

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****January 18, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. TORONTO MAPLE LEAFS [4]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames continued a six game homestand on Thursday night by welcoming the Toronto Maple Leafs to the Scotiabank Saddledome. The Flames would get on the board first just over halfway through the opening frame with Yegor Sharangovich making it goals in back-to-back games to put Calgary up. Nazem Kadri would extend the Flames lead to 2-0 later in the period countered by an Auston Matthews tally as the Flames led 2-1 through 20. The Leafs would score three unanswered in the second to go up 4-2. Andrew Mangiapane would draw the Flames back within one with just over two minutes remaining in the second, but the Flames ultimately fell 4-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Oilers. The Flames suffered a 5-2 setback in their first matchup on October 29th during the 2023 Heritage Classic.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 6-4-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 14-11-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST BATTLE OF ALBERTA THIS SEASON:

The Calgary Flames travelled to Commonwealth Stadium to take on the Oilers in the 2023 Tim Hortons Heritage Classic for the first installment of the Battle of Alberta. Edmonton would open the scoring with Brett Kulak finding the back of the net 4:19 into the game before Zach Hyman made it 2-0 Oilers halfway through the opening frame. Nazem Kadri would tip his first of the year home on the powerplay to get the Flames within one, but Edmonton would add a third to go up 3-1 through 20. In the second, MacKenzie Weegar made a slick rush up ice and saw his shot stopped, but the rebound found A.J. Greer who buried his first as a Flame to once again bring Calgary within one. The Oilers would tack on two in the third and ultimately take the Heritage Classic 5-2.

HOCKEY DAY IN CANADA:

Today is Hockey Day in Canada and Calgary has an all-time record of 11-5-5-1 on Hockey Day. The Flames were part of the inaugural Hockey Day in Canada back on February 19th, 2000, they faced the Edmonton Oilers and prevailed 3-2 in overtime thanks to a pair of goals from current Assistant Coach Marc Savard including the game winner, a pair of assists from Jarome Iginla along with 28 saves from Fred Brathwaite. Last season, the Flames faced the Tampa Bay Lightning on Hockey Day, prevailing 6-3.

SHARAN-GOAL-VICH:

With his first period marker against Toronto, Yegor Sharangovich has registered seven goals over his last five games, the last Flames player with as many over a five-game span was Matthew Tkachuk from March 10-19, 2019. Since January 1st, Sharangovich's eight goals are tied for the third-most in the NHL and trail only Elias Pettersson (11) and Sam Reinhart (10). The 25-year-old is now five goals away from matching his career-best of 24 which he set during the 2021-22 campaign as a member of the New Jersey Devils and has goals in back-to-back contests for his fourth 2+ goal streak this season.

AS A UNIT:

Since January 1st, the Calgary Flames are tied for the second-most goals as a team in the NHL with 35. Yegor Sharangovich leads the charge with eight tallies while Blake Coleman has the second-most at seven followed by Nazem Kadri with six in the midst of a three-game goal streak. The Flames are tied for the seventh-most points in the NHL since the calendar flip, with 12, sporting a 6-3-0 record.

KLAP YOUR HANDS:

Adam Klapka received his first NHL recall on Thursday morning. The Prague, CZE native has skated in 33 games for the Calgary Wranglers so far this season, notching 10 goals and 11 assists for 21 points along with 42 penalty minutes. At the time of his recall, Klapka was three goals away from matching his previous season total of 13 which he set in 60 games during his first North American pro season. The 23-year-old was tied for the team lead in goals for the Wranglers during the 2023 Calder Cup Playoffs with four tallies in nine games and was signed as a free agent by Calgary on May 16, 2022.

A BATTLE BY THE NUMBERS:

This will be the 261st installment of the Battle of Alberta, with the Flames holding a 129-107-24 record over their provincial rival. 100 of those games have been one-goal games or ties (82 wins, 18 ties) with Calgary owning 45 of the 82 wins. Jarome Iginla is the Flames all-time goals leader against the Oilers with 34 tallies, while Al MacInnis sets the mark for points with 89 in 75 games against Edmonton during his time in Calgary.



DOMESWEET DOME:

The Flames get set for game three of a six game homestand starting tonight against the Edmonton Oilers for round two of the Battle of Alberta. This is tied for the Flames longest homestand with their other six-game stretch at the 'Dome coming from November 27th to December 9th when they went 3-3-0. Following tonight, the Flames will welcome the St. Louis Blues, the Columbus Blue Jackets, and Chicago Blackhawks next week.
