AT A GLANCE

LA BELLE PROVINCE

Phillip Danault returns to his home province for the second time in three weeks following the team's pair of preseason games at Videotron Centre in Quebec City. The Victoriaville native's 352 career points (117-235=352) places sixth among active Quebec-born skaters. Among all Kings to hail from Quebec, his 153 points (62-91=153) in 243 games ranks eighth in franchise history on a list led by hall-of-famers **Marcel Dionne** (550-757=1,307) and **Luc Robitaille** (557-597=1,154).

SWISS-SATIONAL

Forward **Kevin Fiala** skates into Bell Center on a goal-streak, having tallied in both of the Kings' previous stops in Eastern Canada. Last night saw the winger net his first even-strength marker in Toronto, his third of the season in total. On Monday afternoon in Ottawa, Fiala scored both his first and second goals of the season on the man-advantage as the Kings went 3/5 (60.0%) on the powerplay. Fiala has now established a goal streak of at least two games for the 34th time in his career, doing so for the 10th time since joining the Kings two seasons ago.

SAUCE LAKE CITY

Forward **Trevor Lewis** scored his first goal of the season on Monday, marking the 99th tally of his career and moving one shy of becoming the 21st skater, and fourth U.S-born skater, selected in the 2006 NHL Draft to reach the 100-goal mark. Appearing in his 14th season with the franchise, Lewis has amassed 180 points (79-102=181) with the organization which place seventh-most by a U.S.-born player with the Kings while his 79 goals rank sixth.

NOT BRAND(T) NEW TO THIS

Rookie blueliner **Brandt Clarke** (0-4=4) leads the Kings in assists through the first four games of the year, powered by his first career three-point afternoon on Monday in Ottawa. The hometown performance made Clarke (21 years, 248 days) the youngest Kings player to post a three-assist game since **Drew Doughty** (21 years, 5 days) on Dec. 13, 2010 per NHL PR.
