

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****December 13, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. LOS ANGELES KINGS [1] (OT)**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames earned a hard-fought 2–1 overtime victory over the Los Angeles Kings on Saturday night at Crypto.com Arena behind a strong defensive effort. After Adrian Kempe opened the scoring for L.A. midway through the first, Calgary tied it shorthanded in the second when Blake Coleman finished a breakaway at the 6:41 mark. Nothing could separate these clubs in the third after a scoreless final stanza despite the Flames holding a significant edge in shots through regulation. In overtime, Morgan Frost iced things just 66 seconds into the extra frame, snapping home the winner off a Jonathan Huberdeau feed to help Calgary claim the extra point. Dustin Wolf stopped 20 of 21 shots to help the Flames start their ‘fathers’ trip’ on a winning note.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary claimed game one of their season-series 2-0 on November 13 at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-3-0 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 6-11-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING WITH SAN JOSE:

The Calgary Flames earned a 2–0 shutout victory over the San Jose Sharks in these clubs' first meeting on November 13 at the Scotiabank Saddledome. After a scoreless first period which saw Calgary outshoot San Jose 13–1, the Flames broke through early in the second when Blake Coleman buried his then-team-leading seventh goal of the year at the 5:46 mark to give Calgary a 1–0 lead, and they would clamp down defensively from there. The Flames sealed the win in the final seconds when rookie Samuel Honzek scored into the empty net with just five seconds remaining in the contest. Dustin Wolf was perfect on the night, posting a 16-save shutout, his first of the season and the fourth of his NHL career to earn first-star honors.

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

With his 16-save effort in Calgary's first meeting with San Jose on November 13, Dustin Wolf became just the second California-born goaltender to record a shutout against a California-based team in NHL history, joining Thatcher Demko (Dec. 6, 2021 vs. LAK). Wolf played his first NHL game against the San Jose Sharks, turning aside 23 saves to record his first NHL win on April 12, 2023. Since that game, Wolf has faced the Sharks eight times, posting a 7-1-0 record with a .920 save percentage and a 1.99 goals-against average.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

With his shorthanded goal on Saturday in Los Angeles, Blake Coleman scored his 11th shorthanded goal with Calgary. With the goal, he tied Matthew Lombardi and Joe Nieuwendyk for the seventh most in franchise history. Coleman now has 21 shorthanded goals in his NHL career which is tied with Jordan Staal for the third most among active players, behind Brad Marchand (36) and Jean-Gabriel Pageau (23).

CALIFORNIA PAINT:

Flames netminders Dustin Wolf and Devin Cooley are both California natives, (Wolf: Gilroy, CA, Cooley: Los Gatos, CA). Devin Cooley was a member of the San Jose Sharks during his rookie campaign in 2023-24, playing the first six games of his NHL career with San Jose. Cooley has never faced the Sharks in his NHL career but faced the San Jose Barracuda twice in the AHL last year, posting a 1-1-0 record.

SUCCESS AGAINST SAN JOSE:

Dating back to April of 2022, the Flames are 12-1-0 against the San Jose Sharks and have swept their season-series with San Jose twice (2022-23 and 2024-25) over that span. Calgary has won seven-straight games against the Sharks since April of 2024, which is their longest active winning streak against an opponent. In their last 10 trips to SAP Centre at San Jose, the Flames have gone 8-2-0, outscoring the Sharks 40-25 in those contests. Calgary's lifetime record in San Jose is 36-29-4-3.

RAZZLE DAZZLE:

Rasmus Andersson enters play tonight with 199 assists in his NHL career. With one more helper, Andersson would become the 24th defenceman of Swedish-decent in NHL history to reach the 200-assist plateau, and the ninth-active Swedish rearguard to reach the milestone. Andersson has recorded 22 points (7G, 15A) so far this season, ranking third among blueliners from Sweden in 2025-26 with his seven goals being tied for the most among Swedish defenceman this season.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar enters tonight's game with 197 assists in his NHL career and is three away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With three more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206th overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round–selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208th overall in 2011).



LOOK BACKS AT IT:

Mikael Backlund looking to skate in his 1,100th NHL game tonight in San Jose. The Flames captain can become the 12th Swedish player in NHL history to reach 1,100 NHL games and the third-active Swede to reach the milestone, along with Victor Hedman and Erik Karlsson.

Backlund was the Flames' first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2007 NHL draft and made his NHL debut on January 8, 2009, against the New York Islanders. As he developed in Calgary, he became known for his hockey IQ, defensive reliability, penalty-killing strength and ability to drive play at both ends of the ice.

He represented Sweden at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, following that tournament with a breakout season in 2016-17 in which he posted a then-career-high 53 points and earned Selke Trophy consideration. In 2022-23, he set a new career high with 56 points (19G, 37A) and a team-best plus-minus rating of +24, while appearing in all 82 games for the Flames. That summer, the Vasteras, SWE, product won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy for his leadership and humanitarian contributions, and on September 21, 2023, was named the 21st captain in franchise history.


Backlund became the 19th player of Swedish descent — and the 397th skater in NHL history — to reach 1,000 NHL games, hitting the mark Oct. 30 in Utah. He was also just the second player to skate his first 1,000 games with the Flames, joining Jarome Iginla. He now looks to join Iginla once again as the second skater in franchise history to reach 1,100 games played with Calgary.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

With Calgary's 2-0 over San Jose in these clubs' first meeting, the Flames recorded their 40th win against the Sharks on home ice. Calgary has now posted 40+ wins all-time on home ice against 11-different franchises.

With his helper in Los Angeles on Saturday, Jonathan Huberdeau tied Henrik Sedin (23) for the 12th-most overtime assists in NHL history. He set up Morgan Frost who scored his seventh road goal of the season which now leads the Flames.

WORLD JUNIOR WATCH:

On December 7, Flames defenceman Zayne Parekh and Calgary's 2025 first-round pick Cole Reschny were named to Team Canada's World Junior camp roster.

Parekh has skated in 11 games for the Flames in his first professional season and has been sidelined since Nov. 7 with an injury. The Markham, ON, product was a member of the gold-medal-winning Canadian squad at the 2023 Hlinka Gretzky Cup, recording three assists in five games. He also represented Canada at the 2022 World U17 Hockey Challenge, finishing tied for second in scoring on Canada Black with five points in seven games.

Reschny has suited up in 16 games for the University of North Dakota this season, scoring two goals and adding a team-leading 16 assists for 18 points, also a team high. The 18-year-old freshman is currently riding a four-game assist streak and has picked up at least one point in eight of his last nine outings. Reschny was part of Team Canada's gold-medal-winning U18 World Championship squad last spring, finishing that tournament with five goals and three assists for eight points in five games.

On Friday morning, Zayne Parekh was loaned to Canada's U20 National Junior Team by Calgary.
