SCORING MACHINE

Egor Chinakhov scored his 14th goal as a member of the Penguins on Tuesday and has hit career highs across the board in goals (17), assists (15) and points (32).

- Chinakhov has 14 goals in 34 games with the Penguins after scoring three goals in 29 games with the Columbus Blue Jackets prior to his trade.
- Since his Penguins debut on January 1, no Penguin has more goals than Chinakhov while his 26 points rank second:

STREAKIN'

Bryan Rust enter tonight's game riding a career-long nine-game point streak, accumulating five goals, eight assists and 13 points since March 10.

- Rust's point streak is the second-longest active streak in the league:


Erik Karlsson continued his Norris Trophy-caliber stretch on Thursday, recording his third-consecutive three-point game on the road to lead the Penguins to an important two points in Ottawa.

- Karlsson has been on a tear as of late, recording 13 points over his last seven games and stretching back further has 22 points over his last 15 games.
- Karlsson has seven multi-point games over his last 10 outings and eight over his past 14 games. Since February 28, no defenseman has more points than Karlsson as his 22 points rank third in the entire league:

MARCH OF THE PENGUINS

During a 17-game month of March when the team has missed Sidney Crosby and Evgeni Malkin for long stretches, future Hall of Famer Erik Karlsson has elevated his game to lead the Penguins to points in nine of 14 games.

- Through 14 games thus far, Karlsson has tallied eight goals, 13 assists and 21 points, marking his second calendar month with 20 or more points in his career (Nov. 2022, 21 PTS in 15 GP).
- Thursday marked Karlsson's eighth multi-point game this month, tying Randy Carlyle (8 in Dec. 1980 en route to the Penguins' only Norris Trophy) for the most by a Penguins defenseman in a single month.
- Karlsson is putting together one of the best singular months by a Penguins defenseman in franchise history, currently sitting seven points away from tying Paul Coffey for the most points in one month:
