

The Dallas Stars Metro Hockey League (DSMHL) is centered around the following principles:

To create a player-centered, development-focused environment to foster a love for hockey.

Aligning with the USA Hockey Advanced Development Model, balance skill growth with enjoyment for all.

Our Commitment

A structured program that encourages personal growth and athletic development through balanced competition.

Team Building and Competition

To provide a challenging developmental path for the very best players while catering to the needs of the entry level player. This is accomplished by a systematic evaluation of each player and the creation of teams with similar ability ranges that promote healthy competition for all.

Since 2015, the DSMHL has followed the <u>USA Hockey Advanced Development Model (ADM)</u> and has consistently developed players who are ready to take the next step into a more competitive travel-hockey environment. In using this program, the DSMHL fosters an atmosphere of age-appropriate training that builds foundational skills over time, while also supporting a holistic development approach that provides physical literacy, agility and balance for overall competitive growth.

Each team is coached by volunteers who have been approved by both USA Hockey and Safe Sport and trained by the Dallas Stars Amateur Hockey staff. If you would like to volunteer to be a coach in the DSMHL, contact the Hockey Manager or General Manager at your local rink.

PLAYER EVALUATIONS

Each season, the DSMHL holds evaluation sessions prior to team building in centralized locations across the Metroplex. This allows the league to have consistent evaluations of all players in the league In an effort to create a more balanced and competitive league for players of all skill levels.

The evaluators at each location provide a number ranking for each player based upon their skating, puck skills and shooting ability. Once the skaters have been evaluated, each player will receive an overall score based upon an average of each of their skill levels.

Once all players are evaluated and have an average score, the DSMHL begins to form teams in each facility location.

TEAM LEVELING METHODOLOGY

Once each player has been evaluated and their home rink has been established, the DSMHL team selection committee works to create balanced and competitive divisions within the league for players of all skill levels.

If the number of participants in any age bracket warrants the creation of a separate division, then the DSMHL will create an additional appropriate division within that age bracket to further address the competitive balance within that age group.

The DSMHL will then use the individual player evaluation scores to create balanced teams in each facility to ensure that each player and each team has a positive experience.
