- The Stars won their ninth straight game, setting the franchise record for consecutive wins. They are the fourth team in the NHL have a win streak of at least nine games this season.
- **Jake Oettinger** won his eighth-consecutive game, matching both his career high and the Dallas Stars team record.
- **Lian Bichsel** recorded the first multi-goal game of his career, scoring two goals against the Canucks.
- **Miro Heiskanen** extended his assist streak to a season-long six games.
- With a goal and an assist, **Colin Blackwell** became the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games that the Stars will play against the Flames this season. The two teams will meet for a final time on April 7 in Dallas.
 - The Stars fell short to the Flames earlier this season on Nov. 22 in Calgary (3-2 SOL).
- Tonight's game against the Flames and yesterday's matchup against the Canucks is the ninth of 12 back-to-back sets the Stars will play this season.
- **Wyatt Johnston** (121) enters tonight's game one goal shy of surpassing **Joe Pavelski** (121) for sole possession of 24th on the franchise's all-time goals list.
- **Johnston** is also just one goal shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.

- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (37, fourth), points (83, second) and points percentage (.692, second) this year entering play Tuesday. The team's success this season comes despite having 206 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Radek Faksa**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Mikko Rantanen** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Seventy-six of the Stars' 202 goals this season have been scored in the third period, which was tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Despite playing in only 60 games this season, **Mavrik Bourque** (11-13—24) is one assist and one point shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 15 goals, 18 assists and 33 points.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Justin Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas in 5-0-3 in those contests.
- **Casey DeSmith** was tied for seventh and ranked eighth in the NHL, respectively, in goals saved above expected (14.1) and goals saved above expected per 60 (0.651) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Tuesday.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of the last nine games that they have played dating back to Jan. 23, which was the longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
 - Dallas has won seven of the nine games during the streak by a one-goal margin. In all, the team has won 20 games by a one-goal margin this season, which was the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The team's nine-game win streak is the longest in franchise history.
- A Dallas victory tonight would make them the fourth team in the NHL this season to win at least 10 consecutive games.
- Dallas has scored first in seven of the last nine games that they have played and have only trailed for 61:21 of game time during the nine-game win streak.
- The team has gone 11-for-29 on the power play over the course of this winning streak for a 37.9 percent success rate. Their 37.9 percent conversion rate and 11 power-play goals scored ranked second and tied for first, respectively, in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Tuesday.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling 13 points (8-5—13) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, nine Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.44), **Jason Robertson** (1.33), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.22), **Jamie Benn** (1.00), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.00), **Roope Hintz** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
- **Duchene's** seven goals during that span were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Fourteen different skaters have scored at least one goal for the Stars during the team's current nine-game win streak: **Duchene** (8), **Johnston** (6), **Robertson** (5), **Mavrik Bourque** (3), **Thomas Harley** (3), **Benn** (2), **Lian Bichsel** (2), **Nathan Bastian** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Adam Erne** (1), **Hintz** (1), **Nils Lundkvist** (1), **Sam Steel** and **Rantanen** (1).

EXTINGUISHING THE FLAMES

- Dallas is 80-72-37 all-time vs. Calgary, including a 34-41-19 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in their last five consecutive games played against the Flames (3-0-2) dating back to Nov. 30, 2023. Dallas has outscored Calgary 19-12 during that span.
 - Dallas has also earned points in their last five games played vs. Calgary at Scotiabank Saddledome (3-0-2).
- **Jason Robertson** has 20 points (11-9—20) in 13 career games against Calgary and has totaled at least a point in all but one game, also carrying a plus-minus rating of +9.
 - **Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a 12-game point streak against the Flames (11-9—20), his longest point streak against a single opponent, including four consecutive multi-point outings. His point streak against them is also tied with William Nylander (TOR) for the longest active point streak against the Flames.
 - His 1.54 points per game average ranks second among active NHL skaters who have played Calgary at least five times in their career.
- **Jamie Benn** has 11 points (3-8—11) in his last 10 games played against the Flames. In all, **Benn** has registered 46 points (23-23—46) in 47 career games vs. Calgary, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5.
 - His 46 career points against Calgary rank eighth among all active NHL skaters.
- **Colin Blackwell** has nine points (3-6—9) in 10 career games against the Flames and upholds a plus-minus rating of +7.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak vs. Calgary, earning six points (3-3—6) during that span. **Hintz** has totaled 14 points (4-10—14) in 16 career games played against the Flames, carrying a plus-minus rating of +7.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has recorded six points (5-1—6) in his last six games played vs. Calgary, dating back to Nov. 24, 2023. In all, **Johnston** has tallied seven points (6-1—7) in 10 career games played against the Flames, upholding a plus-minus rating of +5.
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game point streak vs. Calgary, collecting four points (1-3—4) during that span. In all, **Duchene** has notched 32 points (12-20—32) in 49 career games played against the Flames, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5 and recording eight multi-point outings.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has 13 points (1-12—13) in 17 career games against Calgary, averaging 25:26 of time on ice per game. His 25:26 time on ice per game against them is the fourth-best mark among all active NHL skaters.
- **Thomas Harley** has scored three goals in eight career games played against the Flames, upholding a plus-minus rating of +4 and averaging 19:09 of time on ice per game.
- **Esa Lindell** has registered seven points (1-6—7) in 25 career games played vs. Calgary, carrying a plus-minus rating of +5 and averaging 22:27 of time on ice per game.
- If plays tonight, **Arttu Hyry** will play in his first career game against the Flames.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last eight games he has played dating back to Jan. 20, taking down the Blues (3x), Bruins, Golden Knights, Jets, Predators and Canucks. It is tied for the longest win streak of his career that he originally set from March 20 to April 9, 2024.
- **Oettinger's** current eight-game win streak is tied for the longest in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) and is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.
 - Don Beaupre, who won 11 straight games for the Minnesota North Stars from Feb. 19 to March 19, 1986, currently holds the franchise record.
- **Oettinger's** eight-game win streak was tied with Carolina's Brandon Bussi for the longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday. If he were to win the next game he plays, it would make him the fourth goaltender this season to win at least nine consecutive games.
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 25 games this season, which was the third-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.

21 CAN YOU DO SOMETHING FOR ME

- **Jason Robertson** scored a goal and added an assist in Dallas' last game to give him 70 points (34-36—70) on the season, which was tied for the ninth-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The 2025-26 season marks **Robertson's** fifth-straight 70-point season. The only other active U.S.-born player with as many consecutive campaigns is Patrick Kane (5 from 2015-16 to 2019-20) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** is one of nine players in franchise history to have at least 50-point seasons for the team, joining Mike Modano (12x), Brian Bellows (6x), Dino Ciciarelli (6x), **Tyler Seguin** (6x), **Jamie Benn** (5x), Neal Broten (5x), Dave Gagner (5x) and Bobby Smith (5x).
- **Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in six of the last 11 games that he has played, totaling 14 points in all (7-7—14) during that span.
 - If he were to score tonight it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time since he had a career-long, seven-game goal streak earlier this season from Nov. 11 to 25.
- **Robertson** scored his 34th goal of the year in Dallas's last game on March 2 against the Canucks, the team's 60th game of the season. His 34 goals are the third-most through the team's first 60 games of the season in Dallas Stars team history according to NHL Stats, trailing only his own 35 goals in 2022-23 and Mike Modano's 39 goals in 1993-94.
- **Robertson's** 34 goals were tied for the fifth-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday. His 34 goals are also his fourth-most in a single season in his career and one shy of the 35 goals he scored last season.
- **Robertson** has scored 12 goals on the power-play this year, which were tied for fifth in the NHL entering play Tuesday and was also just one shy of his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.
- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

MIRO THE HERO

- With two assists in Dallas last game, **Miro Heiskanen** has now totaled 50 points (7-43—50) this season. The 2025-26 campaign marks his third 50-point season, which makes him the third Finnish-born defenseman in NHL history, alongside Reijo Ruotsalainen (5x) and Risto Siltanen (3x), to have at least three 50-point campaigns according to NHL Stats.
 - **Heiskanen** also tied Reijo Ruotsalainen (77) for the fifth-most multi-point games by a Finnish defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats. The only others with more are Kimmo Timonen (113), Teppo Numminen (97), Jyrki Lumme (85) and Risto Siltanen (84).
- **Heiskanen** joins Sergei Zubov (6x) and Craig Hartsburg (4x) as the only defensemen in franchise history to record at least three 50-point seasons.
- **Heiskanen's** 50 points were tied for the eighth-most in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Heiskanen** has recorded 14 assists in his last 11 games played dating back to Jan. 20. If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in seven consecutive games for the first time since he had a career-long, nine-game assist streak from March 6 to 23, 2023.
 - **Heiskanen's** current six-game assist streak was tied for the longest such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday and was the longest by a defenseman.
- A point of any kind tonight would give **Heiskanen** points in seven straight games for the first time since his career-best, 12-game point streak from March 1 to 23, 2023.
- **Heiskanen** enters tonight's game two points shy of surpassing Darryl Sydor (334) for the fourth-most points in franchise history among defensemen.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** has totaled 26 points (5-21—26) in 48 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 26 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 50 points (7-43—50).
- **Harley** enters tonight's contest having recorded 10 points (3-7—10) in his last 11 games played.

- **Harley** has scored 37 goals in his career and enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying Richard Matvichuk (38) for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman.
- When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in Dallas' game on Feb. 25 – a 4-1 win over the Seattle – the Stars outscored the Kraken 3-0 and outshot them 12-3 according to Natural Stat Trick. **Harley** tallied two assists in the win.
- **Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - **Harley** also scored the series-clinching overtime goal against Winnipeg in Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Harley's** six overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the ninth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Three of **Harley's** five goals this season have stood as game winners, which is tied for the most in his career in a single season. He also scored three game-winning goals in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- **Harley's** three game-winning goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Tuesday.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 53-for-175 on the power play this season for a 30.3 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The Oilers (54), Stars (53) and Wild (52) were the only teams to score at least 50 power-play goals this season entering play Tuesday.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them power-play goals in seven consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in eight straight games earlier this season from Nov. 1 to 15.
- Dallas' 53 power-play goals are just two shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 53 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (20), **Jason Robertson** (12), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 12 power-play goals are just one shy of matching his career high of 13 that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Johnston** (20-11—31) was tied for third in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Tuesday, followed by **Rantanen** (5-25—30), who ranked fifth, and **Robertson** (12-17—29), who was tied for sixth.
 - **Johnston's** 31 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 29 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 20 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Tuesday and were five more than the second-ranked skaters (three tied with 15).
- His 20 power-play goals are already a career high and are the most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 20 power-play goals are two shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 20 points (1-19—20) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Tuesday.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 19th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' game on Feb. 25 against Seattle, setting the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano previously held with 18 during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- He scored on the power play again in the Stars' next game on Feb. 28, a 3-2 overtime win over the Nashville Predators.
- His 20 power-play goals are already tied for the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history and are two shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 31 power-play goals, which was tied with Draisaitl for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Tuesday.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 44 goals, 42 assists and 86 points, all of which would be career highs.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game just one goal shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.

- **Johnston** is pacing to score 27 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Florida's Sam Reinhart also scored 27 power-play goals in 2023-24.
- **Jason Robertson** (46) and **Johnston** (44) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 23 points (5-18—23) in 60 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 25 assists, which would be a career high.
 - His 18 assists this season are only three shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 11 goals, 22 assists and 31 points, all of which would be career highs. He enters tonight's game two goals, three assists and five points shy of matching his career highs.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in three straight games against the Blues to win in regulation. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2, **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win and **Jamie Benn** scored with 22 second remaining in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 to beat the Blues 5-4.
- At the time, **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- **Benn's** goal on Feb. 4 was his second career go-ahead goal in the final minute of regulation, which tied Brian Lawton for the second-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats. Only Dino Ciccarelli (3) has more.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.

- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (352) and **Wyatt Johnston** (306).
- **Robertson's** 351-game Iron Man streak was tied the eighth-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 305 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Tuesday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forward **Jason Robertson** and Flames forward Joel Farabee skated for Team USA during the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Flames forward Joel Farabee were teammates at Boston University (NCAA) during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman **Thomas Harley** and Flames forward Connor Zary both represented Team Canada during the 2021 IIHF World Junior Championship and 2019 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Nathan Bastian** and Flames defenseman Kevin Bahl shared the ice in New Jersey from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Flames defenseman Jake Bean were both members of Team Canada during the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Alexander Petrovic** and Flames defenseman MacKenzie Weegar were in Florida together from 2016-17 to 2018-19.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played under Flames President of Hockey Ops Don Maloney for the Phoenix Coyotes in 2008-09 when Maloney was GM in Phoenix.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** played under Flames assistant GM Dave Nonis when Nonis was the assistant GM for the Ducks during the 2019-20 to 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** were both members of the Montreal Canadiens alongside Flames defenseman Joel Hanley during the 2016-17 season.
- VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played with Flames forward Jonathan Huberdeau with the Florida Panthers from 2014-15 to 2015-16.
