



### **FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP**

**April 15, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS [4] (SO)**

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Vegas Golden Knights to the Scotiabank Saddledome to conclude the home portion of their 2024-25 season. The Golden Knights would open the scoring with Pavel Dorofeyev putting the visitors up 5:25 into the contest. Later in the frame, a Morgan Frost powerplay marker would draw the Flames level, but Vegas would score a pair before the end of the period, and Calgary trailed 3-1 through 20. The middle stanza would see the clubs combine for 21 shots, but both goalies stood tall, and the score remained 3-1 Golden Knights through 40. In the third, Calgary came storming out with Nazem Kadri drawing the home side within one just 32 seconds in, before Mikael Backlund tied things at the 1:04 mark. Adam Klapka would give Calgary their first lead of the contest just past the midway point of the frame, but Vegas responded shortly after and through 60 minutes of play, nothing could separate these clubs. Overtime would solve nothing, but in a shootout, Dustin Wolf went 3/3 while Morgan Frost recorded the only successful shootout conversion to lift the Flames over the Golden Knights 5-4.

### **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the third and final meeting this season between the Flames and Kings. Calgary has beaten Los Angeles in both of their prior meetings so far in 2024-25.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 15-4-6 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 25-16-8 against Western Conference opponents.

**NAZ-HIM KADRI:**

On Tuesday against Vegas, Nazem Kadri scored his team-leading 33<sup>rd</sup> goal of the season to set a new career-high in goals. Kadri had previously reached the 32-goal mark twice in 2017-18 and 2016-17 as a member of the Toronto Maple Leafs.

**HOWLIN' FOR YOU:**

Dustin Wolf earned his 29<sup>th</sup> win of 2024-25 with his 38-save effort on Tuesday to tie Stuart Skinner (29 in 2022-23) for the second-most wins by an active goaltender in their rookie season. The list is topped by Matt Murray (32 in 2016-17). With the victory, Wolf also surpassed Ryan Miller (36) and tied John Gibson (37) and Alex Nedeljkovic (37) for the second-most wins by a U.S.-born rookie goaltender. Only Jimmy Howard (38) has more.

**BREW CREW:**

On Wednesday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of defenceman Hunter Brzustewicz from the Calgary Wranglers. Brzustewicz, a native of Washington Township, MI, has skated in 69 games with the Wranglers in his inaugural professional campaign, scoring five goals and 26 assists for 31 points. Brzustewicz's 31 points are the fourth-most among rookie blueliners in the AHL this year, and since March 28<sup>th</sup>, he has seven points in the Wranglers eight games, including a goal and an assist in back-to-back wins over Abbotsford this past weekend.

**RICK AND MORTY:**

On Wednesday morning, the Calgary Flames also announced the recall of forward Sam Morton from the Calgary Wranglers. Morton, a native of Lafayette, CO has also skated in 69 contests for the Wranglers in 2024-25, scoring 20 goals and 25 assists for 45 points. Morton has scored timely goals for Calgary in his first full professional season, with his four game-winning goals tying for the third-most on the team. From March 8<sup>th</sup> to March 15<sup>th</sup>, the 25-year-old scored goals in four-consecutive games while adding two helpers for six points. Morton skated in six playoff games for the Wranglers last season, scoring three goals which ranked second on the club.

**MATT SCORE-ORONATO:**

With a pair of assists on Tuesday against Vegas, Matt Coronato extended his point-streak to a career-best six games with four goals and three assists over the six-game run which began on April 5<sup>th</sup>. Coronato has become the first Calgary player with a six-game point streak at age 22 or younger since Matthew Tkachuk (8 GP from Feb. 6-21, 2020).

**LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

On Tuesday night against Vegas, Mikael Backlund scored his 214<sup>th</sup> career goal and surpassed Al MacInnis (213) for the seventh-most goals in Flames franchise history. With one more tally, Backlund would match Lanny McDonald's 215 markers with the franchise, the sixth-most in Flames history.

**(SAGINAW) SPIRIT OF THE WEST:**

On April 8<sup>th</sup>, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of defenceman Zayne Parekh from the OHL's Saginaw Spirit. Parekh, a native of Nobleton, ON skated in 61 games for the Saginaw Spirit in 2024-25, posting 107 points from 33 goals and 74 assists, finishing second on the team in scoring. Parekh's 107 points were the fifth-most in the OHL and he led not just all OHL defencemen, but all rearguards in the CHL as he became just the fifth blueliner in Canadian Hockey League history to reach the 100-point mark. He reached the 30-goal mark on March 2<sup>nd</sup> in North Bay and became just the second defenceman in OHL/OHA history to record 30 or more goals in back-to-back seasons, joining Bobby Orr who did so in 1964-65 and 1965-66.



**SUN-IEV SHINE:**

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Aydar Suniev to a three-year entry-level contract. Suniev, a native of Kazan, RUS played 35 games for the University of Massachusetts Amherst in 2024-25, posting career-bests in goals (20), assists (18) and points (38), finishing second on the team in scoring. Suniev helped his club upset the number three ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers in the Fargo Regional Semifinals, scoring a pair of goals including the overtime winner in a 5-4 UMASS victory.
