2024-25 SEASON

- Started 63 games for TBL and had a 38-20-5 record with a 2.18 goals-against average and a .917 save percentage
- Became the fastest goalie in NHL history to reach 300 wins, doing so in 490 career games played and breaking the record set by Jacques Plante (521 GP).
- Notched six shutouts, good for the second-most of his career
- Became the 49th goalie in NHL history to reach 40 career shutouts on March 27 vs. UTA
- Earned his eight consecutive season with 30+ wins
- Tallied two assists, marking his ninth consecutive season with at least one point

2025 PLAYOFFS

- Started all five Stanley Cup Playoff Games vs. FLA
- Recorded a 3.27 goals-against average and .872 save percentage

CAREER

2023-24 Season

- Missed the first 20 games of the season after undergoing a successful microdiscectomy to address a lumbar disc herniation in the offseason
- Returned to action on November 24 at CAR, earning a win as he made 22 saves on 24 shots on goal
- Led NHL goaltenders for wins from December 1 to the end of the regular season with 29
- He finished the season with a 30-20-2 record with two shutouts in 52 starts for TBL
- Recorded the second-most saves in his career (53) on December 14 at EDM
- Started all five Stanley Cup Playoff games for TBL in their first-round series vs. FLA
- Finished postseason with a .897 save percentage and a 3.22 goals-against average

CAREER CONTINUED

2022-23 Season

- Finished the season 34-22-4 with four shutouts in 60 starts with a 2.65 goals-against average and .915 save percentage
- Recorded 30-plus wins for the sixth time in his career and sixth-consecutive season
- Finished sixth in the NHL for wins, ending a streak where he finished first or tied for first in the NHL for wins at five-straight seasons
- Ranked tied for third in the NHL for home wins (20)
- Tied a TBL regular season record for saves in a shutout after making all 45 stops Feb. 25 at DET
- Notched shutouts in two of his last five regular season starts
- Recorded a .932 save percentage over his last five regular season starts
- Made the second-most saves of his career (52) in a shootout loss November 3 vs. CAR
- Was selected to participate in the NHL All-Star Game for the fifth time in his career
- Started all six Stanley Cup Playoff games and went 2-4 with a 3.56 goals-against average and .875 save percentage
- Three of his four losses in the series came in overtime
- Made his 100th career playoff start in Game 1 vs. TOR

2021-22 Season

- Appeared in 63 games and finished 39-18-5 with a 2.49 goals-against average and .916 save percentage
- Ranked tied for first in the NHL for wins with Sergei Bobrovsky (FLA)
- Ended the season first or tied for first in the NHL for wins for the fifth-straight season, becoming the first goalie in the NHL's expansion era (since 1967-68) and third in League history to at least share the NHL lead in wins in five consecutive seasons
- Made the second-most starts of his career, and his 39 wins were tied for the second most of his career
- Had a season-long, seven-game win streak December 2-21
- Notched a 17-save shutout November 26 vs. SEA for his second shutout of the season and 200th career NHL win
- Selected to participate in his fourth NHL All-Star Game
- Started all 23 Stanley Cup Playoff games for TBL and went 14-9 with a 2.52 GAA and .922 save percentage
- Stopped all 49 shots Game 4 of the second round vs. FLA for his sixth career shutout in a series-clinching win
- Won six straight games from Game 6 of the First Round vs. TOR through Game 4 of the Second Round vs. FLA to tie the longest winning streak of his playoff career
- Earned his 63rd career playoff win Game 5 of the Stanley Cup Final at COL for the second most among active NHL goalies and tied for the 13th most all-time in NHL history



CAREER CONTINUED

2020-21 Season

- Appeared in 42 games for TBL, posting a league-leading 31 wins to go along with a 2.21 goals-against average, .925 save percentage and five shutouts
- Ranked tied for third in the NHL with five shutouts and ranked ninth for save percentage
- Set TBL record with a 12-game winning streak (T-7th longest in NHL history) from February 22 to March 23
- Posted the longest shutout streak of his career (228:09) from February 22 through March 4
- Recorded third consecutive shutout on March 2 at DAL, becoming first TBL goalie to post three shutouts in a row
- Appeared in all 23 Stanley Cup Playoff games, registering a record of 16-7 to win the Stanley Cup
- Posted a 1.90 goals-against average and .937 save percentage
- Won the Conn Smythe Trophy as playoffs MVP
- Set career-high with five shutouts, including shutting out each series-closing game

2019-20 Season

- Appeared in 52 games with TBL, compiling a record of 35-14-3 to go along with a 2.56 goals-against average and .917 save percentage
- Named a finalist for the Vezina Trophy for the 3rd consecutive season
- Selected to the NHL All-Star Game
- Led the NHL for wins with 35
- Passed Ben Bishop to become TBL's franchise leader for games played (228) by a goaltender on Dec. 7
- Recorded a 21-game point streak from December 17 through February 15 (19-0-2), setting a TBL record
- Became TBL's all-time leader for wins with 132nd victory on November 23 against ANA
- Appeared in all 25 of TBL's Stanley Cup Playoff games, posting 18 wins to go along 1.80 goals-against average and .927 save percentage
- Led all NHL goaltenders for wins and save percentage
- Posted first career playoff shutout in Game 6 of the Stanley Cup Final against DAL, making 22 saves

2018-19 Season

- Appeared in 53 games, posting a record of 39-10-4 to go along with a 2.40 goals-against average and .925 save percentage and 6 shutouts
- Won the Vezina Trophy
- Set career bests for goals-against average and save percentage
- Ranked 1st in the NHL for wins
- Became TBL's all-time saves leader (5,739) passing Ben Bishop with 13 saves on March 25 vs. BOS
- Set TBL record for saves in a game with 54 on March 20 at Washington
- Played in his 2nd All-Star Game
- Missed 14 games from November 15 through December 10 with a fractured left foot
- Became TBL's all-time leader for shutouts
- Appeared in all four of TBL's Stanley Cup Playoff games

2017-18 Season

- Appeared in 65 games with the Bolts, posting a record of 44-17-3 to go along with a 2.62 goals-against average and .920 save percentage with 8 shutouts
- Set a franchise record for shutouts in a season
- Ranked tied for first in the NHL for wins and shutouts
- Made his first NHL All-Star appearance
- Tied franchise best nine-game win streak (in decisions) from October 9-30
- Finalist for the Vezina Trophy
- Appeared in 17 Stanley Cup Playoff games for TBL, posting a record of 11-6 to go along with a 2.58 goals-against average and .918 save percentage
- Ranked third for both wins and saves (481) in the postseason

CAREER CONTINUED

2016-17 Season

- Appeared in 50 games with TBL, posting a record of 23-17-7 to go along with a 2.61 goals-against average and .917 save percentage
- Recorded consecutive shutouts from November 14-19

2015-16 Season

- Appeared in 24 games with the Lightning, compiling a record of 11-10-0 to go along with a 2.76 goals-against average and .910 save percentage
- Missed the first nine games of the regular season after having surgery to remove a blood clot on September 3
- Also appeared in eight Stanley Cup Playoff games, registering a record of 3-4 to go along with a 2.76 goals-against average and .925 save percentage
- Set TBL record for saves (44) in regulation time in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Final vs. PIT
- Became first goalie to record first two career playoff wins in relief effort since Olaf Kolzig (1995-96)

2014-15 Season

- Played in 16 games for the Lightning, compiling a record of 7-5-1 to go along with a 2.36 goals-against average and .918 save percentage
- Ranked tied for 6th among rookie goalies in the NHL for wins
- Made 28 saves for his first career NHL shutout on March 3 vs. BUF
- Set a new TBL rookie franchise record with 45 saves on December 20 at NYI
- Made 23 saves on 24 shots, picking up the win in his NHL debut on December 16 at PHI
- Appeared in 25 games with the AHL Syracuse, registering a record of 14-6-5 to go along with a 2.45 goals-against average and .917 save percentage
- Appeared in four games with TBL during the postseason, compiling a record of 1-1 to go along with a 3.19 goals-against average and .895 save percentage
- Made his Stanley Cup Playoffs debut in Game 4 against MTL in the Second Round
- Started Game 4 of the Stanley Cup Final, making 17 saves on 19 shots
- Recorded his first career playoff win in Game 2 vs. CHI in the Stanley Cup Final in a relief effort
- Became the first goalie to win his first career playoff game in a relief effort in the Stanley Cup Final since 1928

2013-14 Season

- Played 28 games for Salavat Yulaev Ufa of the KHL, recording 28 wins and 14 losses

2012-13 Season

- Played in 27 games for Tolpar Ufa, recording a 1.93 goals-against average and .930 save percentage

2011-12 Season

- Played in 27 games for Tolpar Ufa, notching a 2.23 goals-against average and .931 save percentage
