SEYMOUR H. KNOX III

Chairman of the Board and President

The Chairman of the Board of the Buffalo Sabres is a successful businessman and an outstanding athlete in his own right.

Since his school days when a football injury ended his hockey career, Seymour Knox has been an avid hockey fan, and turned that interest into a long quest for an NHL franchise — one that paid off in 1970.

Former president of the U.S. Squash Racquets Association and a nationally-ranked player, he is Regional Vice President of Dominick & Dominick, members of New York Stock Exchange, and Sabres' representative on the NHL Board of Governors.



NORTHRUP R. KNOX

Vice Chairman of the Board

"Norty" Knox was an outstanding goalie at Yale and turned his athletic abilities to polo and court tennis after college. He was the court tennis World Champion for 10 years, and captain and number one player on the U.S. Polo team in 1969. Currently he serves as Chairman of the U.S. Polo Association. With his brother Seymour, Norty Knox was disappointed in the first expansion of the NHL when the well-prepared Buffalo application was turned down. But the Knox brothers and other local backers continued to be persistent, leading to the league's dynamic new franchise.



DAVID G. FORMAN

Administrative Vice President

Front office operations of the new Sabres organization have been under the direction of Dave Forman in the hectic months of putting together a new franchise.

No stranger to administration, he has been a well known and highly respected business and civic leader in Western New York for three decades. He was named administrative vice president and a member of the Sabres' executive committee in the fall of 1970, after serving as a Sabres' vice president since the club's inception.



ROBERT O. SWADOS

Vice President and Counsel

Professional sports in Buffalo have been both vocation and avocation for Bob Swados, partner in the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifin & Bradford.

He is a former vice president of the Buffalo Bisons Baseball Club, vice president, Major League for Buffalo, Inc., and was counsel to the Knox brothers when they first sought an NHL franchise in 1965.

A Buffalo native, he has a B.A. from the University of Buffalo and is a cum laude graduate of the Harvard University Law School.



GEORGE "PUNCH" IMLACH

The new Buffalo Sabres presented a different kind of challenge to hockey's most colorful and quotable coach, and Punch met the challenge with more success than even his most ardent admirers had hoped.

But success in building and rebuilding is one of Punch's strong suits. In 11 seasons as general manager and/or coach of the Toronto Maple Leafs, his teams won four Stanley Cups and made the playoffs 10 times.

Punch predicted the Sabres would be

the first expansion team to win the Stanley Cup, and he is sticking to his prediction.

A heart attack during mid-season last year benched Punch for the duration, but he was back in the Aud by season's end to watch his young club. During the off-season Punch decided to confine his duties to general manager, and continued work to build a winner.



JOE CROZIER

When Punch Imlach was sidelined with a heart attack at mid-season last year, there was only one logical choice for his replacement, his long-time friend, Joe Crozier.

Joe had been coach and GM at Buffalo's new Cincinnati franchise in the American League, and came to Buffalo as acting coach.

The young Sabres responded to his intense drive to win and instructional ability to finish the season on the upbeat with only two losses in the final eight games.

A former defenseman in the minors, Joe was one of the most successful coaches and general managers in pro hockey, with a barrel of league and playoff championships in the past decade at Rochester in the AHL and Vancouver in the Western League. Joe Crozier coaches winning teams and intends to keep up the practice. He was named coach of the Sabres this spring when Punch stepped down to retain the Buffalo post as general manager.



FRED HUNT

Assistant General Manager

For 18 years general manager and four-time coach of the old American Hockey League Buffalo Bisons, and a star player here for nearly a decade before that, Fred Hunt and pro hockey in Buffalo go hand in hand. He joined the Sabres shortly after the new franchise was awarded, and in that first season was the club's principal trouble shooter in the complicated process of setting up a big league organization - on and off ice. When Joe Crozier moved to Buffalo, Fred was placed in charge of operations at Cincinnati, where the Sabres have their AHL farm club.




JOHN ANDERSEN Director of Scouting

Like his scouting staff, soft-spoken John lives out of a suitcase much of the year, crisscrossing Canada and the United States to scout both amateur and professional hockey talent.

Danish-born, Andersen worked for Punch Imlach in Toronto for 10 years and moved west to become director of scouting for the California Golden Seals when Punch parted company with the Maple Leafs. When Imlach joined the Sabres, Andersen joined Imlach once again.



THE SECOND YEAR

The Sabres' second time around was a year of change and of challenge . . . of record performance on the ice, and record numbers at the gate . . . as Buffalo become the newest "hot ticket" in professional sport.

Thirty-six players wore Buffalo colors during 71-72, as Punch Imlach began rebuilding after only a year, making the Sabres the youngest club in the NHL by season's end.

The oldest forward by the last month of the season was 25-year-old captain and center Gerry Meehan, and the youngsters began to jell during the final weeks.

In their last eight games, Buffalo lost only twice. And on the season's final night, before a frantic Memorial Auditorium crowd, the club knocked the Philadelphia Flyers out of the Stanley Cup playoffs with a last second Meehan goal.

The youngsters who Imlach is building with include right winger Rene Robert, rugged Jim Lorentz, Steve Atkinson, Don Luce, Randy Wyrozub, Craig Ramsay and his first draft choice of 1971, Rick Martin.

The bullet-shooting Martin scored 44 goals in his first season, wiping out linemate Gil Perreault's old record of 38 goals set a year before. Martin had a great chance for the magic 50 goal figure, but late season injuries slowed him down.

Perreault's second season was better than his first, when he won the Calder Trophy as NHL rookie of the year.


He scored 26 goals, added a club record 48 assists, and was instrumental in helping Martin to his goal-scoring mark.

Roger Crozier, rated by many of his fellow NHL'ers as the best goalie in hockey, had another sensational year, and was named MVP by both his team mates and the Buffalo fans.

With Punch Imlach sidelined in mid-year by a heart attack, and a succession of injuries, Buffalo never was a playoff contender in 71-72.

But Buffalo's fans turned out for 35 sellouts in 39 homegames, and the waiting list for season tickets in Sabretown is lengthy. A hockey ticket in Buffalo is a precious commodity.

"We hope we can pay off this season," says Punch Imlach. "We still aim to be the first expansion team to win the Stanley Cup. And we have to make the playoffs first. We intend to make them this year."

THE PRESS BOX

The Sabres' press box in Memorial Auditorium is located on the west side of the building, suspended from the ceiling.

SportsCom copy transmitting facilities will be available during 1972-73. Radio and TV broadcast locations are in the press box. The press box is also served by a Western Union Sportsticker. An internal PA system has been installed for 1972-73, and closed circuit television monitors, to be fed by either Sabres' video tape equipment or commercial TV pickups, are anticipated.

The press interview room is located at ice level directly between the Sabres and visiting dressing rooms, and includes work areas for writers.

The press lounge is located on the west side of the building between Level Two and Level Three.
