

Miller set career-highs in goals (9), assists (34) and points (43) in 2022-23, ranking second among Rangers defensemen in all three categories. Selected by the Rangers in the first round (22nd overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft, Miller has collected 75 points (21G, 54A) and a +44 rating in 214 career NHL games and was named to the NHL's All-Rookie Team in his first season, 2020-21. Miller played two seasons at the University of Wisconsin from 2018-20, producing 40 points (12G, 28A) in 62 career contests. He was named to the NCAA All-Rookie Team and was the recipient of the Badgers Mark Johnson Rookie of the Vear award as a freshman in 2018-19 after recording 22 points (5G, 17A) in 26 outings. A product of the U.S. National Team Development Program, Miller represented his country at the 2019 and 2020 IIHF World Junior Championships, helping the U.S. capture the silver medal in 2019 and serving as an alternate captain in 2020.
