide.

During the game, multiple mental health-based charities were invited to be the Hockey With A Heart partners. The charities included the Association of Mental Health and Wellness, Beyond the Badge NY, and Project Healthy Mind. These nonprofits are unique, each providing various services to individuals in the communities and working to eliminate stigmas surrounding mental health.

The New York Islanders and UBS Arena strive to raise awareness and support efforts promoting positive mental health services to all individuals and a supportive atmosphere in the community.





COMMUNITY COLLECTIONS & DRIVES



Food Drive: Before the November 27th home game the New York Islanders hosted their annual Thanksgiving Food Drive. All non-perishable food items that were donated were distributed to Island Harvest. Over 2,950 pounds of non-perishable food items were collected.



Coat Drive: In partnership with New York Cares and We Love New York City, the New York Islanders hosted its annual coat drive before the Friday, January 24th home game. Fans that donated three new or gently used coats, received a ticket voucher redeemable for an upcoming regular season home game. This season over 750 coats were collected.







Pride Awareness Game: January 16th was full of activations and initiatives supporting the LGBTQIA+ community and furthering the #HockeylsForEveryone mission.

The LGBT Network and New York City Pride Hockey Alliance were present on the concourse, receiving a portion of the 50/50 charity through the Hockey With A Heart program. Both charities support the inclusion of LGBTQIA+ across the game of hockey and in local communities across New York and Long Island.

Throughout the game, fans purchased Hockey Is For Everyone player-autographed mystery pucks and a pride-themed t-shirt. The t-shirt was designed by Emma Rizzo, a Long Island

native and Islanders fan who is part of the LGBTQIA+ community. Rizzo was the winner of the contest the club ran throughout June. The fundraisers raised additional monetary support for LGBTQIA+ programs throughout Long Island.



Brent was one of six brothers in his family to reach the NHL. Brent Sutter entered the league collecting 43 points in 43 games and would go on to help the Islanders win the 1982 and 1983 Stanley Cups, before becoming the fourth captain in franchise history. Brent Sutter finished his career with 694 games played and 610 points with the Islanders and ranks top 10 in even strength points, even strength goals, game-winning goals, power-play points, power-play goals, and shorthanded goals in franchise history.


Additional Events: The New York Islanders Alumni group continues its presence and dedication to the community by immersing themselves into the fandom by attending games, charity events and fan development opportunities.

Over the course of the season, Anders Lee hosted families affected by cancer at Islanders home games, complete with complimentary tickets and a post-game meet and greet with the families.










KIDS CLUB








Lighthouse Limo: During home game intermissions, young fans received the opportunity to take a ride around the ice that their favorite players skate on.

From grassroots initiatives to elite development programs, the Islanders are dedicated to building the sport of hockey not just on Long Island, but throughout the Metropolitan area and beyond. These programs serve as the foundation for that growth, ensuring that the sport thrives for generations to come.



GROWING THE GAME




Future Islanders Learn to Play: As part of the league-wide Learn to Play initiative, the Future Islanders program operated at 25 rink partner locations, introducing boys and girls ages 5-9 to the game of hockey. The program also served as a transition pathway for first-time players interested in joining house league. This season, more than 1,500 children participated, including over 300 girls.

Islanders Youth Hockey Jamboree: The annual Jamborees are day-long events featuring cross-ice games for local mite teams. This past season, the Islanders hosted a jamboree each month from October through March. These events included all-girls jamborees, Learn to Play jamborees and traditional mite jamborees, welcoming players of all skill levels. Over 500 skaters participated in this season's program. The year-end jamboree was held at Northwell Health Ice Center and had over 150 participants from over 20 organizations in attendance.









Uscience presented by Northwell: This event was designed to give young athletes the opportunity to develop advanced hockey techniques while exploring the science behind the game. This unique program seamlessly combines skill development with education, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation for sport. In addition to engaging players, it offers valuable insights for youth hockey coaches and parents, creating an educational experience led by the pros. By emphasizing proper techniques and safety, the event promoted a safer and more supportive playing environment for all participants. This past program over 40 players in the U12 division and 40 players in the high school division participated in the one-day event.



GIRLS HOCKEY



Islanders Girls Next Step Program: As part of our continued effort to grow girls' participation in hockey, the Islanders Girls Next Step Program hosted an introductory Learn to Play series at four rinks this season. More than 140 girls took part in the clinics that were led by professional female hockey ambassadors including players from the LIU University women's team, and former professional players Callie Hutchenson, Shelly Picard and Kelly Nash. Islanders alumni Arron Asham and Radek Martinek also made special appearances throughout the program.



Islanders Girls Hockey Weekend presented by Global Industrial: Islanders Girls Hockey Weekend, presented by Global Industrial, is a dedicated celebration of girls' hockey held at The Park at UBS Arena. The weekend featured a variety of exciting events - including Try Hockey for Free sessions, Girls Jamborees and advanced clinics, designed to empower young female athletes and grow the sport within the community. Participants of all skill levels were invited to experience the game, develop skills, and connect with fellow players in a supportive and inspiring environment. The event reflects the Islanders' ongoing commitment to expanding girls' hockey across Long Island and the Metropolitan area. This past season, we hosted two separate weekends that featured over 200 participants.



Mother Power Play Event supported by Northwell Health: The Mother Power Play event, supported by Northwell Health, was held at Northwell Health Ice Center in celebration of Mother's Day. This special event brought together young female hockey players and their mothers for a day of activities focused on health, wellness, and bonding. Participants enjoyed engaging with a variety of stations, including bracelet making, guided meditation, and healthy snack preparation. The day concluded with an on-ice session, allowing mothers and daughters to share the joy of skating together. This event exemplifies the Islanders' commitment to community engagement through the promotion of healthy, active lifestyles among families.



HOCKEY IS FOR EVERYONE



Long Island Blues & Long Island Rough Riders: This season, the Islanders partnered with two local adaptive hockey programs, the Long Island Blues and Long Island RoughRiders Sled Hockey. The Long Island Blues is composed of children with autism and developmental disabilities, while the Long Island RoughRiders includes athletes from the disabled community, including amputees and wounded veterans. In November, the Long Island RoughRiders competed in the NHL Sled Classic in Dallas, proudly bringing home the championship title.





Warrior Hockey Team presented by Collins Building Services: The New York Islanders are proud partners of the Long Island Warriors Hockey Club, a recreational hockey team for military veterans, active military, and reserve members. The club was founded to strengthen community engagement and provide camaraderie among veterans as they transition to civilian life. The program educates, trains and supports individuals from all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces, including those with physical or mental disabilities incurred during service, offering them a chance to participate in the sport of ice hockey.

In addition to on-ice participation, the program raises awareness of challenges faced by veterans, promotes team-building, and fosters self-confidence. Today, there are more than 150 participants across three teams at varying levels of play. Each season, the Islanders host the Long Island Warrior Classic at Northwell Health Ice Center, welcoming warrior teams from around the world.





Play It Forward presented by Northwell Health: In partnership with Northwell Health, Play It Forward aims to make hockey accessible while also focusing on the importance of teamwork, nutrition and different career pathways. In celebration of the team's fourth year, over 120 students from the Freeport School District were allowed to complete the four-week Learn to Play program. At the end of the program, three children received a hockey scholarship to cover all hockey costs for the next three years.



430ak Partnership presented by UBS: The New York Islanders and UBS continued to stay dedicated to their five-year partnership to diversify hockey with the 430ak Foundation. The 430ak Foundation, assists in serving minorities and underprivileged youth hockey players of all ages. Throughout the season, New York Islanders staff, alumni and members of the UBS hockey team host clinics, serve as mentors and promote educational development to more than 150 children associated with the 430ak Foundation. This season, UBS and the Islanders hosted the 3 Keys Cup to raise awareness and money for the 430ak Foundation.



INTERNATIONAL HOCKEY



Islanders Quebec Team presented by Enterprise: Comprising 11- and 12-year-old hockey players from 12 different organizations across Long Island, New York City, New Jersey, Philadelphia, and Connecticut, the Islanders Quebec Team proudly represents the New York Islanders on an international stage. The team began their journey with a pre-tournament competition just outside Philadelphia, where they captured the championship at the World Cup Tournament. Their path continued to the prestigious Quebec International Pee-Wee Hockey Tournament, often called the World Championship of Pee-Wee Hockey.

Held each February, this event is the largest and most significant minor hockey tournament in the world, attracting over 2,300 amateur players from more than 16 countries. Competing in this historic tournament is a once-in-a-lifetime experience for young athletes, symbolizing their hard work and dedication to the sport. This year's team made an impressive run to the quarterfinals before ultimately falling short. Their entire journey was captured and shared through the compelling series, Road to Quebec, highlighting the team's growth, challenges, and unforgettable moments on and off the ice.





WickFest – Female Hockey Team presented by Xerox: The New York Islanders Girls Tournament Team, presented by Xerox, made history as the franchise's first all-girls team to compete internationally, participating in the prestigious WickFest tournament in Vancouver, British Columbia. Coached by Islanders alumnus Arron Asham and his daughter Oceane Asham, a former NCAA player at Minnesota State University, the team achieved an impressive undefeated 5-0 record, culminating in a thrilling shootout victory over the Vancouver Angels

to secure the 13U Silver Division championship. Beyond their on-ice success, the players had the unique opportunity to engage with hockey legends, including skating sessions with three-time Olympic gold medalist Charline Labonté and insights from four-time Olympic gold medalist and WickFest founder Hayley Wickenheiser. This groundbreaking initiative underscores the Islanders' commitment to advancing girls' hockey and providing young female athletes with platforms to excel and be inspired.

P.A.L. Junior Islanders: In 2013, the New York Islanders partnered with Pride in Athletics for Life (P.A.L.) Hockey, a non-profit, amateur hockey organization. The affiliation marked the inauguration of the P.A.L. Junior Islanders Hockey Club. The organization operates teams at six different levels: mite, squirt, pee-wee, bantam, midget and junior. The Islanders and P.A.L. work together in coach and player development, hockey expertise, marketing assets, promotional assistance and public relations support. This past season, more than 450 hockey players participated in the program.



Islanders Elite Girls Program: The Islanders are proud supporters of the Girls Elite program, a travel program established to support and promote the growth of female players through skill development and to pave the way for play at prep school and college levels. This past season, the program featured 10U, 12U, 14U and 16U level teams with over 100 girls in the program.





New York Islanders Hockey High School League: The New York Islanders High School Hockey League (operating as High School Hockey League of Nassau County, aka HSHLNC) was established in 1995 as a not-for-profit organization that works with young men and women in middle school through high school to foster and promote, honesty, integrity, good sportsmanship, good fellowship, self-discipline, fairness, self-reliance, teamwork, self-confidence, leadership skills, and positive decision making through the sport of ice hockey. This year Nassau County and Suffolk County hosted their first high school championship since 2009. The Bellmore-Merrick Bulldogs were crowned the champions this year.

Sparky's Hot Shots, Mites on Ice: Led by the group sales department, the Sparky's Hot Shots program, sponsored by Solo Stove, youth teams at the mite/mini-mite and squirt level, received the opportunity to skate on the ice during the intermission of an Islanders game with a complimentary Sparky's Hot Shots jersey.

In addition to skating on the ice, friends and families were able to enjoy watching the Islanders play at the arena. Over 600 players from 40 teams ranging from upstate New York, Nassau County, Suffolk County, Brooklyn, Queens, Manhattan, and New Jersey participated.





Amateur Hockey Update supported by UBS: Every home game the New York Islanders and UBS highlighted an amateur hockey player in the community with an in-person interview. The youth participant being highlighted also received complimentary tickets to enjoy the game. This program showcased more than 42 hockey players in the community.



Youth Hockey Night: Youth Hockey Celebration is a day to honor and inspire young talent who will shape the future of hockey. This is more than just a game; it's a celebration of sportsmanship, teamwork, and the love of hockey. This year, we had over 500 tickets sold and 32 different organizations join us for Youth Hockey Day. We also had a mite all-star game where participants from 11 organizations played in Sparky's Hot Shots during the 2nd intermission. At the end of the game, we had someone from each organization join us on the ice for a postgame photo to capture a picture of all the organizations with us for this fantastic day.



Post Game Skates at UBS Arena: This one-of-a-kind experience allows people to skate on the ice just minutes after the Islanders home games. Teams participating receive professional hockey experience, complete with scoreboard and PA reads, in-game music, professional locker rooms, and more. This past season, we had 30 postgame skates with over 20 groups from youth, high school, junior, college, and men's leagues.

Public Skates: The Islanders offered public skate sessions before game day and select UBS Arena show experiences. Each session was 90 minutes, skates were available for rent and more than 4,000 people took the ice this past 2024-25 season.



Pond Hockey Tournaments: The Islanders park experience offered 3-on-3 hockey tournaments for all ages. Each tournament team consisted of 6-8 players. This past season, more than 300 players took the ice. Brackets consisted of hockey players of all different levels, including U8, U10, U12, and Adult. Specialty events geared towards first responders and female players were included.



Pregame Pond Hockey and Skates at the Park: Pregame Pond Hockey and skates allow kids and adults to play hockey or skate outdoors at the Park presented by Northwell Health before enjoying the Islanders game. Pond Hockey games include mini nets where players show off their skills before heading inside to watch the professionals do it. This past season was the first time we had this experience for an extended period. In the 2024-25 season, 24 teams/skates participated in the program.
