AT A GLANCE

MULTIPLE CHOICE

The Kings had six different skaters record two-point performances on Thursday in Philadelphia. In doing so, the Kings set a new season high for individual multi-point performances in a single game. Five different Kings registered multiple points in last Saturday's 5-1 victory over the Rangers, which tied the previous season-high set on Oct. 14 in Ottawa and Oct. 30 against Vegas. Through the first 32 games of the season, Kings skaters have a cumulative 63 multi-point player games amongst their roster so far this season, 13 of which have come from **Adrian Kempe** and 11 from captain **Anze Kopitar**. The 2024-25 season is just the third campaign in the last 30 years to have 60 or more cumulative multi-point games by Kings players at this point in the year. The Kings currently have the seventh most cumulative multi-point player games in the NHL through the first 32 games of the season.

TURCY-TROT

Forward **Alex Turcotte** gears up for the Kings' sixth stop of their seven-game sojourn averaging a point-per-game on the trip. With an assist on Thursday in Philadelphia, Turcotte extended his point streak to a third game (2-2=4) with his fifth point of the road trip (2-3=5), dating back to Dec. 10 on Long Island. During the Kings' previous seven-game road-trip to open the campaign, Turcotte recorded a career-long four-game point streak (1-3=4) with his run from Oct. 14 in Ottawa through Oct. 20 in Anaheim. The 23-year-old looks to match that stretch with a point tonight in his third visit to the Music City. In his first career appearance at Bridgestone Arena, Turcotte notched both his first career NHL goal and assist as part of his first career multi-point game on Jan. 31, 2024.

KEEPERS OF THE CASTLE

After shutting out the Predators 3-0 in their last visit to Nashville, the Kings return to Bridgestone Arena having allowed two or less goals in seven of their last ten games. Entering today's matinee in the Music City, the Kings have allowed 81 goals through 32 games, the second fewest in the NHL behind the Dallas Stars (80), who have played one fewer contest. Among their 81 goals allowed, a league-low 16 have come in the first period. The team's 2.53 goals-against-per game (GA/GP) is the lowest in the League.
