THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW


The Sabres have not allowed a goal in two straight home games against the Kings and a shutout in tonight's game would mark the first time in franchise history that Buffalo has shut out an opponent in three consecutive home contests.

Buffalo has won three of its last four contests against Los Angeles, scoring at least five goals in each win during that span.

The Sabres have earned a win in five of their last six home contests against the Kings.

A win in tonight's game would mark the eighth time in franchise history, and the first since the Sabres won four straight games against the Kings from Oct.

20, 2018 to Dec. 21, 2019, that Buffalo has defeated Los Angeles in three or more consecutive games.



The defunct Cleveland Barons are the only team Buffalo has recorded more goals per game played against (46 games; 4.15 G/GP)

Jason Zucker is expected to play in his 700th career game tonight.



ON THIS DATE

The Sabres are 10-9-1 all-time on October 10.

October 10, 1970: The Sabres play their first game in franchise history, a 2-1 win at Pittsburgh. Jim Watson scores the first goal in franchise history at 5:01 of the second period and Gilbert Perreault scores the game-winner on the power play at the 11:26 mark of the third period.

October 10, 1974: Danny Gare scores 18 seconds into his first NHL game, kicking off a 9-5 Sabres win at Boston.

October 10, 2009: Mike Grier scores the only goal of the game and Ryan Miller turns away all 25 Nashville shots in a 1-0 victory over the Predators.

KINGS OF THE HILL

JJ Peterka has recorded at least one point in each of the three games he has played against Los Angeles in his career and he has tallied six total points (4+2) in those games.

Peterka has registered multiple points in each of his last two games against the Kings (1+1 on Feb. 13, 2024; 2+1 on Jan. 24, 2024) and a multi-point performance in tonight's game would make him the eighth Sabres skater to record three consecutive multi-point games against Los Angeles.

Dylan Cozens (2+5) and **Peyton Krebs** (2+2) have tallied at least one point in four straight games against the Kings.

In his last eight games against the Kings, Alex Tuch has recorded nine points (5+4), including at least one point in each of his last two.

Jordan Greenway has recorded at least one point in six of his last seven home games against Los Angeles and he has posted nine points (2+7) in that span.

Jack Quinn has posted four points (1+3) in three career games against the Kings.



In his only start against Los Angeles in his career on Feb. 13, 2024, Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen recorded a 33-save shutout.
