

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****November 11, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. ST. LOUIS BLUES [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames came up just short in a 3–2 loss to the St. Louis Blues on Tuesday night at the Enterprise Center. The Blues jumped out to a 2–0 lead in the first period with goals from Dylan Holloway at 10:59 and Matthew Kessel shortly after. St. Louis extended its advantage to 3–0 early in the second when Nathan Walker buried a pass from Alexey Toropchenko at 7:20. Calgary roared back less than seven minutes later, scoring twice in a 25-second span — first from Matt Coronato, who notched his fourth of the season on a setup from Brayden Pachal at 14:04, followed by Rasmus Andersson's third of the year off a feed from Mikael Backlund. Despite outshooting the Blues 40–31, including a 16–7 margin in the third period, the Flames' comeback effort fell just short.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the first of four meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary claimed all four meetings with San Jose in 2024-25, sweeping their four-game season-series.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-3-0 against Central Division teams and a record of 1-11-0 against Western Conference opponents.

FROSTY THE SNOWMAN:

Morgan Frost enters tonight's contest with 99 career assists and sits one helper away from reaching the 100-assist milestone. With one more, Frost would become the 11th player from the 2017 NHL Draft class to record 100 career assists. The Aurora, ON native collected his first career assist in his second NHL game on November 21, 2019, in Carolina, setting up the game-winning goal as a member of the Philadelphia Flyers.

2024-25 SEASON RECAP VERSUS SAN JOSE:

The Flames went 4-0-0 against the Sharks in 2024-25 to sweep their season-series against San Jose for the second time in the past three seasons.

GAME ONE (December 28, 2024 – at SJS):

The Calgary Flames opened their season series with the San Jose Sharks at the SAP Center in December. Calgary controlled the opening frame, outshooting San Jose 17–7, and Jonathan Huberdeau broke through late to give the visitors a 1–0 lead after 20 minutes. In the second period, the teams traded blows as Macklin Celebrini drew the Sharks even before captain Mikael Backlund restored the Flames' advantage to make it 2–1 through 40. In the third, Dustin Wolf shut the door, stopping all eight shots he faced, while Huberdeau sealed the victory with an empty-netter—his second of the night—as Calgary skated away with a 3–1 win.

GAME TWO (February 23, 2025 – vs. SJS):

The Calgary Flames returned from the NHL 4 Nations Face-Off break by welcoming the San Jose Sharks to the Scotiabank Saddledome on February 23, 2025. Macklin Celebrini opened the scoring 3:41 into the contest to give the Sharks a 1–0 lead, but just under four minutes later, Nazem Kadri hit the 20-goal mark to draw the Flames even, and that's where things stood after 20 minutes. In the second period, Kevin Rooney put Calgary ahead with his fourth of the season as the home side carried a 2–1 edge into the intermission. In the final frame, Tyler Toffoli tied it for San Jose, but Joel Hanley restored the Flames' lead with his first of the campaign—a goal that stood as the game-winner—as Calgary edged the Sharks 3–2.

GAME THREE (April 7, 2025 – at SJS):

The Flames headed to San Jose for their third meeting with the Sharks of the 2024–25 season on April 7. The home side recorded the only goal of the opening frame, with Will Smith giving San Jose a 1–0 lead through 20 minutes. In the second, Calgary outshot the Sharks 11–8, but both goaltenders stood tall to keep it a one-goal game heading into the third. Just over eight minutes into the final period, Nazem Kadri and Adam Klapka broke in on a two-on-one; Kadri's initial shot was stopped, but Klapka followed up and buried his fourth of the season to draw the Flames level. On a later power play, a Morgan Frost shot deflected off Jonathan Huberdeau and in to give Calgary its first lead of the night. Moments later, Matt Coronato capitalized on a Sharks turnover to extend the advantage. San Jose pressed late and drew within one, but the Flames held firm to secure a 3–2 victory and two more points on the road.

GAME FOUR (April 13, 2025 – vs. SJS):

The final matchup between these clubs came at the Scotiabank Saddledome in the Flames' 80th game of the 2024–25 season. The Sharks opened the scoring early, with Tyler Toffoli putting the visitors ahead just 3:09 into the contest. Later in the frame, MacKenzie Weegar teed up a shot from the point and blasted home his eighth of the campaign to draw Calgary even. With under five minutes remaining in the first, Nazem Kadri made a slick move around Henry Thrun and found Adam Klapka at the back post, who tapped in his fifth to give the Flames their first lead of the night and a 2–1 edge through 20 minutes. In the middle stanza, Jan Rutta scored the lone goal to knot things up at two apiece heading into the third. Just 1:30 into the final period, Yegor Sharangovich finished off a give-and-go with Morgan Frost to restore Calgary's advantage. Midway through the frame, Matt Coronato extended the lead with his 24th of the season, and Sharangovich sealed it with an empty-netter to give the Flames a 5–2 victory.



RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson scored on Tuesday night in St. Louis to record his 50th-career goal in the NHL. Andersson has become the eighth defenseman in Flames history with 50 career goals. He is also one of just seven defenceman in Flames franchise history to record 250-or-more points in the regular season and playoffs combined. The others: Al MacInnis (924), Gary Suter (603), Paul Reinhart (517), Mark Giordano (516), T.J. Brodie (281), and Jamie Macoun (271).

SHARKNADO:

In Calgary and San Jose’s last meeting on April 13, 2025, Yegor Sharangovich scored his 100th NHL goal to become just the third skater of Belarussian descent in NHL history to reach the 100-goal plateau, along side Mikhail Grabovski (125) and Andrei Kostitsyn (103). Sharangovich also became the third member of the 2018 NHL Draft Class to reach the mark, joining Brady Tkachuk (191) and Andrei Svechnikov (155).

KEEPING HIS COOL:

Devin Cooley made his third start of the season on Sunday in Minnesota, stopping 17 of 18 shots faced. The netminder has appeared in five games for the Flames so far in 2025-26, posting a .935 save percentage and a 1.75 goals-against average. Cooley earned his first NHL victory on April 6, 2024, as a member of the San Jose Sharks, turning aside 34 shots in a win over the St. Louis Blues.

MIRO, MIRO ON THE WALL:


On Saturday morning, the Flames announced the recall of defenceman Daniil Miromanov from the AHL’s Calgary Wranglers. In seven American Hockey League games, the Moscow, RU native posted four points from one goal and three helpers, including a two-assist effort in his most recent outing on Thursday night. Miromanov also posted a positive plus/minus rating in five of his seven contests, accumulating a +6 rating in AHL play.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Dating back to April of 2022, the Flames are 11-1-0 against the San Jose Sharks and have swept their season-series with San Jose twice (2022-23 and 2024-25) over that span.

On Tuesday in St. Louis, the Flames scored twice in 25 seconds, marking their fastest two goals since Feb. 18, 2023 (0:08 vs. NYR).
